As you will note, the Portsmouth PD and [REDACTED] have been notified. I spoke with Captain Janet Champlin of the Portsmouth PD this morning who stated that she was fine with the Diocese notifying Mr. [REDACTED] of the allegation. Thus, the notification will be made today and Mr. [REDACTED] will be instructed that he is not to be involved in any volunteer activities with the Church pending the results of the investigation. I will keep you updated on all developments.

Update on last two. Victims [REDACTED] accused [REDACTED] (usher) Portsmouth PD contacted family and mother became very defensive and would not allow children to be spoken with. Diocese Inv. Lunt also attempted to speak with [REDACTED] family. Mother again very defensive and indicated only reason they were following up was because the Pope was in US. [REDACTED] suffers from dementia and has been allowed to return to church by his family at a mass that is very well attended and is not allowed contact with children.

Victim [REDACTED] accused Paul Groleau - I had asked if Diocese was paying for seminary. Brian advised prior issues as priest. Also was a Boy Scout councilor and that is where he met [REDACTED] I looked at old index and found and found 4 prior entries. Groleau was liaised back in the 80s.
