- I, James R. Hawkins, M.D., being first duly cautioned and sworn, hereby state as follows:
- I am a medical doctor, board certified in the field of Psychiatry. My curriculum vitae is attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- 2. It is my opinion, based upon my experience and review of the authoritative treatises attached hereto as Exhibit B, that victims of pedophiles who have experienced a childhood encounter of a sexual nature will typically have similar psychological reactions. These reactions include long-range effects on the quality of their personal adjustment, on the quality of their interpersonal relationships, and serious emotional problems, including Post Traumatic Stress Disorder.
 - Victims of child sexual abuse typically and frequently experience:
 - Feelings of Inferiority
 - Non-Integrated personality
 - c. Poor basic trust
 - d. Repressed anger
 - e. Unresolved Identification and fixations

- f. Difficulties in establishing and maintaining relationships
- g. Shame, guilt, and fear of social disapproval
- Underlying feelings of helplessness, powerlessness, and fear.
- Typical emotional problems of victims of child sexual abuse include:
- a. Guilt about an imagined defect in themselves; victims typically conclude they are evil or corrupt.
 - Shame, including feeling dirty, unloved, and worthless.
- c. Lack of self-worth and learned passivity; victims feel powerless, have low self esteem, and have difficulty refusing sexual predators; they are more vulnerable to present and future sexual abuse.
- d. Anger and hatred; depression, despair, and self-punishment;
 typical experiences are rage without provocation, self-mutilation, suicidal
 thoughts and attempts, self-loathing and self-destructive behavior
- Fearfulness and anxiety once basic trust has been violated,
 victims typically develop fear of intimacy and romantic partners may be
 perceived as potential betrayers, making close friendships and marriages
 difficult
 - f. Loss of childhood, and the attendant suffering.
- g. Loss of trust; the craving for love and attention that renders a child vulnerable is the natural response of a child to a trusted adult religious figure who the child can see is highly esteemed by parents, the community, and the church; where the abuser is supposed to be the spiritual protector, comforter, valued adviser, and close friend of the child, the abuse of that trust destroys the ability of the child to trust in the future.
- 5. Sexual abuse meets medical criteria outlined in DSM-IV (APA 1994) for events that cause Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). PTSD refers to the psychological reactions that typically occur as a result of a disaster or an extreme psychological stressor. The criteria include:

- The person experienced, witnesses or was confronted with a. an event or events that involve actual or threatened death or serious injury or a threat to the physical integrity of self or others and
- The person's response involves intense fear, helplessness or horror, or in children disorganized or agitated behavior.

Those suffering from PTSD commonly make deliberate efforts to avoid thoughts, feelings, or conversations about the traumatic event and to avoid activities or people who arouse recollections of it.
