Comes the Plaintiff, MS-6 , by counsel, and states as follows for his complaint:

1. From at least June of 1976, the Defendant, Reverend Miller, was assigned to the St. Elizabeth of Hungary Parish in Louisville, Kentucky.

2. At all times relevant to this action, the Roman Catholic Bishop of Louisville, a Corporation Sole, through St. Elizabeth of Hungary Parish, operated St. Elizabeth of Hungary Parish and employed the Defendant, Reverend Louis Miller, as its priest and counselor.

3. In June of 1977, while operating within the scope of his employment as a Roman Catholic priest and counselor and as an agent of the Defendant, the Roman Catholic Bishop of Louisville, a Corporation Sole, and of the Defendant, St. Elizabeth of Hungary Parish, the Defendant, Reverend Louis Miller sexually abused the Plaintiff.

4. The Defendants, the United States Catholic Conference, Inc., the Roman Catholic Bishop of Louisville, a Corporation Sole, and St. Elizabeth of Hungary Parish were negligent in their training, hiring, and placement, and supervision of the Defendant, Reverend Louis Miller, and that such negligence and carelessness was the direct and proximate cause of the injuries suffered by the Plaintiff.

5. The Defendants, the United States Catholic Conference, Inc., the Roman Catholic Bishop of Louisville, a Corporation Sole and St. Elizabeth of Hungary Parish were negligent in their failure to warn parishioners in general and the Plaintiff, MS-6 in particular, of the sexual tendencies of the Defendant, Reverend Louis Miller, and that such negligence and carelessness was the direct and proximate cause of the injuries suffered by the Plaintiff.

6. The Defendants, the United States Catholic Conference, Inc., the Roman Catholic Bishop of Louisville, a Corporation Sole, and St. Elizabeth of Hungary Parish, both individually and collectively, intentionally concealed the sexual tendencies of the Defendant, Reverend Louis Miller, and others like him, and that such concealment was the direct and proximate cause of the injuries suffered by the Plaintiff.

7. As a result of the negligence and gross negligence of the Defendants, the Plaintiff was sexually abused and as a result of such abuse,

he has suffered, suffers, and will suffer much mental and physical anguish, has incurred, is incurring, and will incur expenses for medical treatment, has lost wages and will suffer a decrease in his capacity to earn money all to his damage in an amount in excess of the jurisdictional amount of this Court.

8. The actions of all of the Defendants were willful and wanton for which the Plaintiff demands exemplary damages in an amount in excess of the jurisdictional amount of this Court.

WHEREFORE, the Plaintiff, MS-6 demands judgment against the Defendants, jointly and severally, for compensatory damages in a reasonable amount in excess of the jurisdictional amount of this Court, and for exemplary damages in a reasonable amount in excess of the jurisdictional amount of this Court, trial by jury, and any and all further relief to which he may appear entitled.

#### Count II

Comes the Plaintiff, Wife of MS-6, and states as follows for her complaint:

9. She reiterates each and every allegation as set out in Count I of this complaint.

10. States that she is the wife of MS-6 and has been continuely since December 6, 1985.

11. Before the injuries suffered by the Plaintiff, MS-6 was able to aid, assist, and perform services for this Plaintiff around their house and home, and he gave this Plaintiff society, companionship, and they enjoyed a conjugal relationship.

12. As a direct and proximate result of her husband's injuries caused by the Defendants' negligence, he has not been able to aid, assist, and perform services for this Plaintiff around their house and home, nor has he been able to give society, companionship, or enjoy a conjugal relationship with this Plaintiff as they did before his injuries, all to the damage of this Plaintiff in an amount in excess of the jurisdictional amount of this Court.
