Mr Humphries lived in Chesapeake, Virgina which is a part of the Tidewater Council. We do not find very many boys names indicated in any of the material in our files. We do have the name of three boys, but one or them.

I cannot tell you much more about this situation, except I am confused since this was a Scout troop that Mr. Humphries worked with. Would not have been in the Scout troop at eight years of age. I do not have any evidence that Mr. Humphries worked with a pack, although that certainly is possible and may have been omitted from our information. He did work for a period of eleven years with a troop that served the handicapped.

Former Scout leader pleads guilty to sodomy

CHESAPEAKE — Arthur W. Humphries, a Boy Scout leader for nearly three decades, pleaded guilty in Circuit Court on Thursday to sodomy with 20 boys between the ages of 8 and 18.

Humphries, a small, frail 69-yearold man who is hard of hearing, entered pleas in a faint voice to a total of 31 felony charges dating back to 1972.

Testimony during the two-hour hearing before Judge William H. Hodges indicated that many of his victims were Boy Scouts who came to his Norfolk Highlands home for craft counseling or were members of the Order of the Arrow Dance Team that he advised.

Some of the boys were severely disabled members of Troop 472, which he organized a decade ago at the Kirk-Cone Rehabilitation Center in Chesapeake.

Eleven of the charges were forcible sodomy, which carries a maximum punishment of life in prison.

Assistant Commonwealth's Attorney Kenneth R. Taft Jr. said the victims in those cases were below the age of 13 and under Virginia law could not have given their consent to the homosexual acts. Taft told Hodges that the commonwealth had refused to plea bargain with Humphries.

Humphries also pleaded to 11 charges of consensual sodomy and nine counts of having taken Polaroid pictures of his liaisons for sexual purposes. The color photographs were introduced into evidence Thursday and immediately sealed by Hodges.

On the motion of Stephen L. Comfort, Humphries' court-appointed lawyer, Hodges ordered the preparation of a presentence report and delayed sentencing until Nov. 1.

He also ordered that Humphries be seld in the city jail until then.

About 60 people attended the 10 a.m. hearing, most of them victims or members of victim's families. Fumphries looked into the audience only once and smiled at his wife, who sat at the front of the room with other members of his family.

Detective Jeff Routson said that in one instance Humphries talked six young boys into a "strip dice" game.

held at his home in the The majority of the attacks took place while Humphries' wife was out of the house, Routson said, and the man frequently took the boys into the master bedroom where he could watch the driveway.

On two occasions, Humphries went to the homes of the victims, Routson testified, and in another incident, Humphries sexually assaulted an 3year-old boy at Camp Baker, a Boy Scout facility near Centerville Turnpike.

Humphries, who has three sons, retired as an electronics technician at the Naval Air Station. He is also a former vaudevillian performer and ventriloquist.

His career with the Boy Scouts dates back to 1930, said Jack Terwilliger, executive director of the Tidewater Council.

During his years as a volunteer scoutmaster and adviser, Humphries was awarded two presidential citations for outstanding leadership and the Silver Beaver, scouting's top award to an adult leader.

Terwilliger said in an interview after the hearing that no one in the council had any indication of Humphries' behavior until he was arrested and charged on 12 counts in May. He was later indicted on 19 other felony charges.

Terwilliger said he feared publicity surrounding the case would have a negative effect on the local council's recruiting activities.

In recent years, Terwilliger said, Humphries was the adviser of the councilwide honor camping society that learned historical Indian dances and performed them at public functions throughout Tidewater.

One of the attacks took place in 1983 after the dance team had performed at the Chesapeake Jubilee celebration, Routson said, and others occurred when team members came to Humphries' home to work on their dance routings.

Humphries formally resigned from his volunteer role in the Boy Scouts last December.

The attacks continued after he left the organization, and Routson testified that 12 of the 31 charges related to liaisons he had between March and May of this year:

CHESAPEAKE - Art Humphries coaches a baseball team that doesn't use bals or hasehalle

Instead of running from base to base, his players move from chair to chair.

"They're the greatest kids in the world," the said.

Humphries, 63, a retired Naval Air Station hydraulic specialist, was honored for his scouting work Thursday night when he received the Mayor's Outstanding Service Award at the Parks and Recreation Department's first annual Volunteer Awards Banquet.

The award was presented to the volunteer who had done the most to promote or provide leisure-time services in Chesapeake:

Twenty other Chesapeake residents also received awards at the banquet, held at the Indian River Community Center.

"I treat these children like normal kids—which they are. They're no different from anybody else." said Humphries, who has three grown children and a grandchild of his own

In 1974 the Norfolk Highlands resident, who has been active in scouting since he was 13, was awarded the Silver Beaver award by the Tidewater Boy Scout Council, the highest award the the beaver and the silver Boy Scout Council, the highest award that can be presented to an adult by a local council.

Humphries started the Kirk-Cone troop five years ago at the urging of the local scout council.

"Scouting is well worthwhile," he said.
"It teaches citizenship, survival, how to camp and cook—things that are important to know."

Since the troop was formed, handicapped Cub Scout and Girl Scout troops involving 28 children have been started at the school

"The students learned to work together and learn that, through teamwork, they can get things done." said Lorence Bredahl; center director.

At least two former Kirk-Cone pupils, now attending regular high schools in the city, were motivated to read through the scout program, Bredahl said.

"A lot of our kids have no real incentive to learn to read and the scout manual is a reason for reading." Bredahl said.

Ex-Scout leader admits sex abuse

CHESAPEAKE. Va—A herery leader of a troop of handicapped Boy Scours who had received presidential citations pleaded guilty Thursday to 31 charges involving sexual abuse and taking pornographic pictures of young boys. Arthur W. Humphries. 69, of Chesapeake, entered his plea before Circuit Court Judge William Hodges, who set sentencing for Nov. 1. Humphries pleaded guilty to 22 counts of sodomy, 11 of which carry a maximum life term, 10 of which carry a maximum 5-year term and one that carries a maximum 3-year term. He admitted to nine charges of manufacturing child pornography, which carries a total maximum term of 55 years. Assistant Commonwealth Atty. Ken Taft said Humphries had engaged in sodomy and taken pornographic pictures of 20 boys, ranging in age from 8 to 15.

The article regarding Edward C. Chambers is for information only and is apparently not related to either Humphries or Gardner cases; however, the article mentions Detective J.L. Rouston who is the detective investigating Humphries and Gardner.

Attached also are the news articles referring to the settlement several Eastern Shore (Virginia) youths who were molested by a school bus driver.

Question: You said that when you were changing your pampers, began talking to you about your apparent physical development, mainly your growth of pubic hair, the growth of your penis, and your general physical development. Is this true? said yes. Question: At anytime, while changing your pampers, did touch your penis? said no. Question: Did he or did he not touch your penis with his mouth, with any part of his body? said no. Note: father has periodically admonished to be sure that he is telling the truth, that he is leaving nothing out of this description of his experiences at Camp Pipsico. It appears to me that we have a real healthy relationship here, and that in fact is not denying anything that did in fact happen. Statement to The event of your changing your pampers amounted to making fun of you because you had to wear pampers and of interest in your physical development. Question: does that about summarize the pamper changing incident? said yes.



The Chespeake Sexual Traumal Team, made up of social workers and police, worked on the case. Police said the investigation is continuing.

Humphries' arrest shocked Scouting officials. "It's kind of knocked everybody off their socks. They don't know what to say," said Robert Oliver of the Elizabeth River District of the Tidewater Boy Scout Council.

Though Humphries' affiliation with the Scouts officially ceased in March. when he did not renew the charter for the handicapped Scouts of Troop 472. Arthur W. Humphries, who had been a Boy Scout adviser and leader in Chesapeake for more than 30 years; was jailed Tuesday night on \$140,000 hail, said Detective Lt. Donald S. Zeagler.

Humphries was charged with nine secounts of felony sodomy and three counts of manufacturing pornography, Zeagler said.

"Police said they confiscated a "handful" of color photographs of juveniles involved in various sexual acts when officers arrested Humphries at his bome Tuesday night.

Police said that the alleged contacts with the boys, all of whom were Boy Scouts, took place at his home from 1981 through last month. Some of the boys are handicapped or have learning disabilities, police said.


The six-week investigation began after a tip from an adult. The Chesapeake Sexual Trauma Team, made up of social workers and police, investigated.

Humphries dropped out of the Boy Scouts in March, according to Scout officials.

Police said Humphries was a recipient of the Silver Beaver, scouting's highest award for a volunteer leader.

Until March, Humphries had been scoutmaster of Troop 472, according to David Davies, field director of the Tidewater Council of Boy Scouts of America. "He has had a distinguished record with the Boy Scouts of America with this council for a good many years," Davies said.

Humpriries, a South Carolina nastive, yetired in 1970 from the Norfolk Navat Station after 30 years as an saircraft mechanic.


