Dear Father Provincial,

If you recall on your last visit how I felt as to the situation here. We have just finished retreat here and I have given the matter serious thought during these days. I am perfectly happy and content in the work, as you know, and I feel that I can go on here for another year. My previous feeling was, that I thought I was too long in the area, but the solution to that was new work which we have been doing and which we have lined up for next lent. I leave it up to you. All I want you to know is that I am perfectly content to stay on here. You my woes, and I want you to know that I appreciate your sympathetic understanding of the situation.

As you will see from our report, we have had an excellent season. For the first six months, January to June, we have sent in four thousand dollars to the Provincial House; this with roughly over two thousand for expenses, and we have a balance of over sixteen hundred. We have a fine community with the fitting in very nicely and doing good work. He and Brother will stay at the rectory and and myself move to Wilmington where is preared to keep us. I will not bother you any more as I can well realize the state of mind you are in, just returning from Rome, and so many things coming up.

My dear Joe:

Just received your letter this morning, and you do not know how much I appreciated your kindliness and the cooperation you offer me.

It will help me out of a difficult situation, if you can carry on longer, but of course, I would not want to hurt your health in any way. Nevertheless, if, as you suggest, you can continue until June, it will be a great help, until I can get all the replacements lined up.

I believe that I must relieve! as soon as possible. So he will be the first to be changed from the Mission Band, and I plan to replace him with After Eddie gets started a little bit here, I will send him to replace who is lined up for another work. That will give you a while to break in on the Coast, before changing you. Thus our continuity of work will go on, and the transfers will be made smoothly without interrupting our programs.

You do not know, then, how much you have helped me out in the situation that had me worried for a while.

I do expect to go to California before too long, and will see you. So, thanks a million, again, Joe, and be assured of my deep appreciation for this help.

The rest is in your hands now, and whatever decision you come to, with God's help I hope to accept.

I will have a difficult time and problem in replacing, at the same time, both yourself and and I suppose you know there is also something in the cards for That creates a tremendous problem for me to reorganize practically all our English-speaking Mission Band at one time. So, if just a transfer from the West coast to the Mission preaching over here would satisfy you, it would help me tremendously. However, be frank, because I do want to help you all I can.
