Brd molestation complaint against priest

COURTS: Ex-altar boy says the Rev. Eleuterio Ramos abused him. Two others have made similar complaints.

A Riverside warehouse clerk became the third man to claim that he was sexually molested as a youngster by a priest

permitted to work with children, despite repeated complaints lodged with his Orange County superiors, according to interviews and court records.

The complaint, which an attorney says he filed with the Roman Catholic Diocese of Orange, is the latest molestation allegation against local clergymen. Also pending are a lawsuit against Monsignor Michael Harris and one involving the Rev. Richard T. Coughlin, former leader of the All-American Boys Chorus. An-

other case involving Coughlin was settled this week.

The new complaint against the Rev. Eleuterio Ramos alleges that senior clergymen shirked their moral and legal duty to protect the one-time altar boy, and failed to take action when his parents brought the abuse allegations to their attention in the late 1970s.

As a matter of policy, the Orange County Register does not identify alleged victims of sexual abuse without their consent.

"The man's attorney said Friday that the diocese's response—then and now—is typical of its failure to confront and resolve similar molestation allegations and complaints against the priest in the 1970s and 1980s.

"His father went to the diocese and they did nothing," said Werner R. Meissner, the San Pedro attorney who has filed three complaints against Ramos. "They never tried to help the boy. They never cared about him. They don't care about him

now. They just want him to go away."

Monsignor Lawrence Baird, spokesman for the Diocese of Orange, was out of town Thursday and Friday. Two attorneys who have represented the diocese in these cases did not return calls Friday.

claimed that in the late 1970s and the 1980s Ramos performed oral sex on them, gave them alcohol, showed them pornographic magazines and took nude photographs of them.

The diocese has never publicly acknowledged that either boy was abused. Settlements in both cases were sealed by the court, at the request of the diocese.

Ramos was reassigned to Tijuana in 1985. In 1990, he admitted that he sexually abused one of the boys, but it was after the young man turned 18. In a letter that year to the boy, the priest allegedly blamed "the molestation" on his abuse of alcohol and his own history as an abused child.

One lawsuit involving Coughlin has been settled, although a second claim is pending along with two other lawsuits against the diocese or its priests. The most prominent involves a lawsuit filed in September, accusing the popular Monsignor Michael Harris of sexually molesting a Mater Dei High School student from 1979 to 1983.

Meissner said the latest Ramos allegation was sparked when his new client saw a news article about a settlement in the molestation case of another former altar boy, James Rogan. Rogan has consented to the publication of his name.

Rogan's claim stated he was molested over a period of 11 years and Friday he said that the emotional scars have changed his view of the church.

"The church has never done anything without being forced," Rogan said Friday. "Things haven't changed. I won't step foot in a Catholic church."

Unlike Rogan, who was molested repeatedly, Meissner said his new client is presently able to recall only a single molestation incident in 1978 when he was 13 years old.

According to Meissner, when the priest performed a wedding in Santa Ana, the altar boy helped with the service. Afterward, Meissner said, the priest gave the boy alcohol and invited him to spend the night at the rectory where the priest allegedly molested the child.

The boy told his parents the next day, and they complained to the diocese. Ramos was transferred to another Orange County parish not long after, Meissner said.

Meissner said Rogan's tale prompted his new client to connect his abuse as a child with problems he is experiencing as an adult forging and maintaining relationships with other people.

In court records, a priest, church schoolteacher and librarian related other troubling episodes regarding Ramos' conduct with children.

All three claim they and others took their concerns directly to Auxiliary Bishop Michael Driscoll.


In a deposition from a 1991 case filed by a Tustin man, Driscoll said he did not recall hearing any complaints firsthand. He said he did know secondhand of complaints about Ramos, but only involving alcohol.

His account is contradicted by the Rev. Robert Tressler. The Orange County priest said that in 1982 a teen-age boy confided that he had been sexually molested by Ramos.

Tressler said that both he and the boy spoke with Driscoll. He said Driscoll told the boy to keep their conversation "to himself" and promised the priest he would take care of it.


By way of introduction, this office represents [REDACTED] concerning legal action against the Roman Catholic Diocese of Orange and other defendants relating to allegations of childhood sexual abuse and molestation performed by Father Al Ramos. As you are aware, I represented two other boys who were also molested by Father Ramos.

[REDACTED] is alleging that he was molested by Father Ramos during the summer of 1978, when [REDACTED] was [REDACTED] years of age. At that time, [REDACTED] was an altar boy at St. Joseph's Church in Placentia and the molestation is believed to have occurred at Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish in the rectory and Father Ramos' room.

I have been in contact with Monsignor John Urell regarding this matter and informed him that I have received the report from [REDACTED] treating doctor. Monsignor Urell has requested that I contact you to make arrangements for a meeting to discuss [REDACTED] situation and potentially resolving his case in a fair and expeditious manner. Please be advised that we will have no alternative but to file and pursue legal action through the courts if we are not able to do so in the next couple of months.

Monsignor Urell has suggested that you contact the insurance companies that would be involved in this particular situation to request their cooperation accordingly. Once you have had an opportunity to discuss this matter with your principals, please contact me so that we can make appropriate arrangements for a meeting or settlement conference.

Church Not Liable for Sexual Abuse Of Minor by Sunday School Teacher

The C.A. 4th has ruled that a church was not liable for the sexual abuse of a minor by a Sunday school teacher whose actions were not within the scope of his employment.

Ernest Schwobeda was a member of and a Sunday school teacher at Central Baptist Church (CBC). He was active in the church's Thursday night visitation program. Jeffrey E. was a second grade Sunday school student of Schwobeda's and accompanied him at the Thursday program. Jeffrey also often spent Sunday mornings and evenings with Schwobeda and occasionally helped him with errands on Saturdays. During the two years Jeffrey was with Schwobeda, his mother encouraged the relationship between them, believing Schwobeda was a "second father" to Jeffrey. Schwobeda was charged with 47 felony counts of child molestation, and pleaded guilty to nine counts involving Jeffrey. Jeffrey sued CBC for assault, battery and intentional infliction of emotional distress. CBC claimed that it could not reasonably foresee Schwobeda's actions, that the teacher had no authority from the church to molest Jeffrey and that Schwobeda's conduct was unrelated to his duties as a teacher or a church member. Jeffrey and CBC stipulated that the facts were not in dispute, and the trial court granted CBC's motion for summary judgment.

The C.A. 4th affirmed. CBC could only be responsible for Schwobeda's actions under a theory of respondeat superior if his actions against Jeffrey were within the scope of his employment. Schwobeda's actions were "independent, self-serving pursuits unrelated to church activities," and there was no evidence that any molesting happened during Sunday school or on CBC property. Where any sexual molestation was "not foreseeable *in light of the duties* (he was) hired to perform," Schwobeda's conduct with Jeffrey was not within the scope of his employment. Furthermore, since Schwobeda did not abuse any authority given him through a special relationship with the church, Schwobeda's acts did not fall within the respondeat superior doctrine based on a "position of trust." Sexual molestation is not related in any way to either teaching Sunday school, attending church-sponsored visitations or any of the other duties of a Sunday school teacher or a church member. Summary judgment for CBC was therefore proper.

most widespread publicity in the past weeks for two cases in which he infuriated the district attorney's office.

In one of them, Fitzgerald let Joeri DeBeer, convicted of involuntary manslaughter, walk out the courtroom on probation after the jurors pleaded for leniency. They said DeBeer, an 18-year-old from the Netherlands, deserved a second chance because the man he killed had sexually abused him for four years.

In the other case, a nonjury trial, Fitzgerald acquitted Michael Garritson, 32, of Fullerton of charges that he killed a baby. Jurors at Garritson's first trial had voted 11 to 1 to convict him of murder.

A veteran lawyer from the public defender's office said of the judge: "I believe the old boy has mellowed. Fitzgerald would never have made those same two decisions a year ago."

Based on 'Law and the Facts'

Fitzgerald disagrees.

"You make your decision based on the law and the facts in front of you," he said in an interview in his chambers. "Some of these defendants are animals, and I'm not afraid to give them what they deserve. But I'm also not afraid to side with a defendant when that's the best way justice can be served."

Fitzgerald, 51, who has been on the Superior Court bench for six years, is not a judge who blends in with the plastic paneling. His supporters staunchly defend him, but some of his critics can't discuss him without raising their voices.

Many attorneys in the county say they like him but shudder at some of the things he says from the bench.

One review that Fitzgerald probably would not mind comes from William M. Monroe, a top Santa Ana criminal defense attorney.

"Judge Fitzgerald has that Marine Corps attitude—tough but fair," Monroe said. "He lets you put on your lawsuit," meaning he doesn't interfere with the defense lawyer's game plan. "Then, if your client is found guilty, he sends him away for a thousand years."

'Always Polite'

One defense lawyer who praises

of his decisions," said one defense attorney. Another, who claims he avoids Fitzgerald's courtroom if at all possible, said, "He is too impulsive." Many defense lawyers complain that Fitzgerald is pro-prosecution and holds grudges against attorneys he doesn't like, which can affect their cases.

Fitzgerald has critics in the district attorney's office, too, many of whom argue that he is pro-defense.

One prosecutor who generally praises Fitzgerald complains that the judge too often keeps score.

"It's like: 'OK, I let you guys win on these two points, so I've got to let the defense have a couple.'"

But Melvin L. Jensen, who prosecuted DeBeer, calls Fitzgerald "a stand-up guy." He said: "I don't always agree with him, but I think he tries to be fair."

Hipshooter, Some Claim

One complaint from both sides is that Fitzgerald "shoots from the hip," both in his comments and sometimes in his decisions.

For example, three years ago in an attempted murder case, Fitzgerald ordered his bailiff to turn off the courtroom lights. Fitzgerald wanted to give jurors a better idea of the lighting at the time the crime

questioning a different judge]. But I think that's died down now."

He admits that he made a mistake when he ordered the courtroom lights turned off. But the mistake, he said, was in not telling the lawyers ahead of time what he was about to do.

But Fitzgerald says criticism won't deter him. "We weren't put on the bench to be namby-pamby," he said. "Judges are public figures. We are in an environment where the public is entitled to know where we stand."

Fitzgerald, who served four years in the Marine Corps before going to law school, began his law career in the Orange County district attorney's office. He was in private practice briefly after that, then was a prosecutor for three years in Los Angeles County.

He was elected to the North Municipal Court bench in 1976. It was there that he gained his reputation for toughness.

In his most celebrated case, Fitzgerald sentenced two social workers to six months in jail for demonstrating at a military arms exposition at the Anaheim Convention Center, a sentence that many considered unusually harsh.

Fitzgerald said he would let them out after 30 days if they signed a letter promising not to do it again. They refused. He finally let them out after two months, telling them that he had finally met someone "more stubborn than I am."

Fitzgerald was elected to the Superior Court bench in 1980. His campaign signs, "Reelect Fitzgerald," created a stir. Fitzgerald said he wanted voters to know "that I am an elected judge, not a Jerry Brown appointment."

On Death Penalty Panel

Fitzgerald is now on a criminal panel that receives most of the death penalty cases. So far, he has sentenced four men to Death Row, calling all four "very deserving fellows." "I don't see a damn thing wrong with executing people," Fitzgerald declared.

He sometimes criticizes the state Supreme Court as "ridiculous." He said the Hefner verdict and sentence were overturned because the court ruled a year later that jurors must be told that "intent to kill" is necessary in finding special cir-



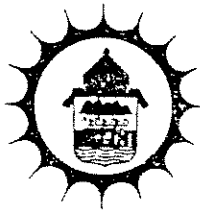

Ex-Altar Boy Sues Church, Alleges Molestation

SANTA ANA—A 26-year-old former altar boy on Friday sued a Santa Ana parish and top officials of the Roman Catholic Church, alleging that he had been sexually molested by a priest over seven years.

The civil lawsuit filed on behalf of Ronald Glenane, a county resident, says the alleged abuse occurred at Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish, 1100 S. Center St., from October, 1974, until December, 1981. The priest named in the suit is Father Eluceterio Ramos, also known as Al Ramos, now 52.

Msgr. Lawrence J. Baird, director of communication with the Diocese of Orange, said he had not seen the lawsuit, which was filed late Friday in Orange County Superior Court, and would not comment on its allegations.

"We'll have a statement as soon as we have the facts," Baird said late Friday night.

He said, however, that Father Ramos is now in a pastoral assignment in San Ysidro and is not an active priest with the Diocese of

Orange.

Glenane's attorney, Werner R. Meissner of San Pedro, said he has also heard that Ramos has since left the Santa Ana parish.

Meissner said no law enforcement agency has been notified about the alleged abuse.

The suit states that he had psychologically repressed the alleged events and did not remember them until March 29, during psychiatric counseling.

Glenane, who was a houseboy as well as an altar boy at the church, alleges in the suit that the abuse went on "continuously for four years and on and off for three years. . . . From the time he was 10 to 14, there were a lot of molestations at the church."

"The family knew the priest," Meissner said. "They thought their kid was in good hands with a church figure."

The amount of damages was not specified, but Glenane is seeking punitive damages as well as recovery of medical and psychiatric expenses, loss of earnings and other costs.

Glenane "has been in different institutions and therapy," his attorney said.

The suit alleges that the church and its bishops were negligent in the hiring and supervision of Ramos. It names the Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish, Father John Weenhoffer, the Roman Catholic Dioceses of Orange and Los Angeles, Archbishop Thomas Clavel, Pastor Francis Moran and Bishop William Johnson.



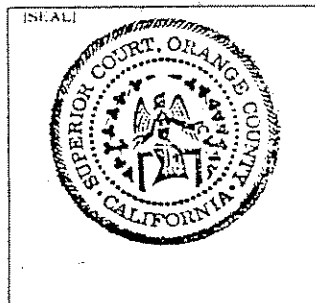
