My number is and I've been directed to report this to you guys and it's an emergency and I'd like to put some closure on what's happened with me with Fr. Rusty and it happened around the time of my First Communion and I think that was in 1980 with Fr. Rusty. So please call me back as soon daughter, who has past daughter and as possible please. I'm away, so please call me back as soon as possible - again That was and I'm not sure what their last name is but they were supposed to deliver the presents yesterday, and today and they're still not doing that and there is going to be no Christmas for my children and I have no money and I'm having a very hard time and Fr. Rusty was going up my dress etc. and trying to give me presents to make up for it during Valentine's Day in the 80's around the time of my First Communion and I need this reported and taken care of right away and thank you his my date of birth and my phone number very much. I talked to Quirk this morning. They made the connection between Fr. Rusty and Fr. George Routier in the following way. There are no known priests in the Diocese named Fr. Rusty. Fr. Routier was called Fr. Rusty. Fr. Routier had faculties to work at Diocesan parishes and did fill in from time to time. They have no records of the parishes in which he filled in because it was just on a day-to-day basis. However, Fr. Routier (aka Fr. Rusty) had 2 previous complaints (both reported to AGO). In one situation, the victim stated that Fr. Rusty was from the Sisters of Mary but was filling in in Nashua when the abuse occurred. Therefore, they know that this Fr. Rusty was most likely Fr. Routier and by extension it is likely that the Fr. Rusty in the present complaint is the same perp. Since Fr. Routier is dead and there are no other known Fr. Rusty's in the Diocese, I don't think there is anything else we can do to follow up.
