

What's happening in the Mass, our Sunday Liturgy?

Part 3 - Liturgy of the Eucharist (continued)

The Communion Rite begins with the Lord's Prayer.

"In the Lord's Prayer a petition is made for daily food, which for Christians means preeminently the Eucharistic bread, and also for purification from sin, so that what is holy may, in fact, be given to those who are holy" (GIRM no. 81)

The sign of peace follows. This is not a secular greeting, not a "Hi, how are you?" not a chance to talk to those whom we missed greeting as we entered the church. It is not a duplication of the gathering rite. We extend to one another a sign of Christ's peace, not our own, for sometimes, we have

HOW DOES ONE RECEIVE COMMUNION?

In 1969, Pope Paul VI gave permission to receive Communion in the hand. The reception of Communion in the hand is a return to a traditional practice of the Church.

- 1) When you approach Holy Communion place one hand on top of the other creating a "throne" which will receive the Blessed Sacrament.
- the Blessed Sacrament.
 2) Then with your lower hand, take the consecrated Host and place it in your mouth.
 - The Blessed Sacrament is received from the minister not taken from the minister
 - b. The Blessed Sacrament must be consumed immediately.

WHAT IS THE PROPER GESTURE WHEN RECEIVING COMMUNION?

The proper gesture when receiving Holy Communion in the dioceses of the United States is a bow of the head. The Communion minister presents the consecrated bread or wine; the communicant bows his/her head before the specific element, responds "Amen," and receives Communion.

WHAT DOES ONE SAY WHEN

When the communicant is presented with the Body (the bread), or the Blood (the cup), of Christ by the minister, their response is simply "Amen."

approach the table of the Lord only after having dedicated ourselves as a Christian community to peace and reconciliation."

Following the sign of peace, the Eucharistic bread is broken and the sacred wine is poured while the assembly sings the "Lamb of God" litany. This action of the breaking of the bread speaks our prayer that even though we are many, we all seek to become one body in the Lord.

After the presider's invitation to eat and drink and our response as an assembly, the Communion procession begins, and with it all join in singing the Communion song. This is not a time for private prayer or silence. It is a time to express our unity in the Lord through joining our voices in sung prayer as we come forward to share and become the Body and Blood and as we return to our places while others continue to receive Communion.

After all have shared the holy meal, communal silence may follow. The Communion Rite ends with the Prayer after Communion prayed by the presider in the name of us all.

The community's act of Holy Communion is the most perfect participation in the Eucharistic celebration.

Stewardship...

moving us closer to God

Our first reading is from the Book of Job, of which most of us are familiar if only from the saying "You have the patience of Job." Job is portrayed as a man who seems to be dealing with more than he can handle and could be seen as the ultimate pessimist. He bemoans his state in life and appears as if he wants to die because he feels that was the only way to free him from his pain and suffering. As we learn later in the Book, God has other plans for Job. God gives him both relief and joy in eternity. At times we also may concentrate so much on our own difficulties that we fail to see the positives. The greatest positive is that the Lord is with us, both to share and relieve our suffering. Jesus is our hope, and that is where our focus should be.

Today's Gospel from Mark speaks directly to the healing done by Jesus. "He cured many who were sick with various diseases." While the stories are of physical healing, try to see them as foretelling of the spiritual healing that Jesus brought to Job and promises to all. Notice also that Jesus stops to pray. Even though He is busy with His ministry, He shows us that being busy is no reason not to pray; instead



it is a reason to pray. Jesus always found time and made time to pray. We need to do the same. A consistent and regular prayer

life is an important way we live out our stewardship of Time. St. John Vianney wrote, "Prayer is the inner bath of love into which the soul plunges itself."

An additional note about the recent Gospels: this is the third Sunday that our Gospel is from the first chapter of Mark. We started on January 25 with verse 14 and have had consecutive verses ending with verse 39 today. The next two Sunday will also be from Chapter 1. It's unfortunate that we have a week between these readings because Chapter 1 is a wonderful narrative of the beginning of Jesus' earthly ministry. Take some time to read it as one piece. It's a fast paced narrative and you'll get a feel for what Jesus accomplished in the early part of His ministry.






