

# Catholic Women Hear Archbishop Gerken As State Convention Opens in City

## Delegates Visit Lourdes School; Plan Luncheon Session and Elections Tuesday

Delegates and visitors from throughout the state were in Albuquerque Monday to attend the two-day archdiocesan convention of the National Council of Catholic Women at the Alvarado Hotel. More than 100 women had assembled by late Monday afternoon for the meeting.

Heading the group of speakers at the opening session was Archbishop R. A. Gerken of Santa Fe who addressed the women with an inspirational message.

Mrs. Martin Riley, president of the Albuquerque council, welcomed the visitors. Mrs. George W. Jones, Albuquerque, is presiding as archdiocesan president.
