

DEAR PARISHIONERS,

The Second Sunday of Lent always gives us the Gospel passage of the Transfiguration of the Lord. This year we hear it from the Gospel of Mark. The first reading is the story of the covenant with Abraham and God's test of Abraham's obedience when asked to sacrifice his own beloved son, Isaac. When God sees that Abraham is willing to obey him, he stops the action and allows Abraham to spare his son. This passage from Genesis provides us with a great prefiguration of God the Father's willingness to sacrifice his own Son on the wood of the cross.

The Transfiguration provides us with another instance when a voice from Heaven is heard. This time the voice is heard to say: **This is my beloved Son, Listen to him.** This time the voice is not directed to Jesus but to his disciples. Peter has already professed his belief that Jesus is the Messiah. He is not the Messiah who will conquer the lands that oppressed the Israelites, and he is not the Messiah who will do away with Roman domination, but he is the Suffering Servant. Jesus, who called his disciples to follow him, is now renegotiating the summons. It is no longer **Come, Follow me**, but it has become: **If you would be my follower**, **deny yourself, take up your cross, and come follow me.** It seems that the program is changing! From this point on the Gospel becomes an instruction in servant discipleship, and it will conclude in Jerusalem. How have you participated in carrying your cross as a disciple of Jesus? Have you had a mountain top experience which has helped you during a more difficult time in life?

Accusation of Sexual Abuse of a minor: It is with deep personal sadness, that I am publishing a letter from the Archbishop to all of us, the people of Resurrection parish. There has been an accusation made against Fr. Leo Riley, Associate Pastor of Resurrection from 1985-86. Please read the letter (Bulletin, page 5). Part of any investigation is to notify the parishes where the accused has served. If you are aware of any information of abuse perpetrated by Father Leo Riley, please call Ms. Carol Gebhart, Director of the Office for the Protection of Children and Young People at the Archdiocese (556-2580). The Archdiocese remains committed to protect children from harm and to create a safe environment. An investigation does not constitute guilt, but attempts to determine the truth. Let us pray for victims, their families, and for those who are accused.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On 10 December 2014, an accusation of sexual abuse of a minor was made against Father Leo Riley, alleged to have taken place in 1985, when he was assigned as an associate pastor at Resurrection Parish in Dubuque.

For your information. Father Riley is presently serving as a priest in the Diocese of Venice in Florida, where he transferred in 2002, not because of other accusations, but to be close to his parents. The bishop there, after learning of the accusation, has placed Father Riley on a temporary leave from ministry until the matter is resolved.

On 11 February 2015, the day after receiving the full complaint from the accuser's lawyer, the Archdiocesan Review Board advised me that the accusation was not manifestly false or frivolous. This does not mean that Father Riley is guilty, but merely that he and the alleged victim were at Resurrection Parish at that time.

As a consequence, I have opened a preliminary investigation to determine whether there is sufficient evidence that the allegation of sexual abuse of a minor likely did occur. Even that determination does not mean that Father Riley is guilty, but that the accusation will now be reviewed in a process to establish innocence or guilt.

Part of the preliminary investigation, according to the policy of the Archdiocese of Dubuque, is to notify the parishes in the Archdiocese of Dubuque where Father Riley served before he transferred to the Diocese of Venice.

If you know of any sexual abuse of minors alleged to have been perpetrated by Father Riley when he was assigned for ministry in your area, if you would, before 30 March 2015, contact Ms. Carol Gebhart, Director of the Office for the Protection of Children and Young People, at the Archdiocesan Pastoral Center (1229 Mt. Loretta Avenue, Dubuque, IA 52003; 563-556-2580).

Please join me in our continued commitment to do all that is humanly possible to protect minors from harm and to create a safe environment for involvement in Church activities, but also to preserve the good name of someone accused.

HOLY FAMILY



The Holy Family Catholic Schools Board of Education is the recipient of \$61,209 from the Archbishop

Kucera Grant Awards from the Archdiocese of Dubuque Educational Development Fund. The grant was gwarded for tuition assistance to those families who can least afford the cost of attending a Catholic School. A portion of the grant was also directed towards tuition assistance for minority students who qualify for Federal School Lunch Program. Awards for these two programs totaled \$485,000 for the 2014/15 program year.

The Archbishop Kucera Grant Awards annually provides \$80,000 for faith formation resources and leadership development for faith formation leaders, catechists, Catholic school administrators and teachers. The grant also covers one-third of the program cost for adults enrolled in the Archdiocesan IMPACT Program.

The Archdiocesan Educational Development Fund was developed for the purpose of supporting the educational programs of the Archdiocese. This is the twenty-ninth year that grants have been awarded. Over 8.9 million dollars have been distributed since the Archdiocesan Educational Development Fund was established. Grants are made possible through the generous donations of contributors and parishioners throughout the Archdiocese.
