McGuire ordained as Jesuit Priest

McGuire begins teaching at Loyola Academy

Archdiocese of Chicago priest Fr. Schilax notifies Jesuits of McGuire's sexual abuse of John Doe 84

McGuire told he must leave Loyola Academy immediately, and is transferred to Loyola University

Father of Victim #6 confirms in writing his prior report of sexual abuse of his son

Fr. Hardon, a Jesuit Priest who evaluated McGuire says McGuire is "mentally or morally deranged"

Parents of Victim #8 call Jesuits about inappropriate conduct by McGuire

Between Sept. '00 - Jan. '01, parents of Victim #8 notify Jesuits three times of McGuire's inappropriate conduct

Parents of Victim #7 write letter to Jesuits about McGuire's inappropriate conduct

Jesuits finally respond to parents of Victim #8, and tell them that they must trust Jesuits to act appropriately

Their concerns ignored for more than two years, parents of Victim #8 write several more letters; to Jesuits, Archdiocese of Chicago, and Savannah Diocese

Victim #4 files lawsuit (John Doe 84)

Victim #2 files lawsuit (Vic Bender)

McGuire's faculties removed after John Doe 84 and Vic Bender lawsuits filed

Victims #5, 9, and 10 file lawsuits as John Doe 116, 117, and 118 respectively

McGuire continues to wear clerical garb and represent himself as a priest. Jesuits state they cannot prevent him from doing so

McGuire remains a Jesuit priest and walks free in Illinois. Jesuits state that monitoring him is not their responsibility

McGuire convicted for molesting John Doe 84 and Vic Bender in Wisconsin. During investigation and trial, Jesuits do not tell prosecutor about information they had regarding McGuire
