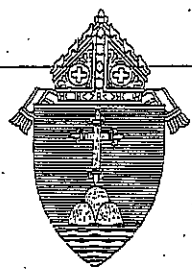

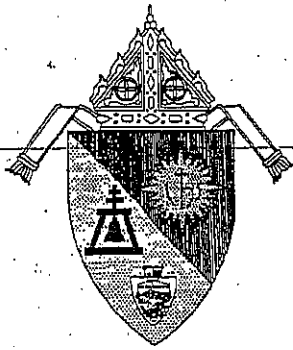
**Poly boys' basketball**

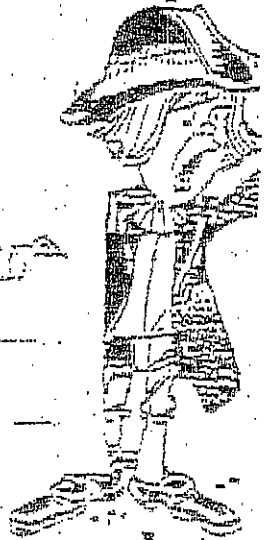

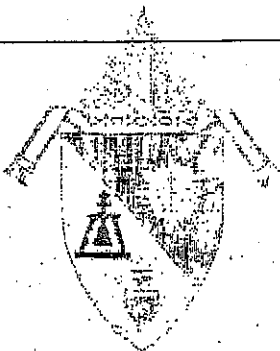

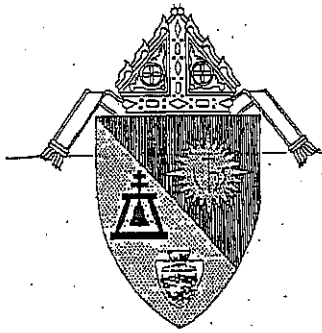

"Health practitioner" includes physicians and surgeons, psychiatrists, psychologists, dentists, residents, interns, podiatrists, chiropractors, licensed nurses, dental hygienists, optometrists, or any other person who is licensed under Division 2 (commencing with Section 500) of the Business and Professions Code; marriage, family and child counselor trainee as defined in subdivision (c) of Section 4980.08 of the Business and Professions Code; unlicensed marriage, family and child counselor interns registered under Section 4980.44 of the Business and Professions Code; state or county public health employees who treat minors for venereal disease or any other condition; state or county public health employees who treat minors for venereal disease or any other condition; coroners; paramedics; and religious practitioners who diagnose, examine, or treat children.

I am writing with regards to a very sensitive matter that affects you as a priest who has served here in the Diocese of San Bernardino. On January 28, 2003, the Honorable Judge Bob N. Krug issued an Order ("Order") requiring the Diocese of San Bernardino ("Diocese") to respond to certain questions and produce files for "in-camera" review by Referee Judge Kenneth Ziebarth. The Order was made and to be complied with prior to March 10, 2003.

An in-camera inspection simply means that Judge Ziebarth (a retired judge from San Bernardino County) will be reviewing the files to determine whether they must be produced to the plaintiffs.

The Order provides, among other things, that the Diocese produce files which reflect inappropriate contact between minors and priests that allegedly may have occurred or been reported from the period 1960 through 1988.

The Diocese has agreed to turn over the files through the 1988 date. The files will include dates of alleged acts of misconduct, the sources of information and the maintenance of files regarding alleged accusations of misconduct. It is incumbent upon me to inform you that materials from your priest file are among those materials which will be turned over by the Diocese in complying with this Order by Judge Krug.

Judge Ziebarth will review the files and make his report to Judge Krug regarding whether or not those files are discoverable, which means whether they should be turned over to plaintiff's counsel.

Bishop [REDACTED] understands your expectation of privacy of your personnel file. The Constitution does provide you with certain protections which you have the right to exercise.

In this instance, the court has compelled discovery and the Diocese believes that it must not contest that decision. We are attempting to avoid all unnecessary legal entanglements.

Privacy law continues to change on a regular basis and the Diocese intends to exercise its statutory responsibilities regarding the confidentiality of your file. The Diocese will also conform to orders made by the court.

The Diocese will not be exercising any right you may personally hold. The Diocese will make the appropriate review and take procedural steps to protect files that are irrelevant to the civil litigation which is the subject matter of the Order.

If you wish to challenge the admissibility of your files as evidence in court, you should take immediate steps to do so.

If you are going to exercise any objection to the files either being reviewed by Judge Ziebarth or ultimately any that may be turned over to Judge Krug for review, you should do so forthwith and without delay.

The case number is referenced above. The litigation is in the San Bernardino Superior Court, Central Division before the Honorable Judge Krug in Department S16.

On Monday, October 4, 1993, I was contacted by phone by the Reverend [REDACTED], of the Archdiocese of Boston, [REDACTED].

Father Paul Shanley has been a supply priest in this diocese since 1990. He lives in the Diocese of San Diego. He does not have an address listed. As arranged with the parish and the former pastor, Father [REDACTED], all of Father Paul's mail and telephone came to St. Anne's parish in San Bernardino and a report would be given to him when he would come up for supply. He supplied twice a month, said Mass and celebrated the sacrament of penance for Father [REDACTED].

It appears that events from 25 years ago, Father Shanley is now accused of sexual misconduct with minors. Three different incidents have been reported to the Archdiocesan office. Father Shanley is to report back into the diocese next Friday, October 15, 1993. I had a private meeting with the Pastoral Coordinator, [REDACTED] on Tuesday, October 5, to discuss this issue. I have asked her to keep the information privileged and confidential at this time. I question whether either she or any staff people have any concern or red flags concerning any possible sexual misconduct on the part of Father Shanley while he has worked here in the diocese. He is well known to [REDACTED] and she considers him a friend. She stated that she is not aware of any concerned that she would have concerning any possible sexual misconduct. It would appear to me that because of his limited involvement in the parish, this would be true. I discovered that he also supplies in the Beaumont parish at the church with Father [REDACTED], and maybe supplying in La Jolla, California. [REDACTED] have asked Father [REDACTED] to contact San Diego Diocese with the information he gave to me.

I have left a message for Father Shanley to contact me upon his return from the East Coast today, Thursday, October 7. Two questions I will have for him are:

- 1) Has there been any sexual misconduct in his behavior here?
- 2) To inform him that he does not have faculties to supply in the few days that he remains here in the diocese. It would be inappropriate with this personal issue for him to be doing public ministry. According to our policy he would be put on administrative leave.

I have called Father [REDACTED] to inform him of this pertinent information, in case of any public notice of Father's recall to Boston. At this time, it appears that Boston has not discussed these matters personally with him of only given him the information. It would be my conclusion that there is no cooperative evidence or red flags to indicate at this time a concern. I have asked [REDACTED] to be alert to anything she might further discover in this case.

At this stage we are not going to make any public statement concerning his recall back to Boston. I have discussed this matter with Boston, that if there were any issues here that we would address them our forthright public manner. At this time it would be inappropriate to, in any way, publicize the allegation with no reason for concern for any of our minors. I do not want, in any way, to give the impression that we are attempting to cover up this information. Our handling of it would be appropriate to our policies. Unless I am notified in my personal interview with Father Shanley, of any other information.

Telephone conversation of 10/8/93

The three cases that are alleged against Father happen 25 years ago. He is returning to his own diocese on this coming Friday, October 15. We will make no statement of his departure from our diocese, because he does not a formal assignment here. In discussing the issues with Father Shanley and [REDACTED], it would appear that we have no cause for concern at this time. Father was very detailed. He only celebrated Mass and the sacraments on the weekend. There was only one case that he spent the weekend with the youth at St. Anne and it was well chaperoned. They had actually placed Father in another cabin away from the children and the other adults supervising the kids while the weekend went on. He has told both Ms. [REDACTED] and Father [REDACTED] that he has been asked to

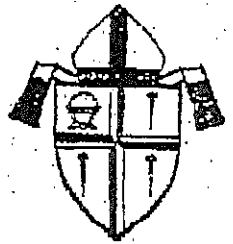

I have reviewed with our Chancellor your information about the claim being made by the mistress (or former mistress) of the retired priest. Our conclusions are these:

1. We cannot amend the priests' pension plan to make provision with reference to her claim; and
2. We believe there is no legal basis for her claim; and
3. We do not see any facts which suggest that either diocese should even consider pastoral outreach in this situation. Her grievance, if she has one, is with the priest, not with Church administrators. So we feel that Church funds should not be used in this situation.

As you know, these conclusions are based on nothing more than information which you provided in our brief telephone conference the other day. Therefore, we are open to reconsidering our conclusions after reviewing the relevant documentation.

Turning to another unfortunate situation, Fr. [REDACTED] has been in correspondence with Msgr. [REDACTED] regarding the allegations of [REDACTED] who lives here in San Diego. 
