ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

The National Catholic Disaster Relief Committee is responsible for coordinating the activities of Catholic groups in time of domestic disaster.

The United States Catholic Conference of Bishops has assigned Catholic Charities USA to act as secretariat to the committee. The committee is responsible to the United States Catholic Conference and the Board of Catholic Charities USA.

DISASTER PROGRAM

The National Catholic Disaster Relief Committee is designated by the United States Catholic Conference to act on behalf of the Catholic Church in domestic disaster relief matters. The staff of Catholic Charities USA provides support and assistance. It is the responsibility of the Committee to work with appointed Diocesan Disaster Coordinators and local Catholic Charities offices. At the national level the committee is responsible for keeping in contact with other national voluntary organizations and with the Federal Emergency Management Agency. The local Disaster Coordinators together with the Catholic Charities staff coordinate the efforts of the local diocesan parishes, schools, and institutions and work with ecumenical or non-sectarian groups active on the local level, to develop an organized response plan to disasters.

When a major disaster strikes a locale, contact is established between the local coordinators and the national staff. An immediate assessment is made of the extent of damage, number of victims, and the abililty of local resources to meet the needs. If outside assistance is needed beyond phone consultation, consultants may be assigned to go to the area affected to advise the local church authorities. Funding for the disaster is primarily a local diocesan responsibility. Special fund raising efforts are conducted within the diocese, and often appeals are made to surrounding dioceses to assist in meeting the need. If other immediate financial help is required for early start-up needs, help may be available from the Committees' small emergency reserve. If the disaster is of major proportions and large-scale help is needed, the committee may launch a national appeal through the local dioceses.



What surprised me most was that this move was supposed to have been undertaken because our Sisters, who are staffing the parochial school, would close the school and leave were Fr. Kraft, the pastor, to remain. I was never informed of any related problems in this matter.

I got in touch with the Provincial Superior in order to find out what the facts are, and she informed me that the Sisters had nothing to do with this move. Except for some minor difficulties regarding some differing opinions in school, there have been no real problems between Father Kraft, the pastor, and our Sisters.

My conscience compels me to assure your Excellency of the esteem and gratitude our Congregation, especially our Sisters of St. Joseph Province in the U.S.A., have for Father Kraft. I, and a great number of our Sisters are sincerely sorry that Father is submitted to such a humiliating situation. This turn of affairs was by no means our cnoice. On the contrary, we would rather see him back in the parish as a happy and dedicated priest, the way we know him.

I do hope that my statement will be of service and will remedy the present circumstances in which Father Kraft finds himself.

Your Excellency:

The underlisted Pastors meet once a month for lunch and sharing of ideas and problems. At the meeting of December 21, the question of Stewardship was the topic of the hour. It was decided that the views and feelings of all present should be brought to your attention.

To say that the Pastors were disturbed by the latest Stewardship developments would be a gross understatement. There was widespread dismay and even anger. Many parishes already receive nothing from Stewardship. The increased assessments will add many more to the list. The Pastors feel that the monthly assessments, possibly the highest in the country, should be more than enough to run the offices of the Diocese. To add to this a heavy Stewardship load is unfair and unnecessary. An unreasonable amount of parish income is syphoned off to the Diocese, in some cases close to, and in others over, one thousand dollars a week. The Pastors feel that they are being used and exploited as mere fund-raisers. They find it increasingly difficult, if not entirely impossible, to justify these arrangements to their people. In the matter of Stewardship in particular, which was originally advertised as a limited project, they feel that you have broken faith with them.

It is with great regret that the undersigned feel this letter is necessary. They do not regard themselves as adequately represented by either the Diocesan consultors or the Senate, many of whose members are not Pastors and do not have the heartaches or responsibilities of Pastors. They feel strongly that there must be direct consultation with themselves in money matters and more attention and consideration must be given to parish needs.



Dear Father Kraft:

I'm writing to you on behalf of our Parish Stewardship '74 Committee to forward their thoughts concerning procedures for future drives. We hope they will assist in decisions leading to the successful implementation and control of whatever plan may be chosen for future drives.

First, we don't feel that an outside firm is needed to organize and run the drive. Many parishes like ours (St. Therese) can be given the goal and will meet the commitment. For those parishes which need help, qualified volunteers could be found to help them organize and run the drive.

Secondly, there seems to be a "bamboo curtain" between the Diocesan finances and the people of the Diocese concerning Stewardship funds. As an example, I asked Bob Eidt for a breakdown of how the Stewardship '73 funds were spent; he didn't write the promised letter, so I called the Stewardship office for the information. At first I was told that it wasn't available; finally Bob Eidt returned the call and verbally gave me an unaudited view of the expenditures. We used these as the "need" backup for Stewardship '74. My committee feels strongly the need to be honest with the parishioners or they won't help. This information must be made available in enough detail for those who understand finance (many of the large donors) and also in a simpler form for those who don't need the full details.

Thirdly, give the parish the right to decide what type of appeal is best for its community. No two parishes have the same personality or needs. What might work best for one - considering the offertory trend, possible change in community spirit, requirement to raise parish money with a drive, effort involved with respect to other parish functions, and the prevailing attitude towards drives - may result in failure for another parish. Our Parish Committee felt hampered rather than helped by the rules and regulations of implementation in both the '73 and '74 drives. The parish could be given a Diocesan goal and the time for completion, and then be allowed to determine if the goal should be increased to include its own needs.

Last, but not least, we feel that, for the success of future drives, it is imperative that billing and accounting be accurate. It is also important to get billing information to the parish in time for review and action on

those in default, or late with payment. We picked up about \$3,000.00 in follow-ups in 1972, but late billing information in 1973 didn't give us time for any follow-up before Stewardship '74 drive began.

Father, I'm sure you are aware of the time it takes to thoroughly organize for any successful function. Will you point out the need to let the parishes know no later than November 15 that a drive is needed. This gives the Pastor a chance to get a chairman, who can start getting organized before an advanced solicitation is started. I personally feel that both 173 and 174 Stewardship schedules were too short in this part of the drive. We do believe in short drive period, but the planning should have adequate time. In our schedule this year, the period for planning, advanced list solicitation (1/2), and Sign-up Sunday was only 3 weeks and 4 days.

I felt that you handled the Region meeting well, in fact with dispatch. I was glad to see your parish goal reached in the very early stages of the drive. We are happy with our effort this year.

Please say hello to your mother for Emily and me. We hope she is well and enjoying life.



Dear Miss O'Connor:



If you state that you wish to be oppn and honest, then as a matter of courtesy and ecclesiastical protocol, I should have assumed that you personally would contact me after I had written to you on previous occasions and called but received no reply. I am not a neophyte on the San Diego scede as I have been civicitly involved for the past twenty-three years as founding paskor of St. Therese of the Child Jesus Parish and as former Director of Cemeteries for the Diocese. Since April of 1970, I have been appointed to organize this new parish of the Good Shepherd. This is the real issue that is of concern to our good people regarding the genuine and sincere proposal made by hundreds and signed by petitions and cards to effect the change of the name of Camino Ruiz to Good Shepherd Boulevard. Permit me to enfold the history of this grass roots movement which began in September of 1971.

At that time a committee of citizens in this area of Mira Mesa, Rancho de los Penasquitos and Scripps Miramar Ranch was formed to promote the change of the name of Camino Ruiz to Good Shepherd Boulevard. Richard Fernandes was named chairman of the committee. An army of men, women and children proceeded to obtain petitions and hundreds of signatures of qualified voters and residents were obtained. The matter came before the Planning Commission on December 15, 1971 and three members approved the change and one cast a negative vote. After much delay, the entire issue was then submitted to the City Council for action. It was propitious to submit the request at that time as only a small portion of the street had then been dedicated. Mr. Fowler had asked that the petitioner, the church, post \$1,000.00 for the cost of street signs though he thought and stated that this was about twice the amount needed. A donor was readily obtained and the deposit made with the City of San Diego. The committee worked many more hours in obtaining more signatures and solicited several more hundred cards specially signed for the City Council to consider at the time the matter was docketed. personally winte to you apprising you of these facts on begalf of the committee, many of whom were not of our faith. You never answered my letter. The matter was scheduled for hearing on June 1, 1972 and the City Clerk and Mr. Gil Johnson's office advised us that the resolution would be presented at the afternoon session. We alerted over 70 people and arranged for a special bus to be present at the hearing at that date. Mr Johnson conveniently armanged to be absent for "a medical check-up" though his office stated that his views would be presented in his absence. Mush to our dismay the matter was pushed ahead to the morning session and no one from the committee was present. The hundreds of cards and sheets of petition signers were presented by the City Clerk, but when no one appeared on behalf of our cause, Mr. Bates made the motion for denial and it was seconded as Resolution #205733 by Councilwoman Maureen O'Connor -- our proposal went down in defeat though Mr. Hitch did state he couldn't understand where the proponents were as it was evident so many people were interested in this significant change and very few in opposition. The Mayor then asked Mr. Hitch if he was prepared to argue the merits of church-state relationship and then put the resolution seconded by you to a vote and the matter was finalized.

You may then perhaps understand the futility that seized the spirits of so many people who worked so hard on this meaningful proposal to note that a Catholic had made such a positive move in seconding the motion for defeat. That, my dear Miss O'Connor, is the real issue. If remarks were made about you they were solely on this issue and not the question of church taxation, that I can assure you. The fact that Bishop Buddy may or may not have made his home available to your family or whatever benefits you have received through the faith over the years is clearly not the issue either, except that people who have known you were rightly alarmed at your action. I see no wrong in these good people knowing the fact that you voted against this issue and that is all that was publically stated. I welcome you at any time to discuss this matter with me and members of our Parish Council or parish at large if you feel you have not been treated justly. Obviously, many of our people cannot forget your action in opposing our cause. Unfortunately as in the past, it has been observed that Catholics who hold public office are not wont to go on record as favoring the faith, but this was not a faith-related issue; it was a community issue.

I do pray for you in the difficult position that you hold and I personally believe you sincere in fulfilling your obligations impartially. I regret these misundersaundings take place, and perhaps they would not have if you had contacted me personally and learned the true facts as stated. Let us both resolve the issue by pursuing our respective duties with added zeal with the dove of Christ in our hearts with dedication and compassion for all we serve.

Your Excellency:

As you may recall, I was the young woman to whom you graciously gave of your time when I was thinking of announcing my candidacy for the City Council. At that time I made a promise that I would be open and honest in matters regarding the office.

Now, a matter which I feel is quite serious has come up that perhaps concerns both of our offices. During the past week I have spoken with some of the members of The Church of the Good Shepherd in Mira Mesa. It seems that they have been grossly misinformed as to my position on certain issues by one of their priests, Father William A. Kraft.

Father Kraft is under the mistaken impression that I am for taxing the churches and church schools. I am not, nor have I ever stated that I favor such a proposal. I am also well aware that church land not used for religious purposes and the clergy are taxed.

Father Kraft is also under the mistaken impression that our family was provided free housing by Bishop Buddy. As you are probably well aware, this was not the case. Furthermore, I have not, as Father Kraft alleges, "turned against the church". Normally, I would not rebut personal attacks. But apparently he has gone to the point of denouncing me publicly from the pulpit.

The seed of this misunderstanding stems from the time that Father Kraft came before the City Council requesting permission to be heard regarding the moratorium in Mira Mesa.

Greetings and Peace of the Child of Bethlehem,

It has been a year since I have made you aware of my decision to resign from Saint Therese Parish, which I had the privilege to have established in 1956. At that time I assumed full-time responsibility as Director of Cemeteries for the Diocese of San Diego. My Father's health was most critical at that time as he had suffered four serious heart seizures. Relinquishing my responsibility as Pastor of this large parish permitted me to devote time to my endeared parents, who had long been neglected because of pressing duties. My Father's health at present has improved somewhat as he has not been in the hospital since July. He has, however, sustained some minor attacks. I so admire the wonderful faith of my good parents and their indomitable spirit of devotion to me and the Church.

Cn April 24th I was relieved of my position in the Cemetery Department and was appointed to establish a new parish in the north section of San Diego City. Bishop Maher permitted me to name the parish, Good Shepherd. There are over 100 square miles within the parish boundaries and the potential is great and the number of Catholic families grows every day with the completion of construction of many new homes.

In July the Bishop purchased one of the tract homes in the Mira Mesa subdivision to serve as a rectory. We are fortunate to have obtained a vacant store for our services in the Penasquitos area and also have Mass at the rectory in the garage, which was converted to a Chapel. We use Miramar College auditorium as a third location. I find this assignment a challenging one. It is a little harder the second time around because you know from experience the many difficulties and heartaches that are before you and you wonder how you can surmount them a second time — but with the grace of God it isn't an impossibility. At times I find it difficult to imagine that I am no longer with my devoted people of Saint Therese, whom I learned to know and love so much. Now there are new experiences and other families becoming a part of my daily life. I am so grateful to the countless friends who rushed to assist me in beginning this new parish. Without them it would have been impossible. My dear relatives have also rallied to the cause with their kind assistance and my Mother and Dad are again among my most faithful and loyal supporters.

It's a refreshing experience again to be close to the heart of the people in personally serving their spiritual needs. In recent years, burdened with so many administrative duties, I was too far away from my beloved flock. Living in a home just like theirs and in their midst keeps me in constant contact with their spiritual needs and allows me to relate to each member of every family. I am doing my own cooking and housework again and find this a different task.

I thank you for all your help and prayers and be consoled that there is tremendous amount of satisfaction in knowing that you are trying to fulfil the Will of God as expressed by obedience to the Bishop. We are experiencing difficult times financially but we hope this will soon improve as the parish grows. If you should have any Mass requests I should be most pleased to receive them. Please keep me in your good thoughts and prayers and I assure you that you are in my poor prayers and Masses.

Most Reverend and dear Bishop,

After consultations with the officers of the Newman Club of San Diego State College, I have been able to outline a tentative program for the club's activities for the coming semester. A religious and cultural educational program will be planned for the regular weekly meetings held on the campus. This program will include basic moral and doctrinal instructions followed by open forums with a view to clarify in line with Catholic philosophy the problems that the students will meet in their regular academic classes. Paralleling this basic religious program, periodically outstanding Catholic laymen will be invited to speak in a vocational series outlining the part a Catholic plays in their particular profession and the basic qualifications required to aspire to that profession.

Because membership in the Newman Club is on a voluntary basis, we are arranging an active social program that will provide wholesome recreation for the members. Thanks to the genuine interest of Monsignor Ott we will be able to use the facilities here at Blessed Sacrament for these social events. As there are over 500 students on the campus who indicate Catholic preference we are in great hopes that our membership this year will be a goodly number. We seek your Excellency's advice concerning the practicality of addressing letters to the Reverend Pastors in the San Diego area urging Catholic students attending State College to join the Newman Club.

Although there are a few distinct advantages in affiliating the Newman Club with the National Federation, especially the advantage of receiving the periodic chaplain's bulletin, I would hesitate to urge such affiliation without the approval of your Excellency. I should like to know the dispositions in this regard of our other Newman Clubs at Redlands University, Chaffey College, and the college in Riverside; the San Bernardine Valley College had been

affiliated with the Pacific Conference since its inception.

I had an interview with Miss Catherine Ragen, Dean of Women, at San Diego State; she is an excellent Catholic. She pledged the club her support and interest and the co-operation of the faculty with the club's program. At the school there is established an Inter-Faith Council whose chief task is to plan for the Religious Emphasis Week during the semester. This year, the presidency of that Council is in the hands of the Newman Club.

Humbly, then, I present this report to your Exellency with the hope that we might benefit from your suggestions and advice regarding this year's program. We feel that the increasing numbers of Catholics at the college present a great challenge to us to keep the light of their faith burning brightly in these formative days of their youth.

"I firmly hold and accept each and every definition of the unerring teaching of the Church, with all she has maintained and declared, but especially those points of doctrine which expressly combat the errors of our time. In the first place I profess my belief that God, the beginning and end of all, can be certainly known and therefore proved to exist by the natural light of reason from the things that are made, that is, from the visible works of the creation as a cause from its effects. Next I recognize and acknowledge the external arguments of revelation, that is, divine facts, especially miracles and prophecies, as most certain signs of the divine origin of the Christian religion, and I hold that these are altogether suited to the understanding of every age and of all men, also of our times. Thirdly, I likewise hold with firm faith that the Church, the guardian and exponent of the revealed Word, was proximately and directly founded by the true and historic Christ Himself, while He dwelt amongst us, and that she was also built upon Peter, the Prince of the Apostolic Hierarchy, and upon his successors to the end of time. Fourthly, I sincerely accept the teaching of faith as transmitted down to us from the Apostles through the orthodox Fathers in the same sense and even in the same wording; and, therefore, I wholly reject the heretical notions of the evolution of dogmas, which pass from one sense to another alien to that which the Church held from the start; and I likewise condenin every error whereby is substituted for the divine deposit, entrusted by Christ to His Spouse and by Her to be faithfully guarded, a philosophic system or the creation of a human consciousness, gradually refined by the striving of men and finally to be perfected hereafter by indefinite progress. Fifthly, I hold for certain and sincerely profess that Faith is not a blind religious sense making its way out of the hidden regions of the sub-liminal consciousness, morally tinged by the influence of heart and will, but is a true assent of the intellect to truth received from without by hearing, an assent whereby we believe to be true, because of the authority of the all-true God, whatever by the personal God, our Creator and Lord, has been spoken, testified and revealed.

"I also reject the error of those who aver that the Faith proposed by the Church may be in conflict with history, and that Catholic dogmas in the sense in which they are now understood cannot be harmonized with the more truthful "origins" of Christianity, Moreover, I condemn and reject the opinion which declares that a Christian man of better culture can assume a dual personality, one as a believer and another as an historian, as if it were permissible for the historian to hold fast what his faith as a believer contradicts, or to lay down premises from which there follows the falsity or the uncertainty of dogmas, provided only that these are not directly denied. Likewise I reject that method of estimating and interpreting Holy Writ, which, setting aside the Church's tradition and the analogy of Faith and the rules of the Apostolic See, adopts the rationalists' principles and with equal arbitrariness and rashness considers criticism of the text the one only supreme rule. Furthermore, I reject the opinion of those who hold that a teacher of the science of Historical Theology or the writer on the subject must first put aside the notions previously conceived about the supernatural origin of Catholic tradition or about the divine aid promised for the perpetual preservation of each revealed truth; then, that the writings of individual Fathers must be interpreted solely by the data of science, without any reference to sacred authority, and with that freedom of judgment wherewith every profane record is usually examined.

"Finally and in general, I declare myself to be far removed from the error of the modernists who hold that in sacred tradition there is nothing inherently divine; or who-far worse stilladmit it in a pantheistic sense; so that thus there would remain only a bare simple fact equal to the ordinary facts of history, viz., that the school started by Christ and His Apostles finds, in the ages that follow, men to carry it on by their energy, their skill, and their genius. Wherefore most firmly do I retain and to my last breath will I retain the Faith of the Fathers of the Church concerning the sure endowment of truth, which



Most Reverend and dear Bishop: .

I read with interest Your Excellency's recent directives and wish to make a personal observation regarding the proposal of some of the Fathers regarding the use of the Easter collection to satisfy a parish's obligation regarding the seminary. Let me say that I am not in favor of this plan for two reasons particularly. Because the seminary assessment is not ordinarily due until September, this money can be budgeted throughout the other months to plan for the fall payment, whereas the Easter collection provides a substantial boost at least in our parish to pay the quarterly interest that comes due on April 1st. Secondly, we find it very helpful to take up a special seminary collection sometime during the year which in the past has helped us to pay almost two-thirds of our assessment. It also occasions helpful indoctrination of the people on our diocesan seminaries keeping them aware of their needs. If the Easter collection would preclude the taking up of a special seminary collection during the year, I would especially look unfavorably upon it.

From the very founding of our parish, we have initiated an active Youth group for high-school students which meets regularly in our hall each Wednesday evening for instructions and a social program. Because of the personal interest in the group that the Pastor has always shown, it was the unanimous desire of the group to name themselves, "The Saint William's Club". An active committee of men and women of the parish effectively assist each week by their presence at each group get-together. The last Communion Sunday of the group saw forty-five of these teenagers at the alter rail.

We are happy to report also that our Newman Club at San Diego State College is experiencing unprecedented attendances at our regular sessions; over 150 young men and women were present at our get-together last week.

In the parish, over 50 block captains gathered together the Sunday before Lent to begin the campaign for souls (we anticipated Your Excellency's instructions) and already over 24 have enrolled in our forum and 11 have come for revalidations since Lent began.



Our Parish, in honor of the Little Flower, has been in existence only five years. Its boundaries included an undeveloped area some seven miles distant. In the last year, low income housing did develop in that area and we have some 60 Catholic families with over 150 school age children finding it difficult to come to this Church for Sunday Mass, due to a hazarous road that they would travel. We have done the best we can in giving them Mass on Sunday in a vacant store and having catechism in garages throughout the area. We are in a position to obtain the donation of a plot of land from a Catholic family in the area, suitable for the erection of a Mission Chapel, where we could provide Mass and administer catechism instructions.

Being a new Parish our debt is now over \$400,000 and we are in no position to assist in the establishment of such a Mission Chapel and it is for this reason that we hope Your Excellency will find the cause worthy of consideration with a view to obtaining funds from the Catholic Extension Society.

We pray for Your Excellency's good health in continuing the zealous Apostolate of the Extension Society in America. We humbly ask Your Excellency's blessing.

Under such an agreement the type of building envisioned would also have been such to merely accommodate the needs of the people at a minimum of cost. The lawyer who drew up the papers also acted in good faith for he was aware that Mr. and Mrs. could not make an outright donation at this time.

Your Excellency is assured that we shall continue to provide Mass and offer instruction in the vacant store that has been provided free of cost until the time when this is no longer available. We shall be most happy to announce to the people who do attend our services that if desirable land were donated a presentable house of worship would be built. We are pleased to enclose a check for five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) in further payment on the reduction of our principal. Since July 1st we have been blessed to remit to the Chancery twenty-two thousand one hundred sixty-one dollars and twenty-four cents (\$22,161.24) in payment on our principal and interest for this quarter. We feel that this is an amazing observation regarding the tithing system inasmuch as people are conscious of their own parish support throughout the summer even though they may be away for several weeks on vacation. Our tithing has kept up all through the summer months as people have either mailed in their weekly tithe or have paid in full when they returned from their vacations.

The fact that our people have accepted the tithing system now that it has been in effect for some eight months is a stark reality. Ninety-one percent of our Sunday offering is paid by tithing parishioners. Since January 1st of this year, our relatively small parish of only 476 families has paid to the Chancery the sum of \$66,661.24 on our principal and interest and in addition we have met all assessments, contributed \$3,600.00 to Newman Club work and have remitted almost \$5,000.00 to the Diocesan Development Fund. Our fervent prayer is that the tithing plan will work successfully in other parishes where it will be introduced.

Your Excellency is assured of our poor prayers and unwavering devotion at all times.

We also forwarded to the Right Reverend Vicar-General today, a more concrete expression of the effectiveness of tithing, when we enclosed a check for ten-thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) in payment of principal and interest for this fourth quarter.

Our thoughts are often with Your Excellency, we personally miss you so very much. When we conducted a holy hour to conclude exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on the Feast of Christ the King, we devoted our prayers for Your Excellency's intentions and especially that Your Excellency will be sustained in good health amidst the rigors of physical strain imposed by your impending duties in Rome. It is selfish to pray for an early end of this session of the Council, but nonetheless our child-like hearts are more at rest when our Father is close by.

It is stimulating to note that all parishes will initiate the tithing program by the first of the year. We have met with opposition from new families moving in as they state that the parish they came from did not have such a program -- such a unified program will eliminate such an arguement.

We heard a little nonesense -- it seems that democracy used to mean that you were free to vote for the candidate of your choice. Now with all the Kennedys in public office, the saying goes that democracy now means that you can vote for the Kennedy of your choice!

We do think and pray for Your Excellency each day and we stand as always ready to accede to Your Excellency's least desire.

"Never before have I really understood my personal obligation to God and His Church, as I do now that the tithing plan has been fully explained to me and adopted in our parish. The effectiveness of this sensible approach to finance over the past months has convinced me of the sound reasonableness and dignity of satisfying this prime duty in justice." This epic statement was recently made to me by one of our parishioners who is the father of four children and who has co-operated with the tithing plan since its inauguration in February of this year. It mirrors the sentiment of 90% of our parishioners.

Tithing is not new, it dates back to Old Testament days and is clearly outlined in the words of Sacred Scripture that specify man's obligation to His Creator as returning the <u>first</u> fruits and one-tenth of them to the Lord. This practice began with Cain and Abel. Just as Abel acceded willingly to return to God the best tenth of his labors, and Cain refused by giving the poorer portion, so has been the history of mankind even to present day times when modern Cains refuse the Lord His just due.

It has been an unwelcome inheritance of the last generation, that due to the economic pressures of the depression in the 1930's, churches had to devise devious means of keeping financially alive; undignified schemes of raising money became introduced and proved effective to stem the tide of obvious bankruptcy due to the inability through unemployment of the average Catholic workingman. As we emerged from the depression years, these sundry gimmicks of providing funds did not cease but continued and were accepted as a part of parish life, though as income of the wage-earner increased the proverbial dollar bill which was considered generous in depression was not increased as income in the family increased. As a result our churches were saddled with increased costs and capital improvements -- serious problems that could not be satisfactorily met

by building fund drives together with all the money-changing raffles that found their way into the temple. The obvious answer was not too obvious -- as it was too latent for too many years. The answer so obvious is not man-made, it is God made; it is the return to Him and His Church the tenth-part, the first tenth-part of one's income -- the tithe.

Faced with the heavy responsibilities of a new parish with an adequate parish compound to serve the spiritual needs of a vigorous, youthful Catholic community, sound financial basis had to be found to insure the proper physical requirements for the new parish of Saint Therese of the Child Jesus in San Diego, California. The usual and sterotyped fund appeals were initiated with limited success. Building fund drive followed upon building fund drive, cake sales, raffles, bazaars, dinners, dances, Christmas cards and all the rest, held things together amidst the weary grumblings of good people who were more interested in living their faith and enriching their spiritual lives. Finance was obtained to provide a commodious church, rectory, convent, and elementary school, together with facilities to serve Catholic students attending nearby San Diego State College -- these were immediate needs. The finance was obtained, the buildings were provided. How then to underwrite the financial burdens of such a compound? The various projects initiated were met with enthusiasm but the sustained efforts without relief transformed enthusiasm into tepidity and cynicism -- what would be the next approach? The pastor consulted with other pastors, parishioners were sounded out and it was decided to eliminate all the old fashioned, depression born fund-raising angles that belonged to another era. Tithing would be restored among our people, an orderly, reasonable answer so obvious, God's own plan.

This, however, was not an "open sesame" that would provide a panacea to end the pastor's financial headaches that were absorbing his precious time and stealing away his spiritual efforts, giving place to the more temporal

necessities of the times. A real problem of communication of ideas was involved. This was not just another gimmick, this was not another building fund or debt-reduction fund clothed in a new garment. This was God's plan to insure a proper solution that would perdure and have the happy effect of satisfying everyone's personal obligations to God and at the same time providing the means to meet the present financial obligations and provide for future needs of a growing parish.

With the help of experts in the field, an intensive educational program was launched extending over a seven-week period. No means was bypassed to insure the proper understanding of each parishioner regarding the tithe. God's share is one-tenth. Modern society also makes charitable demands, the necessity of school tuition is also a factor -- everything must be taken into consideration. The rule of thumb would be 5% of income in the regular Sunday envelope, the other 5% for school tuitions, Diocesan appeals including the Missions and for other civic charitable drives. Those not obliged to contribute toward school tuition would be able to remit more than 5% to the regular Sunday offering.

The spiritual benefits of such a plan were thoroughly explained, such a plan would create a return to the active participation of the faithful in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass by their bestowing their just share as a sacrifice to God as the bread and wine were being offered in their name by the priest at the altar. Material benefits were also to be realized if tithing were accepted. No more nuisance collections, no more undignified money-raising projects, not a constant stress of finance from the pulpit where the Word of God was being squelched due to pressing financial problems.

The initial response to the plan was one of doubt and cynicism. Wasn't this just another harassment for money. Could such a plan accomplish all it was supposed to accomplish spiritually and materially. Opposition waned and acceptance of the plan became contagious -- bitter die-hards opposing became ardent

apostles once they saw the immediate benefits. The Sunday collection tripled the first week of actual operation of the tithing plan. What is more spectacular, this level of giving has sustained at a constant level for the past eight months. The people of Saint Therese now know that tithing is the only answer. Comments of enthusiastic parishioners encourage new parishioners coming in from other parishes where tithing is yet to be introduced.

The result to date is that among the 486 families in the parish, 436 have accepted the tithe and have not only indicated their acceptance in writing but in fact are keeping their pledge to God and His Church. The priests have now more time to unleash their energies for priestly work among the people, the phone call or letter from the parish church may not be feared as just another appeal for money, now it is an invitation to spiritual enrichment; the dinners and socials of parish life are geered to the atmosphere of neighborliness as the pressure of expense and financial success is no longer a factor.

The second collection, the raffle tickets, the bazaar wheels, the 50-50 Clubs, the cake sales -- these now belong to a past decade. God's house has been cleansed of the money-changers; by this dignified plan of Church Support, the modern Catholic parish can meet the demands of present-day economy. The sights of our people have been truly raised, lay employees of the parish can be given a living wage, proper upkeep of the parish compound and up-to-date equipment can be provided and all because God has made His will known and His people have learned that God's plan is the best plan; it has brought blessings to those accepting it far beyond their wildest expectations.

Your Excellency:

We were overjoyed in receiving such a joyous letter in your own hand; it is something we shall always treasure. Your Excellency has been all too kind to us. The article seems to have been well received by the people and several of the Fathers have called seeking information on our program. The one vital aspect of the tithing plan that is not too stressed is the follow-up work that must be carefully planned to insure its continued success. The initial results that were effected here by more than doubling our Sunday offering have persevered through these eight months following at a steady pace due to the vigorous program of the tithing committee which meets with us monthly to contact new parishioners and check on those who have fallen behind on the tithe. The Pastor and his key laymen cannot sit back and remain idle once the program is initiated, constant contact must be maintained to insure its successful operation. We have found that the extra services we provide to accommodate the remission of the weekly tithe have proved so effective. We send postage paid envelopes as a regular practice to those who may be away on vacation or attend another church on an odd Sunday, and they faithfully use these in sending in the tithe they missed. They then receive a personal letter from the pastor encouraging them in their fidelity to the tithe. All these contacts create active interest on the part of the tithing parishioner and they are appreciated. From time to time they are reminded what their tithe is doing for God's work; the interest and principal payments that are made, the taxes paid, the assessments met; the general upkeep of the parish plant. We are confident that the people really appreciate the absence of the subject of money from the pulpit and they have congratulated us for the positive spiritual instructional program that we have presented from the pulpit since tithing began.

Because we have remained faithful to the letter on our pledge not to seek special funds to meet our obligations, they too have been consistent in the remission of their tithe. For this reason we cannot help but feel that the pastors would welcome a realistic assessment on a month-by-month basis in lieu of a special Diocesan Development Campaign in 1963. One of the sad disadvantages to such is the proportionately enermous expenses involved with such a campaign, money that could be directly used by the diocese for its many needs and relatively few expenses are involved with an assessment type program. Psychologically too, the paple may become sour should another full-range appeal

be directed toward them upon the heals of a newly initiated tithing program, and thus destroy the good that was accomplished by educating them to the tithe. Such an assessment plan should be most favorably met by our priests as it would be elastic enough that should the tithing program be not too successful in an isolated instance, that pastor could meet his assessment obligation by whatever means that would prove most successful in his particular situation -- at least the needs of the diocese would be insured and provided as the pastor would understand his minimum share. We surely can state that our parish now meets the \$24,000.00 interest payment each year as well as reduction of the principal by over \$50,000.00 this year alone and this due to the tithing.

It seems that an influx of Catholic students attending State College is inevitable -- we now have the names and address of over 1500 Catholics attending this year. FatherStraling is doing an excellent job in providing a stimulating program, now that he devotes himself completely to that work save for the time he gives for teaching at the University High School. We are happy to underwrite the operational expenses of the Newman work from this parish as that work was prime in the foundation of the parish here. It surely would be desireable to have clarified our jurisdictional status regarding the students attending State College as well as the faculty members who teach there. Naturally these students do come here for Mass as they attend the seminars and instructional programs that we provide during the week in our Newman Hall. It seems pusillanimous on the part of those pastors who vigorously object that these students attend Mass at the Newman Center, especially when they do not give one penny of support to our activities. Actually, the college and the housing for the students unfortunately does not lie within the boundaries of this parish and that is where the difficulty arises. Added confusion becomes apparent when a student wishes to be married here at the Newman Center. At some Newman Foundations the Ordinaries have given the Newman Chaplains "personal jurisdiction" over the students and faculty and if the students are married it includes their families. Now that our number of students becomes legion, Your Excellency may wish to give some consideration to this growing problem. Surely, we are not interested from any other standpoint than creating the proper atmosphere of bringing these students together for their spiritual welfare and keeping them apart from jurisdicitional disputes. Their faith is inajeopardy enough from the pagan influence of State College.

We apologize for our ramblings but we wish to bring Your Excellency up-to-date with our happenings in this section of the vineyard. Mother was thrilled beyond words upon learing that she was named to receive a diocesan citation, Your Excellency has been most thoughtful and both mother and dad are appreciative and grateful for all your goodness to them and to us personally.

We are posting a little package for Your Excellency today which we hope arrives safely and we pray constantly for your sustained good health and selfishly we pray for your return to your flock.

Enclosed we are pleased to remit Eight thousand dollars (\$8,000.00) in payment on our principal and interest together with another check for two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) to meet our assessment due on February 6, 1963. With the help of God and the encouragement of our good people we shall be faithful in meeting our obligations.

Your Excellency has been most considerate in approving the tithing system and our parish could not have received the plan more enthusiastically. Last year we were able to pay over \$61,000.00 on our principal and another \$25,000.00 in interest. Pray God we can hold this record. Last year our diocesan assessments amounted to \$10,000.00. Enclosed is our report indicating the results of our appeal for catechetical teachers and helpers with our Confraternity of Christian Doctrine program for children in elementary public schools.

In June of 1962, we anticipated the acute need of adequately instructed and prepared lay teachers for our CCD program to be initiated in September. At that time we recruited over thirty adults and with the expert assistance of specialists in the science of catechetics who are members of the Daughters of Divine Charity, we conducted an intensified program of daily instruction from 9:00 to 11:30 a.m. for a three week period this past summer. Our parish underwrote the expense of the special summer session for our lay people and we did co-ordinate the program with members of Monsignor Hurd's staff at that time, inasmuch as we used the same texts in methodology and doctrine that Monsignor Hurd's office anticipated using when the program would be extended on a diocesan basis. Due to the success of this advanced instruction we were competent to meet the needs of our CCD enrollment this past September.

We are, therefore, elated that we have further obtained the additional help of volunteers indicated on our present report who offer to prepare themselves to augment our current staff.

The establishment of a systematized program on the elementary level to nourish the little ones in their faith is a real step forward and we are pleased to co-operate in every way.

The buildings were designed for tile but a lack of funds prohibited the item from the original contract. We intended at this time to appeal to Your Excellency for the payment of the \$11,735.00, the cost of the installation, when generous friends came forth magnanimously and presented me with a receipted bill for that amount. Furthermore, through a special promotional plan, our people purchased a new car for our Sisters at a cost of \$2,843.20 as well as a new parish truck, so sorely needed to maintain our eleven acres. The cost of the truck was \$1,754.82. In all, then, our total for interest, debt reduction, assessments and such capital improvements as enumerated for the first quarter of 1964 has amounted to \$52,333.02. The \$36,000.00 mentioned is the result solely of tithing payments by our people and represent a sincere sacrifice amounting to an average weekly donation of \$5.20 per tithing family.

Your Excellency will be pleased to learn that our daily Holy Communions exclusive of Saturdays and Sundays have averaged 3ll since the first of the year. Your Excellency,

I am sorry to trouble you about this personal matter, but since I seem to be unable to bring it to a satisfactory conclusion on my own, it seemed only logical that it should be brought to your attention.

On June 29, 1964 Reverend William Kraft, Pastor of Saint Therese of the Child Jesus Parish, signed two contracts providing for the employment of an Inquiry Forum Director or Lay Theologian at that Parish from July 15, 1964 to June 30, 1966. The contracts were essentially identical, one being with the Institute of Lay Theology of the University of San Francisco and one with me, James F. Walsh, Jr. as the Inquiry Forum Director. The contracts provided for a beginning salary of \$300.00 per month, with gradual pay increases over a period of approximately two years culminating in a salary of \$450.00 per month for the last six months of service ending June 30,1966.

Father Kraft's decision to employ an Inquiry Director, as indicated by a photostat of his letter which is enclosed, was prompted by the fact that the young priest who was to be his assistant was tragically killed in an automobile accident in June of 1964. About the time of the signing of the contract the only other assistant at St. Therese was transferred and Father Kraft was alone in the Parish.

Around August, 1964 another priest was assigned to St. Therese to replace the one that had moved and some months later a second priest was permanently assigned to assist at the parish. On December 22, 1964, after completion of approximately six months of the two year contract Father Kraft informed me, as indicated by his letter, that since he now had two assistants he did not consider it financially admisable to continue the program at St. Therese and requested that I seek employment elsewhere in the city. I told him that I understood his feeling in the matter, that I certainly did not wish to be employed where it was not felt that I was needed and that I would be happy to seek employment if he wished me to do so. Subsequently, I was very fortunate in being offered employment for a four month period at Sacred Heart Church in Ocean Beach by Monsignor Dillon. I informed Father Kraft of the

offer and told him that in accordance with his wishes I would begin work for Monsignor Dillon for a period of four months.

Around the middle of January, 1965, I received a check from Father Kraft for approximately \$135.00 covering the last two weeks of my employment with him prior to going to work for Monsignor Dillon. Stamped on the back of the check was the notation: "Endorsee acknowledges full and complete payment of all financial obligations due him by St. Therese Church." On Friday, January 29, 1965 I returned this check to Father Kraft by registered mail with a letter stating that it would be impossible for me to endorce and cash a check with this notation at the present time. I stated that if I was fortunate enough to find further employment as an Inquriy Director in San Diego on the same financial terms for the time period covered by his contract (Jhly, 1964 to June 1966) that Ilmicht sustain no significant financial loss. If, on the other hand, I was forced to accept employment at a lesser salary than the one set out in his contract, I could sustain a loss of several hundred dollars during that time period. Of course, if I am unable to find any parish in San Diego that wants the program, it is quite possible that I will be required to sell my home and to move to some new assignment made by the Institute in another city, and the resulting financial loss could be quite heavy.

Having heard nothing from Father Kraft by February 15, 1965, I sent him a letter by certified mail stating that since I had several creditors who should be paid by the end of the month that I would appreciate payment within five days. I have still heard nothing from Father Kraft and so I felt that my only recourse was to write you this letter.

I fully realize that if I have, in some material way, failed to discharge my duties as set out in either of the two contracts of employment with Father Kraft then it is I who have breached the contract, and I would not expect Father Kraft to be concerned about this matter further. However, I do not feel this is the case. I believe the enclosed photostats of letters from Monsignor Rice, Father Joseph McDonald and of my present employer, Father John Costigan would indicate that the performance of my duties as an Inquiry Director at other Parishes in this Diocese has not been completely unsatisfactory. Both in my former practice of law and my studies in Theology, it was always made quite clear to me that any competent person over 21 years of age was responsible for the reasonable consequences of his acts in regard to the signing of a contract.

I will be most happy to discuss the above matter with you personally if you deem it advisable to do so. Father Elliot Short, Society of Jesus, the assistant Director of the Insitute is

presently in San Diego on a visit and I understand that he plans to contact your office in the next few days to request an appointment to pay you a courtesy visit. Perhaps you would prefer to discuss this matter with him.

In closing, let me say that I, personally, as well as the officials at the Institute in San Francisco greatly appreciate your kindness in allowing us to work in the Diocese: In view of this fact, I will be happy to give Father Kraft a release in this matter if you wish me to do so. However, I believe I would be remiss in my duty both to you and the church if I did not bring this matter to your attention.

Your Excellency:

In feference to your letter of March 1, 1965; you said that you intended to confer with Father William Kraft concerning the matter about which I wrote and then contact me later. I do not know if you have had an opportunity to discuss this matter further with Father Kraft, but I thought it advisable to write you again at this time in order to make my position as clear as possible. To do so it will be necessary for me to relate certain facts leading up to and prompting me to write my letter of February 20, 1965. I will attempt to be as brief as possible consistant with clarity.

In July of 1963 I was assigned by the Institute of Lay Theology to two parishes here in San Diego, St. Patrick and St. Agnes. Father John Costigan, O.S.A. signed the contract for St. Patrick and Father Joseph McDonald signed for St. Agnes. Both contracts were for three years. I have always gotten along well with both these priests.

In January of 1964, a new pastor was assigned to St. Agnes and Father McDonald was moved to another parish. Shortly after Father McDonald left, the new paster told me he wished to discontinue the program at St. Agnes as of June, 1964. I felt then, as I feel now, that in the absence of incompetence or moral turbitude on the part of the Inquiry Director, of a parish signs a contract for three years the Fastor has an obligation to honor that contract. However, since the new pastor was essentially unfamiliar with our program prior to coming to St. Agnes, and since he did not personally sign the contract himself, I felt there was some merit to his position.

At about the same time I was informed that Father Kraft was anxious to obtain the services of an Inquiry Director due to lack of clerical assistants. I contacted Father Kraft by phone and he wished to hire me sight unseen. I suggested that it would be advisable to meet personally and discuss the aims, methods and objectives of our program. We did so meet on June 29, 1964, and

Father Kraft signed a contract for two years ending June, 1966. This two year period represented the remaining portion of the St. Agnes contract.

Although Father Kraft and I did not seem to get along well personally, the Inquiry Forum at St. Therese was essentially a success. In all,194 people attended the Forum. Most of these persons were Catholic. At the conclusion of the Forum 12 persons were either baptised or expressed the desire to be baptised and 4 couples presented their marriage cases for examination and validation. While the Forum was in progress Father Kraft was assigned two assistants.

On December 22, 1964 Father Kraft informed me that he wished to discontinue the contract. He stated that as he now had an assistant who could conduct the Forum he did not consider it finanially advisable to retain the program. Unfortunately, he also elected to write a letter to the Institute stating other reasons for discontinuance. I now enclose a copy of this letter. I consider this letter a reflection on both my professional competence and my personal character. Approximately three weeks after writing the letter to the Institute, Father Kraft wrote a letter of recommendation on my behalf giving essentially the same reasons he gave me in our conversation of December 22, 1964. You already have a copy of this letter, but I now enclose a second copy for your convenient reference.

There remains due on Father Kraft's contract appreximately \$5,700.00. In short; Your Excellency, if I have been guilty of all the things Father Kraft states in his letter of December 19, 1964, I have been guilty of breach of contract due to incompetence, and he owes me nothing. If, on the other hand, I have not been guilty of these things, it is my opinion, that he has breached his contract and his maximum limit of liability is the amount remaining due on the contract.

At the present time I am faced with the immediate possibility of forechosure on my home and the expense of several thousand dollars in moving myself, my family and my furniture back to Tennessee. Father Kraft's attorney has suggested to me that "any further claims or demands be enforced by court action." I do not consider this procedure advisable. If I did not feel that there was an element of injustice in the facts set out above I certainly would not trouble you with this correspondence. However, under the present circumstances it seems that I have no other honorable and prudent course left open to me.

It is for this reason that I respectfully request an audience with you or someone appointed by you to discuss this matter.

As indicated in my previous letter, during the past few weeks I have contacted 14 Pastors and 4 Navy Chaplains in an effort to secure further employment as an Inquiry Forum Director for the time period covered by Fr. Kraft's contract. I am sorry to report that in all cases the answer was "not interested at the present time." It is now clear to me that further efforts along these lines would be equally futile. For this reason, I now plan to go back East around the end of the summer when I have completed the Forum now in progress at St. Fatrick's Church. I intend to remain in the program of the Institute of Lay Theology and Fr. Zimmers, the Director, tells me that there will be openings in other parishes in the East at that time.

I believe that I have now made every reasonable effort to arrive at an amicable agreement with Father Kraft by means of securing further employment. I can think of nothing further I can do at this time unless Your Excellency knows of some area I have failed to explore.

As you will recall, Father Kraft's attorney has suggested that if I have any further claim or demand that I should file suit. For this reason, in accordance with Canon Law, I now renew my request to file suit in Civil Court. Since any legal action taken here may affect the welfare of men from the Institute in other parts of the country, I will, of course, take no action until I have first received both the advice and consent of Father Zimmers.

I apologize for burdening Your Excellency with long and detailed correspondence over the past months. However, to question the actions of a Pastor in a case of this kind is a serious matter. Therefore, I wished to make sure that somewhere there would be available an official record stating the reasons for my actions.

Once again I thank you for your time and attention.

Your Excellency:

It is significant to note that his original agreement was made with the Administrator of Saint Agnes' Parish in San Diego. He expressed his "deepest gratitude" to me at the time of his dismissal from St. Agnes that I had allowed him to assist us though at that time no formal contract was entered. His primary contest should be with Saint Agnes' Parish and only with us secondarily. At any rate, it is noteworthy that in all this petulancy, we have received no communication from Father Zimmers. I understand through an informed source close to Mr. that he was definitely advised by the Institute some time ago not to enter a civil suit against the Diocese.

It is a matter of record that we have paid Mr. his full salary for six weeks beyond his termination with us with the hope that he would find a place of employment. He expressed at that time his gratitude for that positive gesture which was beyond our obligation in the strict sense. He has in fact been employed since February of this year and just this morning a newspaper article outlines another sixteen weeks, which we enclose.

I respectfully suggest that he be given the permission to enter a civil suit as we are fully prepared to face such action. It is ironic that an apostolate founded to be of real assistance to Parishes and the welfare of souls should in this case produce such opposite effects. The scandal already evoked from his actions would seem to elicit definite action by the Institute to re-evaluate the program. Please be assured of our utter willingness to accede to any disposition of this matter that Your Excellency may direct.

Your Excellency:

Many thanks for your letter of May 18th. Please know that I am most willing to explore any area that might lead to an amicable settlement of my differences with Father Kraft.

However, since an attorney has been retained by Father Kraft it would be unethical for me to attempt to discuss this matter with him personally.

As I mentioned previously, in his last letter to me dated March 24th, Mr. Raymond P. Coady, Father Kraft's attorney stated, "It is earnestly suggested that any further claim or demands be enforced by court action, if you deem the same advisable." I can only interpret this statement to mean, "Please do not trouble me again until such time as you have actually filed suit." Mr. Coady's failure to answer my last two letters written after March 24 would tend to support this interpretation.

The only other angle I can think of is an even more thorough canvas of Parishes in the San Diego area to determine if any Pastor desires my services for all or part of the time period covered by Father Kraft's contract (June, 1966). I will begin to do this immediately and let you know the results of my efforts in about one week.

Dear Mr. Coady:

On April 17, 1965, I received a letter from His Excellency, Bishop Furey, whom I had written in regard to the above matter. Bishop Furey advised me to deal derectly with Father Kraft in an effort to bring about an amicable settlement to this affair. In accordance with his advice, I would now like to offer the following proposal.

I have been offered further employment for a 4 month period on or about September 15, 1965. However, at the moment I am faced with getting through the next 4½ months on one half salary; that salary which I will receive from St. Patrick's Church. There fore, if your client would be willing to pay the sums set out in the contract he signed for the next 4½ months, I would be willing to consider all financial sums due me under the contract as "paid in full." This represents a total amount of \$1,600 and is \$4,100 less than the amount due under the contract.

I have this day written His Excellency, Bishop Furey, requesting permission to file suit in this matter and have enclosed a copy of this letter to you containing my offer.

If I am required to go to the expense of retaining an attorney I will, of course, be unable to again make such a favorable offer. Further, as I am sure you know, under the contract I have no maoral or legal obligation to accept tenative 4 month offers of employment. Therefore, if suit is filed it will not be 4½ months' salary. Rather, it will be for the loss sustained in the forced sale of a \$20,000 house and the expense of moving my family, my furniture and myself back to Tennessee.

Since I obviously must take some action in the near future, I would appreciate a written acceptance or rejection of this offer within 7 days of the date of this letter.

SUMMARY OF THE REASONS GIVEN FOR THE DISMISSAL OF THE INQUIRY DIRECTOR AT ST. THERESE PARISH: DIRECTOR'S ANSWERS TO THE REASONS GIVEN.

- Lay Theologian procedures and methods inconsistent with parish policies; restricted in scope; cannot be adopted to needs.
 - a. In June of 1964, I contacted the Pastor of St. Therese Parish by phone and asked him if he was interested in securing the services of an Inquiry Forum Director. He stated to me that he was very much interested and asked if I told him that I I would draw up the necessary papers. thought it advisable to meet and discuss the aims, objectives and methods of the Lay Apostolate Program. He stated that this would not be necessary in that he was thoroughly familiar with our program. He said Fr. John Odou, the agent of the Institute, had been to the Parish, discussed the Program at length and left him a copy of the contract. I told him I still thought it advisable that we meet personally and asked him if I could make an appointment. told me that he was too busy to make an appointment and that I should call him back later.
 - b. About one week later I was in the area and made a personal call at the Rectory with the hope that the Pastor would have a few minutes free. He was free at that time and we spent about one hour discussing the aims, objectives and methods of the program. These methods seemed acceptable to him and he again told me to draw up the contract.
 - c. On June 29, 1964 we again met and discussed the program for about one hour and signed the contract.

- d. On July 15th, 1964, I went to work for St. Therese Parish and shortly thereafter the Pastor and I met again and went over the program for about one hour; this time with charts, calendars and diagrams. I still have this material available in my files.
- e. It would seem that the Pastor was thoroughly familiar with the procedures and methods of our program as a result of his conversation with Fr. Odou and myself, both prior to and immediately after the signing of the contract. If these methods were "inconsistent with parish policies and restricted in scope" basic modifications should have been suggested by the Pastor before or immediately after signing the contract.
- 2. Assured that he could direct youth activities, but hopelessly futile due to lack of capability.
 - a. I assured the Pastor that although I had been active in and State President of the CYO in Tennessee I had absolutely no experience as a youth director—I told him I would help in this area to the best of my ability due to the need in the Parish.
 - b. About three weeks after going to work for St. Therese I stated publicly to a group of about 30 parents that I had no experience as a youth director but had taken over these duties in addition to my regular assignment at the request of the Pastor.
 - c. The Pastor made no complaint about my work as youth director during the time I served in that capacity.

- d. When I was "released" from my duties, the Pastor said, "I have some good news for you. Rick, who has been out of the city for awhile is back. He is studying to be a youth director. He is going to serve as the coach or athletic director. at the school and I am going to put him in charge of all youth activities. He has worked with the youth group before and it is more in line with his training. I appreciate the help you have given us in this area but now you can devote all your time to the job you were trained to do."
- e. About four months later the Pastor did make two complaints about my work as youth director. He said, "You failed to turn in the calendar of youth activities which I requested and everytime I came over to the youth dance on Sunday night you were just sitting around."
 - (1) I have a copy of the calendar to which the Pastor makes reference to in my files. It was submitted to and approved by him on August 18,1964.
 - (2) Miss Rosemary Ekberg, who was assigned as my assistant, was more than capable in directing the various dances and games of these young people. My assignment at these dances was primarily one of maintaining order and making sure that youthful exuberance did not exceed the bounds of propriety. I believe that I was always successful in this endeaver as the parents who chaperoned

the dances will be willing to testify.

- (3) Assuming that the Pastor forgot that he approved the calendar and that Miss Ekberg and I understood our assignments correctly; the Pastor has yet to state in what sense my efforts in this regard were "hopelessly futile."
- 3. Provided working schedule of 24 hours per week, but rearranged his schedule without further authorization.
 - a. When I began my assignment at St. Therese Parish, I had a working schedule of 6 days per week and three nights per 3 days and one night at St. Patrick and 3 days and 2 nights at St. Therese. Because we were in the organizational stage at St. Therese and because Sunday afternoon is a good time to see people at their homes to enlist their aid, one of the days assigned to St. Therese was Sunday .. After working about 3 weeks the Pastor pointed out that since I was working a full day for St. Patrick's on Saturday and since it was impossible to do much visiting on Sunday morning he felt that it was only just That I work 3 nights for St. Therese instead of only 2. I then submitted a schedule to the Pastor indicating that I was already working 24 hours per week for St. Therese as well as 24 hours for St. Patrick, and I did not feel that in justice I owed St. Therese a third night. As time progressed and especially after the Forum began in September, it became apparent that this schedule

was unrealistic and certain revisions were necessary.

- b. Shortly after going to work at St. Therese I asked the Pastor if it would be possible to meet with him 15 or 20 minutes each week to discuss the progress of the program. That the Pastor shall agree to such a meeting is clearly stipulated in the contract. The Pastor informed me that he was too busy and such meetings would be impossible.
- Pastor requesting certain changes from the schedule submitted during the organization phase and stating the reasons for those changes. The contract signed by the Pastor describes my job as "a new profession for laymen." Since professional persons ordinarily have a certain latitude in arranging their own working schedule, I felt that I had a right to make certain changes so long as those changes did not interfere with the efficient operation of the program and did not represent an injustice to the Pastor.
- d. If it is thought to be necessary I will be happy to discuss in detail the following questions:
 - (1) The exact nature of the changes
 - (2) The reasons for the changes
 - (3) Whether or not these changes represented an injustice to the Pastor and a violation of his rights under the contract.
- e. In my opinion, this lack of proper communication between the Pastor and myself contributed in large measure to the

misunderstanding concerning the schedule as well as other misunderstandings during the course of my employment at the Parish.

- 4. Failed in meeting deadlines.
 - a. Since no specific deadlines are mentioned, it is impossible to comment intelligently on this statement.
- 5. Made arrangements with a third parish to give of his time free, which interferred with his obligations to this Parish.
 - a. The Pastor of St. Therese was fully informed on June 29, 1964, of the proposed Forum to be held at St. Joseph's Cathedral and conducted by two other Inquiry Directors and myself. He was fully informed prior to his signing of the contract.
 - b. At that time I handed him a copy of my letter of June 18, 1964 to His Excellency, Bishop Furey, proposing the joint Forum. I then handed him the Bishop's letter to me of June 24, 1964 stating that he approved of the idea.
 - c. The Pastor then said, "I'm afraid that you are taking more work on yourself than you can do. Won't this interfere with your work at St. Therese?" I then explained that 3 directors had agreed to take part in the Forum; that the Forum was being conducted on my night off and that the work of giving provate instructions to those desiring to be received into the Church

would be divided 3 ways. The Pastor then said, "Well, under those circumstances I have no objections so kong as it does not interfere with your work here." Shortly thereafter he signed the contract.

- d. As it actually developed Mr. gave private instructions to all persons desiring to be received into the Church as a result of the Forum except one. This was because in September Mr. began work full time at the Cathedral as an Inquiry Director and as a teacher in the high school. I gave private instructions to one person on Thursday mornings at St. Patrick's.
- e. On Sunday, December 20, 1964, I was present at St. Joseph's Cathedral during the baptism of these persons. This prevented me from giving private instruction at St. Therese on Sunday afternoon as was my usual custom. I informed the Pastor that I would be absent on this date approximately three weeks prior to December 20, 1964 and he made no objections.
- f. In the latter part of November, 1964, the Fastor of St.

 Therese requested that I be present in the pulpit on Nov. 29 at all Sunday Masses except one high Mass. The first Mass began at 7:00 A.M.; the last Mass at 6:00 P.M. He requested that I direct the people to sit and stand at the proper times as the new Liturgy was being introduced. Although I was happy to perform this task, this assignment was not

called for by the contract and was not agreed on prior to its signing. Therefore, I believe that the Pastor probably received just compensation for any loss of services he might have sustained on December 20th.

- g. Aside from my absence on December 20th, when or in what way my participation in the Joint Forum interferred with my obligations to St. Therese is not made clear.
- 6. Only 5 persons batised out of an initial attendance of 150.
 - a. My records indicate that 142 persons attended the opening session of St. Therese Forum on Wednesday, Sept. 16, 1964. Of these 115 indicated that they were Catholic and 27 indicated that they were non-Catholic. The average attendance per session for the 14 week course was 88. The average non-Catholic attendance was 18. At the close of the Forum 7 adults and 2 children were immediately baptised. Five other persons expressed a desire to be baptised after further instruction. Four couples presented their marriages for validation. One validation took place before my leaving St. Therese. Varification of these figures can be provided if necessary.
- 7. Neophytes poorly instructed in form of confession and in the conditions required for a sin to be mortal.
 - a. On Tuesday evening, Dec. 15, about 6:00 PM, the day before the last Inquiry Lecture was to be given, the Pastor phoned me at my office at St. Therese. He said that the Baptisms were to take place the following Tuesday. Since I divide

my time between two parishes, this gave me only 2 full working days at St. Therese to make appointments with each person desiring to be baptised to make sure that they had memorized the proper prayers and knew the formula for confession. I asked the Pastor if it would be possible to delay the baptisms a day or so to make sure I had a chance to meet with each one. He said, "That is out of the guestion."

- b. The conditions required for a sin to be mortal were thoroughly covered during the lecture series. On Nov. 18th two hours of lecture were devoted to sin and confession.
- c. All persons recommended by me as eligible and prepared for baptism were baptised personally by the Pastor at the close of the series. Apparently, the Pastor felt that further extensive instruction prior to baptism was unnecessary for these persons.
- 8. The program has not been the asset hoped for because of lack of competency of the Director.
 - a. On Nov.25, 1964, after working at the Parish 4 months, the Pastor stated publically to a group of approximately 60 persons, "St. Therese is very fortunate in having Mr.
 - with us and it is my hope that it will be possible to have him with us for many years to come. It is my opinion that the program of the Institute of Lay Theology is definitely a thing of the future in the Church."
 - b. On Dec. 19, 1964 in his letter to the Institute of Lay
 Theology the Pastor describes the Director as "hopelessly

futile in his efforts" and the program as not being an asset to the parish "Due to the lack of competency" of the Director.

- c. On Jan. 19, 1965, the Pastor described the program as successful and the Director as able.
- d. Although competency or incompetency is to a large extent a subjective matter of opinion; objectively, the Pastor's statements seem to be in conflict on the question.

Reverend and dear Father Zimmers:

After persevering through our Lay Apostolate Program for the past six months, it is our considered and definite opinion that it be terminated at the earliest possible date. We have found the procedures and methods of the Lay Theologian assigned to us as inconsonant with our parish policies and apparently restricted in their scope that they cannot be adapted to meet our needs.

We were motivated to commence the program because of the sudden death of one of our Assistant Priests and we felt a genuine necessity to augment our parish staff with the services of Mr. We were also hard pressed at that time for the services of a competent adult to direct our youth activities. Mr. assured us that he could amply cover these needs but after two to three weeks with our youth group, we found him hopelessly futile in his efforts due to lack of capability though this was clearly stipulated in his contract. He was relieved of that burden to concentrate solely on his Apostolate Program. He provided us with a working schedule which indicated twenty-four hours a week, but he held this as arbitrary and arranged a schedule to his own fancy without our further authorization. He frequently was found to fail in meeting deadlines we deemed essential to the efficient operation of his program which involved our complicity. He unwisely made arrangements with a third parish to give of his time "gratis" and we have noted that this interfered with his obligations in justice to us. After attracting some 150 people to his initial lecture, it was disappointing to us to learn that but five were willing to receive Baptism and of those some were already under instruction before undertook his program.

The priest who interviewed these prospective neophytes informed us that none of them knew the formula or procedure for confession roor did they reveal a basic knowledge of the conditions required that a sin be mortal. The program has not been the asset to the parish that we had hoped due to the lack of competency of Mr. and we feel that we can no longer continue the program in justice to our obligations to the people of the parish.

We hope that you will be understanding in our regard and work out some favorable solution to all parties involved. We have not informed Mr. of our decision as we have awaited your notification of what arrangements can be made.

Thank you for the opportunity of conducting this pilot program, as we are now satisfied that such an approach is not practical for our parish.

I have your letter of January 31, 1966, concerning your interest in seeing a Catholic High School in the general San Carlos area. We have often thought that such a plan would be good and have adequate land for such a purpose.

I met with Most Reverend Bishop Furey recently and during our discussion the subject of Catholic high schools came up and the Bishop apprised us of the fact that the enrollment in the high schools in the Discese had decreased recently, and on that basis perhaps it seemed inadvisable at the moment to consider additional such facilities.

We have discussed similar matters at some length with the San Diego School District and their experience over the past few years has shown, because of population relocation, a reduction in enrollment in their elementary and high schools that lie in the older areas of the City. However, at the same time, they have experienced almost abnormal increases in enrollment in the newer developing areas of the City, such as Clairemont, San Carlos and the like.

We feel that a decision of this type would of necessity have to come from the Bishop, if such a facility is indicated. Again, we are in a position to make land available for such a purpose. If there is anything further that we can do, please do not hesitate to let us know.



As paster of over five thousand people who comprise Saint Therese Parish, it is incumbent upon me to apprise you of our uniform opposition to the action taken by the City Planning Commission today to regore the thirty-five acres adjacent to the parish property to R-2 thus permitting the erection of high-density housing of over 400 units.

This action is a dangerous one and inconsistent with the residential development of the Del Cerro Community. Such a development would create insurmountable difficulties with egress and access to an already overburdened traffic pattern. Due to the bi-level of College Avenue, the future inhabitants would of necessity overburden Lance Street, the main access to St. Therese property. Over 200 vehicles enter our church grounds every week-day during the prime traffic hours to purport their children to Saint Therese Academy — with the volume of traffic coming from the proposed development on the same street attempting to make left hand turns, this would be a temptation for those in the housing development to tresspass church property to seek more immediate egress, thus endangering our children. The fire department is already concerned with the present volume of traffic on Lance Street which they face.

We strongly urge you to vigorously defeat this re-zoning measure when it comes before the City Council. These unscrappious developers have already usurped the city's proposed master plan in their development of Princess Del Cerro in their failure to allocate ample land for schools, parks and churches. We have every confidence that you will champion our cause as you have soooften in the past.

If there is some way we can improve our services to you or we can apologize to you for any mis-service rendered to you, please tell us. Never before have we found it so difficult to meet our obligations. Please understand the predicament -- it isn't easy to manage this large complex and I need your support -- even if you are unable to give it to me in dollars and cents, then please smile anyway - your moral encouragement means something.

I shall surely try to maintain your parish as the best in the city -- but I can't continue to do it without your help.

Re: Memorandum of Conference Held on October 10, 1969

As requested I will attempt herein to restate in essence the subjects discussed during our most pleasant meeting in your office on this date. Before beginning, however, I wish to thank you for honoring me with the valuable amount of time you so generously proferred.

In recounting my notes concerning Father Kraft and his objections to our development of the hillside acreage adjacent to his church, the following recollections are relevant:

- a. He stated his belief that the total number of units to be constructed by us in the neighborhood of 600 and this is the basis he has proceeded upon. He claims that he will not tolerate construction of more than 225 (approximately) units and that if more than this number are built over his objection, he will shut down the parochial school he operates. He claims that this is being considered with the full approval of his Parish School Board.
- b. He claims that the traffic flow generated by the new units will create a jeopardy to the community which he will not tolerate and claimed that the hazard from increased traffic flow is further complicated by the split level posture of College Avenue adjacent to the proposed construction.
- c. Father Kraft was extremely critical of Princess' plans to construct on property not owned in entirety by this company.
- d. Father Kraft also indicated strong opposition to the construction of apartment-type units as he felt that that product would bring too many transient-type people into the local area.
- e. Father Kraft feels that all dealings with him should be conducted through his attorney. He stated further that he made a special trip to Santa Rosa, California, to explain his position to the new Bishop of San Diego and asserts that the Bishop is backing him.

Addressing myself specifically to Father Kraft's assumptions, I submit the following for your learned consideration:

It is the intention of this company to construct a PUD (Planned Unit Development) on the 36 acres of the lower hillside and on the upper 36 acres on the same hillside. The upper acreage is presently in escrow and is being purchased by this company from the owners, Alcoa Pacific.

In reference to Sub-paragraph A above, the PUD will contain 448 units and will basically consist of two-story and some three-story split-levels. In each case the lower level of the building is to be a self-contained two-car garage for off-street parking. All of the units are based upon condominium-type architecture and it is anticipated that 90% of the total development will consist of purchasers of these condominiums. The remaining 10% will be let on long term leases. The price range of these condominiums is planned to range from \$30,000 (one bedroom unit) to \$70,000 (three bedroom structure).

Concerning Father Kraft's belief as stated in Sub-paragraph B, you will recall that I displayed to you the results of the recently engineered traffic count and survey conducted by licensed consultants in traffic engineering retained by this company. The conclusion of this survey was that there is no jeopardy to be feared from too great an increase in traffic resulting from this development.

The streets as they are presently engineered will be further improved by our videning of Lance Street to five lanes; the construction of a left turn island on College Avenue; and a left turn island on Lance Street. In addition, the intersection would normally be signalized by the Street Department when future traffic counts indicate the desirability of it. College Avenue shall have continuous sidewalks where none exist at this time. Lance Street, presently only two lanes wide, would become a hazard if allowed to remain this width. However, the installation of the additional lanes, plus the left turn islands mentioned above, will materially reduce the pedestrian hazard on College Avenue. Upon completion of this PUD, our traffic engineers and the San Diego City Engineers believe it will be safer for children and automobiles at this intersection than it is presently.

The matter referred to by Father Kraft in Sub-paragraph C is obviously a product of lack of current information on the part of Father Kraft's advisors.

In relation to Sub-paragraph D, broad experience on a national basis has proven that condominium purchasers on a whole have far fever children per family than do buyers of single family residences. It might be roughly estimated that the number of children in 443 condominium units would probably not exceed the total to be found in an R-1 single family residential development of 225 homes. Consequently, it does not appear that there should be any fear on the part of the local Parish of a sudden innundation of children for whom educational facilities are not adequate.

Also discussed at our meeting was the fact that under the PUD, the City maintains full control and will compel the developer to build what has been proposed and approved. In order to comply with PUD zoning, the developer must do the necessary planting, landscaping, installation of watering systems for said plantings, and in addition to everything else, complete the development as an aesthetic improvement to the community as a whole. In contrast to this

a normal hillside subdivision can create a multitude of small lots, referred to as "rice paddies" which would normally result in large cuts and fills which would scar the hillside for many years to come. There are many such single home developments in San Diego and this is basically what we are trying to avoid.

The total development, Your Excellency, will be enclosed with an attractive, substantial, decorative wall and there will be no more than three entrances to the development, two on Cdlege Avenue and one on Lance Street. These entrances will be guard-controlled to monitor egress and ingress and to guarantee to the condominium owners the aura of privacy, refinement and gracious living which they are seeking. The only commercial application planned for this development will be an attractive little "convenience center" in one corner of the parcel. This, I understand, is to cover no more than 6,000 square feet and will contain such things as a Laundry pickup point, delicatessen and the like.

This opportunity to discuss the development of our property with you was another fine example of the continuing spirit of mutual helpfulness that has made your Diocese and the City of San Diego the most pleasant place in the world in which to live and work.

Your understanding in this matter is earnestly solicited and, in closing, let me reassure you that Princess Homes, having the interest of the community at heart, will continue to encourage this spirit of mutual respect.

William Andrew Kraft, resident of Rancho Santa Fe for the past twelve years, passed away on December 26th. He had resided on El Camino Real with his wife, Elizabeth Ruth, since coming to the Rancho from Rochester, New York in 1959.

During these past years Mr. Kraft had been a booster of Rancho Santa Fe never neglecting an opportunity to hail the praises of his community which he loved so much. He and his wife had been land-owners in Rancho Santa Fe for several years before coming to reside in California.

A native of Rochester, New York, William Kraft had been associated with Eastman Kodak Company for thirty-nine years in the development and design engineering of the camera and projector division. He had obtained patents as inventor of basic design for modern development of camera and projector design. In recent years before retirement in 1959, he was Chief Engineer of the Experimental Engineering Department of the Apparatus Division of Eastman Kodak Company. He was a native of Rochester. New York and had attended Rochester Institute of Technology and the University of Rochester in that city. Mr. Kraft was overjoyed to have seen his son complete the parish plant consisting of church, sixteen-room school, convent, rectory and hall with a debt of over one million dollars completely paid when Father Kraft resigned his pastorate in December of 1969. Mr. Kraft was enthusiastic in assisting his son, Father Kraft, to found a new parish, the Church of the Good Shepherd, to serve the new communities of Los Penasquitos, Mira Mesa and Scripps Miramar Ranch in San Diego. Besides being a benefactor of Saint Therese and Good Shepherd parishes, Mr. Kraft and his wife donated the Saint William Chapel and a transcept window at the Immaculata at the University of San Diego where Mr. Kraft's solemn obsequies were conducted by his son on December 29th with entombment at the Kraft Family Chapel at Holy Cross Mausoleum in San Diego.

Your Excellency:

I have been a member of the parish of St. Therese of the Child Jesus since 1957 and a member of the diocese for over thirty years. Recently you chose to transfer the Reverend William Kraft from his position as pastor of St. Therese. I am writing this letter because I believe you should be aware of the high regard in which I hold Father Kraft.

When I became a member of the parish in 1957, we had no permanent facilities in which to hold services. The parish was less than a year old and Father Kraft was its first pastor. We held services in garages, homes and a warehouse. As the area in which we were residing was largely a new subdivision development, practically all of the parishioners had transferred their membership from other more established areas and churches. Father Kraft saw the urgent need for a permanent facility and, through his efforts, was able to secure property on which our present parish and school are located. He subsequently caused the construction of the church, school and rectory, and in the course of this construction, the parish incurred a substantial debt. He promised us, however, at that time that he would use every effort to reduce that debt in as short a time as possible. I believe he fulfilled this promise admirably. As you undoubtedly know, we are now free from debt and have some substantial surplus for additional construction.

Through his efforts we were able to secure the staff of sisters which presently teaches in our school. He has been able to keep tuition charges at a minimum and enable parishioners to send their children to a school which offers a good Christian education. My family has been most fortunate in this respect in that we have been able to educate our children in that parish school.

I am not going to attempt to persuade you in this letter that Father Kraft is not a man without faults. I have not

always agreed with his course of action in certain respects, but I always found him willing to listen to my point of view. Whether we agreed or not, we were able to work together for the good of the parish.

As a spiritual leader, I believe that he has been outstanding. This became even more readily apparent over the past three or four years. Father Kraft showed himself to be willing to accept change and to make such modifications, particularly in the liturgy, as would lend themselves to a religious revival.

To paraphrase St. Paul, I sincerely believe that if one were to say that Father Kraft was ambitious, it was ambition to make the parish of St. Therese of the Child Jesus the best parish in the diocese. I believe if one were to say that Father Kraft was demanding and authoritative, it was to demand of his parishioners the religious and parochial zeal which was needed and give direction at times when direction was required.

In conclusion, I must respectfully say that my family and I deeply regretted your decision in transferring Father Kraft from his post as our pastor. This is not to say that we question your decision or feel any reluctance in accepting Bishop Quinn as our pastor, however, I trust that the thoughts I have expressed above will be considered by you when future assignments for Father Kraft are to be made.

Your Excellency Bishop Maher:

For over thirteen years I have known and served a very special, dedicated servant of God, Father William Kraft. You may have some perfectly valid reasons for your actions but they remain a mystery to not only a great number of concerned laity, but a number of young priests in the Diocese who wonder if mayoe they might not be similarly treated after many years of faithful service.

I apologize for having to bother you in this fashion as I know you must have many other important matters to attend to, but do you know of any other way the laity can express their views other than writing directly to you? The Diocesan Paper, the Southern Cross, is virtually worthless as a source of information, controversy, education, or a vehicle of self-expression for the thousands of puzzled concerned members of Christ's Mystical Body in our Diocese.

Although I do not expect a reply to this letter, I feel I deserve one and would appreciate one to help straighten out my thoughts in these areas.

God bless you and help you in you pastoral duties in San Diego. I hope we can arrange to have the pleasure and honor of a visit to our campus at Grossmont College during 1970. I will contact your secretary on this matter to request a visit sometime in January.



This Catholic Church has all the beauty of faith necessary to live in this world in preparation for the next. We preach JUSTICE - but do we practice it?

We preach "LOVE THY NEIGHBOR" but if we practice it, in truth - other "neighbors" view it with an over critical eye.

Our Church preaches "the healthy FAMILY LIFE", but when circumstances such as divorce come along, our children are denied this blessing by the very same Church. So we, the unwilling SINGLE PARENTS, try to make do with honorable associations, which help but never really substitute for the healthy family life.

We call our priest -"Father". We place him in a special place of honor, as a friend and moral support. When we see one dedicate his life so lovingly to his work, it is hard not to speak up when he is shoved aside; especially when it is by his Church that preaches justice.

Now you have made your choice. And I am of my opinion.

I love my Church enough not to go around spouting this opinion, because I know it would make it difficult for Mons. Maury. I do not know him. I am sure in many ways he is quite capable. He will be our pastor and should know what he is facing. This opinion of mine rests in the hearts of many, whose voices you may never hear.

I will accept him and be of whatever help I can be to him. I will also pray that the Church that preaches JUSTICE will one day show better examples of it.

My son, Neil, is in college and I hear what the young have to say. A lot of it, is rebellious self-will. But some truth is there! Sometimes, we of fhe established Church, are wrong!!

Two Jehovah's Witnesses met me in front of my home this morning. One is an ex-Catholic. Why did she leave? Because she say the religeon only as it was being <u>practiced</u> in the Church, which in truth, is oftentimes the hypocracy that the young are also spouting about.

I told them that not all Catholics are Christian and not all Jehovah's Witnesses are Christian. A real Christian, when found, is a beautiful being - no matter what you call him!

No amount of denying or affirming will attest to the truth of this more than the life and witness of such a being.

I also told them that I believed that rather than running away from these inconsistancies, it was Christ's will that we stay and work to bring the Church closer to Christ. Since a Catholic will listen to a Catholic - much better than a Jehovah's Witness - I know where I am to stay.

Now if I am willing to tell this opinion to a Jehovah's Witness, then I will also tell it to the Catholic to whom it should be of concern.

Dear Bishop Maher,

I wanted to delay my writing to you so that my anger could subside. This anger was aroused when you unceremoniously relieved Father Kraft of his duties at Saint Therese. I feel that you must have done this on an impluse to meet some other need because if you had seriously looked at Father Kraft's accomplishments and his good works you would NEVER have made this decision.

Father Kraft came here in 1955 and under his guidance the parish developed one of the most beautiful churches in this diocese. In addition he had built a new school which has an excellent academic standing in the community. He struggled to pay off the huge debt and in the process developed close friends as well as a minority "backbiting critics". This minority in our parish were generally those who did not wish to tithe and felt it an imposition. Notwithstanding the guidance and managerial competence of our pastor prevailed and the church is now debt free. His inspiration and help in religious matters were beyond description and he was always responsive to any request - NO MATTER WHO ASKED FOR HELP.

No sooner had the debt been paid and his principal life work accomplished - he was relieved. The unfortunate thing is that you made no attempt to come or send a special representative to this parish and express your thanks publicly for his excellent work and at least make it "appear" that you were pleased with his work. The manner in which it was handled clearly showed that he was expendable.

I have your letter of July 30 in which you present your counsel about the parish of St. Therese with a Bishop as part-time Pastor. There are many parishes throughout the united States where the Auxiliary Bishops have served as Pastors and continue to do so.

It could be that Bishop Quinn's present schedule has taken him from the parish more than usual, but I am sure that he will be in a position to spend more time in the parish. The normal Confirmation schedule will not interfere with pastoral duties.

I have heard from many of the parishioners and they are delighted to have Bishop Quinn as their Bastor.

As far as the changes in the sanctuary are concerned, this is a matter I think can be solved better by a personal interview with Bishop Quinn. Perhaps you can phone and make an appointment and discuss the matter with him.
