Due to the far-ranging effects from the Mexican Revolution of 1910 to 1917, the arrival of refugee priests - particularly after 1926 - from that troubled land made it possible to establish parishes and missions in California to care for earlier Spanish-speaking arrivals in their own language. One of these refugees was Father Jose Rosendo Nunez who later served three decades at Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish in San Bernardino from 1939 until his death in 1968. He was named a monsignor by Pope Pius XII in 1949. Prior to his last assignment, he had served in several parishes on both sides of the border.

Monsignor Nunez was born on November 6, 1894, to Jesus Nunez and Maria Refugio Cabrera at the town of Jerez in the state of Zacatecas, Mexico. The boy had two sisters (Aurora and Ruth) and one brother (Ramon). Jose attended the local public schools from 1900 to 1909 and then entered the seminary for the Diocese of Zacatecas where he remained until 1922.

While in residence there, General Francisco Villa invaded the city in the spring of 1914. Villa and his henchmen killed several priests and teaching religious brothers before moving on to other targeted areas. Although the seminarians were spared, many of them

left the danger zone to attend a newly-opened Mexican Seminary at Castroville, near San Antonio, Texas. Jose Nunez was not far enough advanced in his studies to be among them. He was obliged by the circumstances of Zacatecas' capture to take his studies for the priesthood underground in the sacristy of the cathedral. He was there assigned homework to study at home - meaning Jerez, not the dormitory. In post-Revolutionary days, the priest was once asked where he had studied, in what seminary. He replied: in the Seminary of "Mi Casa". All of those who did not go to Castroville at times literally studied "at home". More than once the young seminarian had to return to Jerez to wait out the cruder months of the revolution. He was able to find employment any time that he returned because people knew that he was sincere and honest and interested in seeing the community advance. As a born musician he was also popular among the town's youth.

Finally, he completed his studies and was ordained on September 3, 1922, by the Right Rev. Michael de la Mora y Mora, who was Bishop of Zacatecas from 1911 to 1922. Father Nunez' first assignment was at Mazapil in the state of Zacatecas from 1922 to 1926.

The youthful priest, as did all of the Mexican clergy, soon realized that the promulgation of a constitution in 1917 did not really terminate the religious persecution stemming from the political revolution. In May 1926, just before the clergy went on strike en masse for three years, he crossed the border to become an

assistant at Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish in San Diego. By January 1927, he was reassigned to St. Bernardine's Parish in San Bernardino. While there he organized the Christ the King mission on Rialto Avenue. After six months, he became the first pastor of St. Anthony Parish in National City, a San Diego suburb.

Within two years, Father Nunez deemed it to be safe enough to return to his native land. In November 1929, he was assigned to Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish in Tijuana, Baja California. In 1930, he also received the special assignment as Apostolic Pro-Vicar of Lower California.

But the fires of persecution returned yet again in January 1932. A ruling by the Mexican government set a limit of one priest to every 50,000 inhabitants in the nation's federal districts. Lower California, not then a state, was included with the Mexico City district. This meant just one priest for all of Baja; Father Nunez was notified to close his church and leave the country. The government ruled that the priest at Mexicali would have charge of the Lower California district upon the closure of churches at Ensenada, as well as Tijuana.

Mexicali is 190 miles from Ensenada; from Tijuana to Mexicali it is 103 miles. Considering the poor roads in Baja, it was impossible for the population, 90% Catholic, to attend Mass. In protest, the archbishop of Mexico City closed the church in Mexicali, leaving Lower California without a priest.

It was the belief of Father Nunez that the government's new

ruling was directed in a spirit of revenge against the Mexican people because of the recent great pilgrimage to the shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe near Mexico City. This had occurred in December 1931 during the 400th anniversary celebration of the Virgin's appearance in that vicinity. Previously, the government had appeared to be satisfied with its accomplishments since 1926 in blotting out the faith. The referenced celebration caused the government to realize that faith was still undaunted by persecution and that only renewed repressive measures was the proper solution to the problem of a recalcitrant church.

Father Nunez had just erected a new church which was not quite completed. The government notified him that he would be permitted to complete the structure. However, he stopped the work in the face of an uncertain future. A clause in the law would permit the government to confiscate the building. There was also agitation in government circles to turn it into a public library.

Mexican officials next notified him that he was privileged to return to Mexico and live as a Mexican citizen, but he could not celebrate Mass or hold any services in the church or in the homes of parishioners. Instead, Father Nunez chose exile and never returned to the land of his birth in a pastoral capacity, thus remaining a refugee for 36 years.

When he went to Tijuana in 1929, he succeeded Father Alloero who had been ordered by the government to leave Mexico because of his Italian birthplace, Mexico having passed a law that none but

native-born priests could remain in the country. Rev. Alloero then founded Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish in San Ysidro, another San Diego suburb. Upon his notification of expulsion in 1932, Father Nunez also followed to San Ysidro. He carried the Blessed Sacrament with him from his Tijuana church. When Fr. Alloero died on December 3, 1932, Fr. Nunez was appointed parish pastor.

Another priestly career which closely paralleled that of Monsignor Nunez was that of Father Jose Santiago Valencia from the Diocese of Chihuahau. He became pastor at San Diego's Our Lady of Guadalupe Church in 1930, succeeded Fr. Nunez at San Ysidro in 1935 and then was assigned to San Salvador Church in Colton, 1937-1966, death coming after 36 years in exile.

It is of interest that these exiled priests at first grouped themselves together until the passage of time and concomitant events virtually precluded their return to former pastorates. An estimate placed the total of exiles at 120 priests and bishops, most of whom arrived in the United States during the 1926-1929 period. (As noted elsewhere, Mexican people had been arriving in ever-increasing numbers since about 1900.) The first get-together for priests was at a "Spanish Priests' Retreat" held at Sierra Madre from October 17 to 25, 1932. When the priests signed in, the register showed the diocese of origin. Of the 26 attendees, 16 were from Mexico, eight from Spain and two from the U.S. At the next retreat which began June 10, 1935, some 20 were from Mexico, three from Spain and eleven from the U.S. Father Nunez attended

both conclaves, as did his friend, Fr. Valencia and several others.

These statistics can be interpreted that this special group of pastors had psychologically begun acquiring a sense of belonging by 1935. Instead of stating their diocese of origin as in 1932, they had begun stating their diocese of assignment. From that time on they would attend retreats with the rest of the diocesan clergy, as no record exists of subsequent "Spanish Priests' Retreats".

It is also noteworthy that after 1935, Mexican priests began to be assigned to more inland parishes while Irish origin priests appeared at parishes near the Mexican border. The reason for this is unclear. It is possible that Mexican civil authorities exerted pressure which would result in fewer people, for example, crossing from Tijuana to San Ysidro to attend Mass. Or, the assignment change was related to a more enlightened diocesan policy of exposing non-Hispanic origin priests to largely ethnic parishes and at the same time exposing Mexican-origin priests to parishes not closely aligned to Mexican communities south of the border. Father Nunez, as noted, had already had the advantage of diverse assignments when he assisted at St. Bernardine's as early as 1927.

Consequently, it was not surprising that he was reassigned in 1935 from San Ysidro to Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish in Ontario. After three years there, he was sent to Our Lady of Guadalupe Shrine (then still known as St. Francis of Assisi Parish) in Riverside. On November 1, 1939, came the call to move to Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish on the westside of San Bernardino, his third

consecutive assignment "in the north".

Upon his arrival, Father Nunez found a parish that needed a firm hand. It had had a unique history in its short existence. Unlike the usual order of establishing parish institutions, the parochial school had been established first in order to teach English to the influx of people crowding in west of St. Bernardine's Church and east of Colton, a city having a large Hispanic population with ties to their historic New Mexican origins, not recent Mexican. In 1919, the mother church of St. Bernardine's purchased the old public school and grounds on Spruce Street north of Mt. Vernon Avenue. Soon the school was moved to a site at Fifth and Stanford Streets (now known as Pico). With the crowding at St. Bernardine's, even though it had a new church built in 1910, it became feasible by 1920 to have a Sabbath Mass said at the school. In effect, the school became a weekend mission although it was not called that and had no formal name aside from the school's name of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Despite the continuing need for the school, it could not survive the problems of the Great Depression and closed in 1932.

Meanwhile, the concerted campaign continued to establish a parish and build a church. An abortive effort occurred in 1925 when an Irish priest, Rev. Peter O'Dowd, attempted to form an organized congregation. Since he did not speak Spanish, he experienced a very difficult assignment and was replaced after a year. The next assignee was Father Juan Rossi, who is usually

given the credit for founding Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish in 1926, some seven years after the school had been established. He started almost immediately building the first church.

In 1931, after a successful five years, he was reassigned. The next series of pastors came from a religious order rather than being diocesan priests. The history of this change stretches back to Agua Mansa's San Salvador Parish in the 1860's. During that decade, the pastor at that parish had been Padre Pedro Verdaguer. He was reassigned to the cathedral parish in Los Angeles and also for a time to San Gabriel Mission. Bishop Thomas J. Conaty of Los Angeles through the now Bishop Verdaguer of Brownsville, Texas, invited the Claretian Fathers from Spain to care for the Spanish-speaking in Cucamonga and Chino and points east. (The influx from Mexico had started, but as noted, priests did not for the most part migrate until the 1920's.)

The Claretian Fathers arrived in 1905 and remained until 1929 when they had to concentrate their efforts just to locations in Los Angeles and San Gabriel. To replace them, the Augustinian Fathers from Spain were invited to provide ministerial services. The center of activity was moved easterly to Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish in San Bernardino. Three Augustinian Recollects served from 1931 to 1939. During their regime the church was completed, and the rectory was renovated and made adequate.

Bishop Charles F. Buddy of the new San Diego Diocese decided that the supply of Mexican-origin priests had grown sufficiently so

that diocesan priests could now minister to parishes with predominately Hispanic congregants. Accordingly, he appointed Father Nunez as the next pastor at Our Lady of Guadalupe, located just a short distance from his friend, Fr. Valencia, at Colton.

Shortly before Fr. Nunez's switch from Riverside's Our Lady of Guadalupe Shrine, World War II had begun. Any plans for construction and expansion soon were placed in abeyance until the end of hostilities. Upon the occasion of the 415th anniversary of the Our Lady of Guadalupe vision, a solemn coronation of Our Lady was held in December 1946. Bishop Buddy was present and also the Mexican consul stationed in San Bernardino. Rev. Gregorio Aguilar, Protonotary Apostolic from Mexico City, preached on that occasion.

In due course construction and expansion did occur to meet the needs of a steadily growing parish. In 1949, the school which had been closed seventeen years previously, was reopened. For two years the old building was used until a new grade school was completed in 1951. After the economic vicissitudes of the 1970's and 1980's, the parochial school was closed again in 1989. The Sisters of the Poor opened the Guadalupe Care Center in 1960. The building was closed and the nursery moved to Nunez Park in 1977; the building stood empty and was demolished in 1983. At the same time the old rectory (used as a convent), the old school building and added portions were also destroyed after having been condemned. A new Junior High School was opened in 1965.

The crown jewel in the construction program was a new church

dedicated on Our Lady of Guadalupe Day, December 12, 1954. In addition, a new rectory was built.

Death came from a stroke to Monsignor Nunez at the age of 73 on January 23, 1968, in St. Bernardine's Hospital. A Solemn Pontifical Concelebrated Mass of Requiem was held the morning of January 27 in Our Lady of Guadalupe Church. Entombment followed in the afternoon in the Priests' Section of Holy Cross Mausoleum in San Diego.

Thus ended a career spanning 45 years of service, full of accomplishments despite the political adversities of his century. Both of his sisters survived him and continued living a quiet life in the family's home town of Jerez until their passing in the 1980's.

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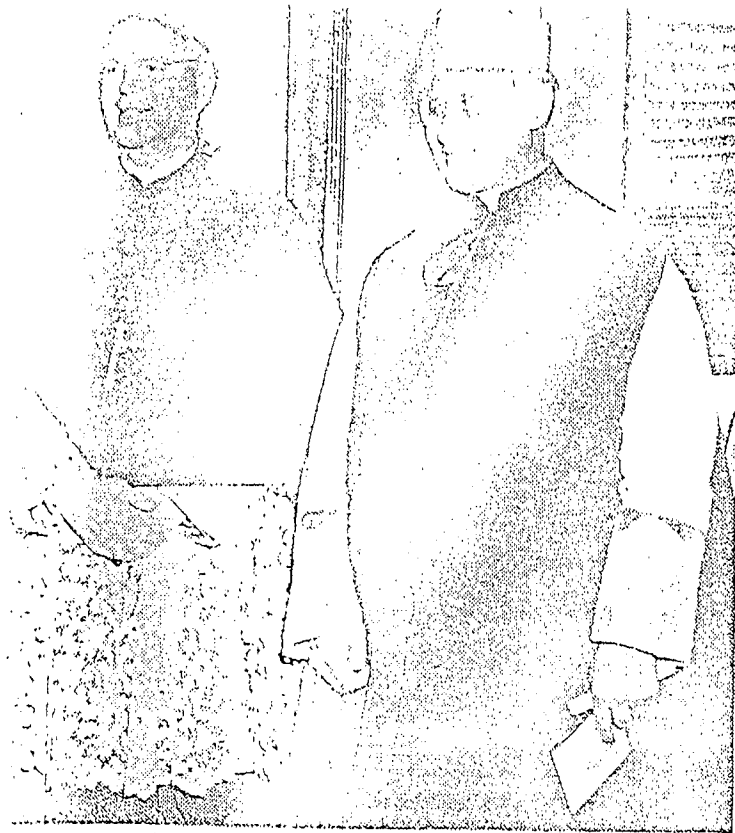

As Domestic Prelate

S. D. Ordinary Presides at Solemn Rites Attended by Many Prominent Officials

SAN BERNARDINO—In the presence of more than 20 of his brothers in the priesthood; some 30 representatives of five religious orders of women, several lay dignitaries including the Governor and Mrs. Earl Warren, and a large congregation of parishioners and friends, Rt. Rev. Joseph R. Nunez was invested in the purple robes of a domestic prelate at Our Lady of Guadalupe Church here, on last Sunday afternoon, October 16.

Many in Procession

At 4 p.m. a colorful procession of acolytes in red and white garments, priests in black cassocks and white surplices, monsignori in the purple robes of their rank, high officials of the state, and the Most Reverend Bishop of the diocese passed through a guard of white-helmeted Catholic War Veterans into the Church, to the strains of "Ecce Sacros Magnus" and "Come Holy Ghost."

The ceremonies proper were opened by Rt. Rev. Msgr. Thomas J. Matthews who read in Latin, Spanish and English the papal brief citing Monsignor Nunez for his "outstanding work for Holy Mother Church."

Blessed By Bishop

The prelatial robes were then blessed and placed around the neck of Monsignor Nunez by His Excellency, the Most Reverend Bishop. The Episcopal blessing was given and the new monsignor was welcomed into their midst by the domestic prelates present.

Rev. Matthew J. Thompson, Corona, and the Rev. Theodore Zurek, Fontana, assisted the Most Reverend Bishop at the investiture. Other priests present were Rt. Rev. Msgr. Peter Lynch, Dean of Riverside, Rt. Rev. Msgr. Francis C. Ott, Very Rev. Richard R. Daniels, Vice Chancellor, Rev. Michael Byrne, Rev. James Pruzinski, Rev. Thomas O'Toole, Rev. K. E. McNally, Rev. His graces are necessary, for without them what could I, a weak mortal do. For this grace undeservedly received I bow my head in profound reverence and humbly thank God, my helper.

"Even though it took nine months," continued the prelate, "the trial was well worth the time and the effort. The verdict will reassure and gratify people everywhere throughout the country. The sentence passed upon the five defense attorneys for contempt of court by Judge Medina will teach Communists and their friends that they may not safely introduce into American court rooms the robust tactics and disorderly procedure which they found so successful elsewhere and with the importance of which they have been so thoroughly indoctrinated by their Moscow masters."

Some of us have been attending Mass at Tijuana Mex. as that place has been more convenient for us and, even so, we have difficulty in taking a stage sometimes as they are full and will not stop for us. The fare is sixty cents apiece round trip. To Chula Vista, we have no stage accommodations. They take us as far as National City and there we have to transfer to Chula Vista. The round trip is One Dollar.

Father Butler has been coming to say Mass here on Monday during Lent, which we appreciate very much. There has not been as good an attendance as the people say they could not attend any other day of the week as they could not on Sunday.

Reverend and Dear Father:

With hope to see the difficulties of the catholic cult to be settled in México in a near future, I havent written to you, and I have made some provisional arrangement with Father Núñez, of Tijuana, Mex., concerning the Sunday collections here, fees on the Baptisms, marriages etc.; but now seeing that there is no hope of arrangements with that bad government, I wish to know from you what could I do henceforward concerning the collections and offerings received from Tijuana here. At present time we have here, on Sundays, four Masses: at 7 - 8 - 10 - and 11 A.M.: half part of total collected money I gave to Father Núñez: from the Baptisms and marriages, only 25 per cent I received; but on these days of so hard crisis I foresee too difficult to sustain the expenses of this Church, dividing the Sunday collections. This town, as you know, has about 125 mex. families, and these generally are very poor: Tijuana, on the contrary is now a city of about ten thousand people, and mayor part of them catholics, and always well disposed to help their Pastor, and with more generosity when they see him persecuted. What do you think, Father, could I do concerning the administration of the collections and offerings for this Church during these days of troubles in México, when the people of Tijuana comes in here to hear Mass, to Baptize their children, etc? - What prudent and wise counsel you give me, also to avoid every kind of disgust with the Father Núñez, who is living yet in Tijuana, Mex. to take care, in some way, of his faithful? 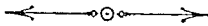

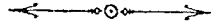

Rev. and Dear Father Dolan:

Confidentially I am writing you this separate letter to explain more at length, the purpose and cause of the other one. I could not say all I wished in the other letter as Father Nunez was at my elbow and I told him to tell me just what he wanted me to tell you and I did write that letter accordingly.

The facts are that I wrote a while ago about this same subject and I received a letter from your secretary, Father Joseph Mc Gucken, advising me to have with Fr. Nunez some arrangement more favorable to the Parish at San Ysidro, until His Excellency, the Bishop or yourself would return from your respective vacations. In the light of this letter and as I personally performed these ceremonies and as the Parish had to defray the expenses of candles, light, wine, hosts etc etc., I thought it fair enough to split fifty-fifty with Father Nunez both with the baptisms and marriages and the collection of the Sunday Masses. But I noticed time and again that Father Nunez was not satisfied and manifested it plainly. So I asked him bluntly whether he was contented with my method of giving him half of the income from whatever function I performed for his people. And he said that he was not satisfied and that if he could not have 75% of this income of the baptisms and marriages and 50% of the Sunday collections he could not afford to remain at Tia Juana through lack of proper support.

As the population of Tia Juana is about 10,000 with a large number of Catholics there, I know that Father Nunez receives some support through collections by the Union of Damas Catolicas and through the offerings from votive candles, Mass intentions, etc.

But to be honest and fair, we must admit that the Parish here is small and a share of the support really comes from Tia Juana. Hence I feel obliged somewhat to the people of Tia Juana and to their good Pastor, Father Jose Nunez who is saying two of the four Masses here on Sunday.

Now so that I may protect myself and my successor, when the time comes, may I have a very definite and detailed instruction from His Excellency the Bishop as to just how much should the Parish's share be from the Marriages and Baptisms of the people who come here from Tia Juana and how much should Father Nunez receive when I perform these functions and how much should I receive when he performs these functions and then how much should Father Nunez receive of the Sunday Collections. With all respect and obedience to His Excellency, the Bishop and to yourself, His Chancellor, I remain,

Up to the present day, since the trouble in Mexico, nearly all the marriages and baptisms of the people of Tia Juana have been performed here in San Ysidro by myself. On Sundays we have four masses. Two I read myself and two are read by Father Jose Nunez, the Pastor of the Parish of Tia Juana. Of the revenue of these functions: i.e. Marriages and baptisms, even when performed by myself, Father Nunez requests 75 % for himself and leaves the Parish here 25%. Of the collection of the Sunday Masses I have been splitting 50-50 with him.

Now I am writing to the Office asking for more definite orders in regard to this problem. On the other hand Father Nunez tells me that if the Chancery Office will ^{request} him to pay more than 25% to the Parish of San Ysidro, he will be obliged to leave Tia Juana thru lack of proper support.

If there is not enough left after the expenses have been paid to furnish the salary for the pastor and the salary for the assistant, it will consequently be necessary to carry on the work in San Ysidro with only one priest.

This conclusion looks to me logical and necessary. If the parish cannot suitably support two priests, then the work must be carried on by one alone.

His Excellency, the Most Reverend Bishop, is very anxious that the people of San Ysidro and the people who come across the border be given all the spiritual care they need, and will consequently make whatever arrangements are required to solve the problem.

The Most Reverend Bishop is sorry to learn of your illness and sincerely hopes that you will soon be quite well and able to attend to all of your duties.

Please let me know the result of your computation as suggested above, and whether or not a suitable arrangement can be worked out from it.

If there is not enough left after the expenses have been paid to furnish the salary for the pastor and the salary for the assistant, it will consequently be necessary to carry on the work in San Ysidro with only one priest.

This conclusion looks to me logical and necessary. If the parish cannot suitably support two priests, then the work must be carried on by one alone.

His Excellency, the Most Reverend Bishop, is very anxious that the people of San Ysidro and the people who come across the border be given all the spiritual care they need, and will consequently make whatever arrangements are required to solve the problem.

I trust that from the above suggestion a suitable arrangement can be worked out. I sincerely hope also that Father Alloero will be soon enjoying good health so that he may take care of the needs of San Ysidro.

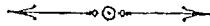

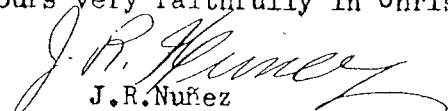

PARISH REPORT

Instructions to Pastors and Administrators

The Right Reverend Bishop deems the following—especially with regard to taxes and insurance—to be of such importance, that standing instructions are hereby given to Pastors and Administrators who are charged with responsibility of carrying them out.

TAXES:

It is almost unbelievable, the great number of tax delinquencies that occur each year on parish property; also, the number of failures of pastors to file affidavits exempting the churches from taxation. All of which throws an unnecessary burden on the finances of the parish, a fifteen per cent penalty being charged each year with other costs and interest charges for delinquent taxes.

The Chancery Office each year—about July 1st—is furnished with a published list of tax delinquencies, which has enabled us to prevent—through this supervision—an absolute loss of the property, although we cannot prevent delinquencies.

In the transfer of pastors from one parish to another, a full and complete legal description of all parish properties should be prepared by the out-going pastor for his successor.

On the first Monday in March, or as soon as possible thereafter, a full statement of parish properties should be given the assessor, together with affidavits exempting the churches from taxation. This filing of parish properties with the assessor almost guarantees your receiving all tax bills.

INSURANCE:

The pastors should at all times know the amount of insurance on the parochial buildings and contents under their charge. Theirs is the responsibility to see that adequate insurance is carried and new buildings promptly covered. In the event of transfer of pastors, a schedule of the insurance in effect on parochial buildings and contents should be prepared and given to the succeeding pastor.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT:

Collections taken up for building purposes should not be shown under "plate collections," as this results in over-assessment to the parishes and as a consequence gives rise to complaints on the part of the pastors.

The assessment of four per cent on pew rents, plate collections, baptisms and marriages, offerings for Cathedraticum and Seminarians' purposes hereafter will be changed to three per cent for Cathedraticum and five per cent for Seminarians; the same basis will be used for computing these assessments.

The financial statement should be completely filled in, correctly totaled and signed. About twenty-five per cent of the reports each year are lacking in one or more of these details.

CHECKS:

Checks covering assessments and collections, payment on fire and other insurance, and sundry other items should be marked with the account to which they are to be credited. Frequently checks received and not marked are applied to the wrong account for lack of information. Cancelled checks upon which the items are indicated make an ideal receipt.

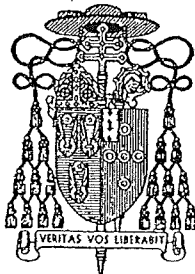

En favor de esta cuenta quedó en el subterráneo de la Iglesia una existencia que no puedo precisar en velas de cera de distintos tamaños, veladoras y velas de ocho días para el Santuario, esta existencia, la hice constar en el inventario, este inventario se hizo por duplicado, el original lo entregué juntamente con los libros parroquiales en la Cancillería de Los Angeles, y la copia me fue entregada al sucesor la noche que llegó. Se tenía esta existencia de velas porque además de las que se usaban en la Iglesia se vendía alguna, y no convenia estar pidiendo de a cartón. Entre las velitas votivas que se consumían allí en San Ysidro que eran muy pocas y las velas que se vendían para Tijuana, ese año las cuentas en la partida CANDELABRA hubo una entrada de \$212.00 Si esta existencia despues que yo salí de allí se gastó o se vendió, ya que actualmente no hay ninguna, no se pagó nada. El mismo saldo que deudor que yodejé es el que hay ahora.

Respecto a la propiedad que está detras de la Iglesia y que durante mi tiempo se usó como cuartos de clase y patio de juegos, informo a Ud. lo siguiente. Al conseguir del Ilmo. Señor Cantwell, despues de muchas dificultades, el permiso para establecer la escuela, que era de gran necesidad no tanto para los niños de San Ysidro, cuanto para los de Tijuana, pues la persecución estaba con toda su fuerza, el Ilmo Señor me puso como condicion terminante el que no se contrajera ninguna deuda, para esto no contaba con mas local que un saloncito que estaba junto al cerco detras de la iglesia, y este de muy malas condiciones. Para empezar renté para residencia de las hermanas una casa que está junto a la casa cural, y quize rentar tambien la casa de que se trata que estaba desocupada y se necesitaba para poner en ella la clase de los muchachos grandes, pero la Compañía J.S. Schirm Commercial de San Diego que era la dueña, no quizo rentarla y si me la ofrecía en venta, acudí a la Mitra, y me dijeron que no podian ni querian comprarla. Esta propiedad me parecia una ganga, pues la casa con cinco cuartos en muy buenas condiciones, un subterráneo de puro cemento y un terreno del 50 pies de frente por 180 de fondo lo ofrecian por solo \$1,600.00. Acudí entonces a mi hermana sugiriendole la comprara ella invirtiendo el dinero que tenia en el Banco, ya que esta inversión le produciria mas de lo que el Banco le pagaba de intereses por las rentas que recibiria, y ademas me ayudaba a la escuela y se ponía en ocasion de hacer un buen negocio, porque en este tiempo empezaron a hacer estudios geologicos en esa region buscando petroleo y contaban que probablemente lo hallaban y si era así la propiedad subiría mucho de valor. No del todo satisfecha aceptó a comprarla, pagó \$600.00 al contado y el resto quedaba como hipoteca de la casa. Pero como en el terreno habia sembrado maiz no servia para patio de juegos. Ella entonces pagó porque limpiaran el terreno, lo cercaron con cerco de seis pa.

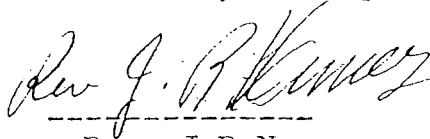

Además de esta propiedad se pagaba renta por una casa mejor a la que se cambiaron las hermanas, la casa que al principio ellas ocuparon y que despues se usaba como salon para Kindergarden y cafeteria y otro salon de una tienda que se desocupó frente al Civic Center para cuarto de clase de los muchachos grandes. Adjunto a esta los datos que me envía ella de lo que se le pago de renta.

Mientras la escuela no tuvo nada, y necesitaba de la parroquia para levantarse y sostenerse, no tuve dificultades con el personal pero cuando ya estuvo todo encarrilado, con la ayuda de Monseñor Hergarty quien con autorizacion del Señor Cantwell me dio \$2000.00 de la testamentaria del Padre Alloero, la escuela ya contaba con dos amplios salones de pobre construccion pero acondicionados lo mejor posible, se tenia todo lo necesario y la escuela casi se podia sostener por sí misma entonces sí empezaron las dificultades, y esto fue la principal razon que me movió a pedir al Ilmo Señor Cantwell me cambiara, lo que sucedio en Diciembre de ese año, dejando las cosas en el estado que le he contado.

Yo estoy muy mortificado por esto, Ud. conoce y comprende el caracter latino. ! Qué pobre concepto tendrá el Ilmo Señor Buddy de mí!!! Que poca confianza me va a tener en adelante!!! Porqué no sabría yo esto antes de pedirle y de que el Señor me diera la incardinacion?... Le ruego, interponga su influencia para que se hagan las debidas investigaciones. "I . . . firmly hold and accept each and every definition of the unerring teaching of the Church, with all she has maintained and declared, but especially those points of doctrine which expressly combat the errors of our time. In the first place I profess my belief that God, the beginning and end of all, can be certainly known and therefore proved to exist by the natural light of reason from the things that are made, that is, from the visible works of the creation as a cause from its effects. Next I recognize and acknowledge the external arguments of revelation, that is, divine facts, especially miracles and prophecies, as most certain signs of the divine origin of the Christian religion, and I hold that these are altogether suited to the understanding of every age and of all men, also of our times. Thirdly, I likewise hold with firm faith that the Church, the guardian and exponent of the revealed Word, was proximately and directly founded by the true and historic Christ Himself, while He dwelt amongst us, and that she was also built upon Peter, the Prince of the Apostolic Hierarchy, and upon his successors to the end of time. Fourthly, I sincerely accept the teaching of faith as transmitted down to us from the Apostles through the orthodox Fathers in the same sense and even in the same wording; and, therefore, I wholly reject the heretical notions of the evolution of dogmas, which pass from one sense to another alien to that which the Church held from the start; and I likewise condemn every error whereby is substituted for the divine deposit, entrusted by Christ to His Spouse and by Her to be faithfully guarded, a philosophic system or the creation of a human consciousness, gradually refined by the striving of men and finally to be perfected hereafter by indefinite progress. Fifthly, I hold for certain and sincerely profess that Faith is not a blind religious sense making its way out of the hidden regions of the sub-liminal consciousness, morally tinged by the influence of heart and will, but is a true assent of the intellect to truth received from without by hearing, an assent whereby we believe to be true, because of the authority of the all-true God, whatever by the personal God, our Creator and Lord, has been spoken, testified and revealed."

"I further, with all due reverence, submit and with my whole mind adhere to all the condemnations, declarations, and ordinances contained in the Encyclical letter *Pascendi* and in the Decree *Lamentabili*, particularly regarding what is called the history of Dogma.

"I also reject the error of those who aver that the Faith proposed by the Church may be in conflict with history, and that Catholic dogmas in the sense in which they are now understood cannot be harmonized with the more truthful "origins" of Christianity. Moreover, I condemn and reject the opinion which declares that a Christian man of better culture can assume a dual personality, one as a believer and another as an historian, as if it were permissible for the historian to hold fast what his faith as a believer contradicts, or to lay down premises from which there follows the falsity or the uncertainty of dogmas, provided only that these are not directly denied. Likewise I reject that method of estimating and interpreting Holy Writ, which, setting aside the Church's tradition and the analogy of Faith and the rules of the Apostolic See, adopts the rationalists' principles and with equal arbitrariness and rashness considers criticism of the text the one only supreme rule. Furthermore, I reject the opinion of those who hold that a teacher of the science of Historical Theology or the writer on the subject must first put aside the notions previously conceived about the supernatural origin of Catholic tradition or about the divine aid promised for the perpetual preservation of each revealed truth; then, that the writings of individual Fathers must be interpreted solely by the data of science, without any reference to sacred authority, and with that freedom of judgment wherewith every profane record is usually examined.

"Finally and in general, I declare myself to be far removed from the error of the modernists who hold that in sacred tradition there is nothing inherently divine; or who—far worse still—admit it in a pantheistic sense; so that thus there would remain only a bare simple fact equal to the ordinary facts of history, viz., that the school started by Christ and His Apostles finds, in the ages that follow, men to carry it on by their energy, their skill, and their genius. Wherefore most firmly do I retain and to my last breath will I retain the Faith of the Fathers of the Church concerning the sure endowment of truth, which

is, has been, and ever will be in the succession of the Episcopate from the Apostles; not in such a way that what seems best and most fitting according to the refinement of each age may be held, but that the absolute and unchangeable truth preached from the beginning by the Apostles may never in any different wise be believed, never in any different wise be understood.

All this I promise that I will faithfully, entirely and sincerely keep and inviolably guard, and from this never in teaching or howsoever by word or writing in the least depart. So I promise, so I swear, so help me God and these His holy gospels.

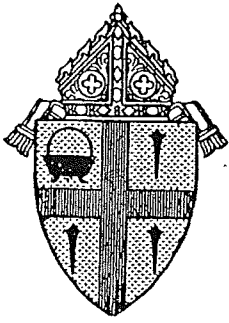

During this time I could make the life of the parish by other ways ; entertainments, jamaicas, suppers, raffles, etc. working day and night, but now the majority of the people are on the way (about two thirds) and I can't do nothing for my income, the collection last sunday was \$ 9.30 and by this reason I am now unable to make my obligations. I am deeply gratefull for all the assistance Your Excellency have given me. However I ask you to come in my help with a mortgage on this church for \$1500.00. With this money I paid in full my more heavy monthly payments, the debt of the parish will be the same, and my conditions relieved. After next October the people will back home and with the God's help we will do the best on our debt.



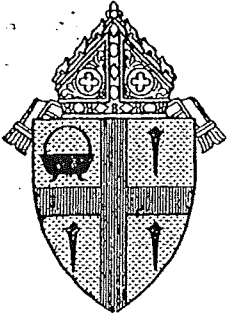

Dentro de poco empezará el nuevo año escolar y vuestros hijos, los pequeños y los mayores tendrán que volver a la escuela para continuar su educación que los haga útiles para mañana poder enfrentarse a las luchas de la vida, ya que el que esté mejor preparado, con menos esfuerzos obtendrá mayores éxitos que el impreparado, y el deber que imponen a vosotros los padres, las leyes divinas y las leyes humanas es dar a vuestros hijos toda la educación que esté a vuestro alcance.

Pero vosotros, padres de familia católicos, estais obligados a dar a vuestros hijos una educación católica, y la educación católica únicamente la imparte la escuela católica. Por desgracia, la escuela católica es en vuestra parroquia una empresa gigantesca, y por ahora irrealizable. Dios permita que lo que vosotros ahora no podeis hacer por vuestros hijos, ellos sí puedan hacerlo por los suyos mañana y que a la sombra de esta iglesia, levantada con esfuerzos y sacrificios de muchos de vosotros y de vuestros padres, vuelva a reabrirse, en días no muy lejanos, la escuela parroquial que en hace ocho años cerrara sus puertas y en la que muchos de vosotros aprendisteis las primeras letras, pasasteis algunos de los días más felices de vuestra niñez y vuestra juventud y de la cual conservaréis en vuestra memoria gratos recuerdos.

Su Santidad el Señor Pio XI de grata memoria, en su carta sobre la Educación de la Juventud dice lo siguiente: " Puesto que la educación esencialmente consiste en la formación del hombre tal cual debe ser y como debe portarse en esta vida terrena para conseguir el fin sublime para el cual fue creado, es evidente que no puede existir educación verdadera que no esté ordenada totalmente al fin último y no puede existir educación completa si la educación no es cristiana ".

La educación para que sea completa debe formar la inteligencia y el corazón; los principios del saber van a la inteligencia, los de la moral al corazón. De nada servirá a vuestros hijos ser muy ilustrados, dominar las distintas ramas del saber humano si tienen nulos principios morales; porque si son grandes sabios y malos cristianos ni serán felices ellos mismos ni harán felices a los suyos, "la ciencia sin la fé, hincha" dice el Apostol, y la experiencia nos enseña que un hombre malvado hace mayores males mientras más ilustrado es.

La mejor herencia que podreis dejar a vuestros hijos es una educación cristiana, esa nunca la perderan del todo en los vaivenes de la vida y les servirá para siempre, esforzaos por educar a vuestros hijos cristianamente, haced de ellos fieles servidores de Dios, empeñaos por formarles la inteligencia, pero no descuideis el corazón. El Espíritu Santo dice: "La senda por la cual comenzó el jóven a andar desde un principio, esa misma seguirá cuando viejo.

Una de las tendencias actuales en muchas naciones es arrebatarse a los padres el derecho que tienen a la educación de sus hijos, y en estas naciones los hijos se educan no a gusto de sus padres, sino a gusto del Estado. Dios que os ha hecho a vosotros los padres de familia sus cooperadores en esa magna obra de su Providencia, la procreación de la humanidad, no solo os da derechos sobre vuestros hijos, sino que también os impone deberes, y uno de estos principales deberes, es el que se refiere a la educación." Los padres están en gravísima obligación de educar religiosa y moralmente, lo mismo que física y civilmente a los hijos, según sus fuerzas, del mismo modo que están obligados a procurar sus bienes temporales, dice el Cánón 1113. Por desgracia, no son pocos los padres

de familia que desconocen teórica y prácticamente sus derechos para exigirlos y sus deberes para cumplirlos y se descargan dejando la educación de sus hijos en manos extrañas no importándoles cuales sean .

Más permitidme que de estos principios generales, descienda a particularidades. Profesando, vosotros los padres, la Fé católica, estais obligados a dar a vuestros hijos una educación católica y si la escuela a que asisten vuestros hijos fuera católica, llenaría con perfección vuestra obligación; pero como no es así, como la escuela a que asisten vuestros hijos no es escuela católica, luego no podeis descargar vuestra responsabilidad en ella y si quereis cumplir y llenar vuestras responsabilidades delante de Dios, necesitais suplir lo que la escuela no hace. De la escuela no católica vuestros hijos, católicos, podrán salir sabios, ilustrados, unas lumbreras si quereis, pero no buenos católicos, porque es imposible que un católico ignorante, sea buen católico.

¿ Como conseguireis suplir esa instruccion que la escuela no da a vuestros hijos sobre su religión y cumplir así vuestro deber? . Este es el objeto de la enseñanza del catecismo para los niños de la escuela primaria y de la clase de Religión para los de la Junior y High School que se dan en la Iglesia, ayudaros a cumplir este vuestro deber. Haced que vuestros hijos pequeños asistan al catecismo, empeñaos porque vuestros hijos mayores asistan a su clase de Religión y las buenas hermanas catequistas, el sacerdote encargado de la clase de Religion haran lo que a vosotros se os dificulta hacer; pero si por vuestra negligencia, apatía y descuido vuestros hijos no asisten a su instruccion religiosa que culpables sereis vosotros delante de Dios.

Hay muchos padres de familia que dicen, mis hijos ya hicieron su primera Comunion, ya se confirmaron, ya no tienen a qué ir al catecismo, no necesitan la clase de religion, sin fijarse que para la primera Comunion el niño mal entiende las primeras oraciones, para la confirmacion apenas se le explican las principales verdades de la Fé; pero no es esto todo lo que vuestros hijos necesitan y deben aprender para ser buenos cristianos, y en la práctica no son pocos los jóvenes de Junior y High School tan ignorantes, porque todo lo poco que aprendieron han olvidado, que ni las primeras oraciones pueden decir con facilidad.

Padres de familia, esforzaos por infundir a vuestros hijos el temor de Dios, empeñaos por educarlos cristianamente, haced que sean no solo católicos de nombre, sino católicos prácticos, haced de vuestros hijos, buenos hijos de Dios y vuestra recompensa será crecida, ahora de niños y jóvenes seran hijos dóciles y obedientes y mañana seran los ciudadanos dignos, orgullo vuestro y honra de la Patria y de la Iglesia.

Explicación del Evangelio

Pecar es quebrantar la ley de Dios. Ley a la que el hombre su creatura, debe ajustar sus pensamientos, palabras y obras. El pecado ofende a Dios y el ofendido, es el único que puede y debe perdonar a su ofensor.

El Evangelio de hoy nos refiere que llevado un enfermo paralítico en una camilla ante Jesús. El le dice: hijo mío, ten confianza tus pecados te son perdonados. Al oír esto, algunos doctores de la ley que estaban presentes se dijeron, este hombre es un blasfemo, un mentiroso, un impostor, con qué autoridad perdona los pecados? quien le ha dado poder para hacerlo? Jesús entonces descubriéndoles los juicios que de él hacían, les dice: Porque me estáis juzgando de esa manera? Os voy a probar que estáis del todo errados; que si tengo poder para hacer lo que he dicho. Decidme, que es más fácil el decir a este hombre tullido como levántate y anda? Pues para que sepáis que el Hijo del hombre tiene en la tierra poder para perdonar los pecados, (dirigiéndose al paralítico le dice) levántate, carga con tu camilla y vete a tu casa. Y al instante el paralítico pudo levantarse y cargando la camilla en que había sido traído, se aleja dejando asombrados a todos los presentes.

Era el segundo día después de la resurrección del Señor. Los Apóstoles estaban en el cenáculo con las puertas bien cerradas por miedo a los judíos. De pronto, sin abrirse las puertas, se presenta ante ellos Jesús y los saluda diciéndoles: La paz sea con vosotros, les enseña sus manos atravesadas, su costado abierto, los apóstoles se llenan de gozo. Jesús les dice de nuevo, la paz sea con vosotros. Como mi Padre me envió a mí, así también yo os envío a vosotros, y dichas estas palabras, soltó sobre ellos y les dijo: Recibid al Espíritu Santo: quedan perdonados los pecados a aquellos a quienes vosotros los perdonareis, y quedan retenidos a aquellos a quienes vosotros se los retuviereis. (San Juan .XX, 19-23)

Dios es el único que pueda perdonar los pecados.... Jesucristo perdona los pecados y da pruebas de que puede perdonarlos. Luego Jesucristo es Dios..... Jesucristo quizo y de hecho dio a los apóstoles y en ellos al sacerdocio católico poder para perdonar y retener los pecados.... Luego el sacerdocio católico tiene poder en la tierra para perdonar y retener los pecados.

Esta es la razón, porque el que verdaderamente cree, admite y confiesa la divinidad de Jesucristo, cuando se siente manchado por el pecado, cuando perdida la paz y la tranquilidad del alma su triste consecuencia y acozado por los remordimientos que le paralizan el alma, se presenta ante el confesor como el paralítico del Evangelio de hoy y después de acusados sus pecados con vergüenza y con dolor, no importa cual sea su número y su gravedad, oye al confesor que le dice: Yo te ausuelvo de tus pecados, lleno de confianza en la bondad y misericordia de Cristo que quizo darle tal poder, recuperada la paz y tranquilidad..... y se aleja gozoso prometiendo no volver a cargar con el peso de que la autoridad de Cristo dada a su sacerdocio le ha librado.

"Chuy Moreno and Sam and The Palsy Man."

Chuy Moreno had a little friend whose face was as black as coal and whose name was Sam. Every Sunday Sam would wait in Chuy's backyard to hear what happened in the Church; for poor Sam was never inside of a Church in all his tiny life; he never knew anything about God or Heaven, or the Blessed Virgin, didn't know even how to bless himself. Sam had no mother, no father, no big brother nor sister, in fact nobody but his cranky aunt. His aunt never went to Church and would not let Sam go.

Inside of Sam's black body God put a heart of gold. Sam was good if he didn't go with bad boys.

So Chuy starts telling him how the priest explained about a man who was palsy.

"Palsy is a sickness which makes you so you cannot move, you're like in a straightjacket, you cannot move your hands nor your feet, you just lay there in bed, you cannot eat unless somebody brings the food to your mouth; and there lay a sick palsy man, who wanted to be cured. The doctors couldn't do anything about it; he tried everything, and finally he hears about Jesus Christ, who used to go about and just say some words and the people weren't sick anymore."

"Is this Jesus Christ still living? asks Sam.

"Yes we got Him in our Churches, He is the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, and always present on the altars of the Catholic Churches!" says Chuy, but anxious to tell his story of Christ healing the man sick of palsy he continues: /but

"You see curing the sick man was alright, Christ used some words in curing this man that his enemies who were just plain jealous did not like. They didn't dare to say anything because they were afraid of the people; but Christ could tell what they were thinking about and said to them; "which then is easier to say thy sins are forgiven thee or to say arise and walk." The sick man got up and walked and the enemies of Christ couldn't do much about it. Well he had the works on them. But the priest explained that Christ had a special idea when he cured this man; he wanted to show the people what happens to the soul of a man who is paralyzed and enchained in mortal sin; and also to show how this can be cured. "

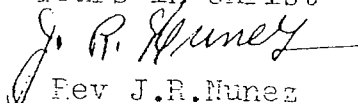
Answering your esteemed letter of Nov.28th please excuse me if I retained your letter to Fater Vincent meanwhile I expone to you the following points: December, by the Guadalupe day, Christmas and New Year, it is heavy month, I am not very strong as in the past and I need help; this father is unable to do this for me and for anybody I think he is not well mentally. I am in bed for four days with bad coold, last night I admonished him because after his mass was out home for all day backed at 6p.m. and was not here for a funeral, and this morning was twenty minutes later for mass. If Your Excellency has not any other priest to send them to me, at Casa Blanca is now a columban priest free, he don't speak Spanish, but at least, he will be in time for mass, and for confessions in english for the younger.

Regarding to call a claretian father, respectfully I will expone your Excellency my opinion. This temporally solution to our problem will not be against your Excellency? will not be used by your unwillings to probe what they colled your injustice and wrongs to the Agustinians?... They can say Bishop Buddy put out the agustinians from Guadalupe's Churches at San Diego and San Bernardino, to call one year later the jesuits and the claretians. This means his unkindness and injustice to the agustinians, and also that his secular priests are complete unable to take care of the spanish speaking people. This confirm what we said, the neglect of the mexican people in all San Diego Diocese.

Let me propone to you, send here one of our younger priests, any one of them speaks litle spanish, and this is enough to hand the people. Personaly I need more help to hand the younger, all speak english. If your Excellency admit a humble suggestion at Redlans in the english parish is Father O'Dee, he speaks good spanish, perhaps will be possible for your Excellency to make some conivation ans send him to here. I send this letter PERSONAL because only your Excellency can guess what I INTENT TO EXPRESS and excuse my wrongs

Responding to your request received today, dispensation is hereby granted from the publication of two banns and permission to perform the marriage with solemn blessing for Marcelo Alvares and Amelia Alonso.

This will acknowledge receipt of your other letter regarding the C. Y. O. situation. While it is my intention to give the matter more thought and investigation, let me advise you now that in the case of a pastor who deems it imprudent to organize his young people in the C. Y. O., it would not be wise to try to force his hand. However, in such event, young people of his parish are free to join a C. Y. O. organization if they so desire once they have the permission of their pastor.

In a word, the pastor is the head of the parish and the one responsible to the Bishop. It has been reported to me by different pastors in charge of Mexican young people that the Mexican parents look with suspicion on the C. Y. O. and do not favor it. So, for the present, we must respect the wishes of these parents and we must also respect what the pastor deems a prudent measure to maintain concord and peace within his own parish group. In other words, the organization of the C. Y. O. is not of obligation on any pastor of any parish and by the same token it is not of obligation for any young people.

My dear Father Nunez, I know that you work earnestly and with great zeal and later I shall be pleased to discuss the matter in person when I come to San Bernardino.

Your Excellency,

As you are aware, there has been much difficulty here in the Riverside, San Bernardino Deaneries, in securing any kind of CYO organisation, worthy of the name. Some parishes have good working groups but after a time these disintegrate and others arise in other parishes similarly to fail after a time. We feel that the reason is the lack of any real CYO organisation in the Northern Deaneries. And after much discussion among groups and among some of the priests (Frs. NUNEZ, LINEHAN, O'TOOLE, GRAY) the conclusion has been reached that there is no use in pretending that we further try to have a CYO organisation here unless the co-operation of the pastors of all Mexican parishes is willingly and wholeheartedly given. Because of the situation we are losing even the good young people who have an interest in the work.

We feel that the time is ripe to do something. And we feel that the one to secure the cooperation is your Excellency. After discussion of the possibilities we are of the opinion that the following is the correct course, and the only one that we believe can achieve any results. We respectfully suggest that Your Excellency arrange to meet the Pastors of the respective Mexican parishes who would come with their heads or officers of their respective groups if they have any---the meetingplace to be Parochial Hall of Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish in San Bernardino---- and discuss the whole situation with them and arrange a proper understanding and spirit of cooperation, without which we feel the CYO must die as far as the Mexican Youth, the hope of the Church in California, is concerned.

In response to an inquiry you made during my last visit to San Bernardino, please be advised that a letter written to Very Rev. Luis Mendoza Guizar, S.J., Rector of Montezuma Seminary, brings the following answer:

"I feel very sorry to inform you that we cannot accept students who do not have completed at least two courses in Latin, since we only have a supplementary course in order to enable them to talk and understand spoken Latin, necessary to follow our philosophy courses."

Therefore, if you have students who show certain signs of vocation for the Priesthood and who have completed two years of Latin, they might qualify for the supplementary course at Montezuma, but evidently they do not take students who have had no latin whatever.

On the other hand, if you have some exceptionally good young man who have sufficient talent to pursue a course in Latin, we might consider taking them into our St. Francis Seminary, even though they have not completed high school. We would make this exception in favor of Mexican aspirants to the Priesthood, because we earnestly desire to encourage vocations along that line. If you will kindly send to me a description of the students you have in mind, we will give them every favorable consideration.



Your Excellency:

In answer to your request for a criticism of the plan presented in Father McGowan's memorandum for the Archbishops and Bishops Conference, I present the following conclusions which were arrived at after a discussion with my assistants.

We think that the plan is complete enough --perhaps too much so to be practical. The work planned for the regional staff must be simplified so that the most urgent needs of each locality will be met immediately and in such a way that the effect of the work will be permanent. The funds on hand must not be scattered.

We think that before the plan is put in operation something definite must be done to insure the cooperation of every priest in the diocese and of every Catholic lay organization in the locality. We are rather pessimistic about what can be hoped for in the way of cooperation. We think provision should be made so that time and money will not be wasted in a parish where the operation of the plan will only be tolerated for a period and then allowed to fade out.

We think that in the parishes where the operation of the plan is needed most, there will also be need of permanent financial help.

He will be appointed Administrator of the Meadowbrook Church with East Highlands as a mission. There are distinct advantages in having him live with the people so they can easily approach him for spiritual help. There is an old couple that live two blocks from the Meadowbrook Church who have been highly recommended to me by other priests in the neighborhood. This old couple offer shelter to Father Gomez. "I firmly hold and accept each and every definition of the unerring teaching of the Church, with all she has maintained and declared, but especially those points of doctrine which expressly combat the errors of our time. In the first place I profess my belief that God, the beginning and end of all, can be certainly known and therefore proved to exist by the natural light of reason from the things that are made, that is, from the visible works of the creation as a cause from its effects. Next I recognize and acknowledge the external arguments of revelation, that is, divine facts, especially miracles and prophecies, as most certain signs of the divine origin of the Christian religion, and I hold that these are altogether suited to the understanding of every age and of all men, also of our times. Thirdly, I likewise hold with firm faith that the Church, the guardian and exponent of the revealed Word, was proximately and directly founded by the true and historic Christ Himself, while He dwelt amongst us, and that she was also built upon Peter, the Prince of the Apostolic Hierarchy, and upon his successors to the end of time. Fourthly, I sincerely accept the teaching of faith as transmitted down to us from the Apostles through the orthodox Fathers in the same sense and even in the same wording; and, therefore, I wholly reject the heretical notions of the evolution of dogmas, which pass from one sense to another alien to that which the Church held from the start; and I likewise condemn every error whereby is substituted for the divine deposit, entrusted by Christ to His Spouse and by Her to be faithfully guarded, a philosophic system or the creation of a human consciousness, gradually refined by the striving of men and finally to be perfected hereafter by indefinite progress. Fifthly, I hold for certain and sincerely profess that Faith is not a blind religious sense making its way out of the hidden regions of the sub-liminal consciousness, morally tinged by the influence of heart and will, but is a true assent of the intellect to truth received from without by hearing, an assent whereby we believe to be true, because of the authority of the all-true God, whatever by the personal God, our Creator and Lord, has been spoken, testified and revealed.

"I further, with all due reverence, submit and with my whole mind adhere to all the condemnations, declarations, and ordinances contained in the Encyclical letter *Pascendi* and in the Decree *Lamentabili*, particularly regarding what is called the history of Dogma.

"I also reject the error of those who aver that the Faith proposed by the Church may be in conflict with history, and that Catholic dogmas in the sense in which they are now understood cannot be harmonized with the more truthful "origins" of Christianity. Moreover, I condemn and reject the opinion which declares that a Christian man of better culture can assume a dual personality, one as a believer and another as an historian, as if it were permissible for the historian to hold fast what his faith as a believer contradicts, or to lay down premises from which there follows the falsity or the uncertainty of dogmas, provided only that these are not directly denied. Likewise I reject that method of estimating and interpreting Holy Writ, which, setting aside the Church's tradition and the analogy of Faith and the rules of the Apostolic See, adopts the rationalists' principles and with equal arbitrariness and rashness considers criticism of the text the one only supreme rule. Furthermore, I reject the opinion of those who hold that a teacher of the science of Historical Theology or the writer on the subject must first put aside the notions previously conceived about the supernatural origin of Catholic tradition or about the divine aid promised for the perpetual preservation of each revealed truth; then, that the writings of individual Fathers must be interpreted solely by the data of science, without any reference to sacred authority, and with that freedom of judgment wherewith every profane record is usually examined.

"Finally and in general, I declare myself to be far removed from the error of the modernists who hold that in sacred tradition there is nothing inherently divine; or who—far worse still—admit it in a pantheistic sense; so that thus there would remain only a bare simple fact equal to the ordinary facts of history, viz., that the school started by Christ and His Apostles finds, in the ages that follow, men to carry it on by their energy, their skill, and their genius. Wherefore most firmly do I retain and to my last breath will I retain the Faith of the Fathers of the Church concerning the sure endowment of truth, which

is, has been, and ever will be in the succession of the Episcopate from the Apostles; not in such a way that what seems best and most fitting according to the refinement of each age may be held, but that the absolute and unchangeable truth preached from the beginning by the Apostles may never in any different wise be believed, never in any different wise be understood.

All this I promise that I will faithfully, entirely and sincerely keep and inviolably guard, and from this never in teaching or howsoever by word or writing in the least depart. So I promise, so I swear, so help me God and these His holy gospels.

Enclosed find a letter and photostats from the United States Credit Bureau relative to the claim of their client and my answer to the same.

While your lawyers have assured me that this claim is not warranted, we should promptly get into some action to terminate the lengthy correspondence -- if necessary, by a court decision.

Please get in touch with the attorneys to whom you have entrusted this case and ask them to bring the matter to a head. If their final decision is -- and we must respect their skill and the hours of diligent study they have given this claim -- that we owe nothing to subject client, please ask them to so advise the collection manager.

If, on the other hand, a reasonable doubt exists, then let us give the benefit of the doubt to the subject claimant. You are aware of my general policy in these matters. While we have always defended the rights of the Church, even in expensive litigation, we would rather be out the money than permit anyone to suffer even a slight injustice possibly through a misunderstanding or even a technicality.

To summarize, please review the relative evidence to determine if there is any moral obligation on our part, even though we are satisfied with the findings of the lawyers that there is no legal obligation. You understand, of course, that the persistence of collection agencies is not to be taken seriously. They have a technique of trying to wear out the defendant. Prescinding from this nuisance value, please conclude this case along the lines indicated above.

This is a personal observation for your own peace of mind and security. Now that the moratorium has terminated, let me beg of Your Lordship to conserve every possible income, so as to lessen the very large principal sum of indebtedness in the amount of \$232,715.21 as of this date, January 22, 1958.

Our record shows that on January 2nd a check was received from you for \$1,000.00, which was applied to the first quarter 1958 interest due of \$3,169.69.

It is therefore necessary to curtail any more expenditures, otherwise the interest and principal would grow out of control.

Please ask the lady who owns the residence next to your school to give an option, but we cannot buy at the present time because it is more important to put that \$6,000 on your interest and principal rather than a new investment.

My dear Monsignor, you understand that strict economy and adherence to the absolute essentials in church and rectory will enable you to meet the interest and some of the principal. The school should run itself.

Most of our Pastors are disposed to exercise great charity, but unless such a large loan is active in the repayment, it hurts our credit with the Bank and the loan mounts up to the point where, in time, you're paying for the church and rectory twice.

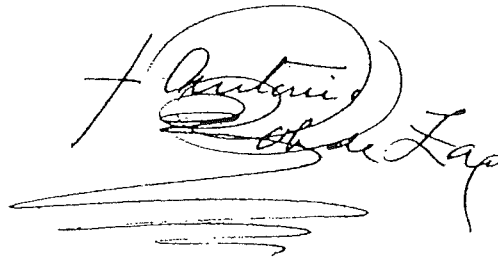

Dear Monsignor Nufiez:

An investigation of just precisely what has been spent on St. Cecilia's, Oro Grande, and Father Alzamora (Santandreu), reveals that in the last eight months we have spent on St. Cecilia's and Father Alzamora \$2,386.94. He does not realize this because money comes in to him so easily.

Please invite Father Alzamora to your home and brief him as follows: On the 8th of August he received \$80.00; on the 24th of November, \$75.00 from Extension Society; on April 1st we paid his interest and principal due the Chancery January 1st and April 1st, amounting to \$1,060.94; on October 5, 1958, we paid \$503.00 due on his interest and principal; and on January 1, 1959, we paid \$503.00. Since that date he has received \$75.00 from Extension, plus \$80.00 from this Chancery, making a total of \$2,386.94.

Please call him in and go over this four or five times so that he will grasp it. Instead of moaning, he should be very very thankful for getting all this money without any effort on his part.

An effort was made to arrange a military chaplaincy for him, but he did not speak sufficient English. When he complained a few months ago, I suggested that he get another Diocese.

Instead of suggesting it, I now demand that he look for another Diocese where money will come in great amounts even though his work is light.

You will have to go over this with him in Spanish. Tell him to please arrange matters so that he can terminate his services in this Diocese not later than May 1st. It is evident that he will never be satisfied, no matter what he receives.

If he would stir out and take an interest in those hundreds of people that work in the cement plant next door, if he would go over and take two census' every month (footwork), he would not have time to complain.

Inasmuch as we cannot activate zeal in this Padre, it will be better for him to find another jurisdiction before May 1st.

Most Reverend and Dear Bishop,

I received your letter late last Saturday, March 13. However, after my telephone conversation with Your Excellency I travelled to Oro Grande. After talking with Father Sandandrea he agreed without any objection and with all good will to accept the request to help Father John Saldana at Chino as you wished. He told me that the information which Your Excellency has concerning Oro Grande and vicinity is somewhat false. At the cement plant there are over 200 employees but the majority of these live in Victorville, Barstow or San Bernardino and not in Oro Grande. If Your Excellency were to have a census taken no more than 45 families would be found of whom 30 of these are Catholic. Each Catholic family would also be found to be in a very poor financial position. The Catholic population is completely unable to support the Church. The \$2,386 that Your Excellency sent was in no way used for Father's personal use with the exception of \$155.00. Your Excellency promised Father upon his appointment that all the bills for 1958 would be paid. The average Sunday collection is about \$25.00 and some of this comes from transients and people not living in Oro Grande.

Regarding your demand to look for another Diocese Father states that he is unable to do so because he knows of no one to help him in this matter. If, however, he is forced to leave the priesthood he will try and find work as a layman to support himself. Please let me make this humble suggestion. Father Sandandrea is incardinated in this Diocese and has gone willingly to help Father Saldana. Is it not possible to let him stay there? Father Saldana and Father Sandandrea were assistants here at the same time and worked very well as a team. Father Saldana has no one

to help him in Chino since Father Flores was transferred to Blyth. And in my humble opinion he does need a Priest to help him in his work at Chino.

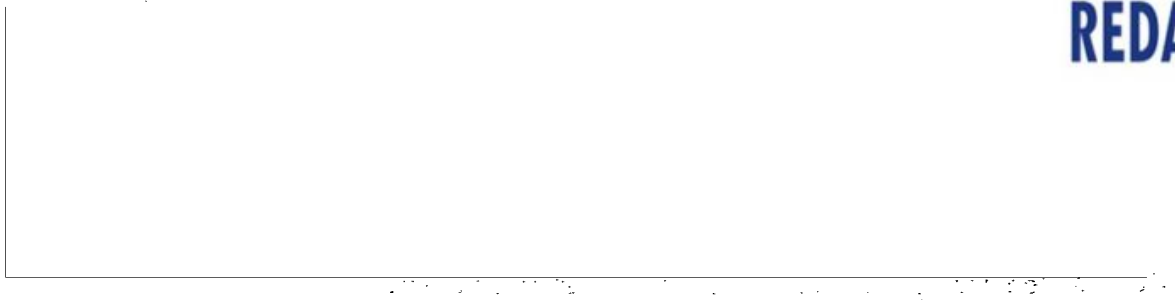

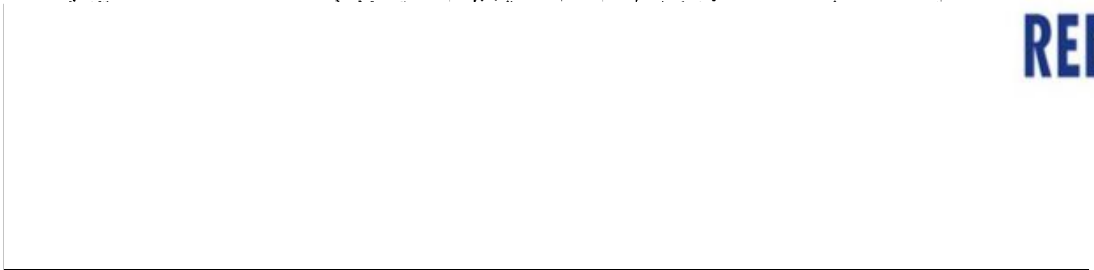

"I firmly hold and accept each and every definition of the unerring teaching of the Church, with all she has maintained and declared, but especially those points of doctrine which expressly combat the errors of our time. In the first place I profess my belief that God, the beginning and end of all, can be certainly known and therefore proved to exist by the natural light of reason from the things that are made, that is, from the visible works of the creation as a cause from its effects. Next I recognize and acknowledge the external arguments of revelation, that is, divine facts, especially miracles and prophecies, as most certain signs of the divine origin of the Christian religion, and I hold that these are altogether suited to the understanding of every age and of all men, also of our times. Thirdly, I likewise hold with firm faith that the Church, the guardian and exponent of the revealed Word, was proximately and directly founded by the true and historic Christ Himself, while He dwelt amongst us, and that she was also built upon Peter, the Prince of the Apostolic Hierarchy, and upon his successors to the end of time. Fourthly, I sincerely accept the teaching of faith as transmitted down to us from the Apostles through the orthodox Fathers in the same sense and even in the same wording; and, therefore, I wholly reject the heretical notions of the evolution of dogmas, which pass from one sense to another alien to that which the Church held from the start; and I likewise condemn every error whereby is substituted for the divine deposit, entrusted by Christ to His Spouse and by Her to be faithfully guarded, a philosophic system or the creation of a human consciousness, gradually refined by the striving of men and finally to be perfected hereafter by indefinite progress. Fifthly, I hold for certain and sincerely profess that Faith is not a blind religious sense making its way out of the hidden regions of the sub-liminal consciousness, morally tinged by the influence of heart and will, but is a true assent of the intellect to truth received from without by hearing, an assent whereby we believe to be true, because of the authority of the all-true God, whatever by the personal God, our Creator and Lord, has been spoken, testified and revealed.

"I further, with all due reverence, submit and with my whole mind adhere to all the condemnations, declarations, and ordinances contained in the Encyclical letter *Pascendi* and in the Decree *Lamentabili*, particularly regarding what is called the history of Dogma.

"I also reject the error of those who aver that the Faith proposed by the Church may be in conflict with history, and that Catholic dogmas in the sense in which they are now understood cannot be harmonized with the more truthful "origins" of Christianity. Moreover, I condemn and reject the opinion which declares that a Christian man of better culture can assume a dual personality, one as a believer and another as an historian, as if it were permissible for the historian to hold fast what his faith as a believer contradicts, or to lay down premises from which there follows the falsity or the uncertainty of dogmas, provided only that these are not directly denied. Likewise I reject that method of estimating and interpreting Holy Writ, which, setting aside the Church's tradition and the analogy of Faith and the rules of the Apostolic See, adopts the rationalists' principles and with equal arbitrariness and rashness considers criticism of the text the one only supreme rule. Furthermore, I reject the opinion of those who hold that a teacher of the science of Historical Theology or the writer on the subject must first put aside the notions previously conceived about the supernatural origin of Catholic tradition or about the divine aid promised for the perpetual preservation of each revealed truth; then, that the writings of individual Fathers must be interpreted solely by the data of science, without any reference to sacred authority, and with that freedom of judgment where-with every profane record is usually examined.

"Finally and in general, I declare myself to be far removed from the error of the modernists who hold that in sacred tradition there is nothing inherently divine; or who—far worse still—admit it in a pantheistic sense; so that thus there would remain only a bare simple fact equal to the ordinary facts of history, viz., that the school started by Christ and His Apostles finds, in the ages that follow, men to carry it on by their energy, their skill, and their genius. Wherefore most firmly do I retain and to my last breath will I retain the Faith of the Fathers of the Church concerning the sure endowment of truth, which

is, has been, and ever will be in the succession of the Episcopate from the Apostles; not in such a way that what seems best and most fitting according to the refinement of each age may be held, but that the absolute and unchangeable truth preached from the beginning by the Apostles may never in any different wise be believed, never in any different wise be understood.

All this I promise that I will faithfully, entirely and sincerely keep and inviolably guard, and from this never in teaching or howsoever by word or writing in the least depart. So I promise, so I swear, so help me God and these His holy gospels.

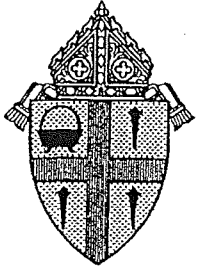

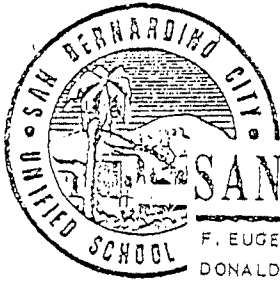

To date we have not had an answer to our letter of July 19, 1968, wherein we asked for the sale price on your property at 676 Ramona Avenue, San Bernardino, California.

We are assuming, therefore, that you have been unable to establish a price. As you know, the School District has had your property professionally appraised by two appraisal firms and these firms have established a fair market value on the property. The Board of Education is limited by the rules and regulations of the State Allocation Board, Department of General Services of the State of California, to the amount we can offer for the property. This amount is the higher of the two appraised values. The higher fair market value appraisal on your property is \$5,000.

If this offer is acceptable to you, will you please let us hear from you by return mail. The District pays all normal escrow fees, including the Documentary Stamps. Escrow can be closed within 30 days if you desire.

As we mentioned above, the District is limited to the amount we can offer. We have no authority to go over this figure at all. Therefore, if the offer is not acceptable to you, we have no alternative other than to ask the Board to adopt a resolution initiating condemnation proceedings. In a condemnation action the matter is referred to the courts and the court determines the fair market value. The School District as a public agency, can then acquire the property at the court determined price.

We are anxious to cooperate with you in this transaction and ask that you call if you have any questions whatsoever.

The District must adhere to a time limitation in this acquisition, so we would appreciate hearing from you on or before August 9, 1968.

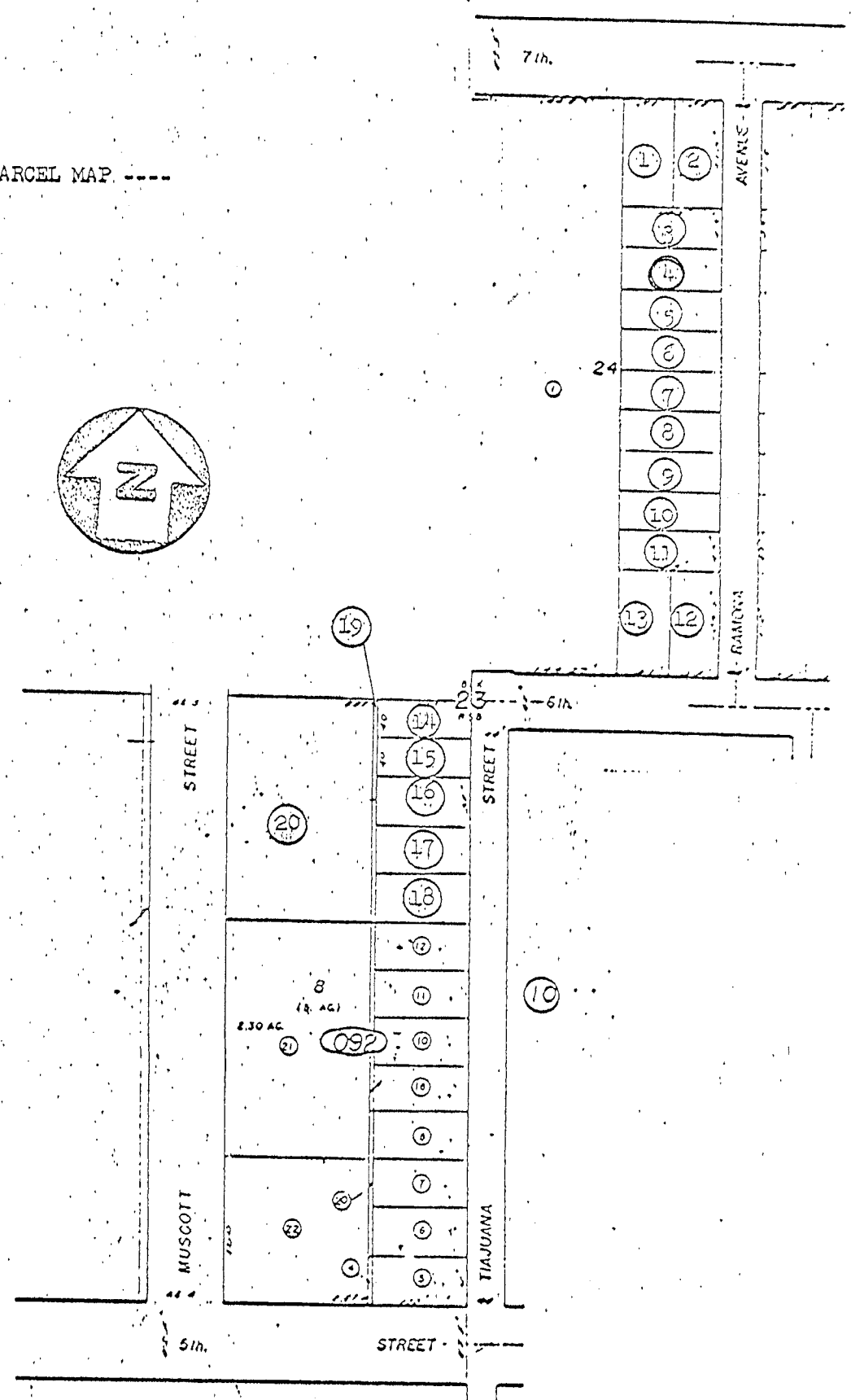
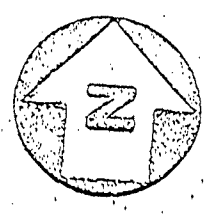

NUNEZ, deceased, renders to the Court the following First and Final Account and Report and presents herewith the within Petition for its Settlement, for Allowance of Statutory Commissions and Fees and Extraordinary Fees and for Final Distribution as follows:

J. R. NUNEZ, also known as JOSEPH R. NUNEZ, also known as JOSEPH ROSENDO NUNEZ, also known as JOSE R. NUNEZ, died on January 23, 1968, in the County of San Bernardino, State of California, being at the time of his death a resident thereof. Decedent's will dated August 20, 1960 was admitted to probate by order of this Court dated May 17, 1968. Petitioner qualified as executor of the will and letters testamentary were issued to petitioner on May 17, 1968, which ever since have been and now are in full force and effect.

NOTICE TO CREDITORS

Notice to Creditors has been published for the period and in the manner prescribed by law, and within thirty (30) days after the completion of publication

1 there was filed with the clerk of this Court an affidavit showing due publicati
2 in the manner and form required by law.

3 More than six months have elapsed since the issuance of said letters
4 testamentary in this estate and since the first publication of notice to credit
5 and the time for filing or presenting claims has expired.

6 STATUS OF ESTATE

7 Petitioner has performed all duties required of him as executor with
8 respect to the administration of the estate, and the estate is now ready for
9 distribution and is in a condition to be closed.

10 CREDITOR'S CLAIMS

11 No claims have been filed or presented against the estate and all debt
12 of decedent and of the estate and all expenses of administration, except for
13 closing expenses, commissions and attorneys fees, have been paid. The
14 sisters of the decedent, Aurora Nunez Cabrera and Refugio Nunez De Laure
15 paid with their own funds for entombment of the remains of the decedent,
16 Right Reverend Monsignor Joseph R. Nunez, in a crypt in the Chapel-Holy
17 Cross Sanctuary in Holy Cross Cemetery and Mausoleum in San Diego Count
18 California.

19 INVENTORY

20 An inventory and appraisement of the assets of the estate was duly
21 returned and filed showing the value of such estate assets to be \$6,854.77.

3 The Most Reverend Charles F. Buddy, named as a contingent beneficiary under
4 said Will as a joint tenant, predeceased the decedent herein.

5 COMPLIANCE WITH DIRECTIONS IN WILL

6 By the terms of the decedent's will, duly admitted to probate herein, a
7 photocopy of which is attached hereto marked Exhibit "E" and incorporated
8 herein by reference, the executor was directed to pay immediately after the
9 death of the testator, decedent herein, all Mass stipends listed which he (testa-
10 tor) had not satisfied. Petitioner is informed and believes and therefore alleges
11 that since decedent's death the Pastor who succeeded decedent has said approx-
12 imately 60 masses and other priests in the Diocese of San Diego, without
13 expectation of compensation therefor, have said numerous additional masses
14 to such extent that any and all mass intentions not satisfied at the time of his
15 death, for which the now deceased Monsignor received a stipend during his
16 lifetime, have now been satisfied.

17 Concurrently with the filing of the within account, report and petition
18 the petitioner herein, in compliance with the direction in decedent's will, shall
19 forward the sum of \$400.00 to the Roman Catholic Bishop of San Diego as and
20 for standard stipends sufficient to have two hundred masses said for the repose
21 of the soul of the deceased Rt. Rev. Msgr. J. R. Nunez.

22 PROPOSED DISTRIBUTION

23 The decedent's will refers to three (3) life insurance policies and
24 indicates the beneficiary designation on each of them. As a courtesy, petitioner's
25 attorney, J. Steve Williams, assisted the beneficiaries actually designated on
26 the respective policies at the time of the death of the decedent, to wit:
27 the Rector of the Immaculate Heart Seminary in San Diego, California, Aurora
28 Nunez (Cabrera) and Cuca Nunez (Refugio Nunez de Laurent), to secure the
29 proceeds from said policies although such proceeds were not a part of the
30 assets of the estate of decedent herein.

31 In accordance with the provisions of the will of Rt. Rev. Msgr. J. R.
32 Nunez, duly admitted to probate herein, the estate of the said decedent should

1 be distributed, as follows:

2 (a) To Rev. Rudolph Galindo, as Pastor of the Parish of Our Lady
3 of Guadalupe Roman Catholic Church, San Bernardino, Califor
4 U.S.A., for the benefit of said parish, all religious vestments
5 and sacred vases belonging to Rt. Rev. Msgr. J. R. Nunez as
6 of the date of his death on January 23, 1968.

7 (b) To Most Rev. John R. Quinn STL, Rector of Immaculate Heart
8 Seminary of San Diego diocese, San Diego, California, for use
9 in the library of said seminary all books belonging to Rt. Rev.
10 Msgr. J. R. Nunez as of the date of his death on January 23,
11 1968.

12 (c) To the Superior of the Sisters of the Incarnate Word, for the
13 use and benefit of said sisters at Our Lady of Guadalupe Church
14 San Bernardino, California, the 1965 Oldsmobile 4 door Delta
15 88 automobile belonging to Rt. Rev. Msgr. J. R. Nunez as of
16 the date of his death on January 23, 1968.

6 The commissions provided by law for the ordinary services of petition

9 J. Steve Williams, attorney at law, has rendered ordinary legal servi
10 to petitioner, and the fee provided by law for such services is the sum of
11 \$326.63, which has not been paid. Petitioner should be authorized to pay to t
12 attorney that sum in discharge of the statutory fees.

- 27 3. Correspondence with and calls to executor with reference to
28 acceptance of the school district offer (the amount of which was
29 substantially in excess of the appraised value of the subject
30 property determined by the inheritance tax appraiser).
- 31 4. Drafted, prepared and presented to this Court petitioner's
32 Petition for Order Authorizing Conveyance of Real Property to

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San Bernardino City Unified School District Under Probate Code
Section 587.

5. Furnished notice of the hearing on said petition as reflected by
the Declaration of Service by Mail, etc., dated October 16,
1968, on file herein, attended the hearing on said petition and
prepared the Order Authorizing Conveyance, etc., dated
November 1, 1968, which is on file herein.

6. Reviewed the escrow instructions predicated on the certified
copy of the said order, conferred with the executor with refer-
ence thereto, prepared the deed executed by the executor and
attended to the conclusion of the sale.

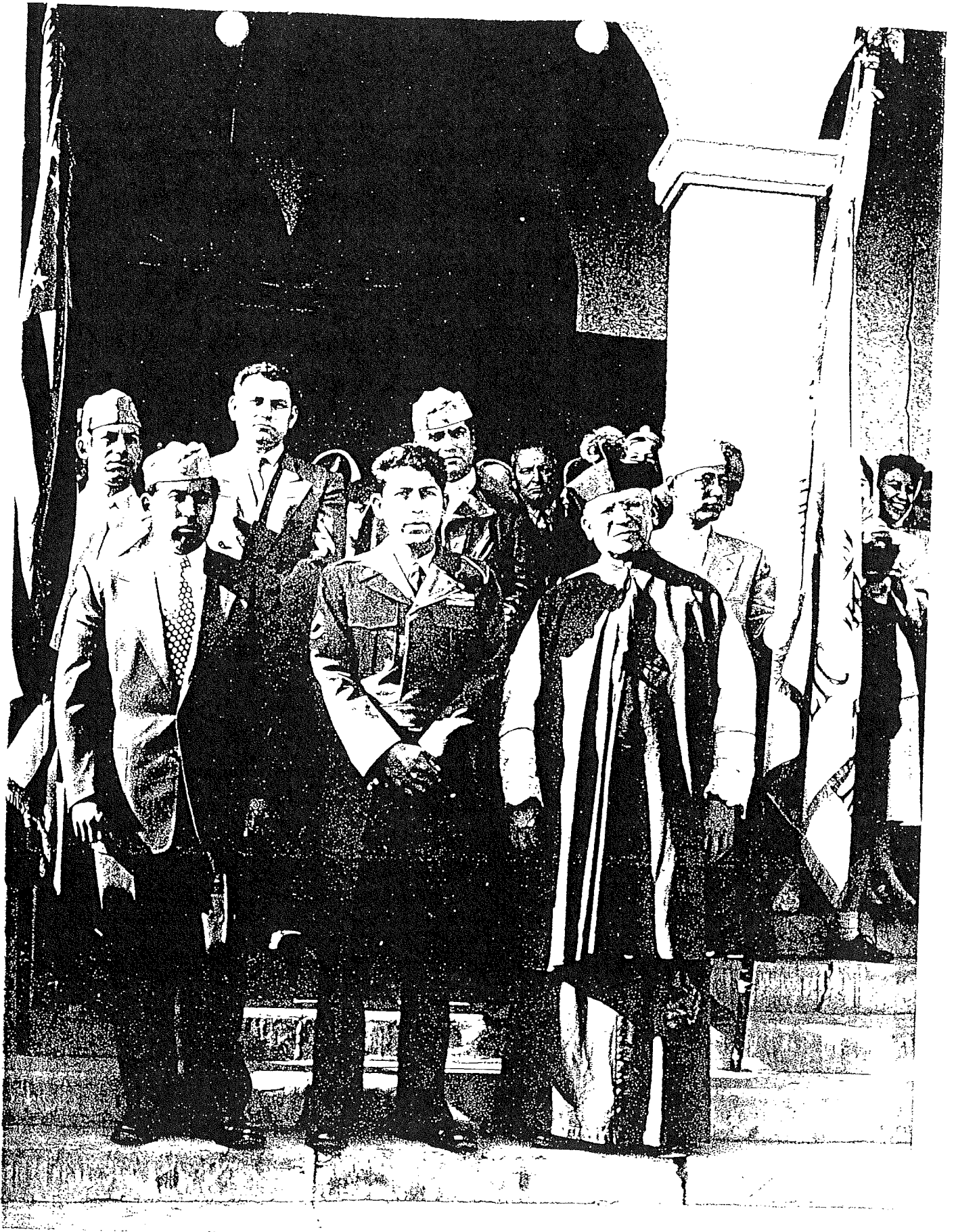

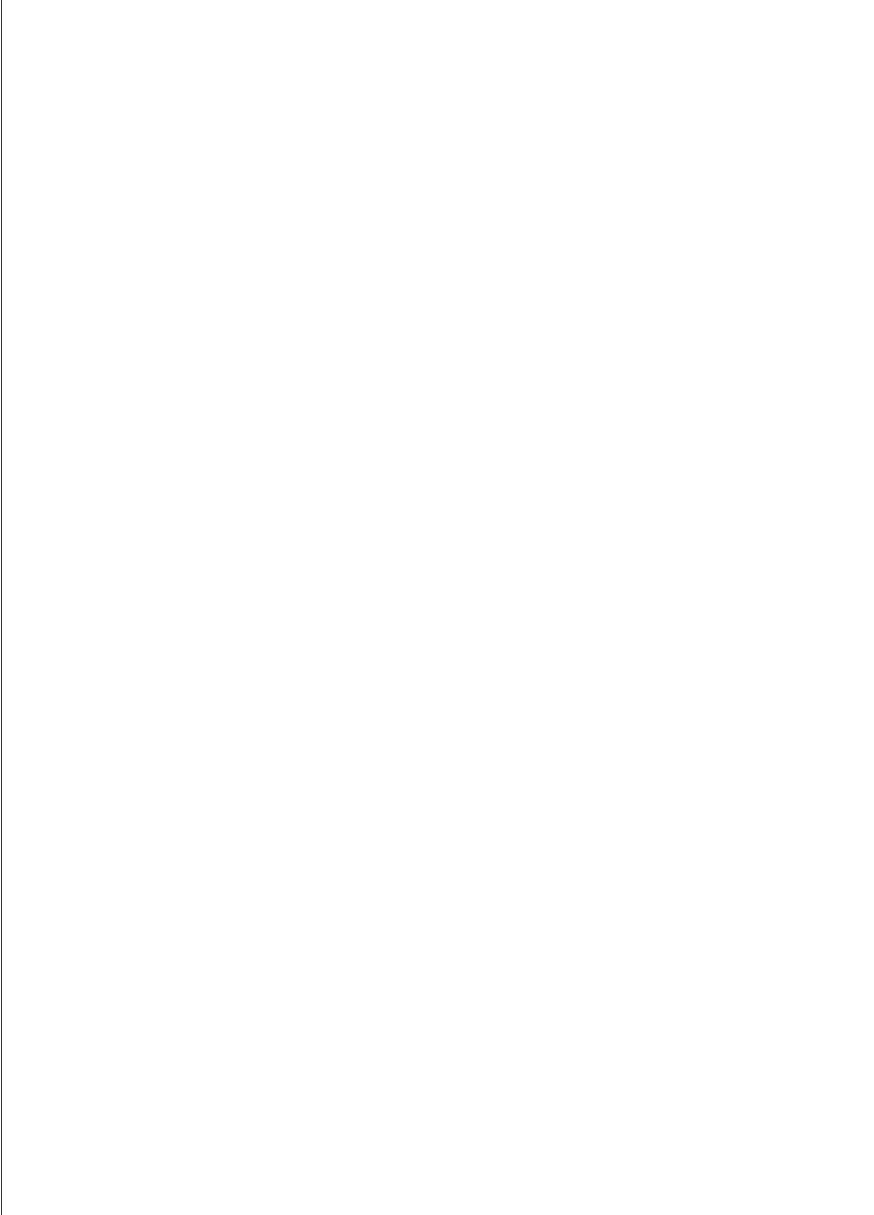

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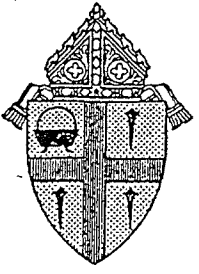
