

## **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

1. Inpatient hospitalization is indicated in order to further evaluate Father Avery's mood disorder and alcohol abuse, to observe him in the context of a therapeutic milieu, and to provide a comprehensive treatment program in a structured environment.

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2. Pastoral Counseling is recommended to assist Father in integrating his emotional, sexual, psychological, and social needs within the context of his spirituality and commitment to priesthood.

3. Further medical evaluation is indicated in light of Father Avery's leukopenia.
