Faculty Evaluation of Daniel Clark

Academic Average at Beginning of III Quarter - 1.95

It is noted that Dan Clark did his Field Education Quarter during the second quarter of this current year at the Cincinnati Correctional Institute (the City Jail) and received a very impressive evaluation.

In academic areas it is noted Dan is still on academic probation but has shown some improvement during the first quarter of this year. Dan is not an exceptionally bright student and will always have to work hard at his studies and indicates in his self-evaluation he is taking them very seriously at this point.

In regard to his personality, in general the Faculty feel they do not know Dan. Several Faculty members note that he is a friendly and sensitive person but somehow he comes off as a loner or somewhat aloof.

In his self-evaluation, he feels he is very blessed with close friends that he can talk to. The Faculty note this but feel that for some reason, he doesn't relate to a larger group of people in the Seminary Community. Three Faculty members call attention to his appearance and note that this might be a hindrance to his future ministry.

In regard to his spiritual life, he notes in his self-evaluation he has been attending Mass more frequently and has a good relationship with his Spiritual Director. One Faculty member notes that he shows a sense of high ideals but perhaps needs more organization and order in his daily life to achieve them. He seems to have a strong vocational commitment to Priesthood as he brings out in his self-evaluation. He enjoys very much, working with youth and has been working in a camp for several summers. He has also done some work in a parish during college.

He intends to continue to work with the prisoners at the Cincinnati Work House on a part-time basis.
