Did you ever engage in oral sex with a person by the name of _____ while in the City of Worcester, Massachusetts?

Did you at anytime have anal sex with a person by the name of _____?

It is the opinion of the polygraphist, based upon the polygraph examination of Mr. Magaldi, that he is telling the truth to the above listed pertinent test questions. In order to verify this opinion, it is recommended that _____ be given the opportunity to submit to a polygraph examination, administered by a qualified independent examiner. This examination concluded at 10:29 a.m.
