A. On numerous occasions Father Soens would come up to you in the hall, put his arm around you, pinch your nipple, twist it. We called it purpling. This was pretty common practice. It happened to a lot of people.

The incident -- I'm going to call it the primary incident or the thing that I thought was way, way out of line, I was sent to the office one time to see the principal. I had been acting up. Nothing major. Not fighting or drinking or anything like that, but kind of school boy stuff. 13

And when I went in his office, he told me to 15 come around the desk. He grabbed me by the front of my 16 pants, put his hand like you were to reach out and grab somebody by the beit buckle and pull them to you, and 18 started fondling me.

something like this and thought it was disciplinary, or
