- ecclesiastical authority, he may not be entrusted with any administrative (directivo) or teaching office.
- d. in other institutes of higher studies, which are not dependent upon ecclesiastical authority, he is certainly not to teach any [theological or related] discipline.
- e. in institutes of lower studies dependent upon ecclesiastical authority he is not to hold any administrative (*directivo*) or teaching office. The dispensed and dismissed priest is restricted by these same regulations from teaching religion in similar institutes which are independent of ecclesiastical authority.
- 6. The priest dismissed from the clerical state, dispensed from ecclesiastical celibacy, or a fortiori who is married, ought to live away from the places where his previous condition is known. However the local Ordinary of the suppliant, the Ordinary of his [prior] incardination, or his major religious superior, is able to dispense from this clause of the decree if it is foreseen that the presence of the suppliant will cause no scandal.
- 7. Notice of dismissal and dispensation can be made either [i] personally by notary or ecclesiastical actuary or [ii] by registered letter; one copy [of this decree] ought to be returned to the suppliant [after it has been] duly signed to signify reception in faith and acceptance of dismissal and dispensation and at the same time these precepts; [yet] if this is not done this decree shall remain completely effective.
- 8. At an opportune time the competent Ordinary is to report the notification briefly to this Congregation, and if there is any wonderment (admiratio) by the faithful this should also be prudently explained.
