This is a very serious "Level 3" case which involved sexual abuse committed against them by two different priests, Romeo Valliere and Paul Aube, both of whom were actively investigated by the New Hampshire Attorney General's office. The case also has significant factors enhancing svaluation.

This is an "uncovered" claim due to the fact that the abuse claimed occurred prior to 1972.

# Abuse by Father Romeo J. Valliero (1966-69)

The sexual abuse committed by Father Roman J. Valliere against involved approximately 40 incidents of oral sex and masturbation.

Mary's school. The had become an altar boy during the 6th grade (1964-65), and Valliere was assigned to St. Mary's on August 3, 1965. Their initial contact was through the altar boy connection, and Valliere befriended the 12 year old most immediately upon his assignment to St. Mary's.

recalls the abuse beginning in the St. Mary's rectory in Valliers's room. This abuse, which most likely occurred prior to the summer of 1966, involved french kissing, displaying pornographic films, and coaxing the 12 year old boy to take his clothes off. He recalls that this occurred 2 or 3 times during that first school year that Valliers was present (1965-66).

The majority of the sexual abuse occurred at Valliere's

parent's home in Berlin. Apparently Valliers would take 2-3 vacation weeks each summer at the Berlin home. He invited to dome with him, and the did accompany Valliers to this home during these vacation weeks for three summers - 1966-1968.

valliere would have sleep in the same bed as him, and the abuse always involved Valliere performing oral sex on the boy to the point of ejaculation, and then force the boy to masturbate the priest, also to the point of ejaculation. Both the boy and the priest would be completely naked and under the covers. The priest would that Valliere would always give him beer, and that the priest would drink beer himself. This same pattern of abuse continued for the three summers noted, and the estimates that it took place on a total of approximately 40 occasions.

occurred at locations other than the Berlin home.

He recalls one occasion that occurred at a home on Cape Cod that parents were renting in the summer of either 1967 or 1968. His parents, brother and sisters were present on the trip. Members of the family had their own rooms, and Valliere slept in a separate bed in the room. During the night, Valliere came into the bed, and performed oral sex on him.

valliere's teenage brother and a teenage friend went to a drivein movie. Valliere's brother and the friend were a year or two
clear than the back seat of the car with Valliere in the middle.
valliere's brother was in the front passenger seat. During the
movie, Valliere unsipped the pants and began to fondle and
masturbate him. Then then realised that Valliere was doing the
same thing, simultaneously, with his other hand to the brother's
friend. Valliere leaned over to the brother's
reach to the front seat and fondle/masturbate his brother.

A third occasion that recalls was when he was a 9th grader on the freshman basketball team. Valltere had volunteered to drive his car to help transport the team. On the way home from a game, Valliere stopped with the team at the Margate hotel in Laconia. He took the players into the hot tub at the resort, and while they were in the hot tub, Valliere fondled his genitals. On the ride the rest of the way home to Claremont,

Valliers also attempted to fondle the senitals, but the fearful the other boys would notice, pushed his hand away.

The abuse stopped when Valliers was transferred from St. Hary's in the spring of 1969. The had no further contact of any type with Valliers after that time.

# Abusa by Father Paul Aube (1970-71)

encountered Paul Aube within the first week of Aube's assignment to St. Mary's in 1970. By this time, (Million) had begun to develop a serious interest in pursuing a vocation in the priesthood, and Aube was made immediately aware of this fact. Aube was very friendly and outgoing, and befriended (Million) immediately.

He recalls his first encounter of a sexual nature with Aube occurring during the summer of 1970. Like Valliere, Aube's parents also apparently lived in Berlin, and again invited to spend a week with Aube at the Berlin house. recalls that at night when was 16 years old at the time. they were going to bed, Aube insisted that they both sleep in the nude, telling how it was more healthy for the body's blood circulation to sleep naked. Trecalls that Auba would keep the light on until 2:00-3:00am talking to while they both would try to go to sleep, lie there naked. Every time Aube would awaken him, often by placing a lit cigarette under o nose. The sexual abuse involved genital fondling. Apparently Aube's form of perversion was to cause the to have an exection, and to continue to fondle him to a point just short recalls this occurring on of ejaculation, and then stop. 6 or 7 nights during that trip. He recalls a total of four (4) one week trips to the Berlin home, for a total of 25-30 incidents of this maked masturbation.

house. He recalls come that Aube rented a dabin somewhere in the mountains for 3 days. He recalls the similar naked fondling, however on these nights the fondling did progress to masturbation and ejaculation. He also recalls accompanying Aube to Maine where Aube was scheduled to give some type of talk or speech. They stayed together at a hotel for one night, and the same form of abuse took place on that occasion as well.

further recalls one extremely bizarre incident that

occurred when he accompanied Aube to Garndar, Massachusetts for a wedding of a 20-21 male that Auba apparently knew. ( was 17 years old at the time. He remembers that on one evening prior to the actual wedding, he. Auba and the groom-to-be were together in a hotel moom, and all three, at Auba's request, were maked. At the beginning of the evening Auba sat facing and the groom-to-be while he fondled the genitals of them both. Aube the directed the groom-to-be to essentially mount (main) and simulate a pax act. After going to bed that evening, Aube engaged in masturbation with to the point of ejeculation for Auba.

This is a very serious "Level 3" case. The value of this case, under our settlement system, is enhanced for several reasons:

Multiple priests; 1-

Instances involving multiple victims; 2 -

POTDOGYADAY; 3~

Simulated sex acts with victims; and 4-

Alcohol.

The sick and perverted nature of the acts as described in this latter speak for themselves, and I will not expound further.

This is an "uncovered" claim, and as such, we will need to choose a date to meet and discuss this and other cases not covered by insurance.

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Mr. Naff, Rev. Arsenault:

Last December, while I was making my report on Rev. Lower, I also mentioned that there had been an incident with Rev. S. Scruton. I would like to report the following incidents for the record.

Because of the change of Bishops and scheduling issues, Confirmation at St. Rose of Lima in Littleton had bee postponed for several years. Finally it was scheduled for the spring of 1975 and in September of 1974 the guidelines for students who wish to be confirmed in the spring were laid out. These included required attendance at formation classes through the year and service projects. Through the year I participated in the classes and the other 'required' activities. I did notice that a number of my classmates dropped out of class and did not participate in the 'required' activities. Yet when confirmation came around, EVERYONE was confirmed, including those that did not fulfill the requirements. Rev. Scruton decided on his own that everyone would be included and though I complained, it fell on deaf ears. I would classify this as abusive authority behavior by Rev. Scruton.

I had been very much involved in activities. One of them I'd like to report because of it abuse of trust (theft from the parish).

Prior to Rev. Scuton's arrival, the collection counting had been taken care by families in the Parish (neighbors that I knew). These were trusted people in the community and freely gave of their time to take care of the responsibility of organizing and counting the collection and depositing it in the bank. Rev. Scruton did not care for this arrangement (for reasons I will disclose later). He decided that the collection needed to be counted in the rectory under his supervision. In January of 1975, I was enlisted to count the collection at the rectory. Each Sunday that winter and spring, I would go to an early Mass and then go to the rectory and begin counting the collection, beginning with the Saturday evening and early Sunday Mass collections. As the morning passed, collection from the additional Masses would arrive and finally after the last Mass, Rev. Scruton would assist in finishing counting the collection. (Since this usually ran into lunch, I would be tasked to cook lunch for Rev Scruton, and quite often for his guest.) As we came to the end of counting the collection, Rev Scruton would go into his office and return with a cigar box. Anywhere from \$20 to \$50 was put into this box (these funds were not including in the collection). The collection was 'fixed' to look like a legitimate number (no even \$100 or even \$10 increments were reported). What I did find was that this cigar box funds were being set aside for personal and entertainment use. The money from the cigar box was used for Pizza, Movie Theater Tickets, and going out to eat. I'm sure it was used for other things that I was not involved in as well. Most of all, it was not reported to the parishioners. This theft is clearly an abuse of trust.

I was very upset at the time of confirmation and quit the collection counting and lunch service I was doing. I even stopped going to church.

Finally on Saturday of the First Sunday of Advent (December1975), I made an attempt to return to church. I happened to stop by church Saturday afternoon while Rev. Scruton and the part time associate (Rev. Rochefort (sp?)) were working on putting up banners for Advent. Rev. Rochfort had to leave for other duties and I was asked to work on a banner in the rectory. This time I was taken up into a workroom on the second floor (north east corner of the rectory as I recall) to work on the banner. This went on into the early evening. At one point, Rev. Scruton offered to show me the changes he had made to the rectory (this is where the incident with Rev. Lower had taken place in 1973). As he showed me on of the bedrooms, we turned to leave and he grabbed me from behind and pulled me back onto the bed. I was able to break away, but did not know how to react. I returned to the workroom and made sure to not have my back to Rev. Scruton for the remainder of my stay that evening. Work was finished quickly (maybe 15 or 20 minutes) and I left the rectory.

I have only been to the Rectory in Littleton twice since (once to get Certificates, and once to see Rev. Klatka).

I stopped going to church at St. Rose. During this time, I was invited and participated in the Methodist church choir and began to attend there.

The following summer, my mother asked why I was not going to church and I told her of the incident of the First Sunday of Advent. My parents supported me and they began to attend Mass at St. Catherine's in Lisbon. By the end of the summer I began to go to Mass in Lisbon as well, while still participating in the Methodist Church Choir.

Rev. Scruton was still pastor n Littleton when I applied to be a Seminarian, for that reason; there was no Pastor's Letter for my file.

My mother reported the assault incident to Rev. John Horan (former Pastor in Littleton and a family friend). This was after Rev. Scruton had been arrested for Sodomy and removed from ministry.

What I saw in this one self appointed church leader was the abuses of assault, theft, and authority. It should never have happened.

#### Dear Tony,

I have asked Martha Kipp, Director of Risk Management for the Diocese of Manchester, to compile a summary of all civil claims made by individuals alleging sexual abuse as minors by certain named clergy that the Diocese learned about since December 10, 2002, the date of the Agreement between the Office of the Attorney General and the Diocese. These claims are those which were made known to us by the filing of civil lawsuits and/or demands being made on behalf of victims by lawyers, etc.

Please find attached a summary of these claims identifying the victim by name and the accused priest. I am submitting the attached document with the understanding that this "report," like all others, is not available to the public under NH's Right to Know law as this information is being submitted to you, for among other reasons, as part of the audit and reporting provisions of the Agreement. In addition, it is important to stress that several of the victims have expressly requested (and in some cases adamantly demanded) that their names be held confidential and not be released.

I believe the attached summary will give you an opportunity to cross-reference your files so that you will be fully informed as we are of all claims asserted. To the best of my knowledge, all of the accused have previously been identified and reported to your office with the possible exception of Gregoire Dumont, Joseph Sands, George Roulier and Brother Henry. None of these individuals are in ministry.


As is our normal custom and practice, please let me know if you would like further information about any of these claims or if you believe that a further report should be made to local law enforcement.
