Rev. Joseph E. McInnis, 74, of West Roxbury, a former Jesuit who founded an alcoholic recovery program in West Roxbury, died Monday in Faulkner Hospital, Jamaica Plain, after a brief illness.

Born and raised in Charlestown, he entered the Society of Jesus in 1929 at Shadowbrook, and was ordained at Campion Center in Weston in 1941.

He taught English Literature at Boston College and at Holy Cross, and was stationed at the Jesuit missions in Jamaica before resigning from the order.

In recent years, Fr. McInnis was chaplain at the mother house of the Sisters of St. Joseph in Brighton and assisted at various parishes in the archdiocese.

He organized Stepping Stones, an alcoholic recovery program, and operated it from the Area E Police Station in West Roxbury. For many years, Fr. McInnis wrote a counseling and advice column under the byline Joe Mac in the old Boston Herald Traveler.

He leaves a sister, Elizabeth Bishop of West Roxbury.

A funeral Mass will be said tomorrow at 9 a.m. in the Holy Name Church, West Roxbury. Burial will be in Holy Cross Cemetery, Malden.
