Any change or alteration to this agreement will involve consultation with the cleric, his on-site supervisor, the Director, and the VP. The cleric, his on-site supervisor, the Director, or the VP can initiate the discussion for change or alteration, or request that this Individual Specific Protocol be reviewed by the independent Review Board. At the discretion of any of the parties, the legal and/or canonical counsel of the cleric may be involved in the discussions.

At around 1:45 PM on 10/7/92 I was called once again by the woman who had lodged the allegation against Walter Huppenbauer. I informed her that we had been in touch with Walter and that we were to meet him that afternoon at 2:30. She asked if he admitted to anything and I said he had not. I also informed her that he was told he has the right to counsel and that he was going to take that right.

Andy McDonagh and I met with Wally Huppenbauer at 2:30 P.M. at Andy's house near St. Mary of the Woods. Our very first thing was to tell Wally of his rights as a citizen. We told him he had the right to counsel and that if he so desired, we could get him the names of lawyers who are independent of the Archdiocese who would represent his interests in this matter. We also told him that the diocese would help him to pay his legal fees.

He said he would want to talk to some lawyer and we gave him the names of several and he chose Pat Reardon whom he called. Pat told him not to say anything about this matter to anyone until he had an opportunity to talk with him in the attorney-client situation.

We then told Walter exactly what the woman had said on the telephone earlier that morning. Wally confirmed that she had called him and he also confirmed that he did not know who she was at the start of that conversation. He did say that the excuse he gave for not knowing her was that whatever happened from the description that she had given him would have happened 20 or more years ago. She had told us that when he said 20 years before, it was an indication to her that there must have been others. Wally said he just meant it as a general statement about the time frame that this woman was speaking about. It was no admission on his part, he said.

Following his counsel's directions, Wally made no statement to us about the incident and we did not press him further on that. I indicated to him that she would be calling back on Friday. I had, with advice from our attorneys, urged her to possibly go to an independent attorney to ask how she should proceed in this matter. I asked her to check out with a

I received a call on Oct. 12 from the woman who has brought the allegations against Walter Huppenbauer. She wanted to know what is happening. I informed her of our meeting with Huppenbauer and his counsel. Her response to that was that she did not know that he could deny it or that he did not have to admit his part in the allegation. I once again informed her that by the constitution of the United States he has rights not to indict himself and that his lawyer was advising him not to do so.

I did, however, tell her that we would be able to follow our normal procedure with Fr. Huppenbauer and that would include [REDACTED] a further inquiry. I acknowledged to her that I had spoken to Fr. [REDACTED] who now has her address and phone number. She wants him to maintain absolute confidence in the matter.

I also explained to her that if, down the road, Wally had to be removed from the parish, then most likely the State's Attorney's Office would be notified and there would be an investigation and it would come out. She made no response to that.

I told her that I would continue to keep her informed when she called and that she also could stay in contact with Fr. [REDACTED], which she has promised to do, for her own sake. [REDACTED]



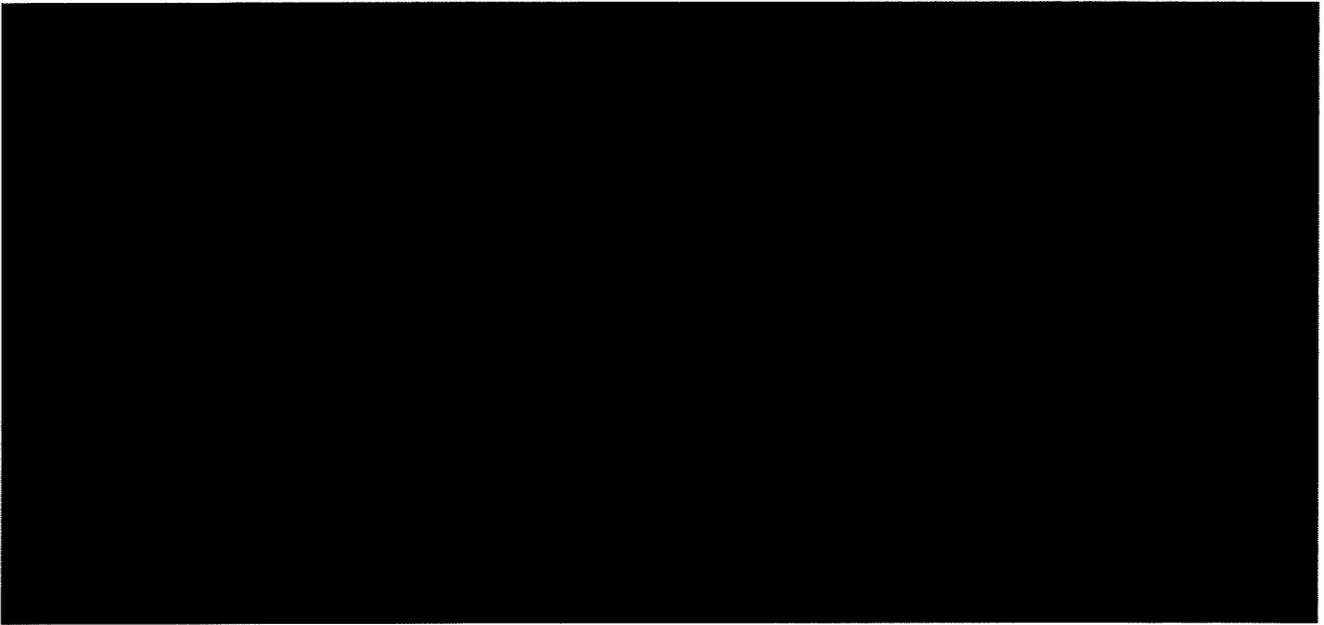

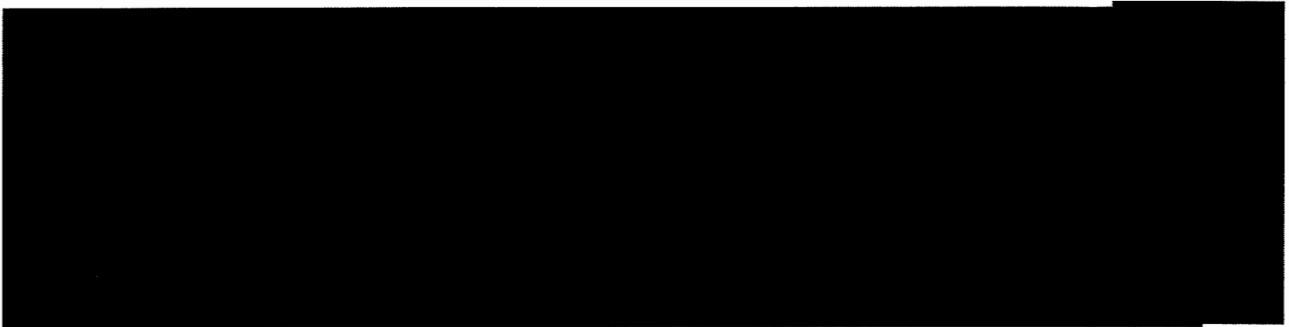

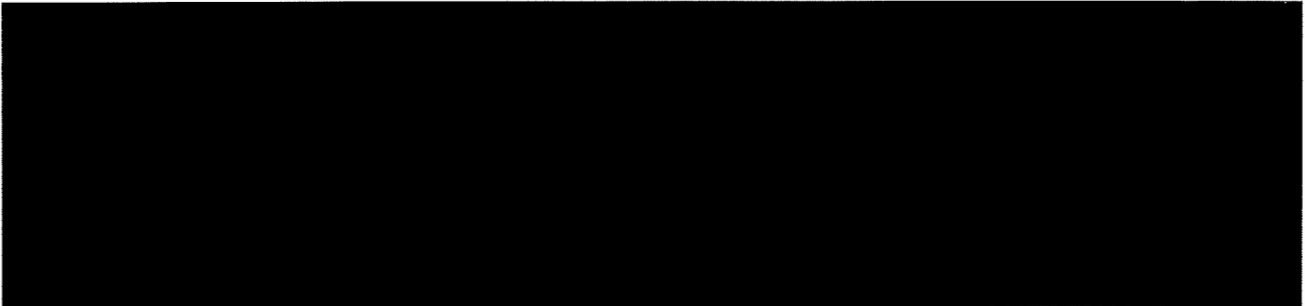

I met with Walter Huppenbauer on Wednesday, Oct. 21. I told Walter about the fact that the woman has now let her name be known to Fr. [REDACTED]. While this is a bit more removed from anonymity, we still have not seen this person, outside of talking to her on the phone [REDACTED].

With regard to monitoring, I told Wally that we need to have someone at the parish know that we have put him under the mandate not to be in the presence of minors under 18. This is for his well-being and for the well-being of any children. It is also what we must do in order to have a believable mandate. Ideally, I asked Wally to inform his principal and his Business Manager. Wally feels that he can inform both of them. He will think it over and then will let me know what he decides. I told him that if he decides that he could not tell them, I would have to tell them. He understands that.

As soon as Wally has done this or made his decision, he will notify me and I will follow up with calls to the two people involved. Wally was concerned that his associate might just be affected in a negative fashion. Wally was not sure how he would respond. This agreed with our preliminary information.

Wally would tell the principal and the business manager that an anonymous allegation has come forward at this time alleging sexual misconduct with a teenager some 27 years ago. The allegation is in the first steps of inquiry and Wally is cooperating with the inquiry at this time.

I alerted Wally that if the woman comes forward, which is a strong likelihood, then we will have to deal with the monitoring in a stronger fashion. I asked if there was any room for a monitor to move into the parish and he said that at this time, no. There is a Fr. Mast there who is working towards his D.Min. He is from New Jersey. He will be

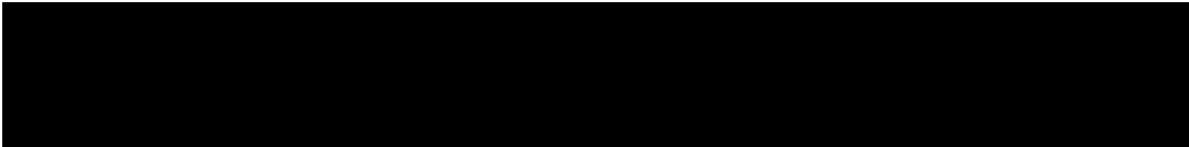

I spoke to Pat Reardon, Wally Huppenbauer's lawyer, this morning at 8 A.M. Wally is at this time reluctant to tell anybody lest the allegation become widespread and, if the situation stays as it is now, that is, anonymous, it would never be able to be atoned for.

I explained to Pat our reasons for this necessary monitoring. That we wanted to be as low-key as possible because of the quasi-anonymous nature of the allegation. I explained to him that we wanted Wally to initiate it and we would follow up on it.

Pat was asking about where this whole thing is going in the future and I told him that it somewhat depends on whether the woman comes forward more. I warned him about the trials that are coming up in November, December and January and that this might occasion people coming forward who have not done so up until now.

Pat will try to get Wally in today or no later than Monday and talk to him about this monitoring and then will get back to me on how we can proceed.



I spoke to Patrick Reardon, lawyer for Walter Huppenbauer, on Monday, Nov. 9. He had met for a long time with Wally. Wally agrees to talk separately and privately with the two people at the parish. He will tell them that I will call or instruct them to call me. We agreed to this. Wally indicated that at this particular time they are in the midst of a series of private confessions with the younger children. The children go into the confessional alone for just a minute or so. I felt that, because of the fact that the allegation against Wally is still in a semi-anonymous stage and that Wally has absolutely no record in his past of any previous problems with youth, I would allow this. Some adjustment could be made in the future at the parish. Wally pleaded that it would be very difficult to change the format at this present time.



Pat wanted some assurance from us that, if Wally and he were going along with everything we ask, he hoped that the rules would not be changed in mid-stream. I told Pat that this case eventually is going to end up with the Administrator and the Review Board. On top of that, we do not know whether the person who brought the allegation against Wally will come forward in any more identifiable fashion, that is whether the case will remain anonymous or not. To some extent, what happens in the future depends on these two conditions. So I could not guarantee anything about the future. I did promise Pat that if something were to change, he and Wally would be notified as soon as possible.

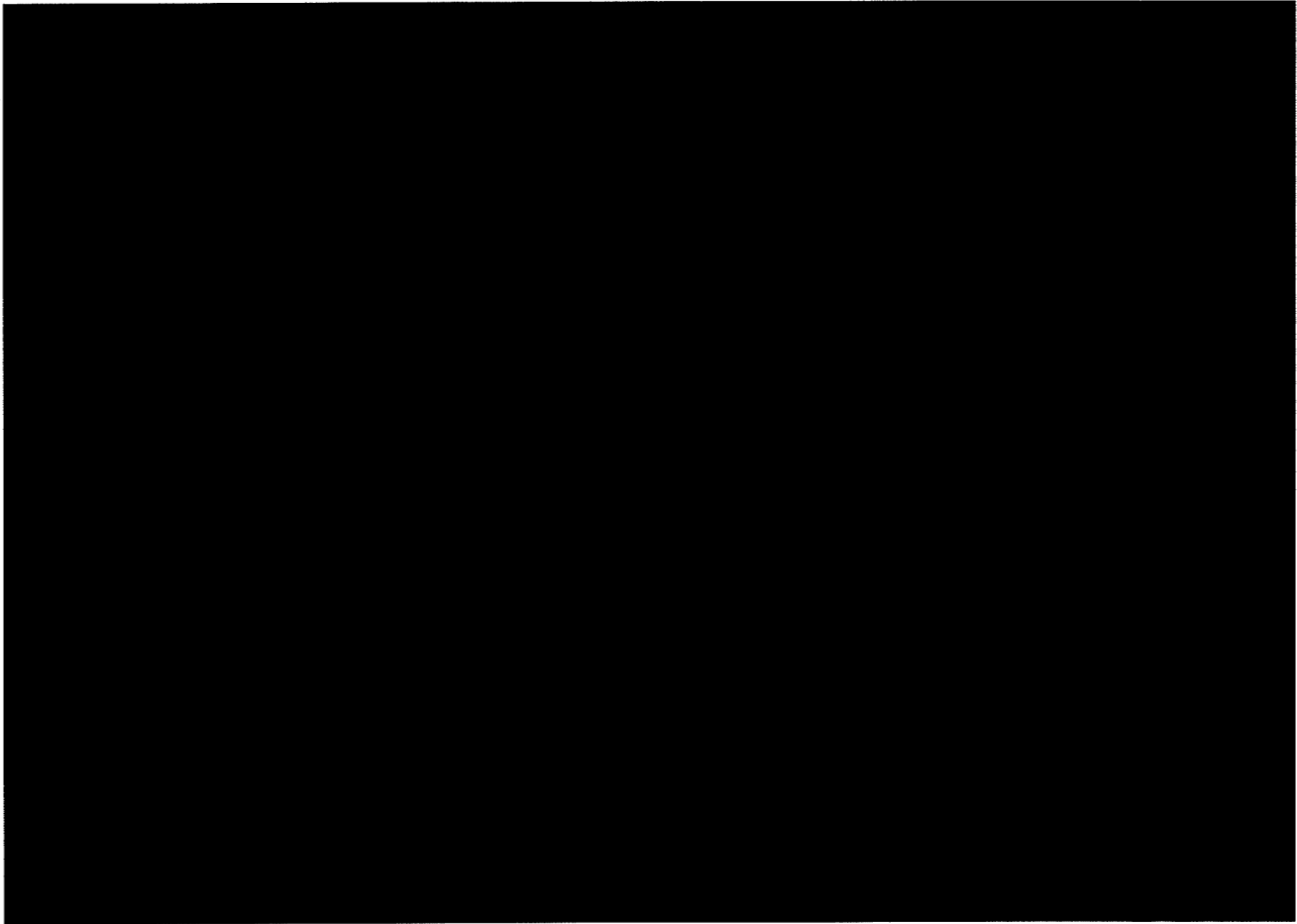

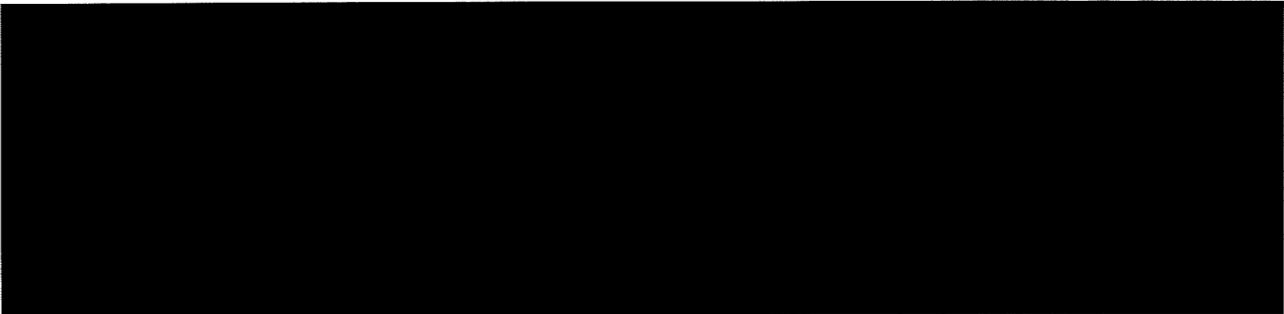

These were the two whom we agreed should be notified about the allegation that has been brought forward against Wally Huppenbauer. I explained to them separately (and without each other's knowledge) that the allegation is still anonymous and that Fr. Huppenbauer is cooperating with the inquiry at this time. He is not to be in the presence of minors without another adult being present.

The principal of the school said that they have made arrangements in the future that confessions would not be done in private, one-to-one sessions with children in the school. Both parties agreed that if they were to see any compromising situation they would alert Fr. Huppenbauer to it. Both also said that they have seen nothing in the past that would warrant any truth to the allegation.

I called [REDACTED] to alert him to where we're at and I was not able to get in touch with him since he is presently in the hospital. [REDACTED]



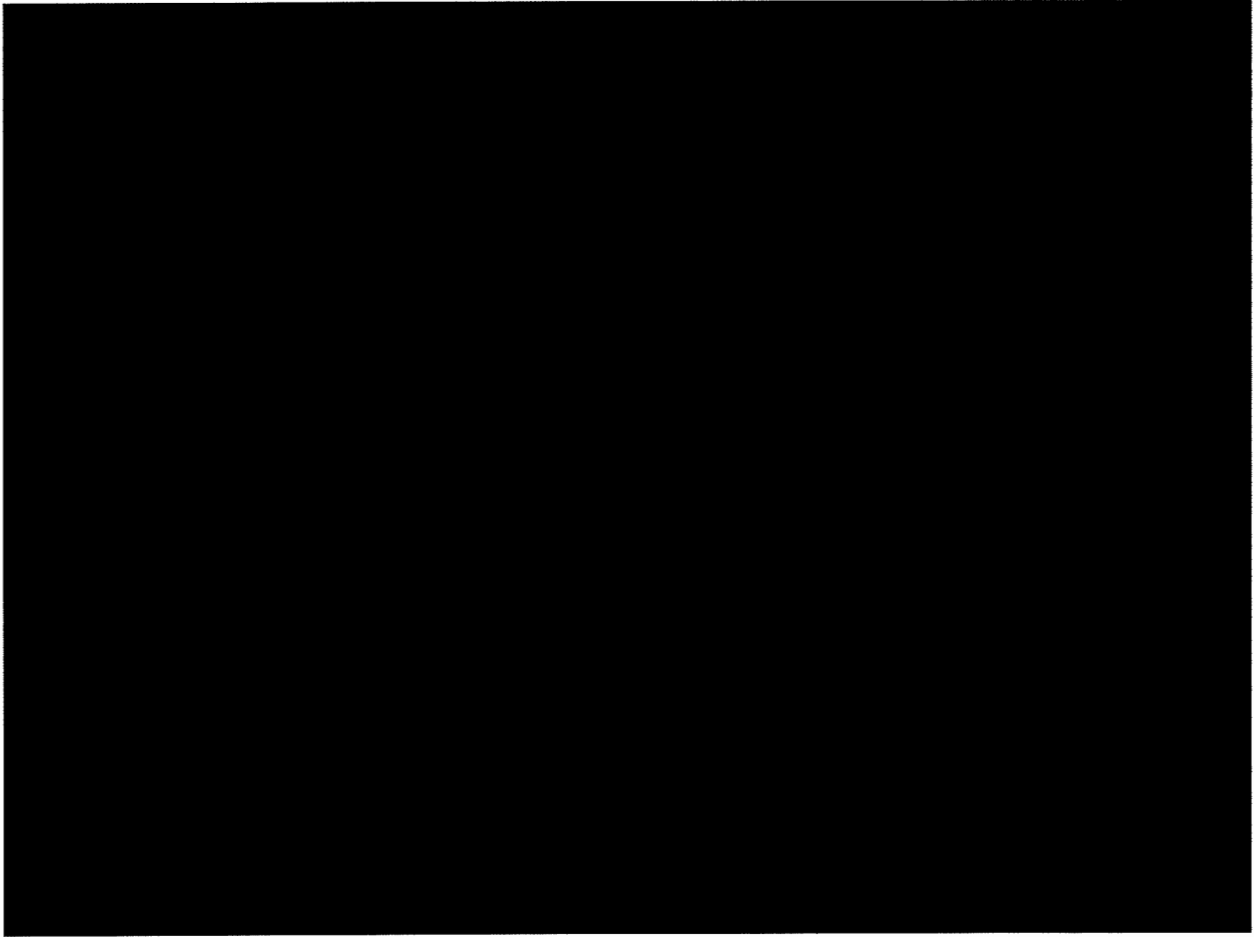

Huppenbauer and the policies would thus call for me informing the Review Board of this anonymous allegation and what action has been taken to date. 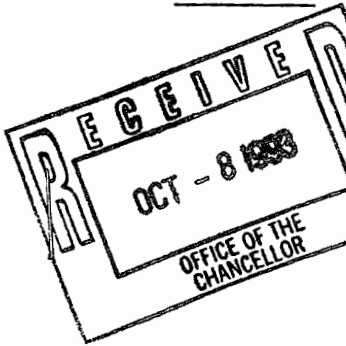

We have spoken before and so you are aware that I am the Professional Fitness Review Administrator for the Archdiocese. The Fitness Review Board met recently and discussed a situation in which I have been directed by the Board to contact you.

If so, then perhaps the person could be informed that if she desires to proceed forward with this allegation with the Review Board, she need only contact me to so inform me of her intention.



The Cardinal and I met with Walter Huppenbauer on 12/28/93. The Cardinal was to present his request and the situation of the Archdiocese. The Cardinal, after laying out the alternatives, asked for Huppenbauer's voluntary resignation from the parish. He told Huppenbauer he could not, nor would he, force the resignation, but felt that that would be best both for Huppenbauer and for the Archdiocese.

Wally was taken back by this and said he felt "betrayed". The Cardinal acknowledged Wally's feeling, but reiterated the difficult position he finds himself in and the risk that the Archdiocese is taking in this situation.

Wally then asked about the alternative. We talked about having someone go into the parish as a monitor for the situation. This person would live there under the usual monitoring conditions. After some discussion back and forth, Huppenbauer said that he would need time to think about all this. The Cardinal agreed. Huppenbauer said that his attorney, Mr. Reardon, is out of town at this time and he would like to wait to talk to him.

We agreed that Huppenbauer should get back to Fr. O'Malley on Jan. 17, the Monday Fr. O'Malley is returning from vacation. He should have his decision made at that time.

Huppenbauer seemed to understand what the Cardinal explained as well as its ramifications.

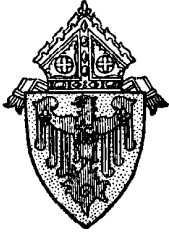
On 1/25/94, Fr. Huppenbauer came to see me with his attorney, Patrick Reardon. Wally wanted to explore exactly what the options meant with regard to the decision he has to make at this time.

With regard to leaving the parish, Huppenbauer wanted to know where he would be staying if he did leave and what he would be doing. We eventually came to the understanding that if he were to leave the parish, we would probably move him to a non-parochial residence, such as a chaplaincy in a convalescent home, or even to Casa San Carlo in Northlake.

There is a possibility, according to John Canary, that, in the future, Huppenbauer could do some work for the Archdiocese in terms of pastor evaluation and other things. Walter asked how much time he would have before he would have to leave and we talked about the date of June 1, 1994. He felt that, in the interim, he could prepare his people for leaving at that time.

He then asked about what the second alternative would be, which would be to move someone in to monitor his situation. He would still have to leave at the end of his second six-year term. He would not then be assigned to a parish but would have to find a non-parochial residence and assignment.

Huppenbauer asked for time to make his decision. I will call him on February 1 to find out. I told him that in the future, when he did get assigned to a place, the people there would have to know what his situation is. I mentioned to him that at Casa San Carlo was already aware of our needs in this regard and that she would be happy to meet with us.

I spoke to Fr. Huppenbauer today, 2/1/94. He has decided that he will voluntarily submit his resignation from the pastorate of St. Thomas of Villanova. He would hope that the effective date for that resignation would be June 1, 1994. This would give him time both to prepare himself and his people for a smooth transition.

We will begin to work with Wally to set up [REDACTED] a residence for him once he leaves, and some ministry for him to do which will not involve parochial ministry directly. At this time I have in mind a chaplaincy at a retirement home or something of that nature.

We have also been looking for someone to help revise the pastoral evaluation process that has been running under Fr. Ed Upton's direction. John Canary will be consulting with Fr. Upton and Carol Fowler as to the possibility of using Wally in that capacity. Wally himself has been evaluated and has served on evaluation teams for other pastors. He is an active, intelligent man who could still contribute to the Archdiocese in a major way. The Office of Evaluation is a rather low-key office and could possibly be an adequate ministry for Huppenbauer combined with some presence as a chaplain.

If you are in agreement, I will instruct Walter to submit a letter to you with his intentions to resign the pastorate as of June 1. After that, everything could proceed as it normally does when a pastor submits his resignation.

I met with Sr. [REDACTED] of the Little Sisters of the Poor on Lakewood Avenue to talk about arrangements for Fr. Huppenbauer's chaplaincy at the institution. The Sisters are willing to pick up a salary for him at \$1,500 per month, which would come to \$18,000 per year. That amount is \$2,020 more than he would receive as an associate pastor with salary, transportation and increment.

I need to check with Wally whether the stoles and stipends are included in that figure. Will he be receiving Mass stipends separately?

At any rate, his apartment will cost between \$400 - \$500 per month. Then there will be the cost of his meals. In addition, we must be on for his insurance, his car insurance, his professional allowance and 1/2 of his social security. I am trying to get in touch with Huppenbauer to work out all the details of the salary and room and board.

Sr. [REDACTED] assured me that she would monitor Fr. Huppenbauer. She and her superior are aware of the situation. No one else is aware of it at this time.

With regard to vacations and days off and temporary coverage while away, Huppenbauer will work that out with the Sisters and his immediate co-workers. He is presently on vacation and is scheduled to take over as of July 1.

I visited with Fr. Huppenbauer today at his new residence at 2300 N. Racine, Apt. 305, in the Jugen Apartments. Fr. Huppenbauer's phone number is [REDACTED]

He is set up at this time and ready to begin work on July 1, 1994. He has a job description from Sr. [REDACTED] of the Little Sisters of the Poor. Fr. Huppenbauer and I discussed his work and then we talked about the financial aspect of his situation at this time.

He will be receiving a salary of \$1,500 per month from the home. That comes to about \$18,000 per year. He will probably receive stipends to the amount of about \$1,800 per year, both from the sisters and from the Chancellor.

He will be receiving benefits including health insurance and car insurance through our office. He will be receiving the professional growth allowance of \$700 per year through our office. Since he will be making more than would be coming to him were he an associate at this time, he will not be asking our office for 1/2 of the social security but will pay that out of his own funds.

With regard to room and board, he needs to pay about \$554 per month rent. Most of his meals he will get at the Little Sisters of the Poor Home. We will subsidize his living up to \$300 per month for the time being. He will see how this works out.

In summary, Huppenbauer will receive from our office: health insurance, car insurance, his professional growth allowance of \$700 per year, and an additional subsidy of \$300 per month. We will put him on our payroll for that \$300 per month. I will be keeping in touch with Huppenbauer to check on his situation as the months go on.

Presenting Problem:

On 10/7/92, VP got phone call from unidentified woman (about 44), demanding anonymity, alleging Fr. F had molested her as teenager in 62-4 time frame. [REDACTED]

VP asked her for her name, explaining our difficulties with an anonymous call. She insisted on anonymity. [REDACTED] There is no previous record of misconduct for Fr. F.

On 10/7, VP and Fr. McDonagh met with Fr. F., explained his rights, described the allegation. Under attorney's advice, Fr. [REDACTED] gave no response. We mandated him not to be with minors. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Staff people at the parish were to be asked to monitor Fr. F.

Meantime the woman called another Chicago priest, Fr. [REDACTED] and asked him to act as intermediary. He knew her vaguely from years before. VP then interviewed Fr. [REDACTED] He had nothing more to add other than that he does know her. At her request, he did not reveal her name. We reiterated our offer of help through priest. She did not accept. She is told that further inquiry will proceed. VP did not hear from her again.

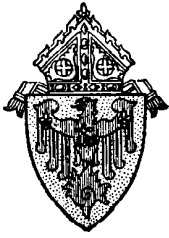
PFRBD: In 4/93, Cardinal determined this case should go before PFRBD to answer question of withdrawal from ministry.

By 10/13/93, case was still anonymous. Fitness Review Administrator agreed to bring this case to his Board without mentioning Fr. F's name.

By 10/19/93, the FRABd ruled that, because it continues to be anonymous and they are not able to make further inquiry, the case should remain with VP office. The other priest, Fr. [REDACTED] had not heard from the woman, nor did he know her phone number or address. No follow up by the FRA was possible. If the woman caller were to come forward and identify herself in the future, the case would go to PFRBD.

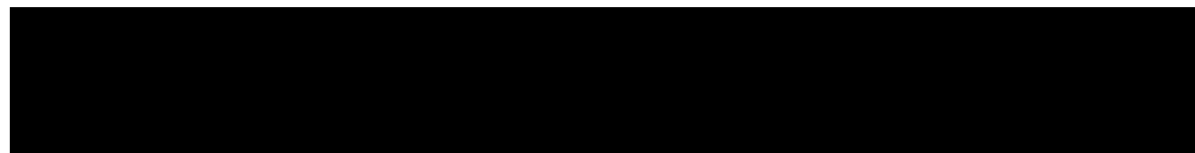
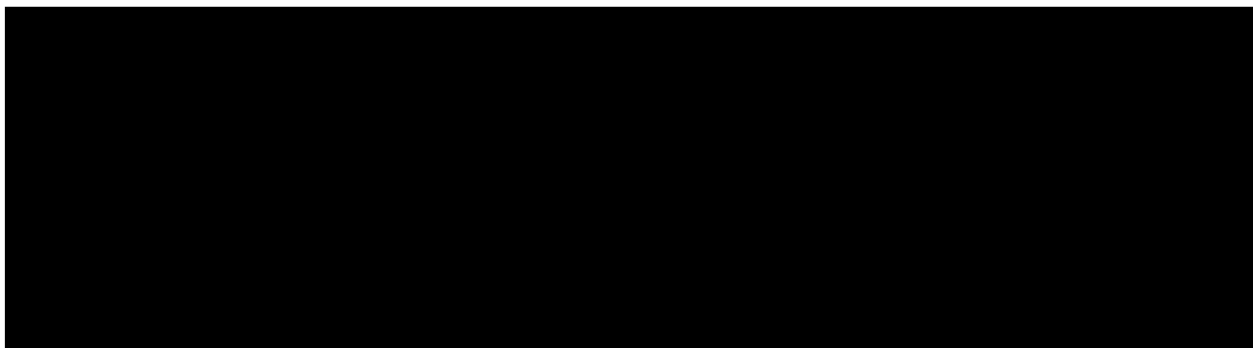

I have been meaning to write to thank you for the time you gave us on Monday, August 26, to discuss the financial remuneration to Fr. Huppenbauer as Chaplain at our Home.

We needed your confirmation that Father Wally receives no financial support from the Archdiocese of Chicago to offset the salary paid him by the Little Sisters of the Poor. On July 22nd I met with Wally at his request. The purpose for the meeting was to explore the possibility of Wally taking some new chaplaincy assignment. He said he had nothing specific in mind. He was merely interested in considering a change. I told him that any such request would have to be approved by PCAC. He seemed reluctant to have the matter become that formal and said he would think it over and get back to me.

Having never heard back from Wally I decided to call him today. He said a new factor had entered the picture. The chaplain at the Little Sisters of the Poor's facility in Palatine died recently and there is a vacancy. Wally said he would prefer living in the suburbs. He said he had no first hand information e.g. the size of the chaplain's quarters etc.

He asked me what I thought PCAC would think. I told him I was certain PCAC would want the Palatine administrator to be made aware of Wally's past. Wally seemed very reluctant to proceed with this. He told me he would think about it and get back to me.

Wally called this afternoon to say that after giving consideration to our last discussion he has decided to remain at the Little Sisters of the Poor. He says he is happy and is content to stay on.

We agreed that our conversation about a possible new assignment can be continued down the road. He will contact me if he becomes interested in pursuing another assignment.

- 12-13-93 [REDACTED] Cardinal meet with WH and Fr. P. O'Malley. Talk about voluntary resignation. If he doesn't do so, WH will not be renewed in 7/95 when his term is ended. – The original suggestion made was: WH be left in the parish until 7/95, should be under protocol as he is with monitoring, but beef it up by having someone move into the rectory, his term as pastor would not be renewed, [REDACTED] – “After some delicate conversation about this matter, we agreed that the Cardinal should see WH in a private conference and lay the problem out before him. The Cardinal should then ask him to resign early from his ministry in the parish. This would help protect Huppenbauer himself, the parish, and the Archdiocese. Whether WH should be reassured that there will be something waiting for him [REDACTED] [REDACTED] is a point that was brought up but not determined. ... The Cardinal will meet with WH and there was some sense that the VP ought to be present at that meeting.”

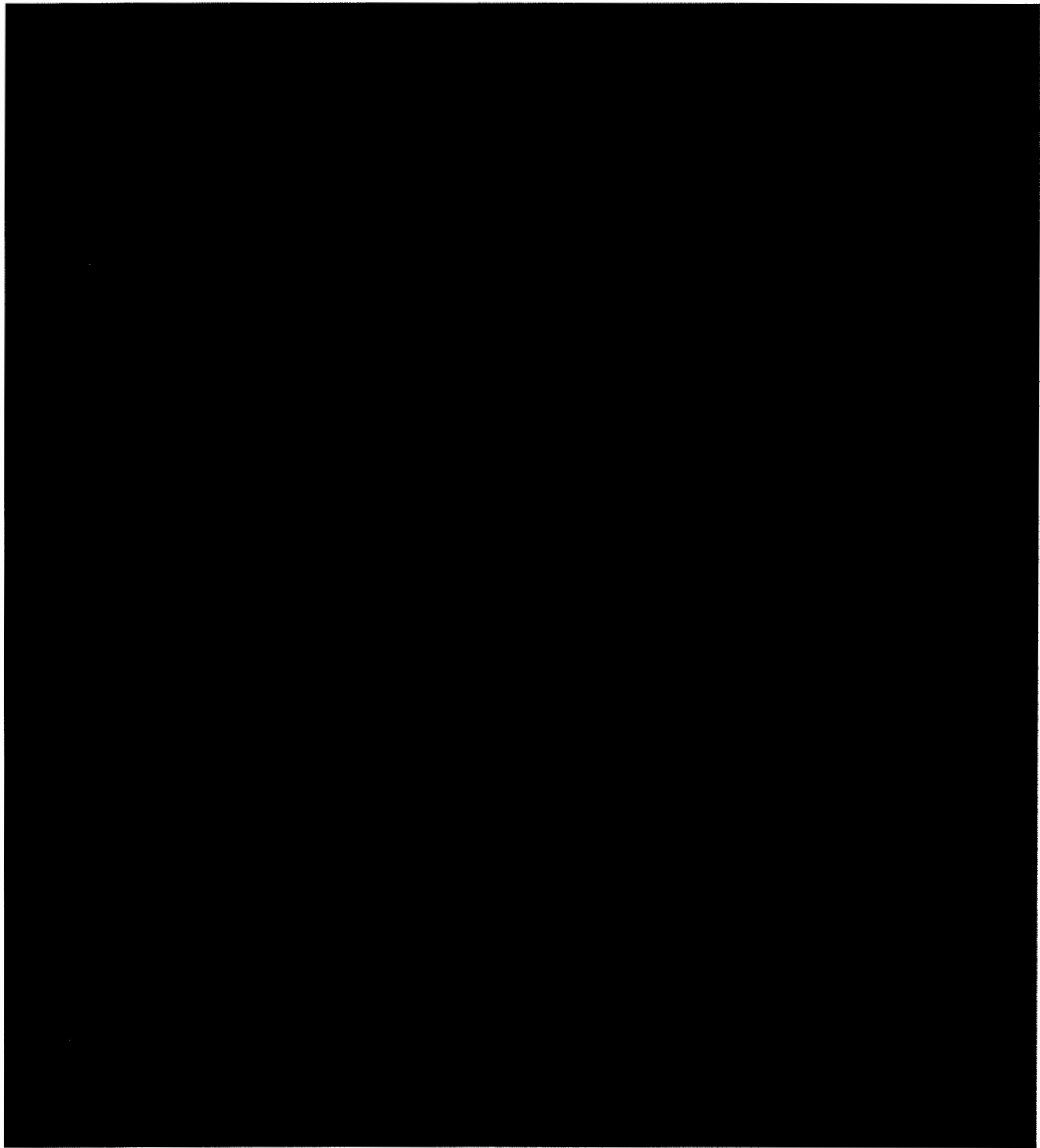

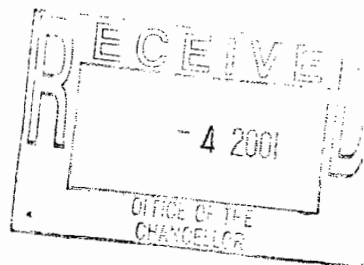

2. Please advise us if any other claims of misconduct have been made relating to Father Huppenbauer.



On May 15, 2002 at 9:00 a.m., I received a very disturbing telephone call from Kathleen Leggdas advising me that she needed to speak with the clients for whom I have sent letters in the last two months to get more information. I advised Ms. Leggdas that we have provided detailed statements and this is the first I have learned that further information was needed or required. Ms. Leggdas advised me that she had forms to fill out. When I asked her if anything had been done responsive to those letters to this point, she replied no, nothing has been done because I have to get further information. I expressed a great deal of anger and my apologies for the expression of that anger, but I have to say that I am both shocked and appalled that nothing has been done responsive to the the letters that had been sent out which you acknowledged receiving. Ms. Leggdas then replied that the attorneys are handling it and I told her that I had been advised by the attorneys that she was handling the matter of the review of the priests for fitness to assignment. You will note that in each of these letters many weeks and in some cases months have passed since the information was brought to your attention immediately by fax and in each case I received a call from Mr. Serritella advising me it had been turned over to the Fitness Review Board for immediate action. I am now informed that no action has been





taken, much less immediate.

The failure and/or refusal of the Archdiocese to respond to these pleas for protection on behalf of other children and information brought forward by my courageous clients to try to get you to address it has gone unheard. This is to advise you that it is my belief that the Archdiocese's failure to respond to this promptly is both dilatory and dangerous. My clients have been deceived as have I about motivation and the intentions of the Archdiocese in responding to their letters immediately when nothing has in fact has been done. You have left me and my clients in the position that we have but no course other than to go public with this information to prevent further abuse and imperiling perhaps other children further. I am deeply disappointed and disgusted.

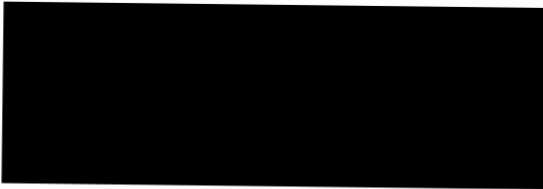

This abstract replaces the Allegation of Sexual Abuse of a Minor and summary prepared by Leah McCluskey, Interim Professional Fitness Review Administrator of the Archdiocese of Chicago's Office of Professional Fitness Review, of Victim MS's statement, given to Ms. McCluskey on August 20, 2002, formalizing her allegation of abuse against Fr. Walter Huppenbauer.

According to Victim MS's statement, the alleged abuse began when Victim MS was in fifth or sixth grade, and lasted until the end of eighth grade. The alleged abuse consisted of rubbing, fondling and kissing. Victim MS stated that when the memories of the alleged abuse resurfaced 8 years prior to her giving the statement, she contacted Huppenbauer and Huppenbauer listed off the initials of six other girls, which made Victim MS believe that she was not the only person abused by Huppenbauer.



Dear members of the St. Thomas of Villanova Parish Family,

In recent months, your parish community learned that two priests who had served your parish have been removed from ministry because of accusations regarding sexual misconduct with minors. Unfortunately, there is more news to share now. Officials of the Archdiocese of Chicago have received new information in recent months regarding your former pastor, Fr. Walter Huppenbauer.

In August, Archdiocesan officials received an allegation from an adult woman who alleged that Fr. Huppenbauer had engaged in sexual misconduct with her 40 years ago while she was minor. At the time she alleges the misconduct occurred, Fr. Huppenbauer was an associate priest at St. Hilary Parish, located on the northwest side of Chicago.

This past weekend, the independent Fitness Review Board reviewed the allegation, found reason to suspect that abuse occurred, and recommended to Francis Cardinal George, that Fr. Huppenbauer, though already retired, not be permitted to perform any public ministry. Cardinal George has accepted this recommendation. According to archdiocesan policies and procedures, Fr. Huppenbauer will be subject to a monitoring protocol under the supervision of the independent Fitness Review Board, and will not again be permitted to be alone with minors without an adult present. The allegation has been reported to the Cook County State's Attorney.

You should know that the Archdiocese had received the allegation of sexual abuse against Fr. Huppenbauer before he left your parish in 1993, but that allegation was presented anonymously by the same woman who has now come forward to identify herself this time. In 1993, her allegation could not be fully processed by the then-newly-established Fitness Review Board. Because Fr. Huppenbauer could not be told of his accuser, the Archdiocese determined it was not appropriate at that time to share news of the allegation publicly with you. Nevertheless, the Fitness Review Board believed then that it was prudent to recommend that Fr. Huppenbauer no longer serve in parish ministry and that he be subject to a monitoring protocol that prohibited him from being alone in the presence of a minor. He was permitted to retire from his pastorate at St. Thomas of Villanova in June of 1994.

As you may recall, earlier this year two priests who had served at your parish, Fr. [REDACTED] and Fr. Daniel Buck, were also removed from ministry following substantiated allegations of sexual misconduct with minors that occurred before either had arrived at your parish. Please be assured that the Archdiocese of Chicago has never received information from any parishioner of St. Thomas of Villanova -- past or present -- that they suffered abuse by any priest who served here.

This morning (@9:30 a.m.), I called  to alert her to the fact that an announcement will be made this evening at St. Thomas of Villanova Parish regarding her allegation against their former pastor, Rev. Walter Huppenbauer. The various points I made with  was:

- The Review Board did meet on Saturday, September 21st, and did discuss her allegation. The board did accept  allegation as credible. Assistance Ministry received word that the Cardinal accepted the board's recommendations. Whatever restrictions are placed on the priest should be discussed with PFRA.
- A previously scheduled open forum meeting at St. Thomas of Villanova this evening. The Archdiocese will take that opportunity to inform the parish of the allegation against Fr. Huppenbauer. A letter from Bishop ListECKI will be mailed tomorrow to St. Thomas of Villanova parishioners.
- I stressed that her name will not be mentioned in any of the Archdiocesan statements. St. Hilary will be mentioned because of Fr. Huppenbauer's assignments. I mentioned that Ralph was in contact with the current pastor at St. Hilary.

 asked what Fr. Huppenbauer's response was when presented with the allegation. I told her that I was not present, and could not speak to that question. She asked if an announcement would be made at St. Hilary (and St. Odilo?). I said that Ralph would coordinate that, and that I didn't have any information at this time. She asked if she would receive a letter from the Archdiocese (I said she would), and asked that her lawyer receive a copy as well.

I told  the purpose of my call was to alert her that an announcement would be made this evening at St. Thomas of Villanova. She was most appreciative of the call.

St. Thomas parishioners learn of latest priest scandal

Parishioners of St. Thomas of Villanova Catholic Church in Palatine reacted with shock and tears Wednesday night after receiving the news of sexual misconduct allegations against Walter Huppenbauer, the church's former pastor.

Huppenbauer, 72, who was St. Thomas' pastor from 1984 to 1994, is retired, but recently was formally terminated from the ministry for abusing a female parishioner at St. Hilary's parish in Chicago in the 1960s, Bishop Jerome Listecki told

reporters at the church after privately informing the congregation in a town hall-type meeting.

He was the church's emeritus pastor before the allegations surfaced.

Parishioners believed they were meeting to discuss allegations that had surfaced earlier in the summer regarding two other St. Thomas priests — not Huppenbauer.

The Rev. Daniel Buck, who served as associate pastor of St. Thomas from 1984 to 1989, and the Rev. Marion Snieg, who served as a visiting priest until this summer, have been terminated from the ministry,

Listecki said.

Snieg and Buck were two of the eight priests in Chicago who were publicly removed from ministry by order of the archdiocese this June.

"Three priests in one parish — it's hard for anyone to comprehend," said Steve Gillmann of Palatine, chairperson of the parish council.

All of the allegations were investigated and determined to be credible by the Chicago Archdiocese's new fitness review board.

Cook County Assistant State's Attorney Shauna Bolicker said no criminal charges were pursued against the former priests because, in

all three cases, the statute of limitations had passed.

Listecki said that in 1993 the archdiocese was contacted by the female victim, who asked to remain anonymous. Her request, Listecki said, made it difficult for Huppenbauer to be removed, although an investigation was started. The woman returned this August and the investigation was reopened in the wake of recent church reforms, Listecki said.

Because Huppenbauer already was retired, his termination is a symbolic move.

But it follows guidelines set in Dallas this summer by the U.S. Con-

ference of Catholic Bishops. The guidelines call for the termination of any priest who has committed any act of sexual misconduct with a minor.

Buck was accused of having sexually abused a teenage girl during his tenure at the Chicago parish of St. Francis Borgia, while Snieg was accused of having had sexual contact with underage boys while serving at the Chicago parish of St. Jane DeChantal in the 1950s.

Parishioners expressed shock first at the fact that Huppenbauer's past had not been made known to the congregation sooner, and that the

victim's attempt in 1993 to bring the abuse to light had not been successful.

Others expressed dismay at the fact that Snieg, who until recently served as chaplain for Addolorata Villa in Wheaton, was placed under review in 1992, when he was still serving as visiting priest at St. Thomas. But his review status was not made known to the parish or to St. Thomas' pastor.

"It was an oversight," said Listecki. "His case fell through the cracks. At the archdiocese, we knew about it,

but the pastor should have known, too."

"I feel very sad about it," said Catherine Karlsen, principal of St. Thomas Elementary School, who considered Buck a personal friend. "But I think it's good that we can talk and that understanding can come from it."

Others responded with a sense of purpose.

"Every school in the U.S. needs to teach the kids about this," said parishioner Cherie Bott of Palatine. "A hand on the shoulder, that's proper. Hands in between your legs — not proper," she said. "That's what needs to come out of this."

Church's 3rd priest defrocked

Abuse allegations against 'Father Wally' shock Palatine parish

It was supposed to be a therapeutic meeting. It was not going to be pleasant.

The 70 or so parishioners who gathered Wednesday night at St. Thomas of Villanova Catholic Church in Palatine came ready to air the thoughts that had weighed them down since summer, when two of the parish's former priests were removed from the ministry on allegations of sexual misconduct.

They were not prepared to hear that a third priest—their pastor at St. Thomas for a decade—had been defrocked on similar charges.

The news of the Rev. Walter Huppenbauer's removal, delivered by Bishop Jerome Listewski at the start of the meeting, blindsided those who knew "Father Wally" as a personable priest with a Santa Claus beard.

Shock turned to sadness—and resolve—for many parishioners, who said Thursday it was only a coincidence that the national

priest sex abuse scandal had torn so abruptly into their quiet, suburban world.

"St. Thomas is very strong spiritually, and we've got active people in the parish," said Steve Gillmann, chairman of the parish pastoral council, who was at the

meeting. "It is hard as a parishioner to accept because it does make you feel like, 'Why us?' But I don't think anyone knew . . . It just happened, and it's just very unfortunate."

Said Ron Schaefer, parish manager since 1989, "It's an unhappy

coincidence."

The retired Huppenbauer, 72, was pastor at St. Thomas from 1983 to 1994. The allegation that led to his formal removal from ministry last weekend dates to the 1960s, when he was an assistant pastor as St. Hilary in Chicago.

The female victim, who was a minor when the alleged misconduct occurred, contacted the Archdiocese of Chicago anonymously in 1993.

The investigation hit a dead end because of the anonymous nature of the case, archdiocese officials said.

The allegation resurfaced in August. This time, the woman identified herself. A review by the archdiocese's independent Fitness Review Board found her claim credible.

The two other priests with past ties to St. Thomas, the reverends Marion Snieg and Daniel Buck, were barred from the ministry earlier this summer after reviews by the board.

Snieg, who is accused of misconduct with minors during his tenure in the late 1950s at St. Jane de Chantal on the Southwest Side, had been a visiting priest at St. Thomas until May.

Buck, associate pastor at St. Thomas from 1984 to 1989, was accused of sexually abusing a mi-

nor while at St. Francis Borgia on the Northwest Side in the early 1980s.

Catherine Karlsen, who has been principal at St. Thomas for 17 years, knew all three priests.

"These are human beings we're talking about," Karlsen said. "I worked with all three of them. To me, they were good men."

Allegations against Huppenbauer were particularly hard to stomach, she said, because he was "a personal friend as well as my boss."

Anh Nguyen, 19, a volunteer with the youth ministry group at St. Thomas who was baptized and confirmed by Huppenbauer, said the allegations were "hard to believe."

She wasn't worried, though, about the parish's reputation being tarnished.

"People can look and say, 'Oh wow, St. Thomas had three priests,' but this all happened before they were here," she said.

In a separate case involving another Chicago area priest, lawyers for a 31-year-old Los Angeles bartender filed suit Thursday in Cook County Circuit Court charging that the Rev. Vincent McCaffrey had sexually abused their client in a church on at least 25 occasions.

McCaffrey is being held on federal child pornography charges.

Palatine parish ^{DH} comes to grips with ^{9/27} latest accusations

As the news began to sink in, many at the parish of St. Thomas of Villanova in Palatine struggled yesterday to reconcile their former pastor's years of service with the recent allegations of his sexual misconduct with a minor.

The Rev. ~~Walter E. Huppenbauer~~, 71, is accused of molesting an underage girl more than 40 years ago during his tenure at the Chicago parish of St. Hilary, where he served as assistant pastor from 1957 to 1964.

"My heart is broken for our people," said the Rev. Ray Yadron, senior pastor of St. Thomas, who was Huppenbauer's successor. "Ours is a beautiful community. It's wounded now and it will take some time to heal."

Huppenbauer is the third St. Thomas priest to come under fire after the archdiocese's disclosure in June of sexual misconduct by former associate pastor Daniel Buck and visiting priest Marion Sniieg.

None of the allegations against Huppenbauer, Buck or Sniieg involve parishioners at St. Thomas.

"None of these things happened here. They happened years ago, before they came to St. Thomas," said Deacon Ed Kaczmarek, a member of the parish for 18 years.

But even though the abuse did not occur at the Palatine parish, the archdiocese first received the allegations of Huppenbauer's misconduct in 1993, when he was still senior pastor of St. Thomas.

That year, the archdiocese was approached by the victim, who asked that her identity not be disclosed to either the fitness review board undertaking the investigation or to Huppenbauer, said Jim Dwyer, spokesman for the Archdiocese of Chicago.

Because of the condition of anonymity imposed by the victim, the board could not complete its investigation, Dwyer said, and Huppenbauer was not asked to leave the ministry.

But according to a letter sent to the parish by Bishop Jerome Listecki, Huppenbauer was no longer allowed to serve in a parish ministry, and after he retired from St. Thomas in 1994, he was placed under a monitoring protocol that prohibited him from being alone in the presence of minors.

He continued, however, to perform the occasional Mass at St. Thomas.

Because of an administrative oversight, Dwyer said, the archdiocese failed to inform the clergy of St. Thomas of Huppenbauer's changed status.

Kaczmarek, who knew Huppenbauer during his 11 years as pastor at St. Thomas, credits him with one of the key spiritual experiences in his life.

Huppenbauer encouraged Kaczmarek to work with a new AIDS ministry at the parish. AIDS then was still a taboo topic.

Kaczmarek was sent to the bedside of a dying patient, a gay man who had never been able to share his sexual orientation with his father.

The man asked Kaczmarek, "Does God hate me?" Kaczmarek replied, "How could he hate you? He's your father."

"You should meet my father," the man said.

With the help of others in the parish, Kaczmarek found the dying man's father. He brought him to his son's bedside.

"The two of them just burst into tears," said Kaczmarek, himself sobbing as he remembers the incident. "Then the father got into the hospital bed and held his son like a baby. He died about two weeks later. I credit Father Wally with letting me do this. If he hadn't said go ahead and do this, I might never have had the chance."

The Individual Specific Protocols (ISP) implement the primary goal of protecting minors. Additionally, the ISP protects the integrity of the Church and serves as a safeguard for individual priest or deacon. As long as the cleric is a client of the Office of Professional Responsibility, he will be subject to appropriate protocols, restrictions and monitoring under the authority of the Vicar for Priests and supervised by the Professional Responsibility Administrator (PRA); please refer to protocol number 15. The agreement of a priest or deacon to abide by these protocols is not understood to prove the truth of any allegation and is not intended to be an admission of guilt for any delict or crime, whether in Canon Law, or State and Federal Law. This agreement represents the cooperation of the cleric with his bishop as he exercises his pastoral office (e.g., Canons 369 and 392).


This ISP for Rev. Walter Huppenbauer is as follows (PRA to initial all that apply):

1. Restricted from being alone with minors (anyone under the age of 18) without the presence of another responsible adult.

9. No ministerial participation in the public celebration of the Eucharist or any other Sacrament or Sacramental without the prior, written permission of the Vicar for Priests.
10. Refrain from wearing any garb that would give the appearance of, or seem to infer, a priest/deacon who has canonical faculties and is currently assigned to some ministry (e.g., the 'clerical shirt').
11. The right of defense must not involve the public life of the Church.
12. On-site visits by PRA annually to include meeting with PRA and the cleric.
13. On-site visits by Vicar for Priests (VP) annually to include a meeting with VP and the cleric.
14. This ISP is to be reviewed annually with PRA, VP, and the cleric.
15. Because the private celebration of the Eucharist is possible, during the course of each week one of the Masses celebrated is to be for the intention of the priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago.
16. Any change or alteration to this agreement will involve consultation with the cleric, his monitor, the PRA, and the VP. The cleric, his monitor, the PRA, or the VP can initiate the discussion for change or alteration, and at the discretion of any of the parties, his legal and/or canonical counsel may be involved.

Bishops “have been designated by the Holy Spirit to take the place of the apostles as pastors of souls and, together with the Supreme Pontiff and subject to his authority, they are commissioned to perpetuate the work of Christ, the eternal Pastor.” (*Christus dominus*, n.2b) However, since the pastors of the Church can never be expected to carry the burden of pastoral ministry alone (*Lumen gentium*, n. 30), they have been given the order of priests to cooperate in shepherding and guiding God’s people. Indeed, bishops, “because of the gift of the Holy Spirit that has been given to priests at their ordination, will regard them as indispensable helpers and advisers in the ministry and in the task of teaching, sanctifying and shepherding the People of God.” (*Presbyterorum ordinis*, n. 7)

Because of this common task, “bishops are to regard their priests as brothers and friends, and are to take the greatest interest they are capable of in their welfare, both temporal and spiritual. For on their shoulders particularly falls the burden of sanctifying their priests.” (*Presbyterorum ordinis*, n. 7b)

Moreover, the *Directory on the Pastoral Ministry of Bishops* states, “In the same way as Jesus showed his love for his disciples....so also a bishop....can hardly fail to realize that he should show his greatest love and chief concern for priests....Led by a sense of duty and sincere and invincible charity he gives willing assistance in every way to help priests to esteem the loftiness of their priestly vocation, to live serenely, to spread joy to those about them and to fulfill their duties faithfully.” (n. 107a)

This same document urges bishops to do “everything possible to prevent the troubles his priests could have....To keep them safe from trouble he takes prompt and prudent measures.” (n. 112)

The Code of Canon Law has described precepts as a means by which ecclesiastical authority “directly and legitimately enjoins a specific person or persons to do or omit something, especially in order to urge the observance of law” (c. 49).

Therefore, I issue this precept, in accordance with c. 49, to urge **Reverend Walter Huppenbauer** to fulfill the obligations which were placed upon him at the time of his ordination. Because some suspicion has arisen about his fidelity to the sacred promises he made at his ordination, I urge him in particular to lead a life which is in keeping with the holiness of his vocation. Although he is not presently exercising public ministry in the Church, he ought to pursue holiness of life in the way that he lives. He is also still bound to the obligation to pray the liturgy of the hours daily, to set aside time for spiritual retreats, to engage in mental prayer, to approach the sacrament of penance frequently, to honor the Virgin Mother of God with particular

eneration as Queen of Priests, and to use any other means of sanctification which he finds helpful (c. 276).

Because of the obligation to observe perfect and perpetual continence for the sake of the kingdom of heaven, **Father Huppenbauer** is to act with due prudence toward persons who could endanger the obligation to observe continence (c. 277§1), and to observe the particulars of the attached Individual Specific Protocol (c. 277§3) which I have established in consultation with him.


He is to avoid all those things which are unbecoming the clerical state, or those things which are foreign to the clerical state (c. 285), especially those things which are set forth in the attached Individual Specific Protocol which I have established in consultation with him.

Father Huppenbauer is hereby dispensed from his obligation to wear ecclesiastical garb (c. 284), and is strongly urged not to do so until such time as the case against him can be resolved and more permanent determinations can be made. Although not removed from office, he is nonetheless urged not to exercise the rights of any ecclesiastical office, in accordance with the Individual Specific Protocol which I have established in consultation with him.


In order to ensure that these obligations are met, I have delegated **Ms. Leah McCluskey** to receive information regarding **Father Huppenbauer's** fulfillment of this precept and his Individual Specific Protocol. She is to submit a report to me no less than quarterly regarding this matter, and may report to the Professional Fitness Review Board more frequently as needed or requested.

I am establishing this precept in a spirit of fraternal charity, mindful of my responsibility to encourage my priests to remain faithful to the obligations of the clerical state. Because the attached Individual Specific Protocol has been established in dialog between **Father Huppenbauer** and the Vicar for Priests, I accept the provisions of this document, and urge **Father Huppenbauer** to fulfil them in accordance with the obedience he is to show to me as his ordinary (c. 273), and which he promised at his ordination.

Having received the recommendation of the Archdiocesan Professional Fitness Review Board that there is "reasonable cause to suspect" that **Reverend Walter Huppenbauer** engaged in sexual misconduct with a minor, I have concluded that this constitutes information which "at least seems to be true" (c. 1717).

Therefore, in accordance with the aforementioned canon, I decree that an inquiry be done into the facts and circumstances of this accusation, as well as its imputability to **Father Huppenbauer**.

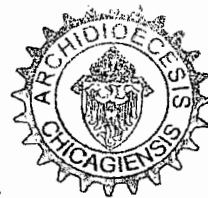
Since my other duties prevent me from conducting this investigation personally, I hereby appoint **Ms. Leah McCluskey** to act as the investigator in this matter. In carrying out these duties, Ms. McCluskey will have all of the authority of an auditor, in accordance with cc. 1428 and 1717. She is to collect any additional proofs she deems necessary in accordance with the norm of law as they relate to the present allegation. She is delegated to take testimony from the accused and from any witnesses (cc. 1530 – 1538 and 1547 – 1573), to obtain any necessary documents (cc. 1540 – 1546), to enlist the services of any experts deemed necessary (cc. 1574 – 1581), and to have access to places or things which she deems necessary for her investigation.

In conducting her investigation, Ms. McCluskey is to take care that such an investigation does nothing to harm **Father Huppenbauer's** name or to violate his right to protect his privacy. Nor may he be asked to do anything which violates his conscience or is morally unacceptable according to the Church's moral teachings.

After she has concluded her investigation, Ms. McCluskey is to make a written report to me, no later than thirty days from the date of this appointment. This report is to address the facts, circumstances, and imputability concerning the alleged offense.

Dear Walter:

I am again writing to you to give you an update as to what is happening concerning the allegations of sexual misconduct with a minor which have been made against you. I am extremely grateful to you for your patience in this matter. As you know, the Dallas Charter required me to act quickly in cases involving allegations of clerical sexual misconduct with a minor to ensure that no priest with a credible accusation was engaged in public ministry. However, because the accompanying Norms had not been approved by the Holy See, I have not been able to act as quickly as I would have liked in getting your case resolved.

With the Norms having gone into effect on March 1, 2003, along with further instructions which came from the Holy See in February, we are now in a position to begin referring our cases to the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith. Before I make such a referral, I will gather any additional information that seems necessary and review the matter once again. I will then send your advocate a copy of the letter I will be sending to the Holy See, and allow him or her the opportunity to offer an opinion as well. I anticipate this being done by the middle of July.

To that end, I have delegated Ms. Leah McCluskey to review each of the cases to see if more information needs to be gathered. I have asked her to report back to me within one month so that I can make a determination about referring the case to the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith. According to the recommendation of the Canonical Affairs Committee of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, if the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith directs me to begin a penal trial, the judges to be used will not be priests serving in the Archdiocese of Chicago. They will be chosen from a list of priests who have been trained to hear cases of clerical sexual misconduct.

In referring your case to the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, I will also consult with the Promoter of Justice and issue a decree which formalizes those things which I asked you to do for the good of the Church and under your promise of obedience to me. The imposition of this decree is required by Norm 6 of the Essential Norms established by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.



I have also designated Ms. McCluskey as the person to ensure that the "monitoring protocol" which you signed is being followed. She will report to me and to the Professional Fitness Review Board concerning your compliance with this protocol. I have asked that she perform this function personally, with the Vicar for Priests doing so in her absence. This will ensure the confidentiality and professionalism of this monitoring.

The protocols which you sign from time to time are not to be considered as penalties imposed on you. Instead, they are ways in which I exercise my responsibility to ensure that you fulfill the obligations which you received when you were ordained. I am establishing these protocols as individual precepts, which canon 49 describes as "a decree which directly and legitimately enjoins [you] to do or omit something, especially in order to urge the observance of law." You will receive a copy of my precept at the same time you receive a copy of your protocol.

I hope this clarifies the process somewhat for you. I am grateful that we can finally begin a process for the resolution of your case. I know this has been a very difficult period of time for you in your priesthood. You have always been in my prayers during this time. I ask that you continue to keep me in yours.

Dear Cardinal George,

As the Auditor whom you appointed in accord with Canon 1717 to conduct a Preliminary Investigation into the allegations of sexual abuse of minors that have been made against the Rev. Walter E. Huppenbauer, a priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago, I would like to inform you that the investigation has been completed.

As required by Canon 1718, a sufficient amount of material is now present for you to make a determination. I have examined the files of the investigations of the allegations of sexual misconduct with minors by Fr. Huppenbauer, and I have found them to be complete.

There is at least one allegation that was submitted to the Archdiocesan Professional Responsibility Review Board in which the Board recommended to you that there is reasonable cause to suspect that the alleged misconduct did occur. Given the material gathered as the Board's instruction of the case, it is now necessary for you to determine if the elements meet the required standard of proof. The Board reported their finding to you after having discussed the evidence and the arguments in two formal sessions. As part of the procedure followed by the Board, Fr. Huppenbauer was read the allegations made against him and provided a response. With reference to his involvement in the instruction of the case, Fr. Huppenbauer had the advice of legal counsel.

I now submit this matter to your Eminence for a determination. It is my recommendation that the allegation of sexual misconduct with a minor against the Rev. Walter E. Huppenbauer has the semblance of truth (*notitiam saltem verisimilem*) as required by Canon 1717 and Article 13 of the Procedural Norms *de gravioribus delictis*, and consequently the case should be sent to the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith.


There is at least one allegation of sexual misconduct against Fr. Huppenbauer. The Professional Responsibility Review Board has been presented all allegations against Fr. Huppenbauer, and has reported to you the finding that the allegations provide reasonable cause to suspect that the alleged incidents of misconduct did occur. It is my recommendation that the aforementioned allegations have the semblance of truth

Dear Walter:

I am writing to let you know that I have received the report from Ms. Leah McCluskey regarding the inquiry she conducted concerning the allegations of sexual misconduct that were made against you.

Taking into account the material already presented to the review board, she has looked into the matter further. I have concluded from her report that there is enough evidence to indicate that I need to refer your case to the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith and ask for their permission to conduct a trial to determine whether you committed the delict of sexual abuse of a minor; and, if so, what penalty ought to be imposed on you.

I will make this referral by the end of the month. It is impossible to say when the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith will respond to my request.

If I am given permission to conduct a trial in the Archdiocese, I will ask the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops to provide me with three judges. I will also present all the material in the case to the Promoter of Justice, and ask that he draw up a formal petition. A trial will then be conducted according to the norm of law. You will be informed throughout the proceedings of how you might exercise your rights. If you have not appointed an advocate, one will be appointed for you.

Since you are already observing the restrictions on your ministry as I requested, I do not see any need to impose any formal penal restrictions on you, as called for by canon 1722. In a previous letter to you, I indicated that I would issue this decree once I sent the case to the Holy See. In light of your cooperation, however, I have decided it is not necessary to take any further steps at this time.


As you know, the Dallas Charter and subsequent Norms state that if even a single act of sexual misconduct with a minor is proven, you must be removed permanently from ministry. Even if the offense does not warrant dismissal from the clerical state, the laws approved by the Holy See for the United States would not allow me to assign you to any public ministry, to celebrate the sacraments publicly, or to present yourself in public as a priest. Instead, you would be expected to lead a life of prayer and penance under my direction.

On the other hand, if the allegations against you are not proven, I will do everything I can to restore your reputation. I realize how difficult this might be, given the publicity that has already been given to this matter. Since I also realize you may have some feelings about this matter, I will consult with you before anything is done in this regard.

I am again appreciative of the cooperation you have given me in this matter. I will keep you in my prayers, and ask that you keep me in yours.





PRA, Fr. Thomas Tivy, Vicar for Priests, and Fr. Daniel Smilanic, Promoter of Justice met with Fr. Walter Huppenbauer on July 25, 2003 to discuss the new monitoring protocols.

PRA confirmed with Fr. Huppenbauer that he did receive a packet of information regarding monitoring via mail from the Office of Professional Responsibility. PRA reviewed with Fr. Huppenbauer his Individual Specific Monitoring Protocol as well as the Daily Log and Travel/Vacation Agreement forms. PRA apologized to Fr. Huppenbauer for neglecting to provide him with a copy of the policies promulgated on July 15, 2003. Fr. Huppenbauer was assured that a copy of the new policies would be sent to him. Fr. Huppenbauer stated that he does not have a canonical advocate. However, Fr. Tivy and Fr. Smilanic voiced their suggestions that he consider obtaining the services of a canonical advocate.

In regards to the Travel/Vacation Agreement form, Fr. Huppenbauer asked if Fr. Daniel Mark Holihan could act as his monitor for out of town/overnight trips. Due to the fact that Fr. Holihan is also requested to follow a monitoring protocol, PRA informed Fr. Huppenbauer that Fr. Holihan could not act as a monitor for him.

PRA answered specific questions that Fr. Huppenbauer had regarding the information needed to adequately complete the Daily Log forms.

Fr. Huppenbauer was not asked to sign the Individual Specific Protocol at the meeting held on July 25, 2003. The Individual Specific Protocols (ISP) implement the primary goal of protecting minors. Additionally, the ISP protects the integrity of the Church and serves as a safeguard for individual priest or deacon. As long as the cleric is a client of the Office of Professional Responsibility, he will be subject to appropriate protocols, restrictions and monitoring under the authority of the Vicar for Priests and supervised by the Professional Responsibility Administrator (PRA); please refer to protocol number 15. The agreement of a priest or deacon to abide by these protocols is not understood to prove the truth of any allegation and is not intended to be an admission of guilt for any delict or crime, whether in Canon Law, or State and Federal Law. This agreement represents the cooperation of the cleric with his bishop as he exercises his pastoral office (e.g., Canons 369 and 392).


This ISP for Rev. Walter Huppenbauer is as follows (PRA to initial all that apply):


1. Restricted from being alone with minors (anyone under the age of 18) without the presence of another responsible adult.

4. The "Clergy Daily Log" to be completed on a daily basis and co-signed by the monitor. The log is a tool that is used for the protection of minors, the priest/deacon, the monitor and the Archdiocese. Although it lists all time periods, it is intended to provide an accurate record of the day rather than a detailed clock. 8. N/A Attendance at a recommended support group _____ (please indicate specific support group). Recommended frequency of _____ times per week/month (please circle one). Attendance at a recommended support group is to be reflected on "Clergy Daily Log" forms.
9. No ministerial participation in the public celebration of the Eucharist or any other Sacrament or Sacramental without the prior, written permission of the Vicar for Priests.
10. Refrain from wearing any garb that would give the appearance of, or seem to infer, a priest/deacon who has canonical faculties and is currently assigned to some ministry (e.g., the 'clerical shirt').
11. The right of defense must not involve the public life of the Church.
12. On-site visits by PRA annually to include meeting with PRA and the cleric.
13. On-site visits by Vicar for Priests (VP) annually to include a meeting with VP and the cleric.
14. This ISP is to be reviewed annually with PRA, VP, and the cleric.
15. Because the private celebration of the Eucharist is possible, during the course of each week one of the Masses celebrated is to be for the intention of the priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago.
16. Any change or alteration to this agreement will involve consultation with the cleric, his monitor, the PRA, and the VP. The cleric, his monitor, the PRA, or the VP can initiate the discussion for change or alteration, and at the discretion of any of the parties, his legal and/or canonical counsel may be involved.

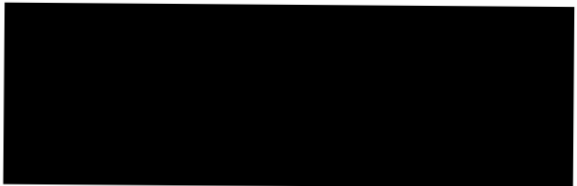





Walter Huppenbauer. According to Victim MT's statement, he was first abused by Huppenbauer when he was 11 years old and was abused by Huppenbauer on four occasions between 1971-1973. Victim MT described the abuse as "oral," and further stated that his first sexual experience was with Huppenbauer.

Fr. Huppenbauer has been aware of [REDACTED] allegation of sexual misconduct
against him for 18 weeks. PRA provided Fr. Huppenbauer with a copy of [REDACTED]
allegation. He was also informed that copies of the allegation would be forwarded to his
canonical advocate and civil attorney.

Prior to PRA reading the allegation, Fr. Huppenbauer indicated that he did not remember [REDACTED]
name, but did recall a situation at St. Thomas of Villanova when a boy [REDACTED]
[REDACTED]

PRA then proceeded by reading [REDACTED] allegation to Fr. Huppenbauer in its entirety. It was agreed that Fr. Huppenbauer would interrupt PRA at any time while the allegation was being read if something was not clear or if he had a comment to make.

It is to be noted that Fr. Huppenbauer's additions/corrections to the draft report of his response are reflected in bold italics throughout the body of this final report.

As PRA read [REDACTED] allegation, Fr. Huppenbauer did interrupt at appropriate times to address certain statements. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Fr. Huppenbauer also stated that he completely denies the allegation of oral sex taking place. He continued by stating that he denies any sexual abuse as alleged by [REDACTED]. Fr. Huppenbauer described the allegation as being a bunch of baloney. He questioned if [REDACTED] has identified the correct priest as his alleged abuser.

When PRA continued to read from page three of the allegation, Fr. Huppenbauer shared his opinion that [REDACTED] is a continued pattern of difficulties that began prior to his entrance to St. Thomas of Villanova [prior to knowing Fr. Huppenbauer]. In response to [REDACTED] statement of, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Fr. Huppenbauer stated that he never said anything of the sort to [REDACTED]

On page four of the allegation, [REDACTED] shares his acknowledgement of Fr. Huppenbauer being assigned to [REDACTED]. Fr. Huppenbauer stated that he was assigned to work with Little Sisters of the Poor.

She is to collect any additional proofs she deems necessary in accordance with the norm of law as they relate to the present allegation. She is delegated to take testimony from the accused and from any witnesses (cc. 1530 – 1538 and 1547 – 1573), to obtain any necessary documents (cc. 1540 – 1546), to enlist the services of any experts deemed necessary (cc. 1574 – 1581), and to have access to places or things which she deems necessary for her investigation.

In conducting her investigation, Ms. McCluskey is to take care that such an investigation does nothing to harm Father Huppenbauer's name or to violate his right to protect his privacy.

After she has concluded her investigation, Ms. McCluskey is to make a written and oral report to the Professional Responsibility Review Board, no later than one hundred eighty days from the date of this appointment. 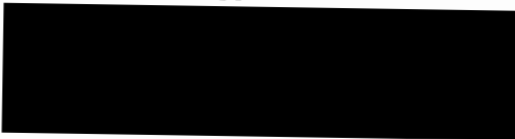

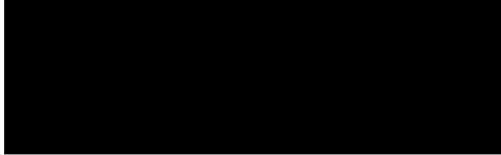

Huppenbauer that the December 2004 letter signed by [REDACTED] was the result of PRA's request that he provide any additional information regarding the alleged incidents of abuse.

PRA then read to Fr. Huppenbauer [REDACTED] letter in its entirety.

Fr. Huppenbauer shared that [REDACTED] allegation against him has been devastating and is completely untrue. He expressed his difficulty with putting his resulting feelings into words. Fr. Huppenbauer also openly questioned why [REDACTED] would make such an allegation against him.

PRA then asked Fr. Huppenbauer if he had any involvement with CCD classes at St. Thomas of Villanova. Fr. Huppenbauer stated that he had two separate assignments at St. Thomas of Villanova, first as an associate and then as pastor. According to Archdiocesan Archives, Fr. Huppenbauer was assigned to St. Thomas of Villanova from September 1, 1971 through June 1977 and then from August 1, 1989 through June 5, 1994 as an associate and then pastor, respectively.

As per Fr. Huppenbauer, when he was an associate the extent of his involvement with CCD classes was possibly greeting students as they walked into their classes. He was also involved with teen masses as an associate. Fr. Huppenbauer stated that he never met with any students one on one to teach the Bible. In regards to his involvement with teens, he would be with a group of teens either at their [teen] meetings or at mass.

PRA and Fr. Grace thanked Fr. Huppenbauer for his response to [REDACTED] allegation. Both PRA and Fr. Grace thanked Fr. Huppenbauer for his time and asked that he call either with any questions or concerns.

PRA informed Fr. Huppenbauer that a draft report of his response to [REDACTED] allegation would be mailed to him for his review. Fr. Huppenbauer was asked to make any corrections to the draft report prior to returning it to PRA.

Penal Decree and Precept resolving the matter against Reverend Walter Huppenbauer (CDF P.N. 288/03-19662)

According to the decree *Christus dominus* of the Second Vatican Council, bishops “have been designated by the Holy Spirit to take the place of the apostles as pastors of souls and, together with the Supreme Pontiff and subject to his authority, they are commissioned to perpetuate the work of Christ, the eternal Pastor.” (*Christus dominus*, n. 2). Diocesan bishops have been entrusted with the pastoral care of a portion of the People of God, and designated their proper, ordinary, and immediate pastor. (CD, n. 11). The Council further teaches, “In exercising his office of father and pastor, the bishop should be with his people as one who serves, as a good shepherd who knows his sheep and whose sheep know him, as a true father who excels in his love and solicitude for all....” (CD, n. 16).

This love and solicitude expresses itself in providing for the welfare of the faithful according to their circumstances (CD, n. 16), and also in being “compassionate and helpful to those priests who are in any kind of danger or who have failed in some respect.” (CD, n. 16)

It is for this reason that my predecessor, Joseph Cardinal Bernardin, expressed such solicitude for the faithful of the Archdiocese of Chicago in establishing policies with regard to sexual misconduct of priests. I have continued that tradition of solicitude by confirming and revising these policies from time to time.

The nature of the priesthood itself requires that special attention be given to matters involving priestly misconduct. Recognizing the high dignity of the priesthood, which was established by the Lord Jesus to be joined in a special way with the episcopal ministry, and hence shares in the authority by which Christ himself builds up and sanctifies and rules his Body, it is all the more necessary to exercise particular vigilance over the behavior of priests and to hold them to a greater level of accountability. The sacred task which has been given to priests demands a conduct commensurate with that task.

At their ordination, priests take on a number of obligations. They are bound by a special obligation to show reverence and obedience to the Holy Father and to their own ordinary (c. 273), and are to fulfill faithfully any function which their ordinary entrusts to them (c. 274§2). They are to be united among themselves, but at the same time promote the proper mission of the laity (c. 275). They are to pursue holiness of life through the fulfillment of their pastoral duties, through the nourishment of the spiritual life by word and sacrament, and through leading a life of prayer (c. 276). They are to continue their studies after ordination (c. 279) and have the right to

associate with other clerics to pursue purposes in keeping with the clerical state (c. 278). They are to foster simplicity of life and are to have a special concern for the poor (c. 282).

Moreover, priests are to avoid all those things which could endanger their vocation or give rise to scandal among the people. First and foremost, they are bound to a life of perfect and perpetual continence for the sake of the kingdom (c. 277), which expresses itself in a life of celibacy. But they are also to act with due prudence in their associations with others (c. 277§2), avoiding those things unbecoming the clerical state (c. 285 §§1-2).

The Catholic Bishops of the United States, in addressing the issue of clerical sexual abuse of minors, established at their annual general meeting held in Dallas in June, 2002 a *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*, commonly referred to as the *Charter*. This was a common commitment by the bishops of the United States to act in a concerted way with regard to the issue of clerical sexual abuse of minors.

At that same meeting the bishops also passed and forwarded to the Holy See for its *recognitio* a set of *Essential Norms for Diocesan/Eparchial Policies Dealing with Allegations of Sexual Abuse of Minors by Priests or Deacons*, commonly referred to as the *Essential Norms*. These *Norms* established, among other things, that “When even a single act of sexual abuse by a priest or deacon is admitted or is established after an appropriate process in accord with canon law, the offending priest or deacon will be removed permanently from ecclesiastical ministry, not excluding dismissal from the clerical state, if the case so warrants.” Diocesan bishops and eparchs were also reminded that they have “the executive power of governance, through an administrative act, to remove an offending cleric from office, to remove or restrict his faculties, and to limit his exercise of priestly ministry.” (*Norm 9*)

In the case of clerical sexual abuse of a minor, this could be by means of a penal decree or a penal precept, since it involves a delict (c. 1395§2).

The universal law of the Church, by virtue of the *motu proprio Sacramentorum sanctitatis tutela*, has given the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith exclusive competence over matters involving clerical sexual misconduct with minors. In removing the bishop’s discretionary authority given by c. 1718, the universal law of the Church requires that, after the preliminary investigation has been conducted in accord with c. 1717, the bishop is to forward to the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith all cases involving clerical sexual misconduct with a minor, and request further instruction from that Congregation as to how to proceed.

The case of Reverend Walter Huppenbauer was referred to the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith on 31 July, 2003. Having reviewed the material submitted by the Archdiocese of Chicago, in a letter of 14 July, 2004 (P.N. 288/03-19662), Cardinal Ratzinger, then Cardinal Prefect of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith and now His Holiness Pope Benedict XVI, granted me permission to impose a penal precept on Father Huppenbauer. However, His Eminence informed me that the Congregation shares my desire “that Father Huppenbauer continue to live at the nursing home where he currently resides.” Moreover, Cardinal Ratzinger expressed the opinion that “while the cleric remains at the nursing home, he could exercise some form of limited ministry, for example, the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the administration of the Sacraments, especially the Anointing of the Sick in danger of death, etc.”

In accordance with the directives of the Congregation of the Doctrine of the Faith, and considering this matter in light of the common good (c. 223); seeking ways to repair scandal and restore justice (c. 1341); reviewing again the accusations made against Father Huppenbauer; and having prayed for Wisdom and Understanding to decide this matter, I hereby make the following provisions with regard to Reverend Walter Huppenbauer:

I am morally certain of the following facts:

As a priest at St. Hilary Parish, Reverend Walter Huppenbauer is guilty of the delict described in c. 1395§2 of the 1983 Code of Canon Law (c. 2359§2 of the 1917 Code).

Since Father Huppenbauer is a retired priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago, there is no question about his having a pastoral assignment. His status as a retired priest will thus continue, with his pension also continuing. He is directed to continue to live at [REDACTED] administered by [REDACTED]. Father Huppenbauer's faculties as a priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago are restricted to ministering to those who are residents of [REDACTED] and to the [REDACTED] who minister or live there. He is not to exercise ministry for the families of any of the residents or for any of the staff of the facility, their family or friends, or for any visitors who may come to the facility. When his services are needed and requested, he must always keep in mind the possibility of scandal to the faithful and respond accordingly.

I also dispense Father Huppenbauer from the obligation to wear ecclesiastical garb (c. 284), and strongly urge that he never wear such attire outside [REDACTED]. Furthermore, he is never to represent himself as a priest to those unknown to him nor act as an agent of the Archdiocese of Chicago at any time.

I also encourage Father Huppenbauer to observe the prescriptions of canons 273 to 289 concerning the obligations and rights of clerics. That is, he is to show reverence and obedience to the Supreme Pontiff and to his ordinary (c. 273); is to unite himself with the presbyterate of Chicago and promote the mission of the laity (c. 275); to pursue holiness of life, especially by availing himself of daily prayer, monthly spiritual direction and an annual retreat, if he is physically able to do so (c. 276); to pursue opportunities for continuing education (c. 279); to foster simplicity of life (c. 282); and to foster peace and harmony based on justice (c. 287).

I further remind Father Huppenbauer that he must refrain completely from all things which are unbecoming or foreign to the clerical state (c. 285) and which could bring further scandal upon the Church.

Most especially, because of his actions in the past, I remind Father Huppenbauer of his obligation to observe perfect and perpetual chastity for the sake of the kingdom and to behave with due prudence toward persons who could endanger this obligation (c. 277).


In order that he observe this precept more closely, I also direct a program be developed in conjunction with the Vicar for Priests [REDACTED]

therapy which will allow his behavior to be monitored. This program can be modified from time to time as circumstances dictate.

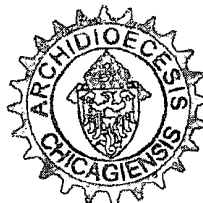
In issuing this precept, I am also grateful to Father Huppenbauer for his patience during this very difficult time. I hope that by the provisions of this decree Father Huppenbauer may renew and deepen his commitment to the priestly life in prayer and penance. I ask that he remember especially in his prayers all those who have suffered from sexual abuse, and ask that the healing power of God be with them and make them whole.

These provisions will remain in effect for a period of five years, at which time they will be reviewed to see if they ought to be renewed or altered in any way.

MEMORANDUM

Date: September 20, 2005

Cardinal Francis George, O.M.I., Rev. Daniel A. Smilanic Promoter of Justice, Revs. Edward Grace and Vincent Costello Vicars for Priests, and PRA traveled to [REDACTED] to meet with Rev. Walter Huppenbauer on July 27, 2005. The meeting had been scheduled at the request of Cardinal George so that he could speak with Fr. Huppenbauer about the “Penal Decree and Precept resolving the matter against Reverend Walter Huppenbauer (DCF P.N. 288/03 – 19662).”

Cardinal George began the meeting with a prayer and then provided Fr. Huppenbauer with a copy of the aforementioned decree [see file].

Cardinal George informed Fr. Huppenbauer that he has completed his review of the case of sexual misconduct with minors that has been pending against him. Cardinal George read over and summarized the decree for Fr. Huppenbauer. As per Cardinal George, the final decision concerning this matter from the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith [CDF] was to administer a punishment of a penal precept. Cardinal George informed Fr. Huppenbauer that this matter was referred to the CDF on July 31, 2003 and that the response was received from the CDF on July 14, 2004.

Summarizing the decree, Cardinal George informed Fr. Huppenbauer that he would be able to engage in limited ministry only to residents of the nursing home and only to the [REDACTED]. The Cardinal also informed Fr. Huppenbauer that he could hear confessions of the residents and staff of [REDACTED]. Fr. Huppenbauer was then informed that he could celebrate private mass for himself in his room. Fr. Smilanic and PRA informed Fr. Huppenbauer that his current monitoring protocols would continue and that the monitoring will be reviewed in the near future.

Cardinal George informed Fr. Huppenbauer that this canonical process is now finished and that the decree presented [to Fr. Huppenbauer] is effective for a period of five years, at which time will be reviewed by the ordinary.

Fr. Smilanic informed Fr. Huppenbauer that a copy of the aforementioned decree was sent to his canonical advocate, Rev. Michael P. Joyce, CM. It was agreed that Fr. Huppenbauer would contact PRA if he would like a copy of the decree sent to his civil attorney, Mr. Patrick Reardon.

Cardinal George then asked Fr. Huppenbauer if he had any additional questions or concerns. Fr. Huppenbauer mentioned his upcoming 50th Anniversary with his class, as he has been ordained for 48 years. Cardinal George informed Fr. Huppenbauer that he [Fr. Huppenbauer] may not concelebrate at the 50th Anniversary Mass, but that he may attend the celebration with his class.

Fr. Huppenbauer then expressed his disappointment to Cardinal George that he [Fr. Huppenbauer] will not be able to have a public funeral mass. He also expressed his disappointment that he was not told that his address was changed to the Vicar for Priests office and that he was not informed that his picture was taken out of the pictorial directory of priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago. Cardinal George acknowledged Fr. Huppenbauer's concerns and apologized for the lack of such information being communicated to him.

Cardinal George addressed Fr. Huppenbauer's concerns with his [Fr. Huppenbauer's] inevitable funeral. The Cardinal asked Fr. Huppenbauer to write down his wishes for his funeral and to forward them to his attention. Cardinal George informed Fr. Huppenbauer that his wishes "...may or may not happen...we will have to see at the time." Cardinal George also asked Fr. Huppenbauer to add at the end of his written wishes for his funeral that he [Fr. Huppenbauer] would allow the ordinary to carry out an appropriate funeral mass and burial.

At this point during the July 27th meeting, Fr. Huppenbauer expressed his wish to "...talk about the false allegation..." made against him. Fr. Huppenbauer was referring to the allegation of sexual misconduct made against him by [REDACTED] see file]. He stated that, "...absolutely nothing happened [in regards to the allegation made against him by [REDACTED]]." Fr. Huppenbauer also stated that he feels he is included in a "group" of priests who are being [falsely] accused of the sexual abuse of minors. He expressed that he is upset and feels helpless and again stated that, "...this [the allegation that he sexually abused [REDACTED]] did not happen."

Fr. Smilanic and PRA then spoke to Fr. Huppenbauer's concerns and talked about his right to initiate a Supplementary Review of the matter with the independent Review

Board. Cardinal George verbally urged Fr. Huppenbauer to initiate a Supplementary Review and request to meet with the Review Board in regards to this matter. Fr. Smilanic suggested that Fr. Huppenbauer discuss this matter with his advocate and then have his advocate request to review the entire file. It was then suggested that upon reviewing the file with his advocate, Fr. Huppenbauer request to address the Review Board in a Supplementary Review.

Cardinal George clarified for Fr. Huppenbauer that the end of the pending canonical process and related decree discussed at the July 27th meeting is independent of the allegation brought against him [Fr. Huppenbauer] by [REDACTED] Fr. Huppenbauer verbalized his understanding of Cardinal George's clarification.

Fr. Huppenbauer then requested information regarding the Archdiocese of Chicago's settlement with [REDACTED] Fr. Grace stated that he would obtain the information for Fr. Huppenbauer.

As you know, some time ago Father Walter Edward Huppenbauer was temporarily withdrawn from ministry following Cardinal George's acceptance of the advice of the Independent Review Board that there was reason to suspect that Father Huppenbauer engaged in sexual misconduct with a minor. According to Canon Law, this determination by the Review Board was forwarded to the Holy See for its review. This is to report to you that this process has been concluded.

Specifically, the Holy See reviewed and confirmed Cardinal George's acceptance of the advice of the Review Board and authorized Cardinal George to resolve the matter administratively. Pursuant to that instruction, Cardinal George reviewed all of the information collected, listened to the opinions of canonical advocates, and sought advice from his own canonical advisors as well as from assessors who are canon lawyers independent of the Archdiocese of Chicago.

Cardinal George has determined based upon the information presented that sexual misconduct did occur with a minor, and he has prohibited Father Huppenbauer from engaging in any public ministry, presenting himself as a priest, or acting as an agent of the Archdiocese of Chicago.

It is my hope and prayer that while this announcement is yet one more reminder of a sad reality, it may also bring a measure of finality and peace to the people of St. Thomas of Villanova Parish.

Please keep in your thoughts and prayers all those affected by the sin of abuse. They and all of you are daily in my prayer.

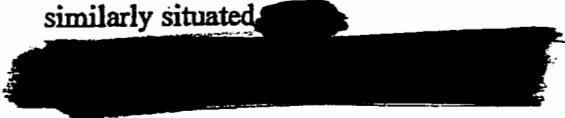

CLASS ACTION COMPLAINT

NOW COMES the Plaintiffs, individually and on behalf of all others similarly situated, by and through their attorneys, JEFF ANDERSON & ASSOCIATES and KERNS, PITROF, FROST & PEARLMAN, to obtain declaratory and injunctive relief against Defendant, states as follows:

INTRODUCTION

1. This Complaint seeks declaratory judgment and injunctive relief against the Archdiocese of Chicago. The Archdiocese of Chicago has established a policy of harboring and protecting suspected child molesting agents, thereby endangering numerous children in Illinois. The Archdiocese has information about a number of suspected child molesting agents that it has never disclosed to law enforcement or the public at large, thereby causing children such as John Doe 100 to be harmed. Further, on information and belief, the Archdiocese has a policy and

practice of document destruction. This declaratory relief and injunction action seeks to have the Archdiocese produce all documents regarding the molestation of children by its agents for court supervision, to release the names of all agents accused of molesting children to the court and to the public, and to enjoin the Archdiocese from destroying any documents regarding suspected childhood sexual abuse by its agents.

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

2. This Court has jurisdiction over this action because it seeks to redress violations of the plaintiffs' rights and to protect children in Illinois that are in imminent danger. Venue is proper because the Archdiocese resides in Cook County and the majority of the allegations herein involve occurrences in Cook County.

PARTIES

3. Plaintiff John Doe 100 is a minor. Mother Doe 100 is John Doe 100's mother and legal guardian. At all times material, Plaintiff John Doe 100 was a resident of the State of Illinois. At all times material, Mother Doe 100 was a resident of the State of Illinois.

4. The identities of all Doe Plaintiffs are made known to Defendants through separate cover letter.

5. Plaintiff [REDACTED] is a thirty five year old Chicago resident. [REDACTED] was sexually molested as a child by [REDACTED] a religious order priest who was serving at a parish within the Archdiocese at the time of the abuse.

6. At all times material, the Catholic Bishop of Chicago, a Corporation Sole (hereinafter "Archdiocese of Chicago") was and is an Illinois corporation. Defendant has approximately eight hundred fifty four Diocesan priests serving in two counties in the State of

Illinois. At all times material to the complaint, Defendant Archdiocese was conducting business in the State of Illinois.

CLASS ACTION ALLEGATIONS

7. Plaintiffs bring this action on behalf of themselves and, pursuant to 735 ILCS 5/2-801, as the representatives of the class of persons who have been molested as children by an agent of the Archdiocese of Chicago and on behalf of those children who have not yet been abused, but who are in imminent danger of abuse because the Archdiocese has not released the names and files of agents that have been accused of molesting children or accused of inappropriate sexual behavior with children to either the public or to the court.

8. The Plaintiff class is so numerous that joinder of all members is impracticable. In its own self report, the Archdiocese asserted that there were 142 cases where they had reason to suspect that an agent had sexually molested a child. These numbers only include information that was reported to the Archdiocese. The underlying data for the results was not disclosed to the public.

9. There are questions of fact or law common to the class, which predominate over questions affecting only individual members. The common questions of law or fact include, but are not limited to: whether the Archdiocese of Chicago has failed to protect children by not releasing the names of its agents who have been accused of molesting children to the public and law enforcement and whether the Archdiocese has or is destructing documents in order to cover up or conceal crimes against children by clergy serving in and/or employed by the Archdiocese.

10. The Plaintiffs will fairly and adequately protect the interests of the class. The interests of the plaintiffs are the same as those of all class members because they have all been

sexually abused by an agent of the Archdiocese of Chicago or are in danger of being molested by an agent of the Archdiocese of Chicago because the Archdiocese's information is not public. All have an interest in preventing the sexual abuse of any further children by agents of the Archdiocese of Chicago.

11. A class action is an appropriate method for the fair and efficient adjudication of the controversy alleged in this complaint. The expense and burden of individual litigation would make it difficult or impossible for individual members of the class to redress the wrongs done to them. The cost to the court system of adjudication of such individualized litigation would be substantial. Individualized litigation would also present the potential for inconsistent or contradictory judgments and would magnify the delay and expense to all parties and the court system. By contrast, the conduct of this action as a class action presents far fewer management difficulties, conserves the resources of the parties and court system, and protects the rights of each class member. In addition, the prosecution of separate actions by the individual members of the class would create a risk of inconsistent or varying adjudications with respect to individual class members which would establish incompatible standards of conduct for the defendant.

ALLEGATIONS OF FACT

12. [REDACTED] (hereinafter "[REDACTED]") was ordained a priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago in approximately 1994.

13. At all times material, [REDACTED] was employed by the Archdiocese. [REDACTED] was an ordained Roman Catholic Priest educated, trained and ordained by, and under the direct supervision, employ, agency and control of the Archdiocese. Among [REDACTED] duties in his employment was to provide pastoral care and counseling for

members of his denomination.

14. In approximately the winter of 2000, a nun at Holy Family Church in Chicago reported to the Archdiocese of Chicago that [REDACTED] asked a fourth-grade boy to pull down his pants in the sacristy at Holy Family.

15. The nun reported this numerous times to the Archdiocese.

16. On information and belief, on one occasion when the nun reported it to the Archdiocese, an official told her that "if the parents aren't pushing it, let it go."

17. After these reports, the nun made a final report to the Archdiocese, this one a written report of [REDACTED] behavior.

18. On information and belief, in 2000, the Archdiocese did not report [REDACTED] to law enforcement, did not tell any of the parishioners at any of the parishes [REDACTED] worked at in the past about the report, did not tell any of the parishioners at any of the parishes where [REDACTED] worked after these reports, and did not tell any other children or parents about the report.

19. On information and belief, after the nun reported the abuse to the Archdiocese, the Archdiocese transferred [REDACTED] to another parish, St. Agatha's in Chicago.

20. On information and belief, despite the report, the Archdiocese allowed [REDACTED] to teach at an Archdiocesan school and coach a boys basketball team.

21. In response to the clergy abuse scandal, the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops passed the Dallas Charter.

22. On information and belief the Bishops passed the Dallas Charter in 2002. The Charter was only enforced, if at all, from within. There was no meaningful external non church

oversight over its enforcement.

23. Cardinal Francis George represented to the public that the Charter was a "zero tolerance" policy that committed them to removal of priests in childhood sexual abuse cases. He also represented to the public that a priest with even one act of sexual misconduct with a child should not be allowed in public ministry in order to protect children.

24. In January of 2003, the Archdiocese released a "Ten Year Report" that purported to give information about the Archdiocese's efforts to stop childhood sexual abuse by clerics in the previous ten years.

25. On information and belief, the Ten Year Report purports to give the current status of priests that were accused of molesting a child anytime from 1993 to 2003. The report indicates that no priest accused of abuse during that time period is in any form of ministry in the Archdiocese of Chicago.

26. The Ten Year Report also states that officials of the Archdiocese have reported all allegations, including those not deemed credible, to the appropriate public authorities.

27. On information and belief, the Archdiocese did not include [REDACTED] in the Ten Year Report.

28. Also in response to the clergy abuse scandal, the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops agreed to participate in a self report survey conducted by the John Jay College.

29. As part of the John Jay survey, each Diocese submitted the number of priests that had allegations of sexual misconduct with a minor within the particular Diocese.

30. On information and belief there was no oversight over the information that was

given to the John Jay College. It was completely up to the particular Diocese to respond honestly.

31. The John Jay College defined "allegation," as all recorded notifications of clerical sexual misconduct with minors, whether or not they resulted in any investigation or whether there was reasonable cause to suspect abuse had occurred.

32. In 2004, the Archdiocese reported that it had reason to believe that 55 priests had sexual misconduct with a minor.

33. In 2004, Cardinal George and the Archdiocese represented to the public that there were no priests that were accused of childhood sexual abuse that were in public ministry in the Archdiocese of Chicago.

34. On information and belief, the Archdiocese did not include [REDACTED] in the 2004 John Jay numbers.

35. On information and belief in August of 2005, the Archdiocese learned that law enforcement was investigating [REDACTED] for childhood sexual abuse.

36. On information and belief, in August of 2005, the Archdiocese did not inform the law enforcement that a nun had reported that [REDACTED] had acted in a sexually inappropriate manner with a child in 2000.

37. On information and belief, just as it did in 2000, the Archdiocese did not report or warn any of the parishioners, the public, or the parents at St. Agatha parish that law enforcement was investigating [REDACTED] for childhood sexual abuse.

38. On information and belief, the Archdiocese elevated [REDACTED] to a position of authority in the Archdiocese on September 1, 2005. It appointed him as Dean of a Deanery of

the Archdiocese. This is an honored, respected, and supervisory position within the Archdiocese. This meant that [REDACTED] was still at St. Agathas, but also had some supervisory authority over roughly 20 parishes in the Archdiocese.

39. The Archdiocese allowed [REDACTED] to remain at St. Agathas and in the position of Dean until at least January of 2006, more four months after the Archdiocese received at least its second report of sexual misconduct against a minor by [REDACTED].

40. In January of 2006, Chicago law enforcement arrested [REDACTED] and charged him with sexually molesting two boys on multiple occasions.

41. On information and belief, the nun who reported the abuse to the Archdiocese in 2000 was contacted by the Archdiocese the day before [REDACTED] was arrested. The Archdiocese indicated to the nun that it did not have the nun's letter.

42. On information and belief, the Archdiocese also stated publicly that it has no written record of the nun's reports or the actual letter.

43. On information and belief, the Archdioceses and Dioceses across the United States, including the Archdiocese of Chicago, have been instructed to destroy documentation of sexual misconduct by priests and/or to send any of this material to the Holy See in order to claim it is immune from public discovery or disclosure.

44. On information and belief, the Archdiocese has not released the names of the 55 priests that it deemed as having reason to suspect committed sexual misconduct with children.

45. On information and belief, the Archdiocese has also not released the names of any of the other clerics, like [REDACTED], who were accused of sexual misconduct and are still in parishes, but not included in the Ten Year Report or the John Jay Survey.

46. Although the Archdiocese had not released the names of offenders, some names of Archdiocesan clerics accused of sexual misconduct have been released during the course of litigation. These names were released in 2005:

48. There are also a number of religious order priests who worked in the Archdiocese. On information and belief, the Archdiocese had control and/or supervision over these clerics while they were working in the Archdiocese. On information and belief, the Archdiocese knows about these clerics' misconduct. On information and belief, those religious order clerics that have been accused of sexual misconduct are:

49. [REDACTED] sexually molested John Doe 100 at some point between approximately 2000 and 2005, when John Doe 100 was a minor child.

50. Neither John Doe 100 nor Mother Doe 100 knew that the Archdiocese had received reports about [REDACTED] sexual abuse of children.

COUNT I
(Injunction - Release of Names)

51. Plaintiffs repeat and reallege every paragraph of this complaint as if set forth in Count I.

52. Plaintiffs bring Count I on their own behalf and on behalf of the class of similarly situated persons described in paragraph 7 of this Complaint.

53. The practices of the Archdiocese of Chicago have endangered numerous children in the past and these practices will continue to put children at risk in the future.

54. Plaintiffs and the class have the right to not be sexually molested by clerics of the Archdiocese of Chicago.

55. The Archdiocese owes a duty to warn all children and their parents that come into contact with its clerics of allegations of sexual misconduct by the clerics because these children and their parents hold clerics in an esteemed position, which gives clerics virtually unlimited access to children.

56. The Archdiocese also owes a duty to children and their parents to release all of the names of clerics against whom the Archdiocese has deemed to have credible allegations of

sexual misconduct with children to the court and to the public at large.

57. The Archdiocese also owes a duty to children and their parents to release all of the names of clerics that have been accused of sexual misconduct with children to the court and to the public at large.

58. Unless injunctive relief is granted numerous children in Illinois are at risk of being sexually molested by clerics of the Archdiocese.

59. In order to ensure that children are protected and free from sexual molestation by clerics, the plaintiffs and the members of the class are entitled to an injunction ordering that the Archdiocese do the following:

- a) Release the names of all 55 of the priests that it reported to the John Jay Survey to the court and to the public.
- b) Release the names of all other clerics, like [REDACTED], that were not included in the John Jay Survey, but against whom the Archdiocese has received allegations of sexual misconduct by the cleric with children to the court and to the public.

COUNT II
(Injunction - Documents)

60. Plaintiffs repeat and reallege every paragraph of this complaint as if set forth in Count II.

61. Plaintiffs bring Count II on their own behalf and on behalf of the class of similarly situated persons described in paragraph 7 of this Complaint.

62. On information and belief, the Archdiocese still has documents that are evidence of crimes committed by clerics against children.

63. The Archdiocese has a duty to the public at large and to law enforcement to not

destroy any documents that evidence a crime.

64. The Archdiocese has a duty to children that were abused by clerics to not destroy any documents relating to the sexual misconduct or alleged sexual misconduct of any cleric at anytime in the Archdiocese of Chicago.

65. On information and belief the Archdiocese has destroyed documents and/or concealed documents and/or failed to give documents to law enforcement relating to sexual misconduct or alleged sexual misconduct by clerics of the Archdiocese.

66. Unless injunctive relief is granted, children will be at imminent risk of being molested by clerics of the Archdiocese, law enforcement will be prevented from doing its job, and those children that have already been molested by clerics will have their rights negatively affected.

67. In order to ensure that children are protected and free from sexual molestation by clerics, the plaintiffs and the members of the class are entitled to an injunction ordering that the Archdiocese do the following:

- a) Turn over any document with any connection to any allegation of sexual misconduct by a cleric against a child to the Illinois Courts for supervision of these documents.
- b) Turn over any document with any connection to any allegation of sexual misconduct by a cleric against a child to law enforcement.
- c) Cease in the destruction or spoliation of any documents with any connection to any allegation of sexual misconduct by a cleric against a child.
- d) Cease to conceal or misplace any documents with any connection to any

allegation of sexual misconduct by a cleric against a child.

COUNT III
(Declaratory Judgment)

68. Plaintiffs repeat and reallege every paragraph of this complaint as if set forth in Count III.

69. Plaintiffs bring Count III on their own behalf and on behalf of the class of similarly situated persons described in paragraph 7 of this Complaint.

70. There is an actual controversy between the plaintiffs and the members of the plaintiff class, on the one hand, and the Archdiocese, on the other hand, concerning whether the Archdiocese is adequately protecting children through its practices of not releasing the names of those clerics that have been accused of molesting children.

71. There is also an actual controversy between the plaintiffs and the members of the plaintiff class, on the one hand, and the Archdiocese, on the other hand, concerning whether the Archdiocese is adequately protecting children through its practice of not removing a cleric that is accused of molesting a child from any position where the cleric has any contact with children.

72. Finally, there is an actual controversy between the plaintiffs and the members of the plaintiff class, on the one hand, and the Archdiocese, on the other hand, concerning whether the Archdiocese is adequately protecting children through its practices of destroying and/or concealing documents evidencing allegations of sexual misconduct by clerics.

73. The plaintiffs and members of the plaintiff class are entitled to a declaration that the Archdiocesan practices of not releasing the names of clerics accused of sexual misconduct with minors, not removing clerics that are accused of sexual misconduct with children from positions where they have access to children, and by destroying and/or concealing documents, is

not adequate to protect children.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs respectfully request that this Court grant the relief requested within this complaint or any other relief the Court deems just in order to protect children.

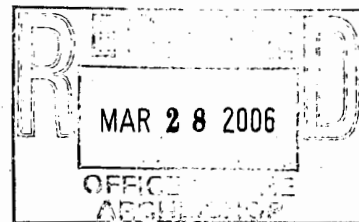

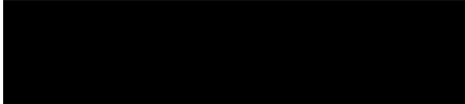

PRA spoke via phone today with Mother [REDACTED], who is currently serving as an on site “monitor” for Rev. Walter Huppenbauer at his residence, [REDACTED]. Sr. [REDACTED] had left PRA a voice mail message this morning to follow up with the e-mail she had also sent [see attached].

Sr. [REDACTED] expressed her concern to PRA with the information she had received last night regarding the IDPH Office of Health Care Regulation and the on site visits that will be made to all nursing home facilities between today and June 30, 2006. As per Sr. [REDACTED] a “Compliance Specialist regarding conformity with the Resident Sex Offender Regulation” will visit all facilities.

Sr. [REDACTED] then spoke of Fr. Huppenbauer and her concerns with [REDACTED] being found out of compliance with the aforementioned state regulation. PRA informed Sr. [REDACTED] that Fr. Huppenbauer has never been convicted of the sexual abuse of a minor by a civil court and is therefore, not a registered sex offender. Sr. [REDACTED] was informed that the statute of limitations has run in the matter concerning the alleged sexual abuse of a minor by Fr. Huppenbauer. PRA then clarified for Sr. [REDACTED] that the allegation against Fr. Huppenbauer has been substantiated in the eyes of the church and canon law, not by civil law.

Sr. [REDACTED] expressed her relief and appreciation for the information and clarification provided regarding Fr. Huppenbauer. It was agreed that Sr. [REDACTED] would contact PRA when/if other questions or concerns regarding the aforementioned state regulation and Fr. Huppenbauer’s residence at [REDACTED].

After a quickly-arranged conference call with the IDPH Office of Health Care Regulation and the provider associations, [REDACTED] has learned that all licensed facilities in the state can expect a visit between tomorrow, April 18, 2006 and the end of June, from a "Compliance Specialist" under contract with the state of Illinois regarding conformity with the Resident Sex Offender Regulation. These people will not be surveyors, but some could be retired surveyors. IDPH has been told to train these Specialists, but they did not have much say in the timing of this process. They pushed hard for the ability to give the provider associations even this much notice. They are trying to get permission to share the actual form with us. If that happens I will forward that to all of you, but we felt it was critical to get this information out as soon as possible since you may get a visit as early as tomorrow.

These Specialists (according to IDPH):

- § will be gathering information;
- § will not be issuing citations;
- § can take no regulatory action;
- § will be asking 5 questions that should take approximately one-half hour (1 side of one piece of paper).
- § there should be no regulatory fall-out from this for the facility.

The questions are (paraphrased from a conference call):

- 1) Do any identified sex offenders reside in this facility? If No, then proceed to question #4. If yes, then they will ask a question if they are registered offenders and you will be asked for their names.
- 2) Do you notify guests and visitors - how do you notify them? The Specialist will ask for a copy of the sign or other notice (since the IDPH signs will not be ready for 4-5 more weeks).
- 3) Do you provide written notification to residents and guardians of a resident sex offender?
- 4) Have you checked with the state police or the Department of Corrections registered sex offender websites?
- 5) Have you conducted background checks on new admissions and/or current residents? (Background checks on current residents do not have to be initiated until May 31, 2006).

These questions are meant to be yes or no answers, but clarifying information can be provided. These will not be scheduled during your Annual survey, but they may come during a complaint or other survey. You will get no feedback from Central Office after the visit.

If you have questions or complaints, please contact [REDACTED] and you can always call on [REDACTED] or myself if these visits do not meet the criteria as stated above. More information will be forthcoming as we get it.

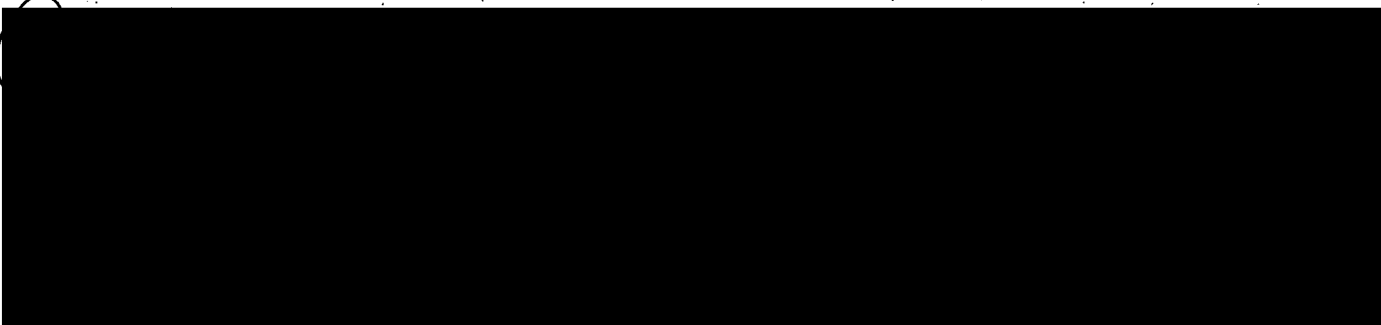

I thank you for the opportunity to meet with you and to address my denial of the accusations raised against me by Mr. [REDACTED]. As I prepared for this meeting, I had several questions. I found in reviewing your own record dated October 16, 2004 that you had similar questions. There is significant information about [REDACTED] that is not available to you or me. I originally intended to ask for that information through you so that I could mount a proper defense. However since you already requested that information and have not received it, I find it useless to make the request.

[REDACTED] presents behavioral problems that are often associated with victims of childhood sexual abuse. He may in fact be such a victim. However, I never abused him. His accusation against me may simply be projection on me of some other abuser, something he imagined, or something he concocted.

The comments he attributes to me sound more like snippets he may have heard from the homilies I gave during that time period.

I ask you to recall the number of students who were enrolled in parochial schools during that time. If [REDACTED] wanted to avoid me, he had sufficient opportunities to get "lost in the crowd." He claims that I was in charge of the CCD program. I was not. Another priest headed the CCD program and even had his own desk in the Religious Education Office.

[REDACTED]

[REDACTED] presents himself as a prepubescent boy in the fifth grade in both his allegation and his deposition.

[REDACTED] presents several inconsistencies in his statement. [REDACTED]

I believe that if you question [REDACTED] further about where the alleged abuse took place, you will find further and more substantial inconsistencies.

I fervently request that you ask [REDACTED] specific information about where the alleged abuse took place. These questions should ask for a description of the building, the room where he claims the abuse occurred, and what presented the opportunity. I also ask that you question him about where the wine came from. His answers about the physical surroundings, I am confident, will show that the abuse could not have taken place without others knowing about it.

[REDACTED] allegation is inconsistent with the other allegation against me. The behavior of child abusers usually follows a pattern. [REDACTED] allegation does not follow the pattern of the previous allegation that you found credible. Furthermore, the one possible witness he cites, [REDACTED] is deceased. There is no one to substantiate [REDACTED] claim.

Furthermore, [REDACTED] is represented by [REDACTED] an associate [REDACTED] prides himself on instigating charges of clerical sexual abuse. There is evidence in an email dated 11/18/04 that Mr. [REDACTED] was searching to build a case without evidence. The email to the Office of Professional Responsibility reads:

I believe that you will find it difficult to find [REDACTED] allegation credible with the above contradictions and inconsistencies. In other words, it is more likely that the alleged sexual abuse of [REDACTED] by Walter Huppenbauer did not occur.

I ask you to have the courage not to cave into false insinuations that collaborators with Mr. [REDACTED] promote. Please stand with the truth and admit that the allegations of [REDACTED] against me have been examined carefully and appear to be unfounded.

PRA received voice mail messages from Rev. Walter Huppenbauer on August 16, 17, and 18, 2006 regarding the letter that he had received on August 15, 2006. Fr. Huppenbauer requested a return call at 

PRA returned Fr. Huppenbauer's phone calls on August 18th. Fr. Huppenbauer was calling in regards to the June 17, 2006 Supplementary Review determination and decision of this matter made by the Review Board and Cardinal George, respectively. At his request, PRA did explain to Fr. Huppenbauer that based upon the information that he and his civil attorney provided, the Board determined that there was not sufficient additional information to reopen this matter for a Supplementary Review. PRA also clarified for Fr. Huppenbauer that the Cardinal agreed with the Board's determination. Fr. Huppenbauer responded by remarking that the Board and the Cardinal were choosing to believe   "lies" over his [Fr. Huppenbauer's] truths. He also noted that he has now lost "...more faith for the church..." than he had already lost. PRA did not respond to Fr. Huppenbauer's statements.

Fr. Huppenbauer thanked PRA for the return phone call.

After ending the phone call on August 18th, Fr. Huppenbauer called again after less than five minutes had elapsed and asked for a return phone call. When PRA returned the phone call, Fr. Huppenbauer asked if there was anywhere else that he could "appeal to." PRA suggested that he either contact Rev. Daniel Smilanic, Promoter of Justice and the Cardinal's Delegate to the Review Board or to his own canonical advocate to ask about an appeal to Rome. When asked, Fr. PRA received a phone call from Mother [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] on December 12, 2006. Mother [REDACTED] requested a return call.

PRA reached Mother [REDACTED] via phone on December 12th. Mother [REDACTED] informed PRA that she did not feel comfortable signing the Daily Log sheets for Rev. Walter Huppenbauer, who resides at [REDACTED]. As per Mother [REDACTED], she does not know if what Fr. Huppenbauer writes on his Daily Logs is the truth and as a result, cannot sign the forms in good conscience.

PRA expressed understanding and appreciation for Mother [REDACTED]'s phone call. Mother [REDACTED] was informed that her feelings would be shared with both of the Vicars for Priests, Rev. Vincent Costello and Rev. Edward Grace. At the end of the December 12th phone call, it was understood that Mother [REDACTED] would not sign Fr. Huppenbauer's Daily Log forms and that she would inform him that she would not sign them as per her conversation with PRA.

PRA informed Mother [REDACTED] that future handlings of the Daily Log forms would need to be addressed by the appropriate Archdiocesan offices and that it absolutely was not her responsibility to do so. 

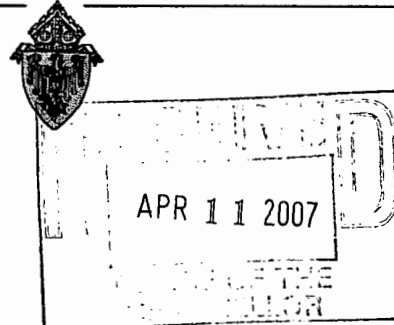

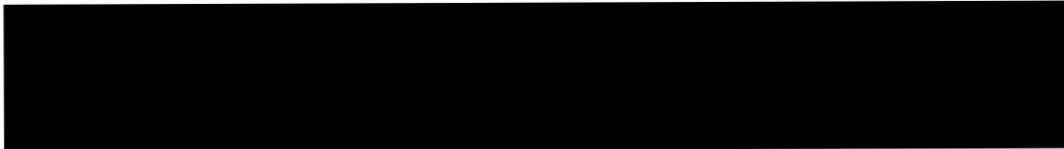
On April 9, 2007, Vicar for Priests Rev. Edward Grace and I traveled to the [REDACTED] to meet with Mother [REDACTED] concerning Rev. Walter Huppenbauer and his 2007 Individual Specific Protocols [ISP]. Mother [REDACTED] has agreed to act as Fr. Huppenbauer's on-site supervisor, however has been clear that she does not feel comfortable signing Fr. Huppenbauer's Daily Log sheets, as she does not know where he is 24 hours a day, seven days per week.

While meeting with Mother [REDACTED] she stated that she does not have any concerns with Fr. Huppenbauer whatsoever aside from his health. [REDACTED] When asked, Mother [REDACTED] informed both Fr. Grace and myself that she does not have any questions concerning Fr. Huppenbauer.

I then gave Mother [REDACTED] the April 9, 2007 letter and related documents [see file] concerning Fr. Huppenbauer's current ISP, related documents, and an updated summary of allegations received against him to date. Prior to the end of our meeting, it was agreed that Mother [REDACTED] would call either Fr. Grace or myself to report any concerns and/or ask any questions regarding Fr. Huppenbauer.

After meeting with Mother [REDACTED] Fr. Grace and I met with Fr. Huppenbauer. I reviewed the entire ISP and supporting documents [Daily Log sheets, Travel/Vacation Notification] with Fr. Huppenbauer, and noted that Mother [REDACTED] has stated that she does not feel comfortable signing his Daily Log sheets. It was agreed that Fr. Huppenbauer would continue to complete his Daily Logs sheets and then send them to me on a weekly basis, without any signature from an "on-site supervisor." Fr. Grace and

I informed Fr. Huppenbauer that the program formerly referred to as “monitoring” will most likely be changed to “supervision” and that the additional changes made to the program and the ISPs will follow. I also informed Fr. Huppenbauer that the current *§1100 Sexual Abuse of Minors: Policies for Education, Prevention, Assistance to Victims and Procedures for Determination of Fitness for Ministry* are in the process of being updated. Fr. Huppenbauer expressed his understanding that once the changes to the “supervision” program are made and once the new misconduct policies are promulgated by Cardinal George, he would be informed and provided with copies of each.



Prior to ending the meeting, Fr. Huppenbauer asked Fr. Grace about wake and funeral arrangements for a cleric who has been withdrawn from ministry. Fr. Grace informed Fr. Huppenbauer that he would obtain the information and follow up with him.

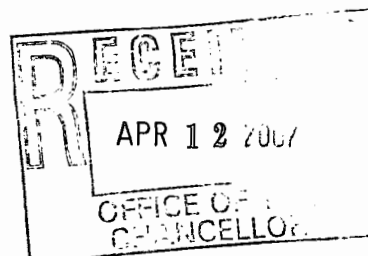

INDIVIDUAL SPECIFIC PROTOCOLS

For

Rev. Walter Huppenbauer

The Individual Specific Protocols (ISP) implement the primary goal of promoting the safety of minors. Additionally, the ISP protects the integrity of the Church and serves as a safeguard for individual priest or deacon. As long as the cleric is a client of the Office for Child Abuse Investigations and Review, he will be subject to appropriate protocols, restrictions and monitoring under the authority of the Vicar for Priests and supervised by the Director of the Office for Child Abuse Investigations and Review (Director). The agreement of a priest or deacon to abide by these protocols is not understood to prove the truth of any allegation and is not intended to be an admission of guilt for any delict or crime, whether in Canon Law, or State and Federal Law. This agreement represents the cooperation of the cleric with his bishop as he exercises his pastoral office (e.g., Canons 369 and 392).

This ISP for Rev. Walter Huppenbauer is as follows (Director to initial all that apply):

1. The client is restricted from being alone with a minor or minors, that is anyone under the age of 18, without the presence of another responsible adult.

4. The "Clergy Daily Log" to be completed on a daily basis and co-signed by the on-site supervisor. *The log is a tool that is used for the protection of minors, the cleric, the on-site supervisor and the Archdiocese. Although it identifies time periods, it is intended to provide a general record of the day rather than a detailed clock. If you are describing an off-site activity, please include your destination and the general purpose of the visit or activity. For example, it is enough to indicate that you did personal shopping at a given Shopping Center rather than the details of each individual store. However, if your self-description is challenged or a complaint is lodged with the Archdiocese, some documentation and verification may be necessary to sufficiently address the situation.

5. W Abide by the assignment of residence to [Redacted]

* Will not be signed by on-site supervisor; WH will fill out Daily logs + send to Director

6. W Must complete and submit the "Travel/Vacation Agreement," and obtain concurrence with the Agreement, prior to a scheduled departure. In the event of a prolonged stay in a particular location, the Archdiocese is required to notify the Ordinary of that place of your presence there.
7. WNA Attendance at a recommended support group _____ (please indicate specific support group). Recommended frequency of _____ times per week/month (please circle one). Attendance at a recommended support group is to be reflected on "Clergy Daily Log" forms.
8. No inappropriate use of computers, software, Internet capabilities, communications tools or video technology. The standards articulated in the *Policies and Procedures of the Archdiocese of Chicago* and the *Handbook For Archdiocesan Employees* apply as they do to all Archdiocesan personnel.
9. No ministerial participation in the public celebration of the Eucharist or any other Sacrament or Sacramental without the prior, written permission of the Vicar for Priests.
10. Refrain from wearing any garb that would give the appearance of, or seem to infer, a priest/deacon who has canonical faculties and is currently assigned to some ministry (e.g., the 'clerical shirt').
11. On-site visits by the Director and the VP annually to include a meeting with the cleric.

This Individual Specific Protocol is to be reviewed annually with the Director, VP, and the cleric. Also, there can be additional, written notations tailored to the needs of a specific situation which are signed by all parties and appended to this document. Any change or alteration to this agreement will involve consultation with the cleric, his on-site supervisor, the Director, and the VP. The cleric, his on-site supervisor, the Director, or the VP can initiate the discussion for change or alteration, or request that this Individual Specific Protocol be reviewed by the independent Review Board. At the discretion of any of the parties, the legal and/or canonical counsel of the cleric may be involved in the discussions.

I have reviewed, understand, and agree to all of these individual specific Protocols.

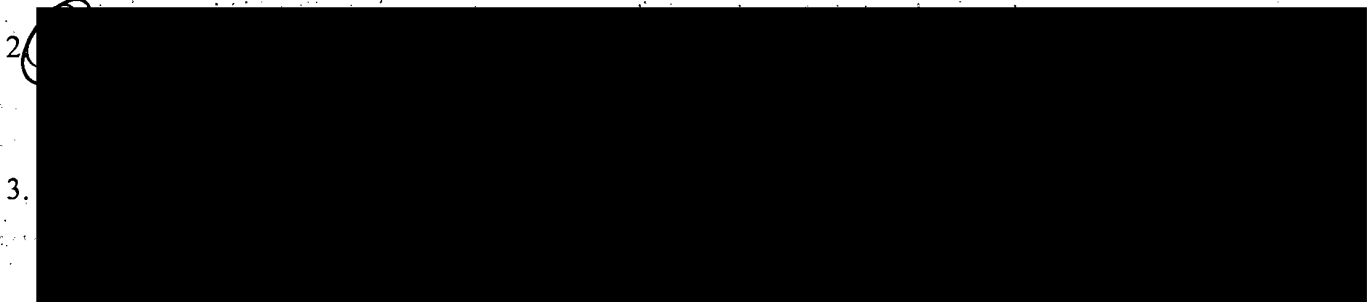

The Individual Specific Protocols (ISP) implement the primary goal of promoting the safety of minors. Additionally, the ISP protects the integrity of the Church and serves as a safeguard for individual priest or deacon. As long as the cleric is a client of the Office for Child Abuse Investigations and Review, he will be subject to appropriate protocols, restrictions and monitoring under the authority of the Vicar for Priests and supervised by the Director of the Office for Child Abuse Investigations and Review (Director). The agreement of a priest or deacon to abide by these protocols is not understood to prove the truth of any allegation and is not intended to be an admission of guilt for any delict or crime, whether in Canon Law, or State and Federal Law. This agreement represents the cooperation of the cleric with his bishop as he exercises his pastoral office (e.g., Canons 369 and 392).

This ISP for Rev. Walter Huppenbauer is as follows (Director to initial all that apply):

1. The client is restricted from being alone with a minor or minors, that is anyone under the age of 18, without the presence of another responsible adult.

4. The "Clergy Daily Log" to be completed on a daily basis and co-signed by the on-site supervisor.* The log is a tool that is used for the protection of minors, the cleric, the on-site supervisor and the Archdiocese. Although it identifies time periods, it is intended to provide a general record of the day rather than a detailed clock. If you are describing an off-site activity, please include your destination and the general purpose of the visit or activity. For example, it is enough to indicate that you did personal shopping at a given Shopping Center rather than the details of each individual store. However, if your self-description is challenged or a complaint is lodged with the Archdiocese, some documentation and verification may be necessary to sufficiently address the situation.

5. W Abide by the assignment of residence to [Redacted]

* Will not be signed by on-site supervisor; WH will fill out daily logs + send to Director

6. W Must complete and submit the "Travel/Vacation Agreement," and obtain concurrence with the Agreement, prior to a scheduled departure. In the event of a prolonged stay in a particular location, the Archdiocese is required to notify the Ordinary of that place of your presence there.
7. WNA Attendance at a recommended support group _____ (please indicate specific support group). Recommended frequency of _____ times per week/month (please circle one). Attendance at a recommended support group is to be reflected on "Clergy Daily Log" forms.
8. No inappropriate use of computers, software, Internet capabilities, communications tools or video technology. The standards articulated in the *Policies and Procedures of the Archdiocese of Chicago* and the *Handbook For Archdiocesan Employees* apply as they do to all Archdiocesan personnel.
9. No ministerial participation in the public celebration of the Eucharist or any other Sacrament or Sacramental without the prior, written permission of the Vicar for Priests.
10. Refrain from wearing any garb that would give the appearance of, or seem to infer, a priest/deacon who has canonical faculties and is currently assigned to some ministry (e.g., the 'clerical shirt').
11. On-site visits by the Director and the VP annually to include a meeting with the cleric.

This Individual Specific Protocol is to be reviewed annually with the Director, VP, and the cleric. Also, there can be additional, written notations tailored to the needs of a specific situation which are signed by all parties and appended to this document. Any change or alteration to this agreement will involve consultation with the cleric, his on-site supervisor, the Director, and the VP. The cleric, his on-site supervisor, the Director, or the VP can initiate the discussion for change or alteration, or request that this Individual Specific Protocol be reviewed by the independent Review Board. At the discretion of any of the parties, the legal and/or canonical counsel of the cleric may be involved in the discussions.

I have reviewed, understand, and agree to all of these individual specific Protocols.

This letter is to update you on actions we are taking to upgrade our monitoring and supervision program. For the past year, we have been reviewing the recommendations from the consultants we hired in 2006 as well as the Ad Hoc Committee who worked with us this past year to redesign our programs for oversight and compliance. We are now in the process of implementing improvements to both of these programs.

We have engaged Dr. Monica Applewhite, former president of Praesidium, Inc., the national accrediting body for religious communities seeking to comply with the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Youth* and *Essential Norms*, to design and recommend an individual protocol with each removed priest. Secondly, we have hired a new compliance supervisor, Ms. Shawnte Jenkins, to oversee compliance with these agreements and protocols.

The Vicar for Priests and members of the Office for the Protection of Children and Youth will be in contact with you to discuss these changes.



Date: September 19, 2008

Several months ago, Rev. Walter Huppenbauer asked Cardinal Francis George, O.M.I. if the two of them could meet to discuss the allegation of the sexual abuse of a minor that  made against him [Fr. Huppenbauer]. Cardinal George agreed to schedule the meeting and asked that Rev. Edward Grace, Vicar for Priests, and I be present as well.

The following is a summary of my notes from the meeting that took place on May 16, 2008 with the aforementioned parties present:

- Fr. Huppenbauer expressed his anger about Mr.  allegation against him and the resulting settlement that Mr.  received after the allegation was substantiated through the Review Board process; Fr. Huppenbauer expressed his protest that he did not and/or was not "...allowed to have representation..." when a representative from the Office of Assistance Ministry and I met with Mr.  to take his allegation
- I explained to Fr. Huppenbauer that the accused is not permitted to be present when representatives of the Office for Child Abuse Investigations and Review [CAIR] and Assistance Ministry meet with the alleged victim when he/she formalizes his/her allegation against the accused; I offered that in the same sense, the accuser is not permitted to be present when the allegation is presented to the accused
- Fr. Huppenbauer stated that he is "completely innocent" of the allegations made against him by Mr. 

- Fr. Huppenbauer made the point that the first allegation made against him was by a female and that the second was made by a male [Mr. ██████████]
- Fr. Huppenbauer said that he feels like he was railroaded [referring to Mr. ██████████'s allegation against him]
- I read the letters that I had sent to Fr. Huppenbauer to notify him of the Cardinal's decisions concerning the Initial Review and Review for Cause of the matter of Mr. ██████████'s allegation against him
- Cardinal George suggested that I add into the Initial Review letters a reminder to the accused and accuser of their right to appear before the Review Board
- When asked, I provided a verbal explanation of the policy and process followed when an allegation is received and the matter is appropriate to be before the Review Board [those instances when the accused is alive at the time the allegation is received]; I also explained that the communications between the Review Board and the Cardinal are confidential; the Cardinal asked that I send him copies of the Review Board meeting minutes that pertain to Mr. ██████████'s allegation against Fr. Huppenbauer; the Cardinal said that he would then discuss the matter further with Fr. Huppenbauer
- As the conversation continued, I provided the clarification that the information about the accused and/or accusers that is released to the media, aside from a list of names of those priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago [AOC] who have at least one substantiated allegation of the sexual abuse of a minor against them, has never been released by the AOC and that the information is normally provided to the media by the accusers' attorneys, such as civil attorney ██████████
- Prior to the conclusion of the meeting, Fr. Huppenbauer asked if there is a process for [withdrawn] priest funerals; Fr. Grace told Fr. Huppenbauer that there is such a process and that he would forward the information to him

APPLEWHITE: Monica Applewhite here. Monica is M-O-N-I-C-A A-P-P-L-E-W-H-I-T-E. It is March 4th, 2009. We're at the...

JENKINS: [REDACTED]

APPLEWHITE: [REDACTED]. Shawnte, can you say and spell your name?

JENKINS: Yes. S-H-A-W-N-T-E, Shawnte Jenkins, J-E-N-K-I-N-S.

APPLEWHITE: We're also here with Father Huppenbauer. Can you say and spell your first and last name?

HUPPENBAUER: Walter, W-A-L-T-E-R and Huppenbauer, H-U-P-P-E-N-B-A-U-E-R.

JENKINS: Okay, I just want to start first about talking about your currently daily life. I know you've had an accident, so it's probably a little bit different, but if you can talk about before your accident and your plans on when you heal, what a typical day for you looks like. On a Monday morning, you would wake up and what does a day look like for you?

HUPPENBAUER: Oh, I probably get up, let's see, I usually get up around 6:30 and then I might get the paper and read the paper, do a crossword puzzle, eat breakfast and then shower and shave and everything after that and so that's gets into a good part of the morning that way because I have, most of the time, no place to go or anything doing, so I can just take my time. It doesn't matter whether I take my shower as soon as I get up or later in the day, which I usually did when I was functioning better. Then, I usually either fix lunch for myself or most of the time...well, all of the time now, I've been eating in the dining room here, but I would usually maybe eat one meal in the dining room at Noon and then fix my own breakfast and supper in the daytime. During the...I would celebrate mass a couple of times a week I celebrate mass privately and also I do some reading and then look for or at the news that comes on the computer and then I'll work some jigsaw puzzles on our website to try to keep my mind going and coordination and stuff like that. Then...

APPLEWHITE: Is there a jigsaw puzzle website?

HUPPENBAUER: Yeah, on our .org. You click leisure and then games and you can pick easy, medium, hard ones...whatever you want to do. They have all sorts of games on that for us old guys. What would be...let's see, again I would either probably fix supper or go down

for supper and then after supper, then I would spend a large part of that would be like watching say Chicago Tonight, 7:00 on PBS and maybe some shows, maybe not. Take a little nap in my recliner. That's a pretty typical day.

JENKINS: If you do leave during the weekday, what kind of places would you go?

HUPPENBAUER: It would be the weekday it would be shopping for groceries once or twice a week, and it might be like things I might need at Wal-Mart or clothes at Kohl's...things like that. I was going out with Mark, usually once a week for lunch and once a week for breakfast usually, maybe twice, so when he was living here. I haven't seen him in the last month and a half or more because he's so far away now in <inaudible 4:24> and if he goes south, he just passes up here, so I don't see him that much.

JENKINS: Has his leaving affected your daily life in a big way?

HUPPENBAUER: Well, in a sense that he was so good when I was in rehab and he brought me things from my apartment and stuff like that. He really went out of his way for a lot of things after he moved. That was good that way. Now, I'm a person who doesn't like to ask for things, so the fellow that, on the way home from rehab, we stopped and got some breakfast stuff and one time after that he got it, so in the last month, so I have no...well, I have a couple of soup things and stuff like that but basically nothing in for other meals except and not even for breakfast now because I ran out of milk and juice and he's in the apartment next to me, but he had surgery on his foot, so he's got a small boot on his left foot too, so he's going to the doctor and change the dressing and all, but I wouldn't ask him to go shopping for me.

APPLEWHITE: You broke your leg, right?

HUPPENBAUER: Right. It's broken. I broke both bones.

APPLEWHITE: How much longer...are you still in rehab now?

HUPPENBAUER:

basically twice a week. I see the doctor on Friday, March 6 and determine if we can get this boot off and get an ankle brace so I

can get my shoes on again. So, since November 20, I haven't had a shoe or anything on.

JENKINS: How did your accident happen?

HUPPENBAUER: Well, the place was in the parking garage at the doctors and I was next to <inaudible 6:49> Brothers Hospital there, the Everly building and I was being so nice. I had a blood drawing at my doctor and I gave some insurance information to a second doctor on an x-ray I was supposed to get and I got that and I was coming back to my car and I got in the wrong way. Instead of putting my back end in first and slide my legs around like I did when I was on the walker before, I had [REDACTED] in '07, and was on a walker for a while, and I was getting in with the right foot first and I was walking with a cane. I threw that in the passenger seat, put one foot in and then I usually put the other foot in, but I fell backward or sideways out of the car. There was another car next to me, so I hit that and made a pirouette and that's when I heard and I felt like a softball going up there. It happened 10 years ago, so I knew I had broken something because it was the same feeling 10 years ago. So, I have a plate in both feet now and screws in the new one.

APPLEWHITE: Same leg or different leg?

HUPPENBAUER: Different leg. The right one was the first time. It will be interesting if I try to fly on a plane with the metal detectors. I have a [REDACTED] too, so it will be a riot. I don't know if I'll have the opportunity or not though. Got to walk a lot better. So, that would be pretty basically...did I mention the office, breavery too, that takes at least 45 minutes during the day.

APPLEWHITE: Once? Do you say the office once or do you say the office five times?

HUPPENBAUER: Usually I'll say two or three times. Two or three breaks.

JENKINS: Typically when you do go out, around what time do you normally return back here?

HUPPENBAUER: Well, I spend about an hour grocery shopping. I spend maybe a couple of hours to and from and eating at the restaurant and that's almost always...well, do you want to know if I'm out late? No, I'm not out late at all. I very seldom go out in the evenings. Maybe if I go get a hair cut and I'll be back by 8:00. So, very seldom out in the evenings.

- APPLEWHITE: Are you able to leave now at all with your leg the way that it is at the moment?
- HUPPENBAUER: Not really unless I get a ride. Like, Friday, I'm going to get a ride to the doctor by one of the other tenants.
- APPLEWHITE: So, who would take you if you go to the doctor?
- HUPPENBAUER: It would be a tenant who lives in the building here.
- APPLEWHITE: One of the other residents here.
- HUPPENBAUER: One of the residents. Yeah, another apartment resident.
- APPLEWHITE: Okay. Is that a friend of yours?
- HUPPENBAUER: No, it's a person that has...there is about three people who have offered to provide rides for us or for anybody that needs it just to let them know that they are glad to do that.
- JENKINS: So, it's like a volunteer service they have offered to the facility. How about the weekend? How is your weekend different than a weekday?
- HUPPENBAUER: I'll probably go out for breakfast in the morning, but otherwise, it's pretty much the same. I don't think there is much of a variance at all.
- APPLEWHITE: Since Father Mark is not here anymore, how do you...who are you friends with now?
- HUPPENBAUER: Well, I'm friends with the fellow next door, the one that's been driving me and just general friends, but really, the Bishop, who is the Chaplain, he is probably the one I'm closest to here at the home.
- JENKINS: What's his name?
- HUPPENBAUER: [REDACTED] He is a retired Bishop [REDACTED]
- JENKINS: How about classmates? Do you ever go out to dinner on a regular basis or have any meeting with any of your classmates?
- HUPPENBAUER: Not too much. Occasionally, we may get together, but that might be only once a year or something like that.

JENKINS: Any volunteer work you are involved in or had been involved in?

HUPPENBAUER: Here?

JENKINS: Anywhere.

HUPPENBAUER: Not really, because I came here after I retired and I wanted to volunteer, but then shortly afterwards, the accusations were made public and then I wasn't able to. That's sort of a moot question, too, that I've thrown over in my mind. I'm not sure exactly because the first case was sent to Rome and a decision was made and the official ruling was that I could live here at the [REDACTED] and then I could celebrate mass privately and I could also minister to the Sisters and to the residence here, but the problem with that is there is hardly anything that is strictly private because people from the outside come in for masses in the Chapel and stuff like that.

So, that's why I've been saying private masses and I have not been to public masses, because if there is a person that comes in from the outside and they see me celebrating mass, they would be...cause a lot of trouble possibly. So, I wouldn't want to do that and I wouldn't want to the [REDACTED] to have a problem for them either and the residents are aware of the charges against me and the gossip and so forth goes around and sometimes people will bring it back to me and say, well, they are saying this or they are saying that. So, I figure that well, an added part of that is I was an associate in Palatine here for six years and then I was Pastor for 11 years at the same parish.

So, I know a lot of people, that's why I moved from Little Sisters in Chicago to [REDACTED] because I know people and I feel comfortable with the people. But, with the accusations and all, I've sort of drawn away from most people. Again, maybe once or twice a year, I'll go out with a husband and wife and we'll go out for dinner or something like that, but as time went on, that has gotten further and further away the times that we have done that. So, the thing that I have seen with volunteering, even I don't know how comfortable residents would feel if I were volunteering here, so I have not volunteered here because there is a big question mark over me.

APPLEWHITE: When you say a private mass, does anyone else come to celebrate with you?

HUPPENBAUER: No. It's private-private.

- APPLEWHITE: Private-private? I've heard a lot of different definitions of private. It's not just not in the Chapel; it's not with anyone else?
- HUPPENBAUER: No. It's on my kitchen table.
- APPLEWHITE: Are you allowed to hear confessions?
- HUPPENBAUER: Well, I guess I could technically minister to people here, but again, how would people feel coming to me knowing about the accusations?
- APPLEWHITE: Was your Decree before 2002 or after? Do you know?
- JENKINS: 2003 I think it was.
- HUPPENBAUER: It was with the first...
- APPLEWHITE: The first wave...
- HUPPENBAUER: It had to be after 2003, because I retired in '01 and I was here a year or two and then the accusation was made public.
- APPLEWHITE: Okay, because I think probably, just under what's become sort of the jurisprudence, it may be that in that time segment it wasn't clear. I don't think that would be permitted now, even with just the Little Sisters. I know it was a big question ...
- HUPPENBAUER: Even if Rome said so? I mean, Rome is a big deal in a church.
- APPLEWHITE: Yes, I understand. But the concern would be regarding your being in ministry with a religious community. For the first year or so after the Charter, whether this would be permitted was a big question.
- HUPPENBAUER: Anyway, I'm not working with them. I'm not there and I won't because of the possibility of a scandal or people being upset.
- APPLEWHITE: So, if we say that's not supposed to happen, that's not going to change anything for you?
- HUPPENBAUER: No, I will continue not to volunteer, continue not to minister publicly or anything like that. Continue just to celebrate mass privately by myself.
- APPLEWHITE: Is there anyone with whom you are providing pastoral counseling or spiritual direction?

HUPPENBAUER: No.

APPLEWHITE: Even [REDACTED]?

HUPPENBAUER: No.

APPLEWHITE: When we were here before, it sounded like the [REDACTED] had a special place in their heart for you and we know you've had longstanding relationships.

HUPPENBAUER: Yeah, I was a Chaplain for seven and a half years in Chicago and I did a good job at that. In all of my priesthood...it's been a very good priesthood and I'm proud of it.

APPLEWHITE: It seems like it would be a little bit harder for them to separate or to be able to say I don't go to him for this because you had that preexisting relationship. It sometimes makes it a little more awkward.

HUPPENBAUER: Like the Provincial now was the Superior in Chicago for most of the time I was there.

APPLEWHITE: [REDACTED]

HUPPENBAUER: Yes. And another Nun that is here had been [REDACTED] in Chicago for a short time now. She came back here this year or last year in '08. So, I do know some of them that way.

APPLEWHITE: Do you ever meet with anyone of them from sort of a "how are *you* doing, Father" perspective? Do you know what I mean? In support of you?

HUPPENBAUER: Well, like with Mother [REDACTED] like after we meet today, I'll tell her what happened and we meet every...I mean like that it would usually be...mostly if there was a change in something or something important came up or something like that, then I would ask to see her and we would talk about things.

APPLEWHITE: Does she stay here most of the time?

HUPPENBAUER: She's here... [REDACTED] It's the head of the house here.

APPLEWHITE: The local Superior.

HUPPENBAUER: She's here most of the time.

- APPLEWHITE: [REDACTED] here is not here most of the time.
- HUPPENBAUER: No, she's traveling around the country, although now she's got a knee replacement last week, so she's sort of here.
- APPLEWHITE: She's stuck here for a little while. Do they have a policy about guests in the room or in your apartment?
- HUPPENBAUER: No, it's wide open.
- APPLEWHITE: Do you have guests in your room sometimes?
- HUPPENBAUER: Not too often. Like [REDACTED] or come or the Bishop. Mostly that's who it is and really most of us are pretty private at the apartments and there would be...like right now, I would say, there is a family that I am friends with and they may stop over again maybe a couple of times a year.
- APPLEWHITE: Can you tell us about that family? This is where it gets nosy.
- HUPPENBAUER: Yeah, I'll let you be as nosy as I want you to be. I'll let this...I've known the wife since she was in grammar school, so it's been a long time. She married later in life and I witnessed the wedding for that. They have like two families...a 19 year old daughter and about a six year old, I suppose, something like that...they have a wide span in the families, and when I was...last year in '07, when I had [REDACTED], I was a few months in rehab too and they used to come and visit me there and they would...they did my laundry for me and things like that. So, that was good.
- JENKINS: Where do they live?
- HUPPENBAUER: They live in the suburbs. I haven't seen them for several months because they are having some medical problems with their older daughter and stuff like that and they've been really focused on the family so I maybe talked to them over the phone since I've been back maybe once or twice. So, I haven't seen them, though.
- JENKINS: Can you tell us about times when you do encounter children like this family's child or any other children that you may encounter when you're here or out? Can you tell us about any encounters that you do have with children?
- HUPPENBAUER: Well, if they would come here and if <inaudible 20:46> they don't bring the small child and sometimes they do and maybe some good

point is I've only been hugged by her once because she's...she never hugs me. She says hello or something like that. One day, when I was in rehab, she ran to me and gave me a hug. I don't know why. Otherwise, there is no contact at all there. There is no physical contact or anything.

JENKINS: How about with children that may be here visiting other residents?

HUPPENBAUER: I never see any, so I may see a lady who comes to mass with a few children. She's a home schooler and if it's after mass and I go by and see them in the lobby and just say hello, but that's it.

JENKINS: Have you ever been told what to do when you encounter children or been given any restrictions about your relationship with children.

HUPPENBAUER: The restrictions were no contact with minors unless another person was present.

APPLEWHITE: Not to be alone with them.

HUPPENBAUER: Don't be alone with minors.

APPLEWHITE: The family that we were just talking about, you said you've known the mom since she was in grammar school.

HUPPENBAUER: She's 40 nor or something like that. 40-41, somewhere in there.

APPLEWHITE: Are they aware of the allegations?

HUPPENBAUER: Yes, they are aware.

APPLEWHITE: The situation with the faculties. Do they know that you don't have faculties right now?

HUPPENBAUER: Yes. They are aware of the accusations.

APPLEWHITE: So, if in this family we were to say, the parents need to know this information, that wouldn't be new for them?

HUPPENBAUER: No.

APPLEWHITE: Did they find out from you or did they find out from the paper?

HUPPENBAUER: I think it was probably from TV or paper maybe and then we talked about it.

APPLEWHITE: A long time ago or recently?

HUPPENBAUER: Oh, yeah. That's when it first happened, so it's been a few years.

APPLEWHITE: Other families that you're close with?

HUPPENBAUER: Nobody much. Well, there's probably the [REDACTED] but the mom is in her 70's and the daughter is in her...she's going to be 50 this year.

APPLEWHITE: Not really a minor.

HUPPENBAUER: She's not a minor so there's nobody. Again, they did my laundry the second rehab because the other people weren't able to do it. So, they did it and it was a big help.

APPLEWHITE: When families or people come to visit here, do they visit with you in your apartment or here?

HUPPENBAUER: Usually in the apartment. Unless sometime we want more room or something, but usually I don't think I've come down here to visit with anyone.

APPLEWHITE: You have a bedroom and a den and a kitchen?

HUPPENBAUER: Bedroom, living room, kitchen, yes. Just like [REDACTED].

APPLEWHITE: I thought that they were probably similar.

HUPPENBAUER: A couple of different floor plans maybe and there is some that are a little bigger where maybe a couple would have. It's maybe a bigger bedroom or more space. For some reason, I don't know if the kitchen might be bigger too.

APPLEWHITE: So, if a family comes here...we have to make a decision about whether it's going to be okay to have children in that apartment at all. Is it a space you would go to if there were four people here? Is it big enough for that? I mean...

HUPPENBAUER: I have a recliner and a sofa, but I also have a desk chair. Sometimes I'll sit at the desk chair.

APPLEWHITE: Do you go to their house?

HUPPENBAUER: Yes. Maybe again that's a couple times a year.

APPLEWHITE: During holidays mostly or birthdays.

HUPPENBAUER: It would be maybe like for Thanksgiving or it might be for a birthday.

JENKINS: Is this the [REDACTED]'s home or the other family.

HUPPENBAUER: No, the other family.

APPLEWHITE: What's the name of that family?

HUPPENBAUER: I'd rather not tell you.

APPLEWHITE: What we have to do is when there is minors involved, we have to verify people. We can't just sort of say, well, this is his private life and we're not going to know anything about it. That's actually true for people in general. When you have relationships in general, we have to know who they are.

HUPPENBAUER: Well, I don't want them involved. I think it's an imposition of your going to them and digging this whole thing up again and they are aware of it and we handled it, so I think that's enough. I don't agree to give you any information on who they are or where they live, telephone numbers and all.

APPLEWHITE: This process of verification, knowing who people are and that sort of thing, that is the program. That is what we're doing.

HUPPENBAUER: Well, maybe I'm not in the program then.

APPLEWHITE: Okay, I mean, that's totally strictly up to you, really. But, it's considered serious.

HUPPENBAUER: I consider it serious too that they remain private and that there have been no incidents and they are aware of it and so I don't see the need for it.

APPLEWHITE: This is...this kind of the...this part of the protocol or this part of this program is just one of those non-negotiable things in the program and you can totally decide you don't want to do it, but it's just going to be...

HUPPENBAUER: Well, what if I decide not to do it, then?

APPLEWHITE: Then the question has to come up, then the question becomes...

HUPPENBAUER: You're the hatchet person, then, right?

APPLEWHITE: I don't want to be the hatchet person. I want you to tell us about these people and I want to have the conversation.

HUPPENBAUER: HMMGH!

APPLEWHITE: I would like to do the verification.

HUPPENBAUER: To carry out Jimmy Lagose and the Cardinal's plan for getting rid of all of us

APPLEWHITE: It is absolutely not my agenda to get rid of you or anyone else.

HUPPENBAUER: Well, that's what happening.

APPLEWHITE: It doesn't have to...

HUPPENBAUER: No, I do refuse.

APPLEWHITE: Okay.

HUPPENBAUER: Definitely, I do refuse. That's why I'm asking if I do refuse, then it's not according to your protocol, then what choices do I have?

APPLEWHITE: Well, then the options become more narrow in the sense that you have a choice to make...do you want to continue to be a priest in Archdiocese of Chicago, which you are today. Any you can be involved in this program of Prayer and Penance, which involves verification, or if you refuse, we have no choice but to pursue... ..

HUPPENBAUER: Then the process of laization.

APPLEWHITE: Again, it's strictly your choice.

HUPPENBAUER: Strictly my choice, forced by you, since your protocols won't accept my present way of living. From my side, unreasonable and you look for it on the opposite side that you've got the protocols and I won't agree with them.

APPLEWHITE: You don't have to agree.

HUPPENBAUER: No, I don't.

APPLEWHITE: But, what doesn't happen in the Archdiocese is if somebody is going to continue to be priest of the Archdiocese, that he can choose how he is going to live prayer and penance. The Program

of Prayer and Penance is this and if there are the movements of a person, where they go and what they do are held accountable now. That is a change. You can say, now, that's not the life I want. I want to be able to go where I want to go and do what I want to do with whom I want to be.

HUPPENBAUER: I've done that within limits and within proper limits and all. That's what gets to me. There has been no violation of any of that stuff, and I kept it in and I have been very good at it and I've done everything I've been asked to do and I think this is pushing me too far because it's involving my friends too much and it gets beyond me. It's no longer personal, but it's beyond me.

JENKINS: I just wanted to add that if you...and I believe we don't have any information to say otherwise, that you're living your life within those limits, the difference would be then now that we just have to verify those things for your own protection, for the church's protection....

HUPPENBAUER: Mostly for the church's protection.

JENKINS: It works both ways, but yes, absolutely...

HUPPENBAUER: I don't have to worry about it. It doesn't protect me because nothing is happening.

JENKINS: It can protect you from false allegations.

HUPPENBAUER: No it can't. I've already been falsely accused and the liar went out and I lost. I was falsely accused, so don't tell me that. I'm angry and you're going to know it. Just picture yourself if you've been falsely accused and the whole world knows it. It's not a fun living. So, they haven't helped me and I'm not going to abide by a new protocols then.

APPLEWHITE: Do you want us to stop this process?

HUPPENBAUER: We might as well because I'm not going to go into the lives of my relatives or something like that. They all know about it, but I'm not giving you names or addresses or places or phone numbers or anything.

APPLEWHITE: Do you want to have any time to think about? I mean, now that you know more about the program, do you want any time to think about it or do you just want to say, I don't want to be here?

HUPPENBAUER: Well, I'm not going to...I'm not going to go into the place you want me to by giving you more information.

APPLEWHITE: Okay.

HUPPENBAUER: So that's where I'm at.

APPLEWHITE: You don't want any time to think about it before we...

HUPPENBAUER: I really don't think so.

APPLEWHITE: Before we go back and say, no, he's not going to do this. I mean, do you want any time? A day? Two days?

HUPPENBAUER: I know usually you've given guys the time, a week or two or whatever they've been given, I understand that in the past...other guys that I know of, but I don't know. I won't become less angry and since my rights have been violated and I don't want my rights violated anymore by this protocol, and I don't really see any reason for going any further because of that. So, probably the decision I have is layization. Maybe that's the only one. I don't know, but I'm not going with the program.

APPLEWHITE: Well, we can certainly take that message back and I'm sorry.

HUPPENBAUER: I've been hurt deeply and I'm...that's where I'm at.


Your Eminence,
