ZRINO E. JUKIC, white male, date of birth (DOB) [REDACTED], Social Security Number (SSAN) [REDACTED], height 6'-1", weight 300 pounds, current residence [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED], was interviewed at approximately 1:00 pm, at the United States Attorney's Office in Cleveland, Ohio, during a proffer session while in the presence of his attorney, Robert Ruggieri, 216-861-1940.

Also present and participated in the proffer interview were Assistant United States Attorney (AUSA) John Siegel, 216-622-3820, and U.S. Postal Inspector Special Agent Brett Schwartz, 216-443-4463. Prior to the proffer, AUSA Siegel explained to Jukic that no promises could be made. Jukic then provided the following information:

In 1995, Zgoznic told Jukic that "JJ" (a nickname for Father John Wright) authorized a wire transfer of approximately \$150,000 to \$200,000 from a Diocesan account into a Fidelity Account in the name of Joseph Smith with Father Wright as a co-signor on the account. Jukic was told the reason this money was given to Smith was because he was invited to be on the Board of Directors for Blue Cross Blue Shield and other companies; however, Bishop Pilla would not permit him to sit on

these boards. Because of this, Smith was going to leave the Diocese while he still had the opportunity to pursue other more lucrative business ventures. Jukic went on to say that Marilyn Rauan, secretary at the Diocese Cemeteries Association was on the payroll of the Resultant Corporation but didn't work there. Rauan was Father Wright's girlfriend.
