Dear

We were told about [REDACTED] lawsuit against Mr. Remond, et al, & I just wanted you to know you both, [REDACTED] & Cheryl have our prayers and concern.

For the past year our daughter, [REDACTED]
has been under treatment for what was first
diagnosed as mania/depression/hysteria disorders.
Now she's under treatment to determine if or
when she was sexually molested. It's been
a terrible year & such a shock. She was
such a lively, happy joyful girl. She's married,
lives (when she's able) in Alaska, & has a
2-year old little girl & the best husband in
the world.

Now, about Fr. Ramos. I was one of the people from St H M School who went to the Bishop to demand his removal. The Diocese took their time doing it, & it wasn't until one of our teachers telephoned Msgr. (now Bishop) Driscoll & said he if he wasn't

removed & placed under treatment by the first of that week, she would have him charged with "contributing to the delinquency of minors" & then the Diocese would.

Now, all the facts I had were of drinking, having boys with him - he even tried to take them out of class. We were afraid he was giving drinks to the boys. Beyond that, I didn't know anything, but we feared the boys were in danger.

The one teacher who was going to call the police did have one parent express fear for her son. That family did take their boy out of the rectory & off the altar.

The Bishop or Msgr. Driscoll told me they needed 4 people to corroborate our statements. I called people who had been at the CC & campout Mass when he was drunk. People refused to help. Then when our teacher told Msgr. Driscoll about the 1 parent, that mother talked with Msgr. & the Diocese, based on her story & the teacher's threat pulled him out of

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JFM.

[REDACTED] I were estranged by many
practitioners for a long time - probably
a year.

H. Raxas, while he was under-
going treatment wrote me a will letter.
When he returned, before he was treat-
mented, I asked to meet with him & I
was told he was under orders ^{not} to go
near me - yet he could see anyone
else in the parish & did!

Unfortunately, other than the alcohol-
ism, & seeing him with him in the car,
& at the campout, seeing little bottles of
liquor in the car, my knowledge is
hearsay.

The teacher I mentioned was
going to call your [REDACTED] lawyer
to tell what she knows. She is [REDACTED]

Our former sister at school,

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who now are all back in Worcester, Mass., feared physical violence from him. That I think was based on his size & his verbal anger. And that I have seen.

I knew he had a temper, became very angry, & when drunk was crude & vulgar.

I also remember one of the upper grade teachers saying one day at least that Harry in her class told of Mr. Remond taking them to some "dirty" movies. We were angry with the director & afraid for the kids, but we had to push without any facts about sexual motivation — just instinct.

We are truly, truly sorry for the agonies [REDACTED] has gone through, as well as yours. I wish I had more words which to help him.
