Father Keefe returned my call. I asked how he was feeling. He replied that that was a stupid question, seeing that his livelihood and his ministry has been stripped from him, and that the Archdiocese has left him hanging. I suggested that he reconsider and go for an assessment. He replied that I had told him to talk with a lawyer, and that he is following the lawyer's advice. I told him that I cannot help him until he starts to cooperate, and that he should talk to his lawyer about reconsidering his position. He said he is cooperating; he is following his lawyer's advice. I pointed out that following advice not to cooperate is not cooperating. An assessment is not an acknowledgement of guilt, but it is a requirement of Archdiocesan policy. He said that he would talk with his lawyer again.
