Father Laferriere seems to be a very happy priest, serving well here and well appreciated by the people. He especially has endorsed and works very well with the religious education program and the youth here. He has a very good youth program going. The one hardship is that the youth of Barnstead do not like to participate with the youngsters from the other three towns or three different high schools that the others go to. One of the reasons evidently is that in St. Paul's in Barnstead they do not have a hall. They feel that everything they do they have to come to Alton and yet they have their little church. Evidently it matters to the parents, especially the older folks there who are not happy about being a mission church. Of course, there's no way they can become a parish since they have so few people there. The income on Sundays (regular Sundays) is only \$85.00.

Father Laferriere has a good program in Advent. He has thematic preaching during that time. Last year it was on Reconciliation, the Sacrament of Penance, Confession, sin; and he's had Benediction every Sunday with Rosary, I guess, and other things on Sunday afternoons during Advent, which was very well attended. For Lenten devotions he has a good turnout of people, too. He also has thematic preaching on Wednesdays of Lent. There is an inactive priest living in the area who is Father Andre Comeau, but he is properly laicized and properly married, and he is helpful weekends when he is able to be there as a Lector, etc.

Father has a good set-up here for lectors, ushers, and everything is well organized. I have encouraged Father Ray not to push too hard the Communion under both species on the weekends, especially during the summertime when the crowds are large. He has agreed to do that. He has a fairly good training program for teachers, although I think something further could be done. I discussed with him textbooks and encouraged him to get more people involved in the teaching field. The problem is he's got 8 of his Council members who are also teachers and I feel it's just too much for these people to do to be preparing for their religious education classes plus serving on the Parish Council's various committees, etc. I encourage him also to develop a committee on vocations to encourage the development of vocations, and to encourage prayer for vocations and to encourage prayer for vocations, to make the people aware of the need for vocations to the priesthood, the religious life, missionary life, and lay dedication. I also asked him to utilize that means to educate parents in terms of supporting youngsters who might want to become priests or dedicate themselves to the Church in one form or another.

Father has very few shutins, but he is faithful seemingly to visit them. He has an adult education program he tries to foster and he has his own Bible Study group with about ten or twelve people attending. I encourated Father to

develop a motivation program for giving. In fact, he's already working on a stewardship program. He's been studying it for several months now.

Father seems to be well balanced. He has no financial problems here. He has reduced the collections on Sunday to one and does not talk about money, only exceptionally. He has fostered, on the other hand, a good Catholic Charities Drive and the Rice Bowl offerings he has supported highly. He also is a person who is interested in reading. He does a lot of reading, both in Theology and keeping aware of developments in various areas. I'm impressed with that kind of practice that he has of reading a lot. He says he's not lonely at all here and does meet with priests quite regularly, although he does not belong to a Support Group, but he is thinking in terms of possibly joining one.

As a whole, the visit has been a wholesome one, and I think the parish is in good hands and going in the right direction.

Father Laferriere is very happy living at St. Anthony's, and very happy with what he's able to do. His ministry at this point is a part-time ministry given his health situation, but he does, I think, quite a bit to be of assistance to priests in need. He regularly covers for Father DesRuisseaux at St. Anthony's and helps out there with daily Masses and an occasional funeral. He also helps out some of the other priests in the area, as that's necessary. On weekends he goes to help Father Andre Thibodeau at the parishes in Henniker and Contoocook, and that's something he does enjoy. I think, given his health limitations which are basically emotional in nature, he is managing to stay fairly active and productive. He certainly is very satisfied with his situation.

He did, a couple of years ago, get himself into some significant spending problems. He simply had been involved in some compulsive buying situations, and was very much over-extended on his credit cards. But that's under control now, and he is paying off those bills appropriately. I think he's got that area well in place in his life, and he's happy with that.

He continues on various kinds of medication for his anxieties and depressive tendencies, but those are fairly stable and he's able to function with them quite well. He doesn't have any other significant health problems. He is a border line diabetic, and that has to be watched. Outside of that everything else seems to be o.k.


He has some good priest friends that he gets together with regularly. He's very careful about taking a regular day off and trying to get vacation time, as is appropriate. He is close to his family here in the area, and they're very good to him. In many ways he's in a good situation from an emotional and a spiritual point of view.

When it comes to retirement, Father Laferriere would just pretty much like to continue doing what he's doing. He will be 68 years of age next year, and I suspect he

will apply for formal retirement because that will be to his benefit financially, but I also would suspect that, health permitting, he simply would stay in residence at St. Anthony's and continue to assist as he has been doing. In a sense, he's been living kind of a life of partial retirement anyway for some years, and I wouldn't think that things would change in the next few years as long as his health cooperates.

He does have Social Security, so that he would be covered medically once he does retire. All in all, I think Father Laferriere is doing quite well. He's happy that Bishop O'Neil and I know of his past and of his situation health-wise, etc., and that we're able to support him.

All in all, I think Father Laferriere is doing quite well given his health limitations.





On the above listed date at approximately 1000hrs, this detective received a telephone who resides in Mexico and has so since March of 2002. indicated that he did receive this detectives E-mail message and confirmed Mr. that he was the victim of abuse at the hands of Father RAYMOND LAFERRIERE this taking place in 1966 when he was a juvenile. MR who indicated that he would cooperate in any investigation taking place against the Diocese. Mr. that he received a cash settlement and signed a confidentiality agreement with the that he supply details of the Diocese in 1995. It was not requested of Mr. assaults at this time, however he indicted that he did disclose this abuse to his parents when it was taking place. Moreover, Mr. indicated that his father (who is now deceased) had contact with the Diocese regarding the abuse at that time. Mr. advised that his mother (who is alive) does not recall specifically having contact with anyone about the abuse. Mr. further indicated that his brother might have additional information alluding to the possibility of his brother being a victim of LAFERRIERE as well however stated that he would allow his brother to explain further if he wished.

It was agreed that this detective and Mr. would begin conducting communication via E-Mail and the telephone so that a future statement can be taken. Mr. was thanked for his time and contact ended.

3) When was the first incident with Father Laferriere that made you feel uncomfortable? What happened? Where? How old were you? Did you tell anyone? Is there anything of evidentiary value in existence today? (diaries, letters, gifts given)

There was always "sexual talk and he was always talking about guys, never woman. First time anything actually happened was at my house when my parents were out, Laferriere came into the house and took his penis out infront of me. No, I did not tell anyone. Not that I am aware of

4) What type of abuse took place between you and Father Laferriere? Types of sexual encounters, how often, where did it take place? Did he ever take you out of State and abuse you? Did anyone else see anything specific happen? What did Father Laferriere say to you before, during or after the abuse took place. (I realize that it is difficult but please be as articulate as possible.)

Although he tried to give oral to me I refused so he would use his hand on me and made me do the same to him. It took place many times, at least once or twice a week for over a year. Yes, he took me to MA as well as NY.

No one saw anything that I can remember. He would always promise me things like fishing trips, etc. However, as stated in my report to my lawyer when my Father went to the Diocese in Manchester to report the abuse, Laferriere was told about it. Then shortly after that my father died and Laferriere was transferred. However, after a month or so he came back to my house and informed me that "my father died because he did something against God by reporting him about the abuse. Can you fucking believe that one? It is something I will never forget and probably the biggest reason why I have no use for organized religions to this date. It is beyond me how a grown person could even think of saying something like that to a kid. Now, thanks to you bringing it all up again my blood is starting to boil once again.

- 5) When did you decide to divulge what was happening to you to anyone else? Did you receive counseling?

 I never admitted it as a kid but as an adult it just started working on me. Not in the head trip sort of way but I did discuss it with people.
- 6) How did the abuse stop? When? I would like to say "when I cut his throat" but it stopped when he was transferred.
- 7) Was the Diocese made aware of the abuse you sustained? How? Who spoke with them? What was their reaction? What information did they tell you about how they would handle the problem?

 As stated above my Father told them and then told me about what he had done. He also informed me that if Laferriere ever "touched me or did things to me that was bad for me to get out of the car and that he would come and pick me up no mater where I was."

 I never admitted to my father that he was doing something to me but I guess he knew. You know the "rest of the story from my lawyers files.
- 8) Do you know of any other victims of Laferriere? Lets face it, talk to any kid that was an alter boy at that time and I am sure you will find lots of them.

However, let me ask you one, do you know of any other kids he molested? I don't want names but would like to

know if anyone else has come forward.

Just so you don't think I am a drop out druggie that moved to "escape" here is a brief outline of my experience.

My name is Mr. Brooke Lemoine and I am a Detective Investigator presently assigned to the NH Attorney Generals Task Force investigating the Diocese of Manchester, NH. I spoke with your girlfriend on the telephone several times now and she said I should E-mail you to set up a time so that we could talk on the telephone as I understand you are in Mexico . I also have spoken with Attorney Michael Fontaine who permitted me to contact you as he could not.

I'm sure that your aware that numerous clergyman in NH and MA have been implicated for sexually abusing minors while they served. What we are discovering during the course of these investigations into particular priests, is that the Diocese in several instances allowed the priest to continue serving even after they became aware of their abuse. We have uncovered a lot of information about particular priests that have abused kids one specifically Father Raymond Laferriere. Your name came up as someone who was a victim of Laferriere. It is important that I speak with you for a few minutes regarding this case specifically how the Diocese handled it. I realize that this matter is highly personal and has caused great pain. 
My apologies for not getting back to you sooner however, with the storm and now that my computer took it's last breath I have been behind with e mails.
