In response to your email below regarding the Marist Brother, Bernard Nolin/Nolan, we have checked the diocesan directories for 1986-87 and 1987-88. The Marist Brothers (F.M.S.) did operate Camp Marist on Lake Ossipee around that time. We do not have a listing for the staff at the camp and the Marist Brothers are NOT listed in the diocesan directories as having a 'residence' in New Hampshire. I am making an assumption that the Marist Brothers came to NH in the summer and operated the camp, then left at the end of the season.

We have been unable to find any information about a Brother named Bernard Nolin/Nolan.


