INTRODUCTION

This handbook contains statements of policies and procedures and is designed to increase understanding, reduce the needs for personal decisions on common issues, and to help assure consistency among Diocesan departments and parishes. The Diocese may revise or discontinue the policies, procedures, benefits or compensation provisions described in this handbook at any time and/or institute new policies, procedures or benefits or compensation at any time.

All employment is at will and no agreement, written or oral, express or implied, between an employee and any supervisor, pastor or other representative of the Diocese is valid. All employment can be terminated, with or without cause, and with or without notice, at any time, by the employee or the Diocese, as the case may be, considers sufficient.

Neither the contents of this handbook nor any other Diocesan policies, procedures or practices (whether verbal or written), nor the acceptance or continuance of employment constitutes a contract of employment or a promise of employment or employment conditions; nor do they create an implied duty or contractual obligation between an employee and the Diocese. No Diocesan attorney, member or representative other than Roman Catholic Bishop and/or Diocesan Business Manager has any authority to enter into any agreement for employment for any specified period of time, or to make any agreement contrary to the foregoing. Any such agreement on behalf of the Diocese, by the specifically authorized and named individual(s) above, must be in writing and the named representative has no authority to enter into any such agreement which is not writing.

No department head or other representative of the Diocese has any authority to waive any provisions of this manual or of revisions to this manual. Only Roman Catholic Bishop and/or Diocesan Business Manager has the authority to waive or alter any of the provisions outlined in this manual and any such waiver must be in writing and signed by the named representative, who has no authority to enter into any such waiver or authorization which is not in writing.

EMPLOYEE PERSONNEL HANDBOOK

SECTION 100 - EMPLOYMENT POLICY

<u> 101 - Employment Policy:</u>

It is the policy of the Diocese of San Bernardino to provide equal opportunity to all applicants for employment, and to administer its personnel practices in a non-discriminatory manner. However, the Diocese reserves the right to favor employees who are Catholic.

Employment and subsequent transfer and/or promotion will be determined by qualifying factors, such as training and experience, and will not be influenced by race, color, sex, handicap or national origin. These principles shall apply to recruitment, selection, hiring, and on-thejob treatment of employees.

Employees of all departments, agencies, offices, parishes, and missions of the Diocese are affected by this policy. It is the responsibility of all supervisory personnel to ensure that this policy is applied to employment situations at all times.

<u> 102 - Categories of Employment:</u>

For purposes of salary and personnel administration, Diocesan employees are classified into categories. These include full-time regular, part-time regular, part-time, temporary, contract, special project, exempt, and non-exempt. Individuals in all categories are covered for Social Security, Worker's Compensation, California State Disability Benefits Insurance and California State Unemployment Insurance as required by law.

Specific provisions regarding all benefit categories are contained in Diocesan Personnel Policies and Procedures, Section 100, and should be referred to for individual determination of benefits.

SECTION 200 - WORKING CONDITIONS AND PAYROLL INFORMATION

201 - Working Conditions:

Diocesan offices observe a 35-hour work week. Regular business hours are from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. daily Monday through Friday except for recognized holidays. Provisions allow for a 1-hour lunch period daily for full-time regular employees and two 15 minute rest periods for non-exempt employees. Reference should be made to Diocesan Personnel Policies and Procedures, Section 201, for provisions regarding employees, who are not included in the "full-time regular" category.

Appearance: Diocesan employees are expected to dress in a neat and professional manner. Department heads and/or supervisors shall be responsible for determining appropriate attire in the workplace. Work Environment: Diocesan facilities are appointed and maintained to provide a safe and comfortable environment for all employees. Any unusual sights or sounds, such as cracks, drips, or any potentially dangerous condition should be reported.

Injury: Job-related accidents and/or injuries are to be reported to pertinent supervisory staff immediately. Coverage by Worker's Compensation Insurance shall be determined on an individual basis.

Work Area and Security: Employees are expected to maintain a neat work area, and avoid anything which might create or contribute to a hazardous condition. Keys to locked desks or work areas must be provided to supervisorial staff, since the Diocese resumes the right to enter and examine any desk, cabinet, container and locked work area utilized by employees. The Diocese is not responsible for loss of personal possessions through fire, theft, or other loss.

Telephone Usage: Employees should not use business phones for personal calls. In cases of necessity, employees may make personal calls during lunch or rest periods. Any long-distance call should be charged to the employee's home phone.

Solicitation and Distribution: Any solicitation or distribution activities must be approved by the Business Manager, and will be monitored by the Personnel Office. Reference should be made to Diocesan Personnel Policies and Procedures, Section 201, 8a. for provisions related to any such activities.

202 - Employee Attendance:

All employees are expected to work according to normal schedules at their established assigned work places. The Diocesan Personnel Policies and Procedures should be consulted for specific information regarding tardiness, absences, exceptions and discipline. Time sheets and absence reports are required of all employees carried on the Diocesan payroll.

203 - Payroll:

Employees are paid twice a month, with pay periods ending on the 15th and last day of the month. Compulsory salary deductions include Withholding Tax (F.I.T.), Social Security Tax (F.I.C.A.), State Income Tax (S.I.T.), and State Disability Insurance (S.D.I.). Voluntary deductions include group health insurance, Diocesan pension plan, and tax shelter investment plans. Absences and tardiness will be reflected in salaries in accordance with the Diocesan Personnel Policies and Procedures.

204 - Overtime Hours and Compensation:

Overtime must be authorized in writing by a Department Head or supervisor, and may be authorized only if monies are available for this use. Compensation for overtime by non-exempt employees is paid at one and one-half times the normal salary. Compensatory time off is not allowed in lieu of overtime for non-exempt employees. All overtime hours must be carefully documented and approved.

205 - Wage and Salary Administration:

It is the policy of the Diocesan Personnel Office to study job tasks and develop fair and equitable pay ranges for assigned positions. The Diocesan Personnel Office will also establish and administer a uniform salary program consisting of wage rate ranges for assigned positions and performance. Each range includes a minimum, mid-point, and maximum rate.

Stipends and Gifts: Employees of the Diocese are not to use their positions with the Diocese for personal gain or advantage or in any manner that would create a conflict of interest. They must refrain from taking part in any activity or transaction in which their own interests may conflict with the best interests of the Diocese. Accordingly, the following policies shall apply: No employee or department of the Diocese may offer, exchange or accept payments or gifts, either directly or indirectly, from any individual, firm or institution, which conducts business with or has contacts with the Diocese of San Bernardino. Furthermore, rejections, acceptances or recommendations and exertion of influence of any kind shall not be tied to payments, gifts or favors in any form, directly or indirectly.

"Payments", "gifts", etc. include vacations, loans, loan guarantees, expenses, consultant fees, stipends, direct gifts of objects or money, etc. The term 'indirect' includes the offering or accepting of payments, gifts or favors by a relative, person acting on behalf of the employee, or a contractor with the diocese, a partnership, corporation or business entity in which the employee has an interest or by any person acting on behalf of the employee. These rules do not preclude the offering or acceptance of Christmas remembrances, thankyou gifts, business meals, or occasional gifts of nominal value, none of which may exceed \$25.00.

No employee or contractor of the Diocese may solicit, offer, or accept a stipend or payment other than their regular salary, from any department of the Diocese without the prior written approval of the personnel director. Such approval will be given only if, in the sole judgment of the personnel director, the services or conduct for which such stipend is requested, does not fall within the duties, obligations, job descriptions or abilities of the employee's regular position.

SECTION 300 - PLACEMENT AND REVIEW

301 - Employee Selection:

All job applicants are accepted on the basis of merit, qualification, and competence. The Diocese resumes the right to be sole judge of these characteristics, but does not discriminate on the basis of age, sex, race, handicap, or national origin.

Provisions: Additions to staff are contingent upon budget needs and require advance approval from the Diocesan Personnel Office in consultation with the Diocesan Business Manager. The Personnel Office will provide a job description. Job classification and salary for each new hire is determined prior to recruitment. Interviewing and reference checks are part of the hiring process. Performance evaluation of new employees will be accomplished prior to the end of 90 calendar days of employment.

Implementation: As authorized vacancies occur, job related qualifications are established, a time period for recruitment and selection is determined, and plans for a selection process are made. A Search Committee may be established for exempt positions. The Bishop and/or the Priest's Personnel Board may be involved depending upon the position. Vacant positions are advertised throughout the Diocese, and all applications are accepted by the Diocesan Personnel Office.

Application Process: Applicants are required to complete a Diocesan Standard Application. Additional specific information may be requested for certain positions. Resumes may be submitted, but may not be substituted for the standard application. Hiring procedures include a pre-employment interview, .assessment of experience, work related testing where applicable, and reference checks. A transcript of grades may be requested for some positions. False or misleading information by the applicant, constitutes cause for automatic disqualification. Successful candidates will be notified in writing. Such notification will also include starting salary, name of supervisor, and starting date.

Reporting to Work: New employees will report to their supervisor on the first day of work for assignment and orientation. New employees must report to the Personnel Office on their first day of employment for explanation and completion of employment benefits, payroll forms, and other applicable employment procedures.

Introductory Period: New employees are in an Introductory status for 90 calendar days commencing with the first day of work. This period may be extended for one additional 90-day period if deemed necessary or appropriate by the supervisor. Employment may be terminated within this time period for any reason. A written performance evaluation must be filed by the supervisor at least ten days prior to the end of the Introductory Period. Regular status is conferred at the end of the Introductory Period.

302 - Employment of Relatives (Nepotism):

Relatives of employees must follow the specified procedures included in the Employee Selection process. A relative, for this purpose, is defined as: husband, wife, father, mother, stepfather, stepmother, child, stepchild, grandparent, grandchild, in-law, niece, nephew, aunt, uncle, fosterchild or ward of the court. Department Heads or supervisors may further restrict the employment of relatives where close proximity might disrupt optimal performance of functions. Relatives are not to supervise one another or check, review, and/or process the work of one another.

303 - Performance Evaluation:

Each employee is given a written evaluation on a regularly scheduled basis and/or prior to consideration for a promotion or transfer. Performance evaluations consist of written and oral discussion procedures as prescribed in Diocesan Personnel Policies and Procedures, Section 303. The employee is requested to sign the evaluation to indicate understanding of the contents therein. Disagreement should be questioned and discussed. Completed Performance Evaluation forms are retained in the employee's personnel file. The Personnel Director is responsible for the overall operation of this procedure and for providing counsel wherever necessary to ensure its completion.

304 - Promotion and Transfers:

Rate changes are affected by promotion, transfers, performance, demotion, re-evaluation of position, and/or rate range adjustments based upon periodic organizational reviews. Supervisors are responsible for initiating rate changes promotions and transfers in accordance with provisions contained in the Dioceson Persenvel Policies and Procedures, Sections 304 and 305.

305 - Termination of Employment and Discipling

1. Voluntary Terminations: Employees resigning voluntarily are expected to give ample advance notice in writing. The minimum lead times are one month from exempt employees, and two weeks for non-exempt employees. Employees should not expect to use accrued sick leave or vacation leave to fulfill the notice requirement. Each person is entitled to receive payment for unused vacation time, accrued to the last day worked.

2. Retrenchment: Reduction in Force (RIF) and Layoff Slack Work (LOSW). Before individuals in this category are terminated, every effort should be made to locate other suitable jobs for them in the Diocese. In seeking such transfer possibilities, consideration should be given to the person's length of service; all other things being equal, this should be the determining factor in offering transfers. Those being terminated for these reasons shall receive separation allowances, equal to one week's pay for each year of completed service. They also shall receive advance notice of one month, for exempt people and two weeks for non-exempt people, where possible or pay in lieu therefore. In addition, unused vacation time accrued as of the last day.

3. Dismissal/Discipline: The Department Head, in consultation with the Personnel Director, is responsible for the discipline of an employee. Disciplinary action up to and including dismissal may result from the commission of acts such as are listed below. In some cases, the action may result in a verbal or written warning. In other cases, the action may result in suspension or discharge. The Diocese reserves the right to decide under which circumstances dismissal or some lesser penalty is appropriate. It should be noted that the types of misconduct identified below are merely examples of acts which may lead to disciplinary action. The listing below is not a complete list of all types of conduct which may result in disciplinary action up to and including discharge:

- a. Insubordination.
- b. Vandalism.
- c. Dishonesty.
- d. Theft.
- e. Falsification of records or information.
- f. Falsification of job application or references.
- q. Working under the influence of intoxicants or drugs.
- h. Sexual, racial, religious or ethnic harassment.
- i. Unsatisfactory job performance.
- j. Unprofessional conduct.
- k. Breach of professional ethnics.
- Inability to work cooperatively with supervisors, peers or subordinates.
- m. Violation of employer rules.
- n. Habitual or excessive tardiness or absence, with or
- without cause, from work or from employee's work area. o. Excessive use of sick leave.
- p. Conduct or activity reflecting negatively upon the

Diocese or which could cause scandal for the Church.

When in the opinion of the Diocese an act of misconduct requires a written warning, the warning should be signed by the employee and the Department Head or his/her delegate and a copy of the warning will be placed in the employee's personnel file. When in the opinion of the Diocese the act of misconduct warrants dismissal, the dismissal will be discussed with the employee and the employee will be given the reasons for the dismissal in writing.

4. Retirement and Total Permanent Disability: Those leaving for these reasons are entitled to receive payment for accrued vacation times as of the last day worked. The arrangements for termination are handled as prescribed in the Retirement and Total Permanent Disability Plans. 5. Exit Interviews: All those terminating their employment, for whatever reasons, are to be interviewed by the Personnel Coordinator before their departure. The information obtained in the exit interview becomes part of the individual's personnel file; it should include, at the very least, the reason for termination, and whether or not the person would be considered for rehire. A part of the exit interview is to recover all Diocesan property, such as keys and equipment, and to settle any financial obligations outstanding.

6. Unused Sick Leave Days are not paid upon termination for any reason.

306 - Employee Grievances:

1. A grievance is defined as an unresolved dispute, disagreement, misunderstanding, or expressed dissatisfaction on the part of the employees relating to employment conditions or the meaning and application of personnel policies. The procedure for filing grievances is as follows:

Step I. An employee should always initially approach his/her immediate supervisor and attempt to resolve the matter. If the employee still believes that the grievance has not been satisfied, he/she may appeal the decision to the next level of supervision. At this point the grievance must be in writing and must contain a brief statement of the facts of the grievance, the basis of the objections and the desired remedy. The written grievance must be submitted within Five (5) working days to the incident or problem which gave rise to the grievance. The Department Head or delegate will investigate the grievance and respond to the employee in writing within ten (10) working days after a submission of the written grievance.

Step II. If the grievance was not resolved in Step I, you may, within ten working days of Step I, present your written grievance to the Personnel Office Director. The Personnel Office Director will request a memorandum from the employee's department supervisors describing the steps taken to resolve the grievance in Step I. The Personnel Director will investigate the grievance and send you a written response within ten working days of receiving your written grievance. If the response does not resolve the grievance for you, or if the Personnel Director fails to respond, you may proceed to Step III.

Step III. Within ten working days of Step II, you may send a memor andum to the Personnel Director requesting the formation of a volunt eer Personnel Review Committee. A Personnel Review Committee is made up of three persons. General; one is chosen by the employee and one is chosen by the employee's Department Head, and the third is chosen by those two. The choice of committee members is to be made wit hin fifteen working days after submission of the Step III grievance. The Director of the Personnel Office will serve as a resource person and staff to the Committee. In the event the grievance is an employee of the Personnel Office, someone else will be chosen to serve in this capacity. The Committee will hear both sides of the dispute in clo sed sessions within six weeks of the date of your Step III memorand um. The Personnel Review Committee will give its decision in writing and copies will be sent to you and your Department Director. The decision of the Committee is final.

2. The Grievance Procedure may be used by an employee or a group of employees with the same grievance. There is a specified time schedule to be followed, but if circumstances beyond the control of the individuals involved make this impossible, the Personnel Director is authorized to approve an alternate schedule.

3. It shall be an express condition of employment that, should a civil court of law determine that the decision by the Committee is not binding, then the matter shall be decided by arbitration in accordance with the Commercial Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association, and judgment on the award rendered by the arbitrators may be entered in any court having jurisdiction. There shall be three (3) arbitrators, one to be chosen directly by each party at will, and the third arbitrator to be selected by the two (2) arbitrators so chosen. Each party shall pay the fees of the arbitrator he/she selects and of his/her own attorneys, and the expenses of his/her witnesses and all other expenses connected with presenting his/her case. Other costs of the arbitrator, and all other fees and costs shall be borne equally by the parties.

PROVISIONS:

The following provisions apply to the use of the Grievance Procedures:

1. Only grievances involving employment conditions and/or the meaning and application of the written personnel policies may be submitted to the grievance procedure.

2. No grievance may proceed to review unless both parties have stipulated in writing the issue(s) to be addressed by the Personnel Review Committee. If a joint stipulation cannot be formulated, then each party shall submit its own presentation of the issues to be submitted to the Committee. The Committee shall be the final judge of which issues are grievable.

3. The Personnel Review Committee's consideration shall be limited solely to the issues raised in the presentation of the grievance.

4. The Personnel Review Committee shall render its decision solely on the basis of its interpretation of the personnel policies. The Committee shall have no authority to add to, subtract from or modify any personnel policy.

5. Under no circumstances shall either the diocese or the employee be responsible for the payment of any attorney's fees or other costs incurred by the other in processing the grievance of its conclusion.

SECTION 400 - EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

<u>401 - Holidays and Holy days:</u>

Full-time and part-time regular employees are entitled to receive paid holidays, holy days, vacation time, medical leave, maternity leave, paternity leave, and State Disability Benefits if eligibility requirements are met. Full-time and part-time regular employees are entitled to the observed paid Holidays and Holy days. Holidays are paid only when they fall on normal work days except for January 1, July 4, and December 25. When July 4 falls on a Saturday, it will be observed on the previous Friday. When January 1, July 4, or December 25 fall on a Sunday the holiday will be observed on the following Monday. Holy Days will be observed on the days on which they fall in the liturgical calendar, and will be paid only when they fall on a normally scheduled workday. Employees must be on the payroll on the Holiday/Holy Day, and must have worked a normal schedule on the last workday before and the first day after in order to be eligible for the paid Holiday/Holy Day.

402 - Vacation:

Employees are encouraged to take most of their vacation at one time, or in one-week increments. Paid vacation time is determined by length of service as follows:

- After six (6) consecutive months in the first year of employment -1 week.
- 2. Up to fourth employment anniversary 2 weeks.
- 3. Fifth to eleventh employment anniversary 3 weeks.
- 4. Year of 12th anniversary and thereafter 4 weeks.

Vacation weeks equal a regularly scheduled workweek of 35 hours. For part-time employees, one week of vacation is equal to the average weekly hours worked during the past year, or total hours worked during the past 52 weeks divided by 52.

A maximum of two (2) weeks vacation time may be deferred to comprise a total of six (6) weeks vacation time in one year. However, deferral of vacation time is an exception to Diocesan Policy only and requires the approval of the supervisor and the Personnel Office. Employees are encouraged to use vacation time annually. Scheduling arrangements must be approved by the supervising authority. Every effort will be made to accommodate the employees request. Vacation pay will not be granted in lieu of time off except for unused vacation time at time of termination in accordance with Section 306 of the Diocesan Personnel Policies and Procedures.

An observed holiday occurring during vacation time will be credited as an additional vacation day. If an employee becomes ill or suffers an accident during a scheduled vacation, the time beginning with the next calendar week will be changed to absence due to illness or accident. Proof of illness and/or accident must be furnished.

Supervising personnel are responsible for preparing vacation schedules, and the Personnel Department will provide vacation schedules and records of vacation eligibility prior to the start of each calendar year. Eligibility records and records of employee vacation time used will be maintained by the Personnel Department.

403 - Medical Leave

Regular full-time and part-time employees may receive payment for illness or non-occupational accident in accordance with the provisions in this section.

Absences resulting from occupational accidents are covered by Worker's Compensation (Section 404.2, Personnel Policies and Procedures).

Absences resulting from total and permanent disability are covered by a separate Long Term Disability provisions (Diocesan Personnel Policies and Procedures, Section 403.4).

Eligibility for medical leave begins after the first three (3) months of employment, and accumulates at the rate of one (1) day per month if unused. Medical leave may be used for illness, maternity, paternity needs, family emergencies, and time required for adoption of a child.

Medical leave time may be accumulated to a maximum of thirty (30) days. No payment will be made upon termination of employment for unused medical leave.

Under state law, disability benefits are paid for bona fide absences beginning on the eighth day for up to 26 weeks at the rate of 50% of pay or a maximum of \$95.00 per week.

Accrued medical is granted for absences related to maternity and childbirth. If the maternity or childbirth absence exceeds the time covered by the accrued leave time, the employee is eligible to receive 50% of pay or a maximum of \$95.00 per week for a period of 26 weeks. Refer to the Diocesan Personnel Policies and Procedures for full details and provisions of medical and personal leave time. The Diocese/Parish reserves the right to request certification regarding medical leaves and permission to return to work. Male employees may take only accrued sick leave as paternity leave.

404 - Time Off With Pay:

Paid time off is granted to employees for death in family, jury duty, military service/reserve training, and educational leaves as follows:

Death in the family.

Spouse or child - total of ten workdays.

Parent or sibling - total of six workdays.

Mother, father, relative (See Diocesan Personnel Policies and Procedures, Section 404) - total of two workdays.

When an employee attends the funeral or burial of a spouse, child, parent or sibling more than 150 miles from place of work, an additional day is granted; two additional days are granted if out of State.

Jury Duty: Employees called to jury duty must notify their supervisors immediately. Employees receive a total of 30 days full pay for jury duty, but must reimburse the Diocese/Parish the amount of jury duty pay received along with a Court statement of monies received. Employees excused at 1:00 P.M. or earlier must return to work on that day. Employees must advise the Court that jury duty in excess of 30 days per year is unpaid.

Military Service/Reserve Training: One day's paid leave is granted for a physical examination, if required, to employees who enlist for military service.

Members of Military Reserve or National Guard receive the difference in pay paid by the military to equal their normal salary for time spent in annual training for a maximum of three weeks. This time will not be considered vacation time.

Educational Leave: With prior permission, employees may attend conferences, seminars, institutes and courses during regularly scheduled working hours. Such activities must relate directly to the employee's job, and be for improvement of skills and/or enhancement of productivity.

405 - Leaves of Absences:

- A. Informal leave of absence may be granted for up to 30 days if a valid reason exists and paid leave time is not available. A written request must be approved by the immediate supervisor. Final approval is given by the Personnel Department.
- B. Formal leave of absence applies to employees who:
 - 1. Have at least five years of service with the Diocese.
 - 2. Wish to leave for more than 30 days and have a valid reason.
 - 3. Intend to return to work for the Diocese.

This leave is intended to encourage the return of Diocesan personnel where careers are interrupted for education, community service, urgent family needs, or other such reasons. Requests are to be made at least 60 days in advance, and may be for a total of one year subject to approval of six months at a time. No leaves are extended beyond one year.

C. Employees on informal leave continue to be covered for all benefits. Those on formal leave must pay for medical and life insurance or the benefits are discontinued. Also, no credit is given toward vacation, or medical leave accrual. The Personnel Office is responsible for all final approval of leaves of absence, maintaining pertinent necessary records, and collecting premiums for continuation of insurances.

406 - Legislated Benefit Programs:

Employees are covered by certain statutory benefits. Actual benefits provided are those specified by applicable legislation and/or policies of insurance carried by the Diocese. All employees are covered, as required by law, for legislated benefit programs. These include Worker's Compensation, Social Security, State Disability Benefits, and Unemployment Insurance. Details for provisions and extent of coverage are contained in Section 406 of the Diocesan Personnel Policies and Procedures.

407 - Pension Plan

The Diocesan Pension Plan is designed to provide employees with an assured income which is in addition to any Social Security Benefits payable at retirement age. Details for provisions and extent of coverage are contained in Section 407 of the Diocesan Policies and Procedures Manual and the Formal Summary Plan issued by Plan Administrator, Epler Company of San Diego, CA. If an employee is eligible for the Pension Plan but does not wish to participate, he/she must sign a Waiver Statement.

408 - Lay Health Benefit Plan (Group 28)

This plan provides lay employees with medical/health care benefits for lay employees and their dependents. Details are contained in Section 408 of the Diocesan Policies & Procedures Manual and the Summary Plan Coverage issued by the Plan Administrator, Heffernan, Keiler and Doble, Inc. of San Francisco, CA. If an employee is eligible for the Lay Health Benefit Plan but does wish to participate, he/she must sign a Waiver Statement.

Barstow's First Catholic Church was built in 1914 on land donated by the Atchison, Topeka, and Santa Fe Railroad. St. Joseph's Church and rectory were first located on Second Street, where Father Chas. Kerfs served as the first pastor of the new parish. At that time the parish was in the diocese of Los Angeles, but in 1935 became part of the newly formed diocese of San



Diego. With the establishment of the new diocese of San Bernardino in 1979, St. Joseph's changed to its present affiliation.

Prior to the establishment of a parish in Barstow, area catholics had been served by visiting priests from needles who celebrated mass at Waterman School and various restaurants and public buildings in the town. The new parish served catholics from Hinkley to the Nevada border, and as far north as Bishop. In 1939 the original church was condemned, a new church was built on the same site by Al Bourget of Minneola, this church dedicated in 1941.



Rev. Michael Noonan recognized the need for expansion and purchased a remote piece of land on Mt. View Avenue where he supervised construction of the convent, and the start of school construction. Rev. Chas. Young oversaw completion of the school, building of Noonan Hall, and the rectory. In 1964 the old church was moved in its entirety from Second Ave. to its present location as part of the school, and in 1966 construction began on the current church structure. 1700 families call St. Joseph's parish their spiritual home at the present time.

According to the Desert Dispatch of February, 1921, the schedule for regular Mass in Barstow looked like this: 2nd and 4th Sunday of the months. Fr. C. T. Kerfs was traveling to many of the desert communities including Blythe, Death Valley, and Victorville, as well as serving Barstow. We've made a lot of changes in the fifty years since the actual founding of the parish of St. Joseph's. Before the parish

was founded in October of 1921, the Catholic Community had been served by various pricests on a monthly or semi-monthly basis as indicated by the schedule in the local newspaper. The first church had been constructed on North Second Street on land donated by the Atchison, Topeka and Sante Fe Railroad in March, 1914. This church, along with rectory built in the rear served the small community of a railroad town set in the middle of the vast Mojave desert.

SAINT JOSEPH'S HISTORY

To try to put in perspective the size of the community, 47 people were baptized in the first year of existence of the parish from the area which it now serves. This compares with 265 baptisms in the past year. Fr. Kerfs, however, recorded an additional 53 persons baptized from Blythe and Ore Grande. To serve this parish has always been a challenge to all the priests who have been assigned here, and to one in the carly 20's the obstacles were great indeed. The 200 mile drive to Blythe that had to be made regularly to serve the people there must have been a real experience in the hot summer times over dusty rough roads in non-air conditioned cars.

The first St. Joseph's Church served Barstow between 1914 and 1941. Fr. Michael Flahive was assigned to Barstow between 1937 and 1948, and saw the needs for expansion of the church due to the rapidly growing city.

A new church was built on the same location as the first one, and dedicated November 23, 1941. With the advent of World War II, and the establishment of an Army base and a Marine Corps Supply Center nearby Barstow's population increased rapidly. Since the Catholic population was rising, and continued growth seemed assured, when Fr. Noonan arrived in March, 1948, he realized the need for even greater expansion, and with the approval of the Bishop, purchased adequate land for the Church, rectory, convent, school and a parish hall.

The convent was completed in 1952, and the first section of the school in 1954. Building continued to include Noonan Hall in 1957, the second section of the school in 1961, and the rectory in 1963. The old church was moved from its location on Second Street to its present location in 1964 and Mass was celebrated for the interim time of building a new Church in Noonan Hall.

Meanwhile, Fr. Noonan had been transferred, and Fr. Charles Young was assigned to St. Joseph's. This beloved Irish import is remembered by many not only as an efficient administrator, but as a friend to all. He was well acquainted with the parish and its people, the new Church was completed under his direction and was dedicated in October, 1966. And still the parish continued to grow both in physical size and in the activity of its members.




Fr. Patrick Fox came to St. Joseph's in February, 1969. Although here only a short, he endeared himself to the parish through his energy and zeal. His many accomplishments included the organization of the Parish School of Religion from the separate CCD classes and the expansion of Mt. St. Joseph's School. He added rooms on the convent for our Sisters to help them in their service to the community. He was unusual among pastors because of his skill with tools. It was rumored that he could usually be found "on the end of the Parish hammer".



Fr. Raymond C. Kirk assumed his duties as pastor of St. Joseph's Church on August 1, 1970. During the short time Father Kirk has been Pastor, he has added two more classrooms to the school and has built Our Lady of the Desert Church in Baker, a mission of St. Joseph's. His associates at present are Fr. Marion Coslowsky, Fr. Anthony Di Leo, and Fr. John Keith.



St. Joseph's can look proudly at the four priests who have come from it. These four are Rev. Louis Marx, ordain ed in 1966; Rev. Richard Waterfall, ordained in 1949; Rev. Bernard McCoy, C. M., ordained in 1939, now deceased, and out newest, Rev. John Magana, who was ordained at St. Joseph's in 1971.





In order that the Catholic Community in Barstow could serve its many different elements of its population, Mt. St. Joseph's School was built in 1951 under Fr. Michael Noonan. A Catholic school is intended to serve three objectives, to help the student in fulfilling and completing his spiritual and religious values, his full intellectual potentialities, and his appreciation of his cultural heritage. The increase in enrollment over the twenty years since its establishment indicates that we have succeeded at least partially in these goals. Fr. Charles Young saw a need for more classrooms and again, under Fr. Patrick Fox enrollment increased enough to warrant two additional rooms. With the last addition of two rooms under Fr. Raymond Kirk, we have a total of thirteen classrooms. The school is staffed by the Sisters of Mercy of the Blessed Sacrament. Presently there are more than 400 students in St. Joseph's.

PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION

In order that children of all grade levels attending public schools may acquire their religious education St. Joseph's established a CCD program in 1961. During the past ten years, this program has grown and was organized into the Parish School of Religion with three divisions in 1969. We currently have some 1,600 students, and are one of the largest programs in the San Diego Diocese.

An organization as active as St. Joseph's PSR needs a leader to fit it, and here, we have $F_{\rm r}$. Anthony Di Leo, our Priest Director.

The elementary division, grades 1 through 6, meets in two sessions on Saturday morning. The principal is Mr. Herbert Younger with Mr. Roland Roy as assistant principal. The teachers here provide a spiritual guide and rule of life for our beginning Catholics.

On Tuesday evenings, the intermediate students, grades 7 through 9, attend classes with Mr. Richard B. Kolbly as principal. Here, in addition to many other courses, the teachers prepare the students for Confirmation. This level has an elective program in which students may select their subjects in religion.


Monday evenings the high school teachers are preparing students to become active Catholics Mr. Larry Castle is principal, and the high school level also has an elective program in their religious training. The students select from subjects such as Courtship and Cana,; Moral Guidance; Mary, Mother of Love; and many more.

With all the teachers, hall guards, secretaries, home visitors and the administrative staff, we also have an Educational Advisor, Mrs. Carol Younger, who also has an adult training program. Mrs. Helen Baily is in charge of special education for exceptional children.

In the past few years, the PSR staff has added a PSR office, a secretary, Mrs. Phyllis Kolbly: a library under the capable direction of Mrs. Marge Roy; and much religious matter only for teacher development and course reference materials, but also available to all Mrs. St

Teachers.

We want all who have made the PSR program a success in the past and those who will continue in the future, priests, sisters, and lay people, to realize that our students have a right as well as a need to a solid religious education through which their faith may become a living reality.



ALTAR BOYS

One of the minor Orders is that of acolyte - one who assists the priest in the liturgy of the Church. Down through the centuries the acolytes - or altar boys - have never lost their importance: they remain the helpers of the priest, the representatives of the people. Theirs is one of the highest Church dignity which the laity may share. St. Joseph's boasts of more than 50 young men serving as Altar Boys. Fr. Keith is in charge of the Altar Boys.

ALTAR AND ROSARY SOCIETY

The Altar and Rosary Society has been in operation for three years under its present name. Previous to that it had the name Sodality of Our Lady and had been in operation for about ten years. The Sodality was formed when the Guilds were disbanded so that all women's organizations could be one. The Society is dedicated to assisting the parish in every way possible, including the care of the altar. It is also interested in the perpetual growth of its members. It has been sending cookies to boys in Viet Nam for seven years. In addition, it helps with the Christmas baskets, assists the PTG with the annual bazaar, and is available to help with any other odd things that need to be done.

BLUE ARMY OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA

The Blue Army of our Lady of Fatima is a worldwide association dedicated to the increase of recognition of the glory of God and His most holy Mother. The Barstow Cell was organized in 1969. Activities include weekly Holy Hours before the Blessed Sacrament, prayers for special intentions, and the making and distribution of the Brown Scapular. A continuing project is the Parish Pilgrim Virgin, where the statue spends a week in someones home and during the time, the area Catholics are invited in to join in the Rosary. Present spiritual director is Rev. Marion Coslowsky, and present chairman is Joyce Thornton.

CATHOLIC YOUTH ORGANIZATION

The CYO is open to all high school students. This organization offers students a varied and interesting program of social, cultural, athletic and spiritual activities. Officers and chairmen are elected among the members which enables these young adults to develop qualities of leadership and responsibility. The advisors to the group are Mr. and Mrs. Al St. Pierre.

CONFRATERNITY OF CHRISTIAN DOCTRINE

The CCD is devoted to the education of all the members of the parish with a special emphasis on the children attending public school. Many members of the CCD serve as teachers and assistants in the Parish School of Religion. Other members serve through a personal apostolate in their own lives. The CCD was established in this parish in 1961.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

Real of the

Fray Garces Council 1830 The purposes of the Knights of Columbus are to assist the Church in charitable endeavors, to promote unity among all Catholics, to promote fraternity among the Knights, and to stress patriotism. The activities of the organization are divided into the following categories: Catholic Activity, Fraternal, Council, Membership, Public Relations, Squires and Youth. The Council meets the first and third Tuesdays of each month. Present Grand Knight is John Halpin.

Joseph Scott General Assembly, Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus The Assembly is composed of men from two councils: Fray Garces 1830 from the Barstow Area and Council 4228 from the Victorville area. It was instituted in 1962. The present Faithful Navigator is Jesse Riley.

LECTORS

In the early days of the Church the role of the lector was so important that it was actually a minor order. (Even today for a young man to be ordained a priest he must first be ordained a lector.) The lector assisted the Priest in conducting the liturgy. Today's lector does the same. It is his duty to help the People of God partake as fully as possible in the Church's sacred liturgy. The head-lector is Frank Godina.

LEGION OF MARY

The Legion of Mary is a worldwide organization dedicated to bring people closer to God through Mary, by means of various works of mercy both spiritual and corporeal. The original praesidium in Barstow was organized in 1957 with Fr. Marion as the spiritual director. Since that time, membership has grown to encourage the formation of three additional praesidia. The four together cooperate to serve the people of St. Joseph's in many ways including visiting the sick, praying for the living and the dead, teaching religion in CCD sponsored classes, visiting homes of both new members of our parish and older tradents as well, and continuing the parish census. Presidents of our four active praesidia are lossphare that, Now Wallace, Helen Riley, and Telly Jaramillo.

JUNIOR LEGION OF MARY

The Junior Legion of Mary is a by-product of the senior praesidia established to fulfill a teenager's spiritual needs and in so doing, he is serving in the army of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Junior Legion is at the disposal of our Parish priests and in the same way as the senior legion, serve as their extra hand to do many odd jobs such as census taking, visiting parishioners, and service in other organizations such as PSR and Mt. St. Joseph's school. Many other activities are planned by the proving there extra hand in mind such as beach outings, picnics, parties, caroling. The members are sets 15 to 29, and still minime of the parish in this age group are welcome to join.

MUSIC

St. Joseph's is a singing parish. We have congregation participation in the singing of fill traditional ordinary and Proper songs at each of our Sunday Masses. PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council Steering Committee was commissioned in early 1971 from the heads of parish organizations to establish a Parish Council for St. Joseph's Church. Formation of the constitution and organization work will be completed during 1971, with the initial Parish Council to become functional in early 1972. The Parish Council consists of active, interested parishioners using their diverse talents in a coordinated and unified manner to assist our pastor in the function of our parish. Through their efforts these members of the Mystical Body of Christ actively demonstrate the living Christ in our parish and our community.

PRE CANA CLASSES

Courses are offered for all who plan to marry. Speakers both lay and religious present the physical, pychological and spiritual aspects of the Sacrament of Matrimony. Certificate of completion is awarded at the end of the course.

RELIGION INQUIRY CLASS

Inquiry classes are held for all those who wish to learn about the Catholic Faith or wish to further enrich their present knowledge. Group Inquiry classes are held weekly or may be taken privately from any of the Priests.

SCOUTING

The scouting program is well represented by various groups from St. Joseph's. All scouting shares the purposes to encourage good citizenship through various activities to promote growth of character, a feeling of patriotism, and a sense of service through various activities.
