

This weekend throughout the world all Catholic parishes are asked to celebrate Mass to pray for victims & survivors of sexual abuse by people authority in the Church & to ask forgiveness in the name of the Church for our failures toward children & families. I know this subject can be very controversial and so I realize some may choose to believe it necessary & I respect that choice.

I know there are parishioners who believe this is not the place for such a discussion & they may believe it is talked about too much and yet there are other parishioners who would say it's about time we addressed it at Mass.

I remember when this rampant abuse was first made public in the 1990s and exploded in the Archdiocese of Boston in the early 2000s. I was at St. Brendan Donisthorpe & St Albert in Longmeadow & I remember practicing often about the sin & crime of sexual abuse within the Church. People needed & wanted it to be addressed by their parish & their priests.

I believe then now that we are not just talking about an individual <sup>Devoutly</sup> sexually harassing a child

or teenager but also the covering up of the <sup>2</sup> crime by the institution itself. In other words the <sup>Covering</sup> of the crime was <sup>many</sup> systemic. It became part of the system & was acceptable to ~~the~~ in authority including bishops.

Some will say that even 20 years ago, we had no idea about the extent of damage done to abuse victims <sup>believed</sup> that the abuser could be cured by counseling or therapy. Some <sup>wanted</sup> to believe over the years that therapists would solve the problem. But we now know how criminal those attitudes were and are.

Unfortunately the Church has become so powerful that it was allowed to handle its problems internally & not be held accountable by the greater society. Think about it, in those days everyone was Catholic - the court system, the police department, the newspapers - nobody wanted to believe that a priest or the Church itself could be sick.

Think about this - if you believed that the Church represented God on earth & that Jesus

less perfect, than in your mind the Church  
had to be perfect. So many things that indicated  
that wasn't true in it to be hidden, covered up or  
denied. That was allowed to happen +  
was encouraged by anyone in authority <sup>in authority</sup> ~~including~~.

I am very aware that from ~~the~~ victims +  
survivors in our congregation ~~today~~ <sup>may be</sup> today + I  
personally thank you for your presence in the church  
& your determination to challenge this institution  
and all others to openly admit what has taken place  
& how we have failed to live up to the gospel.  
we are aware this <sup>now</sup> memory of the many who comes up  
did not survive because of the impact of trauma  
that lead to substance abuse, living with emotional  
pain & suicide. This Mass is in their memory.

I've come to the conclusion that when I haven't  
experienced something <sup>my own</sup>, I need to listen  
to those who have. The Catholic Church is called  
to listen to <sup>our people</sup> stories & respect them.

So in this time, to the recent death of Cardinal  
<sup>in Rome</sup>  
Law or the remarks made by Pope Francis in <sup>Argentina</sup> Chile, there are survivors here in the U.S. +  
throughout the world who are devastated once  
again by their church & its coverup.

To realize there are many Catholic people  
who feel betrayed and abandoned by the church  
because of the church itself how it was handled.  
Many of your strongest families have left the  
church as a result + here we begin to return.  
I understand and respect their decision.

Many of these families continue to have a strong  
faith in God but celebrate it apart from the  
church. It is a huge loss to us and we  
are less because of their absence. But these  
are the consequences + repercussions of being  
held accountable by other people.

Most people believe the church has now
