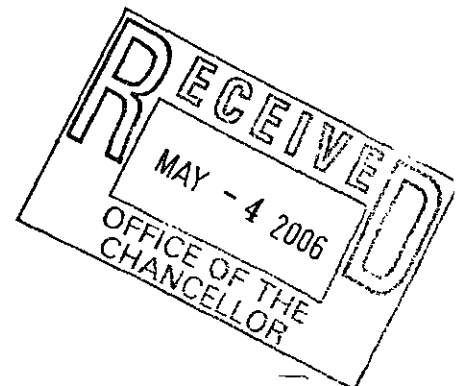


I do this mindful of Canon 528, 1 which reads:

A pastor ceases from office by removal or transfer carried out by the diocesan bishop according to the norm of law, by resignation made by the pastor himself for a just cause and accepted by the same bishop for validity, and by lapse of time if he had been appointed for a definite period according to the prescripts of particular law mentioned in Canon 522.

In accord with the norm of Canon 189, I, the undersigned Rev. William J. O'Brien hereby resign from the office of pastor of Queen of Angels Parish in the Archdiocese of Chicago, effective September 1, 2005.



This abstract replaces a summary prepared by Leah McCluskey, Professional Responsibility Administrator for the Archdiocese of Chicago's Office of Professional Responsibility, of Victim Y's statement, given to Ms. McCluskey via phone on October 17, 2005, formalizing his allegation of sexual abuse against Fr. William O'Brien. Victim Y reported that he was sexually abused by Fr. William O'Brien in Europe sometime prior to 1983, but did not provide the date, number of incidents, or his age at the time of the abuse.

I received a phone call from [REDACTED] this morning stating that he was allegedly abused by Fr. Bill O'Brien in 1975 while [REDACTED] was a seminarian. [REDACTED] said that a bulletin notice is what prompted him to call the Professional Responsibility Administrator but that her voice mail message said that she would be out of town this week and in her absence to contact her assistant.

[REDACTED] stated that the alleged abuse occurred on a trip [REDACTED] with Fr. O'Brien [REDACTED] continued by saying that he was 17 years old [REDACTED] at the time of the alleged abuse. [REDACTED] said that Fr. O'Brien drank quite heavily and treated him like a "Boy Toy."

Victim Statement Abstract

This abstract replaces the summary by Leah McCluskey, Professional Responsibility Administrator for the Archdiocese of Chicago's Office of Professional Responsibility, of Victim Z's statement, given to Ms. McCluskey on July 6, 2005, formalizing her allegation of abuse against Rev. William O'Brien. The alleged abuse consisted of suggestive comments made towards Victim Z and a single incident in which Fr. O'Brien ejaculated on Victim Z when she was a minor. The alleged abuse occurred in the summer of 1981 at the St. Cajetan's parish rectory.

PRA reviewed Rev. William O'Brien's file in the Vicar for Priests office today, and the following is a summary of material information in the file. [REDACTED] formalized his allegation of sexual abuse of a minor against Fr. O'Brien on May 23, 2005.

- **Mid-1980s:** the Vicar for Priests Office was notified of an alleged affair between Fr. O'Brien and a married adult female
- **Mid-1980s:** the Vicar for Priests Office was notified of an alleged sexual relationship between Fr. O'Brien and another adult female
- **September 3, 1990:** memo to file that a priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago reported to Bishop Raymond Goedert that Fr. O'Brien sexually assaulted a nun; the nun was not identified for reason of confidentiality; the alleged sexual assault took place 11 years prior to September 1993; the Archdiocesan priest who had reported the alleged abuse also reported that a man who was then incarcerated for murdering his wife alleged that she had been "fooling around" with Fr. O'Brien
- **1993:** Archdiocese of Chicago made a financial settlement regarding the first case mentioned above; Fr. O'Brien cooperated with all that was asked of him as a result of this alleged affair
- **May 1993:** memo to file that Fr. O'Brien had requested a retreat in September 1993; to take a sabbatical in Rome from September 1994 through December 1994; Fr. O'Brien also requested to become a pastor upon his return from his proposed 1994 sabbatical unless he was "...too much of a liability..." in which case he proposed that he would prepare for another type of ministry such as becoming a military chaplain or teacher
- **November 1993:** memo to file that Fr. O'Brien expressed his feeling that he did not believe that he would act out again as he had in the past; as per Fr. O'Brien, he stated that he had taken precautions in his personal life to ensure "...that those situations would be handled properly next time around. If they do occur, he says he is ready to handle them in an appropriate manner. He wishes to remain a priest

- and knows that there will be a price to be paid personally for that. He is willing to pay that price.”
- **November 1993:** memo to file that Fr. O’Brien have a monitor with him while on sabbatical in Rome beginning in September 1994 and ending in December 1994;
- **June 2000:** anonymous letter written to the family [parents] of an alleged female victim of Fr. O’Brien; letter extremely vulgar and alleged that Fr. O’Brien raped this girl when she was under the age of 18
- **June 2000:** anonymous letter written to the alleged female victim of Fr. O’Brien; letter extremely vulgar
- **July 7, 2000:** Kathleen Leggdas, former Professional Responsibility Administrator met with alleged victim, [REDACTED] denied any abuse under the age of 18 and also denied any abuse/relationship with Fr. O’Brien as an adult
- **October 2000:** anonymous letter [in same handwriting as letters from June 2000] addressed to Fr. O’Brien; letter extremely vulgar, threatening and alleged that Fr. O’Brien had a sexual relationship with [REDACTED]
- **October 2000:** anonymous letters [also in same handwriting as previous letters from June 2000 and October 2000] addressed to Fr. O’Brien and [REDACTED] parents, respectively; letters extremely vulgar, threatening, and spoke of alleged sexual relationship between Fr. O’Brien and [REDACTED]
- John O’Malley, Director of Legal Services brought aforementioned letters to Chicago Police Department; handwriting analysis inconclusive; author of letters never identified

As we reflect on the numerous meetings with parish staff members, Parish Council members and parishioners at Queen of Angels to update them throughout the process concerning the status of their pastor, Fr. Bill O'Brien, we wanted to share some comments and our own insights:

TEMPORARY WITHDRAWAL OF REV. WILLIAM O'BRIEN

When Fr. O'Brien was temporarily withdrawn in June, a group of archdiocesan leadership, that included Bishop Francis Kane, Frs. James Kaczorowski and Grace, and the two of us, met in the parish hall, first with parish staff members then immediately after with some members of the Parish Council. As you might expect, emotions were high. Most expressed shock and disbelief. Bishop Kane explained that he would read the prepared statement at each of the weekend masses and then be present to the people to listen, to answer questions and to comfort those seeking consolation.

Members of the Pastoral Council and parish staff were cooperative and expressed a willingness to be helpful during the stressful time. Some agreed to be present during the weekend masses to join with the Bishop in responding to the needs of their friends and fellow parishioners.

Assistance Ministry inquired about the needs Hispanic Community of the parish. We were told that the announcement would not impact the Hispanic Community. It was said that the Hispanic Community did not identify Fr. O'Brien as "their pastor."

Fr. Tom Lamping offered to inform the Hispanic Leadership of the turn of events and the plan for the weekend at their regularly scheduled meeting prior to the 12:30 mass on Sunday.

Per the principal's request, the school faculty was invited to, and gathered before, the Saturday mass to inform them of the situation prior to the public announcement (Ralph was present for this meeting). The purpose of the meeting of teachers was to prepare them to be *present* to their students in helpful ways on Monday morning...the last day of the school year before summer vacation. Assistance Ministry arranged for a psychologist/counselor to be present at the school on that Monday for faculty, students, and/or parents, as needed.

Reading of the Announcement: Saturday & Sunday, June 4-5, 2005:

Assistance Ministry and Bishop Kane were present after the Saturday evening mass and all of the Sunday masses the weekend of June 4-5, 2005. As Bishop Kane read the announcement, it was clear that parishioners were in disbelief. After the masses most parishioners spoke with either Bishop Kane or parish staff/council members who were present. Handouts and office brochures (in English and Spanish) were available for the taking at the back of the church.

On Sunday, Fr. Lamping met with the Hispanic leadership prior to the Spanish mass. Mayra was also present. Contrary to what we had been told, Hispanic leadership was very much affected by the announcement. They spoke warmly of their relationship with their pastor, Fr. O'Brien, and the hurt they were experiencing with the situation. They asked if there was anything they could do (i.e., *testify* on behalf of Fr. O'Brien) that might reverse the withdrawal. They then offered prayers of support for Fr. O'Brien. On hearing the letter being read during the 12:30 mass, many parishioners became emotional.

Between masses, the bishop asked to gather in the rectory to debrief. Some feedback was offered (i.e., that the letter/announcement was not pastoral enough).

During the days that followed, Assistance Ministry was in contact with the designated parish contact person, Mrs. Deb Madden. We reminded Mrs. Madden of the resources available to the parish community.

CARDINAL'S ACCEPTANCE OF REVIEW BOARD'S RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING WITHDRAWAL

A second parish leadership meeting took place on the evening of Thursday, August 11, for parish staff members and Parish Council members. Archdiocesan leadership present included Bishop Francis Kane, Frs. Patrick Lagges, Ed Grace, Vince Costello and Ralph. Most parish staff members and some council members were present. Fr. Heidenrich, Administrator, was also present for the meeting. Bishop Kane announced that you had accepted the Review Board's recommendation that Fr. O'Brien's withdrawal from ministry continue, and that the case was referred to the Congregation for the Doctrine of Faith.

Parish leadership had specific questions regarding the Canonical process. Fr. Lagges was able to address those questions with more clarity and competence. There was discussion about informing the parish family during the weekend (August 13-14, 2005) masses, and providing appropriate outreach. Parish staff /council members did not feel the need to be present after the masses, but suggested that the bishop and Assistance Ministry be available in an area more conducive for private conversations.

Following those suggestions, Bishop Kane, Assistance Ministry met with parishioners after each weekend mass to answer questions, hear parishioners' concerns and offer clarification of the archdiocesan and canonical processes. (Few parishioners took advantage of the opportunity.)

Dr. Susan George, psychologist, assisted parishioners in dealing with, and understanding, the emotions they were experiencing. Copies of Bishop Kane's letter (in English and Spanish) were available for parishioners as well. Those who did were supportive of Fr. O'Brien, and/or critical of the Archdiocese for its practice of "*leaving priests out to dry*". All were saddened by the new developments.

OTHER COMMENTS:

- Some parishioners expressed a wish that a new pastor be named as soon as possible to allow for further healing before the holidays.
- There was strong negativity against the Victim. Some parishioners accused him of "*being in it for the money*" or believing that he was part of SNAP and therefore couldn't be trusted. Some parishioners couldn't understand how you (and the Review Board) could withdraw Fr. O'Brien solely based on the fact that the Victim was able to identify the layout of Fr. O'Brien's private room (at St. Cajetans). When it was pointed out that the decision to withdraw was based on much more than "*a memory*" (or a *knee-jerk* reaction), people were reassured, and perceptions of some were modified.
- There is a vibrant Hispanic Community that appears to be treated as an auxiliary community. It appears they've not been integrated into the Queen of Angels Parish Family. Assistance Ministry draws that conclusion from the following:
 - The lack of consideration for the Hispanic leadership as shown by their absence from the meetings of parish leadership and staff, leaves us to question the willingness of the parish community/leadership to welcome and include Hispanics in the dynamics of parish life. It seemed as though the Hispanic Community are treated as tenants, *renting* space for worship, though it appeared that the most populated mass (if not the most vibrant) was the Hispanic Mass.
 - Neither the Hispanic deacon nor other members of the Hispanic Community was invited to the parish leadership meetings.
- Fr. O'Brien has many supporters in the parish. His wishes were conveyed/evident in the conversations that took place during the parish leadership meetings.

- Some parishioners expressed a distrust of the archdiocesan process calling it “duplicitous”.
- Bishop Kane was very generous to the people of the parish who approached him. We believe his pastoral and patient presence helped people to understand the seriousness of the matter, and at the same time to feel listened to and *cared for*.
- Fr. Lamping is directly responsible to minister to the large Hispanic Community; likely a larger task than any one person should be expected to shoulder.

Cardinal George, this is a diverse community with a lot of young families (English and Spanish). During our time at the parish, it has become rather clear that parishioners are anxious that their next pastor be able to carry on the momentum that Fr. O’Brien generated. The devotion of the staff (and some parishioners) has for Fr. O’Brien may prove to be a barrier to a new pastor in his efforts to achieve acceptance. Parish Council members as well as parishioners expect to be consulted in the process to name the new pastor.

Bishop Kane returned our phone call today. I informed him that you had wished to tell him that the Review Board had made a recommendation to Cardinal George regarding the Fr. William O'Brien matter. (The Cardinal accepted the Review Board's recommendation that there is "reasonable cause to suspect [that the priest engaged in the sexual misconduct of a minor].") Because of the acceptance by the Cardinal, Fr. O'Brien's status has been changed from temporarily withdrawn to withdrawn. Bishop Kane said that he would share the information with Queen of Angels' administrator, Fr. Robert Heidenrich, this afternoon with the caveat that Fr. Heidenrich keeps the information confidential until a plan can be developed to inform parish staff members and the parish-at-large

On a related matter, much like Fr. Heidenrich had expressed in an earlier conversation, Bishop Kane is also concerned with Fr. [REDACTED] open opposition to the Dallas Charter and his rousing parishioner support for Fr. O'Brien's return. Bishop Kane plans to enlist Fr. Edward Grace's intervention with Fr. [REDACTED], but would appreciate whatever assistance we can provide as well.

Bishop Kane was appreciative of the information. We concluded the conversation agreeing to consult at the necessary time to coordinate efforts to inform the parish of the new development.

As long as the cleric is a client of the Office of Professional Responsibility, he will be subject to appropriate protocols, restrictions and monitoring under the authority of the Vicar for Priests and supervised by the Professional Responsibility Administrator (PRA). The agreement of a priest or deacon to abide by these protocols is not understood to prove the truth of any allegation and is not intended to be an admission of guilt for any delict or crime, whether in Canon Law, or State and Federal Law. This agreement represents the cooperation of the cleric with his bishop as he exercises his pastoral office (e.g., Canons 369 and 392).

This ISP for Rev. William O'Brien is as follows (PRA to initial all that apply):

1. The client is restricted from being alone with a minor or minors, that is anyone under the age of 18, without the presence of another responsible adult.

3. Continued regular Spiritual Direction with the suggested frequency of ___ times per week/month (please circle one) as recommended by _____ (name of spiritual director). Attendance to Spiritual Direction is to be reflected on "Clergy Daily Log" forms.

Questions regarding Fr. William J. O'Brien

Q: What is the nature of the situation?

A: **Fr. O'Brien is accused of having committed sexual abuse of a minor male approximately 25 years ago when he was associate pastor at St. Cajetan Parish, located on Chicago's far southwest side. (If pressed to be more specific) To protect the privacy of the accuser, we cannot discuss the details of this matter.**

In accordance with archdiocesan policies, the matter was considered by the independent Review Board of the Archdiocese, which, in its initial review, determined that the matter warranted further inquiry and recommended that Fr. O'Brien be withdrawn from parish ministry pending this inquiry. Cardinal George accepted the Board's recommendation.

Also in accord with archdiocesan policies, the allegation has been reported to the Cook County State's Attorney.

Pending further review, Fr. O'Brien is cooperating with archdiocesan officials and now is residing in a monitored and restricted setting.

Q: What is the status of Fr. O'Brien?

A: **Fr. O'Brien has been temporarily withdrawn from ministry, pending further review of the situation, and is living in a monitored and restricted setting.**

Q: Why is this withdrawal "temporary"?

A: **It is temporary by virtue of the fact that the process is still ongoing...[if pressed]: The Review Board has advised that the matter warrants additional inquiry, and the final determination is yet to be made.**

Q: When and how was the Archdiocese contacted about this matter?

A: **An adult man first informed the Archdiocese in April, 2005, about the alleged abuse with Fr. O'Brien approximately 25 years ago when the accuser was a teen-aged minor.**

Q: Where did the relationship take place?

A: **To protect the privacy of the accuser, we will not provide such specific information. The relationship occurred during the period of time Fr. O'Brien served as an associate at St. Cajetan.**

Q: Did the Archdiocese offer help of any kind to the accuser?

A: **In accordance with the policy of the Archdiocese, the accuser has been offered assistance, which includes therapy and spiritual counseling.**

Questions regarding Fr. O'Brien—2

Q: Have other reports of sexual misconduct with minors been made against O'Brien?

A: **Yes. An anonymous third party made an allegation against Fr. O'Brien of sexual misconduct with a minor some years ago. This prompted an interview of the alleged victim, who, by that time, was an adult. The alleged victim denied that the allegation was true. However, in accordance with archdiocesan policies and procedures, the matter was reported to civil authorities.**

Q: **Has he ever been accused of misconduct with adults? What do you do when an allegation of adult misconduct is made against a priest?**

A. **Yes [there have been concerns re: adult misconduct]. [If pressed:] Out of respect for the privacy of those involved, we will not offer more information.**

[As needed:]

Because we take charges of adult misconduct seriously, the Archdiocese has guidelines and procedures that include assessment of a priest's ability to continue ministry. Based on the findings, a priest can be placed on administrative leave, even be removed entirely from ministry, should circumstances warrant.

In accordance with the policy of the Archdiocese, the adults involved are offered assistance, which includes therapy and spiritual counseling.

Q: Why doesn't the Church reexamine the issue of celibacy and allow priests to marry?

A: **Celibacy is a commitment freely chosen by those who are ordained priests of the Latin Rite of the Catholic Church. Sexual misconduct is not limited to celibates.**

Q: How long has Fr. O'Brien been a priest?

A: **He was ordained in May of 1973 and is 57 years old.**

Q: Where has Fr. O'Brien served?

A: **Prior to Queen of Angels, he served as first associate director and then director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. At that same time, he was an associate pastor at St. Cajetan. Previously, he served as an associate pastor at St. Symphorosa, Chicago. After ordination, he was first assigned to St. Jude the Apostle Parish, South Holland.**

Q: Was the parish leadership contacted about the allegations?

A: **Yes – earlier this week the parish staff and the parish council were informed of all this information before it was shared with the parish as a whole.**

Several months ago Fr. Bill O'Brien and Bishop Conway each received a number of anonymous letters alleging that Bill had engaged in sexual activity with a female minor. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] After a time, the letters ceased.

Now the letters have resumed. As in the past, they allege Bill has been involved with an underage female.

I wish to assure you this matter is being carefully examined. [REDACTED]

The author of the anonymous letters threatens to bring this to your attention when you visit Queen of Angels. While I do not believe this will happen, I want you to know the threat has been made.

I will keep you informed as the situation unfolds. Please call me if you would like any additional information.

This abstract replaces the summary prepared by Kathleen Leggdas, Office of Professional Fitness Review Administrator for the Archdiocese of Chicago's Office of Professional Fitness Review, of a meeting with Victim AB, which took place on July 7, 2000. Victim AB reported that she had not been abused in any way by Rev. William O'Brien, nor had she voluntarily engaged in any sexual conduct with Fr. O'Brien, as alleged in anonymous letters received by archdiocesan officials.

Fr. Canary and I met with Fr. O'Brien on Friday, 3/10/95. We discussed the points we had made with you earlier. We counseled Fr. O'Brien to speak personally with [REDACTED] to inform him of the past relationship to [REDACTED]. Fr. O'Brien said he has been thinking about that for a long time and has actually rehearsed it in his mind a number of times.

We all agreed that he should not do that immediately because [REDACTED] is going through a change of assignment right now and is under some stress. Our recommendation was that he do it some time after July 1. He agreed to do so.

Fr. O'Brien feels that he has in some ways made a statement to [REDACTED] about his relationship to [REDACTED]. It was not a straight out declaration, but he feels that there was an understanding.

We still feel that there is risk to the archdiocese here, but it is minimized somewhat if [REDACTED] knows the situation. As you know, this was our biggest consideration in terms of assigning Bill. You have talked about making him the administrator when Phil Dressler leaves Queen of Angels. That seems to be an acceptable step right now. Perhaps naming him the pastor after a decent interval once we see if there is any feedback on the appointment might be a way to go. There is no doubt in our minds that Bill could do a good job there.

Bill himself also indicated a concern about Phil Dressler. He seems to feel that Phil needs some encouragement from you at this time. But I know that he has communicated that to you already.

Please accept this letter, mailed in the United States through the courtesy of one of our Institute priests returning home early

Yes, things did not work out as we had hoped. Though a new place for ministry may not have been found, I want to thank you and all who advise you for the vote of confidence and care your efforts represented. That is the very positive memory which remains. Do not second guess what you attempted.

How do I feel? Tired. I write to you on a Tuesday morning. Last Thursday through Saturday were exhausting. First, the invitation to Waukegan out of the blue. Then moving more deeply into that prospect, followed by a most encouraging conversation with Bishop Goedert, and beginning the emotional process of leaving a place which has been very good to me. Quickly, all is in reverse.

Bad memories and regrets about past mistakes, and fears about all that could evolve come forward again. Through the years, I have attempted to prepare myself for whatever might come. Ready and non-surprised as I am when things do occur, they do hit hard, nonetheless.

Following your first call, it took a good deal of fast shifting to move myself towards Waukegan. I've never been too partial to Lake County, too much of a "city boy" with family and friends all there. So, the let down of not going there was not as great as it could have been had I completed the emotional move. But, I had made the move of this being the beginning of my gradual entry into fuller ministry. That will have to recede for a time.

I admire your words, "I have a feeling that this will end." You heard my response. Perhaps stemming from having first created the situation and then living with its aftermath for these years, my optimism is more questioning. That points out a basic difference between you and me. An Italian walks into a crowd and looks first for his friends. One who is Irish walks into a crowd and first looks to see if any enemies are present!

I would like to share with you three simple but important events which form the context in which this letter is written. First, on Saturday, we had a wonderful Day of Reflection led by a Benedictine monk. His themes: hope, God's forgiveness, conversion, reconciliation and always beginning new. Mike Wulsch and I both remarked, "He came to speak to me."

Second, just before Saturday dinner, the mail was passed around. I received two large brown envelopes filled with letters from my 7th and 8th graders. News of family, school, Confirmation classes and life in general. Some things were very personal. I wondered how they knew just what to write?

Third, last Sunday: Eucharist and lunch with the priests from Chicago at the Casa. What a wonderful and refreshing afternoon with "my own." The tide of unrest was beginning to turn.

The conclusion of my letter is this. I am at peace. Although I would have preferred to return home more relaxed, buoyant and serene as I had been up to a few days ago, the cloud has come again. But really, I know, all things have worked as they should: for my good, the good of the Church, the good of Queen of Angels and even for Phil Dressler's good.


Perhaps Bill O'Brien reached another set of reconciliations, hopes and conversions in all this. Queen of Angels is my home and is where I should stay. Maybe Bill O'Brien will not be the Pastor of a so-called "plum" parish, as he and others have imagined. Queen of Angels has been more than good to me. it IS me - middle-income, city, active, all sorts of peoples, in transition, having its problems, deepening in faith and with a touch of class! Maybe Bill has been told that he has to put more effort into his Hispanic outreach. Maybe Bill has been told by his 7th and 8th graders to come home. Maybe they, even more than Bill's Archbishop, know where home is. And maybe Bill was told by a Benedictine monk to go home and begin new right there

And maybeare you ready to read four words I hardly ever say....Maybe, I was wrong! Queen of Angels might be where I should stay. And if Phil leaves as he wishes, maybe I could remain even as its pastor, if all is calm. Up to the time of your Waukegan call, I was already imagining what I could do with all I had experienced on sabbatical when I returned home. I love Queen of Angels. It is home. And, I am happy to be going there.

Though you will receive this after Thanksgiving Day, I hope you had a great one. Mike and I will be at the Casa and I have much for which I am grateful. I will phone you when I return. This letter will help that conversation to be brief. I am going to Wisconsin for a few days, beginning December 2nd, prior to returning to the Parish. Just wanted to let you know how things are here. It was also good for me to put things into print for my own eyes to see.

Dear Cardinal Bernardini,

Best wishes and prayers that you are well. Please excuse this handwritten letter. My three week old computer has a hard-disk problem. I must entrust it to an Italian repair company! A small act of faith, I think. This accomplishes one goal: when I write, rather than format, I am briefer. So, sit down and read this only if you are relaxed. Options.

If the Directorship for Ethnic Ministries has not been filled, I apply. Advantages: I am not made a Pastor and remain at Queen of Angels in residence, part-time as Associate Pastor. My first directorship of the office was never announced in the New World. The same could happen here. Finally, do you have someone better? A three year term with the last year grooming a successor. The salary is split between Office and Parish: a help to Queen of Angels. Very low key, not as high profile as many jobs before. Down side: "it is 'downtown'".

Next, may I apply for Our Lady of Ransom now that Tom Dore is moving to St. Isle? Advantage: a parish that is not one of our most well known parishes. It has a growing Phellipine population whom I know and worked with in Ethnic Ministries. In fact, I am participating in the Asian Ministry Conference in Manila, January 9 to 21, 1996. It is a good parish, not wealthy, a large school which many tend to avoid. Disadvantage: I would be made a pastor and it is, put in the New World.

The next is shared in true confidence. Phil Dressler is going to apply for another pastorate (Team Jesus of Angels 1 1/2 years early) in January, 1975. He has had enough. I have deep feelings about where he is in ministry and the value of a change which he perceives, would bring renewal. Phil would like me to be made Pastor at 2 of Angels. Advantages: no move involved. Not so obvious. Disadvantages are two pronged. The first is that I don't, as a rule, like someone who is Associate to become Pastor. In my case, the world would be expected of me. The second downside is personal. Unless this is the only acceptable way (expedient) for me to become Pastor, I much prefer leaving 2 of Angels and truly starting a new chapter in life. I think you understand that. Once again, naming me anything has its risks.

Finally, don't just continue in "limbo" as you called it. My patience is still strong, but so is my desire to give what I know I can to the Church. The Review Board is "open to a pastoral" but only to another review of the situation at their December meeting. If you will kindly think about these thoughts and perhaps delay appointment if it's mentioned until then? In any case, if we are better candidates, move ahead without question.

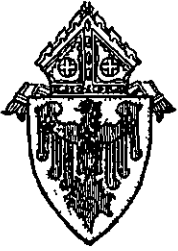

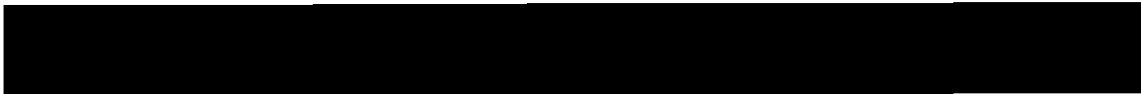

Fr. William O'Brien came to see John Canary and me today. When we had last met in May, we said we would get together sometime after September. O'Brien was to make a retreat and report back to us how things were going after that retreat.

He made the retreat late in September with Fr. Rich McCaslin up at the Jesuit Retreat House outside of Kenosha. According to O'Brien the retreat went very well and has been helpful to him in any number of ways.



I directly asked Fr. O'Brien whether he thought at this time he would ever act out again as he has in the past. John Canary and I reviewed the letter from William O'Brien of April, 1993. You asked for some comments on this letter.

On December 2, 1992, we sent you a memo concerning a meeting that we had with O'Brien. At that time we talked to him about spending two years at least in the parish. He was to look into the possibilities of a fairly lengthy directed retreat as with an after-care program and a spiritual director as part of that ongoing program. There was no talk at that time about a sabbatical that would encompass theological study. The sabbatical that he outlines in his request to you is content-oriented and not a spiritual or psychologically oriented program. We would have opposed it since we felt he still needs to confront the root causes for his past behavior.

Bill was very open to that program at the time, more open than he would have been [REDACTED]

We have met only once with Bill since then. We should meet with Bill to go over our original plan and remove any misunderstandings.

We appreciate you sending this letter on to us from Bill. Bill knows he should be working with us and any request such as this should have gone through our office. It puzzles us as to why he keeps going to you first and does not follow the understood protocol that we had set up. At any rate, with your permission we will call Bill and sit down with him and go over this matter again.

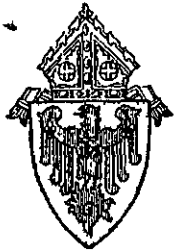

1. Jay Finno called. () Jay said that Bill's name came up yesterday at the Personnel Board meeting for the pastorate of St. Francis Xavier in LaGrange. Evidently whoever had talked to Bill said that he was honored to be named, but wanted to check things out with the Cardinal. The Board seems to have a positive feeling towards Bill. Jay said he just kept his mouth shut.

2. I asked Jay to let me know again exactly what he was able to tell me without violating any confidence. Jay related three events:

A. About 11 years ago, while stationed at St. Jude's, this particular , who was a friend of Bill's

Bill forcibly assaulted this woman. He stripped her against her will and attempted to rape her. He spilled seed on her body. She hit him and escaped from him.

Jay said she also mentioned to the associate, Paul Seaman, something about the incident without identifying the person involved.

She eventually mentioned to Paul that the reason for her attitude was the fact that she had been attacked by a priest in the past, etc. She did not tell Paul the name of the priest.

B. Jay said that he also learned about Bill's relationship to through this same person and also through This same woman mentioned that there is a suspicion in the family that one of children is actually Bill's.

I asked Jay directly whether or not she ever said that there was a sexual relationship between and Bill. Although she never said that, that is certainly the suspicion, particularly since they really believe one of the children is Bill's.

I spoke to Bill O'Brien on the phone yesterday and Bill made some suggestions about how the situation could be dealt with when [redacted] sits down with [redacted]. He reminded me that Jim Roach was able to exercise some influence on [redacted] at the time when this stuff first came up. Jim would apparently tell [redacted] that, if he brought the matter out into the public, he himself would be subject to scrutiny by the press. How is his personal life going? This seemed to have some effect on [redacted] actions, at least according to Bill O'Brien.

Bill also indicated that there may be other difficulties out at St. Jude's parish. [redacted]

[redacted] That might be a problem as well.

O'Brien reminded me that the Cardinal had told him about his interview with [redacted]

I had spoken to Ralph Bonaccorsi about getting hold of someone who might act as an intervenor. 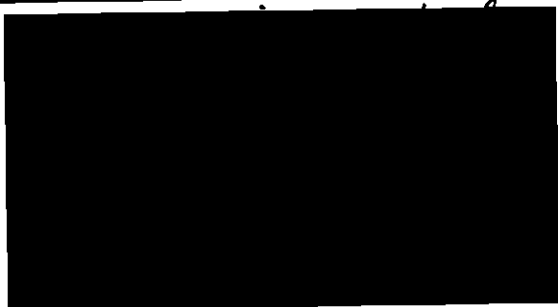

1. Jay Finno called. He has [redacted] been informed that she had been sexually assaulted by a priest. [redacted] but Jay knows her well enough to say that he has absolutely no doubt about the truth of what she is stating.

2. Jay talked to Ed Fialkowski, without naming the priest. But he wanted to explain the predicament and Ed suggested that he then talk to me. Jay said that this woman was [redacted] at the time of the assault about 11 years ago. It was a one-time incident and she has had no contact with him since.

3. This woman is a very close friend of another family [redacted] Through [redacted] they learned about [redacted] who was formerly married to another woman [redacted] and the marriage broke up over this same priest. Jay got to know [redacted] and he claims that the Cardinal is aware of all of this and had even invited him down to talk about it [redacted].

4. Jay also said he had learned that there is supposed to be some guy [redacted] wife [redacted] she was fooling with was this same priest.

5. After listening to Jay relate these tales, it was clear to me whom he was speaking about and I told him that I think I know who he is talking about. He immediately said Bill O'Brien. I told Jay that the [redacted] incident and the [redacted] incident were known to me, but this first situation, which Jay called "rape", was new to me.

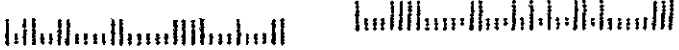

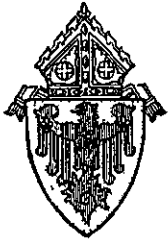

My brother and I had dinner with [redacted] and [redacted] last night. While making small talk before supper, [redacted] happened to ask how the job was going. She said it must be very difficult. She then said, I suppose you have cases like that of Fr. O'Brien from St. Cajetan's. This really took me by surprise, as I hadn't the faintest idea that she would have had even an inkling of a problem. However, she mentioned that her son, [redacted], had said something to her about it. At least he must have said enough that made her wonder why Fr. O'Brien doesn't leave the priesthood, since this apparently wasn't the first problem of this kind. I really didn't respond and someone else invited to dinner came in right at that moment so the conversation ceased.

[redacted] is the vice-president of the firm at which [redacted] is employed. [redacted] undoubtedly has unloaded his story on [redacted]. He must have also told him about the wedding of their mutual boss, [redacted]'s daughter. According to [redacted], Fr. O'Brien was going to say that Mass but was ordered not to do so. This is not quite the way Bill told Jim Roache, but it could be that [redacted] garbled up the situation, too. I don't intend to do anything about this information. It just makes me realize that more and more people are going to be aware of Bill's problem.

According to Victim AA, one of those priests observed Victim AA on one occasion exiting Fr. O'Brien's bedroom where the door had been closed. Victim AA reports that Sexual abuse occurred on multiple occasions between Victim AA's sophomore and junior year.





I also gave Mr. O'Brien a packet that contained copies of information pertaining to the Office for Child Abuse Investigations and Review, the professional investigation firm used by the Archdiocese of Chicago, and a copy of archdiocesan policies (*§1100 Sexual Abuse of Minors: Policies for Education, Prevention, Assistance to Victims and Procedures for Determination of Fitness for Ministry*).

At Mr. O'Brien's request, I read to him excerpts from the aforementioned transcription where  spoke of how he first met the former Fr. O'Brien and described the alleged incidents of sexual abuse that took place.

After I read from the transcript, Mr. O'Brien stated that he would make a response in writing within 14 days of our January 21st meeting. Mr. O'Brien informed Fr. Collins and me that he

Fr. Collins and I again thanked Mr. O'Brien for his time. It was agreed that Mr. O'Brien would call Fr. Collins with any questions or concerns.



Leah,

On November 19th you sent over an unsigned hand printed letter concerning the presence of Bill O'Brien in Queen of Angels School, apparently in the role of delivery person for a local restaurant. On Saturday, November 22nd, I brought this to the attention of Fr. Jim Kaczorowski, the pastor of Queen of Angels. (Jim is, of course, fully aware of the circumstances of O'Brien's removal from ministry.)

Jim informed me that he was already aware of the incident and had addressed it directly with Bill O'Brien. Jim had been informed of Bill's presence at the School by irate parishioners who had seen Bill. That same day, Jim contacted Bill and informed him that he could not be on parish premises of Queen of Angels, even as a delivery person. Jim informed me that Bill understands and accepts this restriction.

In addition, Fr. Kaczorowski informed the school principal that O'Brien was not allowed on the school premises, even as a delivery person. Jim also informed the parish school board of O'Brien's presence in the school and the steps Jim had taken to prevent a recurrence.

Finally, Jim also informed the Regional Vicar, Bishop Kane, of the incident and his steps.

It seems to me that this was an appropriate response. If you have any further thoughts, let me know.
