

All of us have probably written this message on a post card to our friends or loved ones. Only four words yet, if spoke or written sincerely, they express our love. Add a beautiful photo of a magnificent building or an exotic location and your post card recipients better understand your heart's desire to share your experience with them.

Most of our experience together as the Catholic Church in Cook and Lake counties lies close to our homes and our parishes. That is where I find

myself with you, along with the time in many meetings and telephone calls. When I was looking over the proof pages of the 2008 Annual Report, however, I was taken with the story of the year's pilgrimages and journeys. Key among them was the August Archdiocesan pilgrimage to

Lourdes, marking the 150th anniversary of the apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary to St. Bernadette. One hundred and ninety Chicago-area Catholics, many of them in poor health, joined me in participating in this weeklong pilgrimage. Hundreds of others participated in the special "at home pilgrimage" here in the Archdiocese, under the direction of Bishop Thomas Paprocki.

Chicago youth journeyed to Sydney, Australia, with young people from all across the globe for World Youth Day with Pope Benedict XVI. Again, although not many of our young people could make the trip halfway around the world, more than 800 young men and women came on July 20 for the festivities conducted in English, Spanish and Polish at St. Hyacinth Parish. They celebrated an evening Mass to coincide in time with ours in Sydney, Australia. There were also many men and women from the Archdiocese of Chicago, under the direction of Bishop Joseph Perry, joining the tens of thousands of Catholics from around the world who made the pilgrimage to the International Eucharistic Congress in Quebec City in June.

Perhaps the most joyous and memorable journey I made with hundreds of

Chicago area Catholics was to Washington, D.C. and to New York City in April, when Pope Benedict XVI journeyed to this side of the Atlantic for his first visit to our country as Bishop of Rome. As President of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, I was honored to serve as one of the main hosts for the Holy Father on his pilgrimage to our country. Its theme, you might recall, was "Christ Our Hope."

During the hundreds of local trips to parishes, schools, hospitals and

other places throughout the Archdiocese, we had time to pray and work together. On many occasions, I thought of others who were not present physically but who were always with me in prayer.

Thank you for your continuing financial support and generosity to

the Archdiocese and the ministries of the Church. My gratitude is even greater this year, when so many have been impacted by the economic downturn. Never has the outreach of our Archdiocesan institutions and parishes been more crucial than during these tough economic times.

I am proud of your increased efforts to respond to increased demands. The Archdiocese's sense of stewardship and fiscal responsibility is deepened as we carefully monitor our finances and conserve our resources to be good stewards of your generosity.

In Christ, I don't just "wish you were here;" I know, in faith, that you are. You are daily in my prayers; please keep me in yours

Chancellor's Report

The financial results from this past year show extraordinary generosity from the Catholics in Cook and Lake counties. These numbers for FY '08 (ending June 30, 2008) do not reflect the steep decline in relevant economic indicators and investment results at the beginning of the 2nd Quarter of FY '09 that dramatically altered public perception. However, they show continued, strong support for the work and mission of our local church, despite job losses and tightening of the economy.

It is clear that we are all in transition to leaner times. These times require us as church to respond to the needs of those for whom we care in more creative and extensive ways; to find ways to provide extended support to our parishes and schools; and to believe that the Lord will provide the essentials for us if we trust Him.



In this role as diocesan finance officer I can draw from and apply skills acquired and lessons learned along the way through my experiences in both the business world and parish ministry. With God's continued direction I hope to contribute innovation, resourcefulness, energy, and value to

the administrative operations and overall mission of the Archdiocese's parishes, schools, agencies, ministries, and departments.

As is customary, accompanying this communication are the highlights from the Archdiocese of Chicago Annual Report, which summarize the financial results for the previous fiscal year ended June 30, 2008. Reflected therein is a year of stability: outcomes from solid stewardship of the financial position and activities of the Archdiocese.

Despite modest investment returns, relative to previous years, and operating cost increases, including escalated grants to parishes and schools plus self-insured property/casualty losses, the Archdiocesan Pastoral Center added \$21.3 million to its net assets, raising that measure to \$200.5 million. Taken as a group, Archdiocesan Parishes reported steady offertory collections and bequests of \$224.6 million, effectively equivalent to the previous year's results. Expanded Pastoral Center and noise abatement grant receipts along with greater building fund contributions supported this year's \$17.3 million increase to \$943.5 million in combined Parishes net assets. Another year of a strong response to the Annual Catholic Appeal nearing \$13.0 million also buoyed the Parishes and Archdiocese as a whole.

Additionally, the Archdiocese continues to minister to victims and resolve claims related to allegations of past instances of sexual misconduct by priests. During the 2008 fiscal year, the Archdiocese paid \$11.0 million in settlements of various claims. No current contributions to parishes, schools, or the Annual Catholic Appeal were used to fund misconduct settlements. Bank borrowings used to pay such settlements are repaid with proceeds from the sale of undeveloped land and recoveries from insurance companies.










Combined Parish Net Assets




Pastoral Center Net Assets
