RE: Lou Miller

Lou came November 25th. It is a complicated tale because it involves all of his family members: brothers and sisters-in-law, sister and brother-in-law, and an infinite variety of children. There is anger in the family, especially with the in-laws.

Key parties:

1) Sister-in-Law 1, wife of youngest brother Tom. They have 3 daughters: FS-1, Niece 2, and Niece 3. FS-1 claims to have been abused by Lou. Niece 2, a lawyer, is uncertain; she cannot remember anything about Lou during her childhood, a possible symptom. Niece 3 works at [REDACTED], has definitely not been molested, but hates and fear abusers because of her dedication to children.

Sister-in-Law 1 is angrier, and "the more she talks, the angrier she gets." She is threatening to come to see me. That's okay with me, and the sooner the better, since she seems bent on stirring up all the family. She wants to convene all members everywhere for a very big scene.

2) Sister-in-Law 2, another sister-in-law. My notes are garbled here, but her daughter Niece 4 may be troublesome, and even more dangerous is Niece 5, who is living with some guy, and would like to bring a law suit.

Not all of these people live in Louisville, but they seem to have lunch a lot and go on cruises regularly. The temperature is definitely rising. Some are calling Lou "a direct threat".

As bad as it's going to be, I think I'd better see Sister-in-Law 1 alone.
