But disillusionment with Vietnam led to the War Powers Act of 1973, which requires congressional authorization for military action. It's a law that neither Congress nor presidents have been willing to test in the Supreme Court.

"Keeping it vague is in the interest of both parties," said Mike LeMay, political science professer at Cal State San Bernardino. "Congress is sert of refuctaint to push the issue, because there's a question about whether the War Powers Act is legal."

LeMay wonies that if the United States were to oust Saddain Hussein, it could windsing stuck in Iraq for years trying to build a new government.

"I don't think we've discussed and debated it enough," he said:

Sen. Diame Feinstein, D-Calif., introduced a resolution last month calling on the president to seek formal congressional approval or a declaration of war before any military action is launched against Iraq.

"(If is not) ... a question of whicher or not Saddam Hussenis a brutal dictator — he most certainly is," Feinstein said last month:

"The question is what is the best policy for the United States to address these issues and if we are to use force, that we do so only after a full debate and consultration of the options and will a united government and the specific statutory authorization of Congress."

The diocese purchased a plane ticket so Rister could fly to San Bernardino in May to be interviewed by the Rev. Gerald Lepez, who oversees priest personnel matters for the diocese.

They took four weeks to put my interview on paper, and then it was so poorly done that I redid it in two hours and sent it back," Rister said.

The U.S. Constitution gives the power to declare war to Congress and makes the president the commander-in-chief, of the nation's armed forces. That inherent conflict has never been fully resolved.

. But disillusionment with Vietnam led to the War Powers Act of 1973, which requires congressional authorization for military action. It's a law that neither .. Congress nor presidents have been willing to test in the Supreme Court

"Keeping it vague is in the interest of both parties," said Mike LeMay, political science profes-ser at Cal State San Bernardino. "Congress is sert of reductant to push fire issue, because there's a question about whether the War Powers Act is legal."

LeMay worries that if the United States were to oust sad-dam Hussein, it could wind up stuck in Iraq for years trying to build a new government.

"I don't think we've discussed and debated it enough," he said.

Sen. Diamie Feinstein, D-Calif., introduced a resolution last month calling on the president to seek formal congressional approval or a declaration of war before any military action is launched against Iraq.

"(It is not) ... a question of whether or not Saddam Hussein is a brutal dictator - he most certainly is," Feinstein said last month.

"The question is what is the best policy for the United States to address these issues and if we ate to use force, that we do so only after a full debate and consideration of the options and with a united government and the specific statutory authorization of Congress."





Thank you for your FAX communication to Bishop Barnes of February 1, 2003 regarding Ms. Nicki Rister. Bishop Barnes has asked that I provide a reply to you.

Sister Rosaline O'Connor, RSM, our diocesan Coordinator of Victim Assistance Ministry, and I have been in communication with Ms. Rister with regards to her case. Ms. Rister prefers the use of e-mail. I enclose for your review my last communication with Ms. Rister dated December 2, 2002.

As a diocesan church community we have been in a state of waiting given the need for approval of the "Essential Norms" by the Vatican. This was completed on December 8, 2002. However, the "Essential Norms" do not take effect until March 1, 2003. This explains the delay in officially concluding Ms. Rister's case. As a point of clarification, under the approved "Essential Norms" the recommendation of the Review Board is strictly advisory in nature; the diocesan Bishop is to make the final and definitive canonical decision in individual cases. This decision will be communicated to the victims of abuse.

I would like to re-emphasize that as a Diocese we continue to stand committed to offering counseling for Ms. Rister as a part of her healing process. Sister O'Connor has attempted to assist Ms. Rister in this regard. I will ask Sister O'Connor to get in touch with Ms. Rister to explore this once again.

I am also enclosing a recent diocesan publication on our response to the abuse crisis in the Church. Bishop Barnes has also produced a video which was shown to the Catholics in our Diocese last month. If you would like a copy of this video, please contact Deacon Michael Jelley, our Coordinator of Diocesan Charter Initiatives at 909-475-5119.

Thank you for your advocacy on behalf of Ms. Rister. I will once again contact her through the preferred means of e-mail to see how she is doing during this time. Please feel free to contact me if I can serve you in any way further.

Dear Bishop Barnes,

It has come to my attention that your diocesan review board has failed in its responsibility to notify a complainant of the results of the review process.

Ms. Nicki Rister reported sexual abuse by Msgr. Patrick O'Keefe to the review board on May 4, 2002. She has not yet been informed of the board's recommendation.

Such a delay further victimizes Nicki, and goes against the pledge of "compassionate outreach" promised by the bishops at their meetings in Washington last November. Although Msgr. O'Keefe is now a fugitive from the law in Ireland, this does not release your diocese from its obligations to Nicki. In order for a survivor to begin the healing process, there is a need for closure. Closure includes accountability for the reports of abuse Nicki provided to your diocese.

The abuse and trauma that Nicki suffered at the hands of Msgr. O'Keefe cannot be erased. I urge you to immediately disclose the results of this case to Nicki so that her revictimization by the church can come to an end.



As a result of our meeting on May 5, 1992, and your letter to your people, you are resigning as pastor of St. Margaret Mary Church, effective immediately. You will begin a six month health sabbatical. As to the type and place of this sabbatical, this will be determined with the assistance of Dr. Joseph, in the next few days. It is very important that we carefully choose a program which will best assist you and assure you of many more years of good and fulfilling priestly ministry.

Regarding financial arrangements, I am asking that St. Margaret Mary Parish continue to provide your stipend through the end of June, as well as an additional month which will be your vacation pay. I am also asking the parish to provide an extra five hundred dollars to assist you with special needs. Once we determine the type of program that you will be entering, we can then consider additional funds that might be needed to further assist you. Do not hesitate to call upon me regarding these needs.

At the end of July, which will terminate your payments from St. Margaret Mary, your salary and other expenses will be paid through the Priest Relief Fund. You may wish to be in touch with Father Don Webber, around the middle of July, to ensure that your salary and other expenses will be provided by this fund. Your medical bills will be taken care of through our diocesan health insurance.

This has been a very difficult time for you, but I think you are making good decisions that will lead to new life and vitality in your priesthood and ministry. You can be very proud of the many

Dear Monsignor Pat:

I am pleased that we had the opportunity to speak over the weekend while I was in Hesperia for the Confirmation at Holy Family Parish. I think that some things became clearer to me as to what is possible or not possible. I thought there would be some option, from what you said in the past, of receiving priestly employment in England or Ireland. I gather that this is not possible because of the same type of problem that we are having here in the states. Other than your being able to return to England or Ireland for vacations or special visits, there is no possibility of full time employment.

It is not possible for you to continue to work as a priest, here in this diocese, due to the reasons that you and I spoke of during our meeting. It is also not possible for you to go to another diocese because they too would run into the same problems that we have. The only option would be to seek and obtain a job in the secular world. This should be one that in no way would be associated with priestly duties or ministry.

You are entitled to your priest pension benefits once you reach the age of 65. At that time, I would need a letter from you requesting retirement which I would then forward to the Epler Company authorizing payment. At that time, this would amount to \$1,200.00 per month for 30 years of service which you presently have. The question is what do we do between the present time and the official time of your retirement? We

discussed the possibility of a leave of absence or early retirement. You are opposed to the idea of the leave of absence because of some of the connotations that would be attached to it. I have spoken to Monsignor Don Webber regarding granting you early retirement.

The question however is, your means of support as a retired priest until your formal pension would be available. I told you that in this time of transition, as we are doing with other priests who are in similar circumstances as yourself, I will certainly assist you during this time of transition. What I would like to ask you to do is in order to ensure you of adequate funds for this transition, that we would provide you with the current pastors salary and \$600.00 for your rent for the first six months. After that time, we would review with you, your financial condition and then make an arrangement for continuance, change or discontinuance of the stipend. What I envision is your good will in finding adequate employment that would pay your benefits until your pension is available. Once the pension benefits would become available, this could be additional funds to whatever other money you would be earning.

In granting you early retirement, you would not be allowed to do any priestly functions or ministry. I would not see this status from preventing you from saying a private Mass. This may be a little difficult for you to explain to other priests, who know that you are retired, but you would not have faculties to perform public services or ministries.

I am sorry that we must go to this extent of prohibiting your priestly ministry and service in the latter part of your life. However, I think we are both aware of the difficulties and problems that have arisen that make any public ministry or service impossible, at this time. If anything should change

or other assurances be secured that would alter the situation, I am always willing to review this matter.

I realize that this is a very hard decision that you must make, but it is also a very hard for me to write this letter. Know that I will assist you in every way possible, but we must face the realities of our present situation.


