

The following was typed on June 26, 2003 by Monsignor William Lynn. It is a summary of notes (contained on the attached document) made during either a phone conversation or meeting with Father Edward Avery on October 9, 1992. This was typed at the request of James Bock for use by the Archdiocesan Review Board.

Father William Lynn spoke with Father Edward Avery on October 9, 1992 about allegations made by **James**. Father Avery stated that **James** has a selective memory. He stated that he was good to him and many of his friends. He stated h was hurt by them many times because they did not show up for trips or events.

Father Avery stated that every day from February 16, 1976 to September, 1978, **James** and his friends would come to the rectory after school. Father Avery said he was friendly with them all. He stated he thought it funny that **James**'s making allegations when Father Avery kept in contact with all his friends and had their weddings and baptisms. Father Avery stated that **James**'s family had mental difficulties and financial problems.

Father Avery stated that he visited **James**'s mother to express his sympathy upon the death of her husband and the loss of his father. Father Avery stated that he was like one of the family. He stated that they are not on speaking terms now. He was present at a surprise 70th birthday party and stayed over nigh many times. And Father Avery wondered why two occasions were singled out.

Father Avery stated that Father James Sherlock could vouch for him while he was stationed at saint Ignatius Parish.
