

PROTECTIVE ORDER

1. Until further order of the court, which order shall be made not later than the completion of jury selection, all information, documents and transcripts which the parties may obtain through the depositions of the defendants, including persons designated pursuant to Practice Book § 244(g)⁶, and Bishop Edward Egan shall not be disseminated, shown, disclosed, divulged or transmitted by any one to any person or organization other than the parties to this lawsuit and their respective attorneys and to any investigators and potential expert witnesses retained by the

⁶Practice Book § 244(g) provides: "A party may in the notice [of deposition] and in his subpoena name as the deponent a public or private corporation or a partnership or an association or a governmental agency or a state officer in an action arising out of the officer's performance of employment and designate with reasonable particularity the matters on which examination is requested. The organization or state officer so named shall designate one or more officers, directors, or managing agents, or other persons who consent to testify on its behalf, and may set forth, for each person designated shall testify as to matters known or reasonably available to the organization. This paragraph does not preclude the taking of a deposition by any other procedure authorized by the Practice Book."



All such documents and transcripts which the attorneys representing any of the parties believe in good faith may be entitled to protection from disclosure after the completion of jury selection, shall be marked "CONFIDENTIAL: SUBJECT TO COURT ORDER" and shall be submitted to the court for review and appropriate order before being released from the protection afforded by this order.

3. Whenever any pleading, document or motion referencing, incorporating or attaching any documents described in paragraph one of this order is filed with the court or delivered to any judge thereof, it shall be filed or delivered under seal pending review by the court or judge and shall be marked by the party filing or delivering same "CONFIDENTIAL: SUBJECT TO COURT ORDER".

Dear Monsignor Curtiss:

Please be advised that Raymond Pcolka was seen by me for the first time in December, 1960 and seven times in 1961; the last visit being on June 5th, having been referred for psychiatric consultation by his family physician. He had been seen previously by another psychiatrist and psychiatric treatment was suggested.

Briefly, Raymond has been suffering from an obsessive compulsive type neurosis, which for a time interfered with his ability to concentrate and which was associated with anxiety. During the period, when under my observation, there appeared to be a lessening of symptoms, and it was agreed that he would seek further psychiatric help if he again became uncomfortable.

It would be my feeling, if there is presently any sign of emotional disturbance, that he be again reviewed by a psychiatrist in the vicinity of the Seminary, so that he could continue his work.

Dear Reverend Stapleton:

The above named patient was seen for diagnostic only, while attending the seminary in Ridgefield. A brief summary of his clinical record follows:

Diagnosis: Neurotic reaction manifested by tic of the facial muscles.

Stress: 1. Adjustment to seminary-routine.
2. Adjustment problems of late adolescence.

Predisposition: Unknown.

Impairment: Mild.

Recommendation: Discussing his feelings and problems quite openly with his spiritual director; to return to a therapist if symptoms persist or he feels anxious, depressed, ineffectual or uncomfortable in any way.

Progress: There has been no follow-up contact.

Final Recommendation: If there is any question of this man's stability or ability, I would recommend psychological testing before final vows.
