Provincial's Corner

Dear Brothers.

I hope that many of you have had time this summer for a good retreat and a relaxing vacation. As we begin this new academic year I want to highlight three important province events that will occur next summer so that you can mark your calendars.

Next summer we will again offer a province retreat at White House in St. Louis. The retreat will be led by Fr. Paul Harman. It will begin on the evening of Wednesday, June 3, and end at noon on Thursday, June 11. All men in formation except those who are making the Arrupe experience are expected to attend this retreat. We hope to make some space available for Jesuits from New Orleans as well, so please make your reservations early if you wish to make this retreat. The ordination of Brian Christopher will follow the province retreat. On Thursday evening, June 11, we will have a buffet supper for Jesuits in the College Church Ballroom followed by an informal haustus later in the evening. Events on Friday, June 12, will include a morning of recollection ending with a prayer service and picnic lunch. As usual, the ordination banquet for Jesuits and guests will be held on Friday evening in the College Church Ballroom. Bishop Robert Hermann will preside at Brian's ordination at 10:00 am on Saturday morning, June 13, in the College Church. Housing for Jesuits will be provided in the Town House apartments at SLU. Later in the year we will ask you to make reservations for the ordination events.

We will be joined for the ordination events this year by the men in formation of the New Orleans province. It is my expectation again this year that all of the members of the province will make every effort to support our men in formation by joining in the celebration.

Later in the summer we will mark the transition in provincial leadership with a Missouri Province Convocation at Regis University in Denver. The convocation will begin on the evening of July 29 and end on the evening of August 1, 2009. We will follow the same pattern as our previous congregation. The first day will be for Jesuits only with our colleagues and partners joining us for the last two days of the convocation. The theme of the convocation "Sent to the Frontiers" was inspired by Pope Benedict's address to the delegates at GC35. Speakers for the convocation include Fr. Dean Brackley SJ, Professor of Theology at the UCA in San Salvador, the Honorable Janine P. Geske, Distinguished Professor of Law at Marquette University and Fr. Tom Smolich, the Moderator of the Jesuit Conference. I am grateful to the convocation planning committee for the work they have done so far and will put in over the coming months. The committee is made up of Mr. Sean Agniel, (chair), Fr. Jim Blumeyer SJ, Dr. Tom Reynolds, Ms. Gretchen Kessler, Dr. John James, Mr. Michael Rozier SJ, and Mrs. Dale Auffenberg.
