FATHER PAT O'KEEFE AND NICKY RISTER SEXUAL MISCONDUCT INVESTIGATION I AM NICKY RISTER'S SISTER, CHRISTINE. I HAVE INFORMATION PERTINENT TO THIS INVESTIGATION INTO SEXUAL MISCONDUCT. I WILL OUTLINE FOR YOU SOME EVENTS THAT TOOK PLACE FROM 1969 TO PRESENT REGARDING NICKY. NICKY HAS BEEN SEXUALLY ACTIVE SINCE THE AGE OF 15, IN 1969. HER DATE OF BIRTH IS JULY 21, 1954. WE ARE 13 MONTHS APART IN AGE AND I HAVE BEEN FULLY AWARE OF MANY THINGS SHE HAS DONE OVER THE YEARS. IN REFERENCE TO THE NEWSPAPER ARTICLE IN THE S.B. SUN DATED AUG. 26,2002 I WILL CLARIFY SEVERAL THINGS. NICKY AND FATHER PAT DID IN FACT HAVE SEXUAL RELATIONS. NICKY WAS VERY PROUD OF IT AND STATED SO TO MY SISTER, PAULINE AND TO ME. SHE STATED SHE ALWAYS WANTED TO "DO A PRIEST". SHE WAS VERY OUTSPOKEN ABOUT THE FACT THAT SHE INITIATED THE RELATIONSHIP. AT THE TIME SHE AND FATHER PAT WERE HAVING THIS RELATIONSHIP NICKY WAS 18 YEARS OLD - NOT IT WAS CLEARLY A CONSENSUAL RELATIONSHIP. MY PARENTS AND NICKY MOVED TO SAN BERNARDINO THE 2ND WEEK OF JUNE, 1971 FROM FLAGSTAFF, AZ. I AM NOT SURE EXACTLY WHAT SCHOOL NICKY ATTENDED STARTING IN AUGUST OF 1971, BUT SHE WAS IN FACT LIVING IN SAN BERNARDINO AND ATTENDING SCHOOL THERE. SHE MADE ALOT OF "NEW FRIENDS" FROM THE VERY START AND EVEN SPENT THANKSGIVING OF 1971 WITH ONE OF THEM INSTEAD OF WITH MY DARENTS. MY DARENTS SPENT THANKSGIVING WITH ME IN LOS ANGELES THAT YEAR AND WE ATE AT THE RESTAURANT AT THE LA AIRPORT TERMINAL. MY MOTHER, WHO IS DECEASED, DID NOT SUGGEST TO NICKY TO JOIN THE CHOIR IN ORDER TO GET TO KNOW PEOPLE, NICKY DID THIS ON HER OWN ACCORD (IF SHE DID IN FACT JOIN THE CHOIR-THIS WAS NOT SOMETHING SHE LIKED TO DO). FAR AS TYPING UP HYMNS, THIS WAS DONE LATER IN 1972 WHEN SHE WAS LOOKING TO START A RELATIONSHIP WITH FATHER PAT. THIS WAS HER WAY OF GETTING HER FOOT IN THE DOOR AND HAVING PRIVATE TIME WITH FATHER PAT IN THE EVENINGS IN ORDER TO PROCEED WITH HER PLANS OF "DOING A PRIEST". IN MAY OF 1972 I WENT TO MY PARENTS HOUSE FOR A VISIT. DURING THE STAY THERE BOTH MOM AND DAD TOLD ME HOW UPSET THEY HAD BECOME WITH NICKY AND ALL OF HER "BOYFRIENDS". SHE WAS BRINGING NEW BOYS INTO THE HOUSE ON A REGULAR BASIS EVERY 2 OR 3 DAYS. ONE OF THE BOYS MY MOTHER WAS PARTICULARILY UPSET ABOUT NICKY DIDN'T BRING ANY GIRL FRIENDS TO THE HOUSE. MY MOTHER AND WAS BLACK. FATHER LED ME TO NICKY'S BEDROOM WHERE MY MOTHER PROCEEDED TO OPEN THE TOP DRAWER OF NICKY'S DRESSER AND SHOW ME IT CONTAINED ABOUT 30 BOTTLES OF VARIOUS MEDICATIONS. MY MOTHER BELIEVED THAT NICKY WAS INTO DRUGS. I EXPLAINED TO BOTH MOM AND DAD WHAT SOME OF THESE PILLS WERE FOR ESPECIALLY THE BIRTH CONTROL. NICKY WAS 17 AT THE TIME THIS OCCURRED AND MY PARENTS ASKED ME HOW SHE COULD OF GOTTEN THESE PRESCRIPTIONS WHEN THEY HAD NOT TAKEN HER TO THE DOCTOR NOR DID THEY GET THE PRESCRIPTIONS FOR HER. OTHER THAN HAVING A FAKE ID, I DID NOT KNOW THE ANSWER. I DID EXPLAIN TO MY PARENTS THAT NICKY WAS IN FACT PROSTITUTING HERSELF OUT BY THE DESCRIPTION THEY HAD GIVEN ME ABOUT THE MEN COMING AND GOING ALL THE TIME. EVERYTIME NICKY BROUGHT A MAN OVER THEY WOULD DISAPPEAR INTO THE BEDROOM AND NOT COME OUT TO WATCH TV OR HAVE ANY CONVERSATIONS WITH MY PARENTS. MOM AND DAD BOTH SAID THAT THAT EXPLAINED HOW SHE WAS GETTING MONEY. THEY TOLD ME THAT SHE WAS WORKING AT SOME PLACE (NOT SURE IF IT WAS THE POLICE DEPT. AT THIS TIME OR SOMEPLACE ELSE. SHE WAS A DISPATCHER FOR THE POLICE DEPT. OF SB SOMETIME BETWEEN 1972-1973), AND THAT SHE SAID SHE WASN'T MAKING ENOUGH MONEY TO PAY MY PARENTS RENT ON THE BEDROOM. YET SHE WAS ABLE TO PURCHASE A BRAND NEW VW (GREEN COLOR) AND WAS ALWAYS WALKING IN THE DOOR WITH NEW STUFFED ANIMALS TO DECORATE HER ROOM. SHE SAID THAT THESE ANIMALS WERE "GIFTS FROM GUYS". ALSO WAS CONSTANTLY BUYING NEW CLOTHES THAT MY PARENTS WERE NOT HAPPY ABOUT BECAUSE THEY WERE TOO REVEALING: SOMETIME BETWEEN MAY AND SEPT. 1972 MY PARENTS TOLD NICKY TO MOVE OUT OF THE HOUSE.

IN SEPT. 1972 I VISITED MY PARENTS AGAIN AND NICKY WAS NO LONGER LIVING IN THE HOUSE. I WAS VERY SICK AFTER GIVING BIRTH TO MY FIRST CHILD AND MY MOTHER SUGGESTED I GET SOME IRONIZED YEAST AND START TAKING IT BECAUSE I WAS ANEMIC. MY HUSBAND DROVE ME TO A PHARMACY NEAR MY PARENTS HOUSE AND I WENT IN ALONE TO LOCATE THE IRONIZED YEAST WHILE MY HUSBAND REMAINED IN THE CAR. THE PHARMACY WAS SET UP WITH THE PHARMACIST IN THE CENTER ON A RAISED PLATFORM. THE PHARMACIST WENT UP SEVERAL STAIRS INTO THE PHARMACUTICAL SECTION BEHIND CLOSED DOORS. THE TOP OF THIS PLATFORM HAD WINDOWS COMPLETELY SURROUNDING THE AREA SO THAT THE PHARMACIST COULD SEE ALL OF THE STORE. ANYONE LEAVING OFF OR PICKING UP A PRESCRIPTION WOULD BE LOOKING UP TOWARD THE PHARMACIST. EACH SIDE OF THE STORE WAS BLOCKED FROM VIEW OF THE OTHER. WHILE I WAS ON ONE SIDE, I KNEW SOMEONE HAD COME INTO THE STORE AND WAS TALKING TO THE PHARMACIST. I SUDDENLY REALIZED THAT IT WAS NICKY. AROUND TO ONE END AND JUST PEEKED AROUND THE CORNER TO SEE NICKY STANDING THERE TALKING TO THIS PHARMACIST. THEY STARTED OUT IN LOW TONES AND THEN NICKY STARTED RAISING HER VOICE TO HIM. SHE SAID THAT SHE WAS PREGNANT WITH HIS CHILD AND THAT SHE NEEDED \$300 TO GET AN ABORTION AND HE HAD BETTER COME UP WITH THE MONEY TODAY. HE ASKED HER TO QUIET DOWN AND HE WOULD TALK TO HER LATER AFTER HE GOT OFF WORK. NICKY GOT LOUDER AND SAID THAT SHE KNEW HIS WIFE'S NAME AND HIS HOME PHONE NUMBER AND THAT SHE WAS SURE THAT HIS WIFE WOULD BE INTERESTED IN KNOWING ABOUT THEIR RELATIONSHIP. THAT IF HE DID NOT COME UP WITH THE MONEY TODAY SHE WAS GOING TO CONTACT HIS WIFE. NICKY THEN LEFT THE STORE. IN ESSENCE NICKY WAS BLACKMAILING THIS MAN. I FOUND OUT LATER IN 1973 THAT SHE HAD DONE THIS TO SEVERAL MEN. THE MEN CAME UP WITH THE MONEY TO SHUT HER UP AND THEN NEVER SAW HER AGAIN. ONE MAN, ROGER DAWSON, TOLD ME THAT SHE HAD TRIED TO DO THIS TO HIM - CLAIM SHE WAS PREGNANT AND GET HIM TO GIVE HER MONEY. HE SAID NO AND TOLD HER TO GO SCREW HERSELF. NICKY PLAYED THIS GAME IN SB, IN FARMINGTON, NM AND IN WOODLAND, CALIF. NICKY ALSO ATTEMPTED TO SEDUCE MY HUSBAND, AND MY OTHER SISTERS' HUSBANDS. THERE ARE ALSO OTHER FRIEND'S SHE MADE AND THEN LOST DUE TO HER SEXUAL ACTIVITIES.

I UNDERSTAND THAT NICKY HAS TURNED OVER SOME TYPE OF LETTERS FROM MY DAD TO THE POLICE DEPT. IT WOULD BE ADVISABLE TO VERIFY WITH OTHER FAMILY MEMBERS THAT THOSE LETTERS ARE IN FACT FROM MY FATHER AND NOT FORGED OR FAKE. OF SPECIAL INTEREST PLEASE NOTE THAT NICKY DID NOT TELL ANY OF THE FAMILY MEMBERS THAT SHE WAS FILING THIS REPORT ON FATHER PAT, EXCEPT 1 BROTHER, AND THAT INFORMATION SHE GAVE TO HIM WAS MINIMAL AT BEST. SHE DID NOT WANT THE REST OF US TO KNOW BECAUSE WE ARE VERY AWARE OF HER PAST, OF THE TIMELINES AND HER WAY OF LIFE. As you can see, in his own hand writing he admits "you were the victim" and he "wishes I could love the pain from me" and "wish I could tell you how sorry I am for the past."

I have tried many many times to forget and forgive myself but for some reason it keeps coming back and haunting me. I think it stems from being brought up strict Catholic and the respect that was pounded into us for priests. (It is ironic that my own Dad was ordained a priest after my mother passed away.) All the new stories about others being abused and used just reminds me of what happened and brings back all the guilt and doubt.

Even though Pat says he is sorry for the past, he stresses more how sorry he is that he had to be moved and or transferred. I think he felt worse about that then about our affair. I never heard from Pat after his last letter.

I have sent a copy of this letter and the other letters to the San Bernardino Prosecutor. You had suggested contacting the Child Protective Services but I feel the prosecutor is a better place to start.

Bishop Straling,

I feel it is time to step forward and be counted as one of females taken advantage of by a priest. I have carried this guilt with me for 17 years and just now feel secure and brave enough to tell you about it.

I saw an article on 20/20 about priests taking advantage of kids, and I related to it. I realize these priests are the minority, but that is no reason for us victims to stay in the closet.

I am refering to Father Pat O'Keefe when he was in Highland, Da. I was only 17, a senior in high school, and very new to the area. The exact dates are very easy to pin down, as I kept a diary of our affair. I am sure you don't want to know all the sordid details, but I can tell you it went on for months. It started pab. 17, 1972. On April 17, I told Pat (I never called him gather) I thought I was pregnant. He was both scared and excited.

He felt free to call me at home and tell me he loved me, and did so often. My parents thought it was great for me to have such a good rapport with my priest. Little did they know what went on. Luckily, I had, and still have, a girlfriend I could confide in, to help me through all my mixed emotions.

wat always told my mother that as long as I was a "good" girl, I would inherit all his cut glass from Ireland. My mother and Dad never stopped me from going to the church to "help" Pat when he called for me. They always said to be very "good".

Finally, on April 27th, I found out I wasn't pregnant. I didn't want to continue with Pat, but he continued to pursue me. My love for him made it hard to resist his desires. Eventually, it tapered off.


