Brother Joseph (Lorian Josephus) Wilhelm, 89, died on September 6, 2011 at Carmel Manor in Fort Thomas, KY. A De La Salle Christian Brother for 69 years, he was born Raymond Carl, the son of Raymond and Anna Marie (Mueller) Wilhelm in Covington, KY. He graduated from Newport Catholic High School and entered the novitiate of the Christian Brothers in 1942 in Glencoe, MO. He pronounced his final vows in 1948 at Beaver Island, MI. Brother Joseph earned a B.S.S. degree in 1946 from Saint Mary's College (now University) in Winona, MN, and an M.A. degree from the same college in 1954. During his years as a teacher he served in Chicago, IL., St. Paul, MN, Jefferson City, MO., Memphis, TN., and Santa Fe, NM. From 1963 to 1977 he taught at Newport Catholic High School where he was the head coach of wrestling and baseball and was inducted into the Newport

Catholic Hall of Fame. Later he served at St. Henry High School, Erlanger, KY., St. Joseph Villa, LaSalle High School, Cincinnati, and Bishop Brossart High School, Alexandria, KY. He retired in 1986 to St. Anne Convent as Chaplain in Residence in Melbourne,KY. In 2004 he moved to Carmel Manor in Fort Thomas. Survivors include three sisters, Celeste Hollowell, Erlanger, KY., Rita Braun, Highland Heights, KY., and Dorothy Calahan, Deer Park, OH.
