Dear Father Pierre,

I thought I would write a few lines to you and give you a few more of my thoughts and feelings following our delephone conversation yesterday. I realize the possibilities of some of my notions being a little narrow or rationalized but feel that I ought to express them anyhow. If I can work this borrowed typewriter.

One of the difficult things has been the lack of spiritual activity and direction at this place. There is a catholic challain who comes on Wednesday and say lines on Sundays but that is it. From the beginning it seemed to me that my problems were at least as much spiritual as psychological and I still think so.

The security and lack of personal freedoms has atunned me and I find the difficulty even with therapy because of the structure of everything. When they take your billfold, license, money, and the basic freedom to move about on one's own it really does something to you. Most of the people who are here come in not being able to function at all on the putside and I feel very different from that. I don't know what the sudden demial of freedom does to one's basic idenity and personality but I find it too much too sudden. Little things like bed check every two hours at night, signing out to go out on the grounds, and never being able to leave the grounds also make life here very difficult. All doors are locked at 8100 p.m.

The persons I live with are in their late teems or carly 20's and for the most part seem to have had drug problems. All the activities, socials, classes, etc. are directed more to their age. The uncouthness and vulgarity around the clock are unbelieveable. Many are very content here and have been around for months and months. Some don't know what they would do on the outside.

The meetings with one's doctor are very sparce. Never more than three times a week. For example, I saw my doctor on Thursday morning and that is it until Monday morning. I am free in between to walk the grounds, read, go to recreation and sports, or whatver. I don't think I need these things in such a confined environment. The doctors have all the answers about this total therapy but I don't but it.

It is nearing three months that I have had these special problems of mine on my mind almost around the clock. It will be five weeks that I have spent in this place. Some of it has been very helpful, e.g., the realization that I never want to be in a place like this again and a few new insights into myself which have come in in the doctor spessions.

Some funny things do happen and I pray that I won't lose my sense of humor.

Many thanks for your time and understanding. I hope some thing can be worked out when I return to Minnesota in a week.

I am still at the Institute of Living and will be staying here a few more weeks. Things are going a little better and I am not quite as negative as I was a week or so ago or as I indicated in my last letter.

One of the things which really bothered me was that my doctor is now on vacation and that I will be talking with another doctor these days. I still wonder about this but perhaps progress can continue.

Another thing on the positive side is that I can now go to a neighboring parish and say Mass each day. This means a lot to me.

Things seem in good order at St. Francis in Rochester and that also settles me down a lot. I don't know if I mentioned in my last letter that two of my associates were becoming pa stors. This really freightened me, wondering what was going to happen there. Bishop Watters has now asked one of these men to stay on at St. Francis and help out until I return.

I still hope to return to your office and spend some time with you when the doctors are ready to say that that is the next step.

Many thanks for your willingness to listen and for your concern. I will be in touch with you.

Dear Bishop Watters,

I am writing to report to you concerning the counseling which Father Thomas Adamson has been involved in with me since coming to live at St. Leo's parish in St. Paul and to recommend that serious consideration be given to his re-assignment within the Diocese of Winona.

Father Adamson has been most faithful to our counseling relationship and honest, open, and cooperative throughout his months in St. Paul. He has managed the stress of adjusting to parish life in a diocese other than his own and to his academic program at the University. I am satisfied that his personal maturity has grown considerably during the past several months and that he has maintained a vital spiritual life and fulfilled his priestly responsibilities faithfully.

His greatest growth is in the area of an understanding of what he must do in order to maintain his personal well-being and his priestly effectiveness. I am satisfied that he is committed to both and that he is capable of following through on his convictions.

I do think that there should be some maintainance of factorizations of counseling relationship after he has returned to the Diocese of Winona. He should see a counselor on a schedule of once every six to eight weeks. I believe that he is also interested in establishing a continuing relationship of spiritual direction with a priest of his choice.

Father Adamson has not engaged in any of the behavior which precipitated his need for counseling during the past twelve months. In addition, during this time he has borne the heavy cost of the consequences of his former behavior and I feel it is unlikely that he will regress to this behavior in the foreseable future. I would recommend that an attempt be made to find an assignment for him which would combine a stable parochial find an apostolate with that of an involvement in a form of marriage counseling.

Dear Father Pierre,

Thank you for your letter regarding Father Thomas Adamson. I appreciate your efforts to help him and I know that he is grateful to you for your help.

As you know, Father Adamson came to Winona shortly after Easter and asked about a pastoral assignment in the diocese of Winona. I had to reply to the effect that while I was as deeply concerned as ever about him I also had to be equally concerned about other basic considerations regarding the laity and the entire body of priests.

While I do not question your evaluation regarding the progress Father Adamson has made, I must also add that I am convinced that he doesn't even begin to appreciate the numbers of people in at least five different communities across the entire diocese who have finally pieced together incidents occuring over a fifteen year span and who now openly raise questions about the credibility of all priests. Obviously, I am writing to you in confidence. You would only have to struggle through the painful sessions I've had with heart-broken and bewildered parents who only know have come to discover the source of some of the problems of their sons.

And this is not just my own opinion; I felt I had to ask for a recommendation from the members of our Priests Personnel Board and I asked it on the basis of each priest's personal acquaintence with the case and his individual opinion of what the pastoral impact reassignment in the diocese of Winona might have. The unanimous recommendation was to the effect that Father Adamson should be encouraged to receive all the help he needs and at the same time that he honestly face the fact that he cannot accept an appointment to a parish in the diocese now or even in the immediate future.

I realize that this is a difficult decision for Father Adamson to accept. Perhaps it would be helpful if I discussed this with you or with you and Father Adamson together. I could arrange for a couple of hours on Monday, May 5th in the morning or early afternoon or on Tuesday evening, May 6th. If neither of these times are convenient, please let me know and I will try to arrange my

Dear Bishop Watters,

I have continued to see Fr. Tom Adamson over the last several months since I wrote to you. He has maintained an excellent attitude over this time with regard to his residence in the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis. He has also developed a good level of involverant in the marriage encounter movement, worked toward a Specialist degree in education from the University for which he will complete his course work in December, and offered considerable help to St. Leo's parish in Saint Paul.

I am writing at this time to report on Fr. Adamson's progress and to offer my opinion that he is ready at the present time or at any time in the near future for reassignment in the diocese of Winoas. During the last year and a half he has cooperated both with programs of therapy in Hartford and within my relationship with him here at Saint Paul, in a manner marked by openness, docility, and a genuine desire to deal with his problems. He has used his time in Saint Paul constructively and, from my vantage point, could be ready for reassignment in the diocese.

I will be glad to discuss Fr. Adamson's case with you as you wish.

Last week I spoke with Mrs. John Riedle. She told me about her son, Greg, and about your work with him at the correctional facility.

I told Mrs. Riedle I would write to you about Father Thomas Adamson because you were concerned about his involvement with Greg, and whether or not Father Adamson had sought treatment for his problem.

My last contact with Father Adamson before Mrs. Riedle called was in February of 1981. He had been in treatment with me prior to that time. The treatment centered on his sexual behavior and was motivated by his own concern to deal with his problem and by the pressure he was receiving from church authorities to do so.

Since February 1981 Father Adamson has seen Dr. Joseph Gendron, a Minneapolis psychiatrist and consultant to us here at the Consultation Services Center. Father Adamson has seen him on a quarterly basis for maintenance and preventative therapy. To my knowledge, Father Adamson has been able to manage his problem with the assistance of Dr. Gendron since terminating his therapy with me early in 1981.

I am sure if you would like to contact Dr. Gendron, he would be glad to offer you more current information about Father Adamson's adjustment at this time.
