The news of support for Bob and his coming home, sent (it would appear) into something of a hysterical reaction. She told that she was worried that the Cardinal did not know all that Bob had supposedly done and that it seemed as if he was going to be returned to ministry where he could "harm others as he has harmed "." Consequently, she was talking about a law suit.

SUbsequently she did talk to a lawyer who did not give her much encouragement about a law suit. So she now has taken the tact of trying to prevent his being restored to ministry. It is my impression that she might be calling Ray Goedert to try and arrange a phone conversation with the Cardinal.

It would be my suggestion that Ray be brought up to speed on all of this. If she feels as if she is getting a run around, I think she is angry enough to do something stupid. If it is possible, the process of evaluation and supervision etc. that (according to my impression) is usually part should be explained to her.

As for the Cardinal speaking to her, it might be the type of symbolic event thatwould put some closure on this. On the other hand, it might not be totally productive. As a minimum, I would suggest that Ray or someone else be on the line at the same time.

Enclosed is a salary check for January that was sent to me at and and then forwarded to me here. I am sending it back to you since I am now being paid by Mercy Hospital.

This does, however, give me the opportunity to bring to your attention two related financial matters which I have discussed with Ed McLaughlin.

The first has to do with the Archdiocese paying Our Lady of Grace rent or room and board for me. I am not ministering here in the parish since my allotted work hours are consumed at Mercy. Therefore, I believe that OLG should receive some recompense. Ed said that he had discussed this with you earlier. Tom Tivy has been most gracious and supportive to me. He does not expect any recompense, but I believe that the parish deserves it.

Secondly, I discussed my own financial needs with Ed. I am presently being paid approximately \$900.00 per month by Mercy. This equates my level on the diocesan scale of \$880.00 per month. I do not, however, receive Mass stipends with the exception of \$10.00 per week for two Masses I celebrate at Mercy. My work limitation prevents me from celebrating other liturgies. I am therefore requesting the \$200.00 guaranteed allotment from the Archdiocese. This would certainly be helpful since I have also encountered additional, unforeseen expenses for transportation and for meals in connection with my work at Mercy.

I appreciate your attention in these matters, and hope to hear from you soon.
