Dear Archbishop Quinn:

Bishop Phillip F. Straling has been approached by Father Anthony Rodrigue, seeking his assistance with a petition for dispensation from the obligations of priesthood and from celibacy from our Holy Father, Pope John Paul II. He has asked me to instruct the case in accordance with the Procedural Ncrms issued by the Sacred Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith (1980; Prot. 128-61).

Father Rodrigue has informed me that you knew him during his time of formation as a seminarian, and thought you might have some personal reflections to offer about him at that particular time. I realize it was a long time ago.

I would appreciate any personal reflections or information you could provide for his petition to the Holy Father. Were there any indications that a significant lack of judgement or an unsuitability to lead a celibate life present at that time? Were there any mixed signals about his suitability for priesthood during his time under your guidance? Were there any different opinions as to whether he should proceed towards ordination? In your opinion, was his judgmental capacity and his ability to deliberate maturely, well developed? Were there any significant problems that presented themselves during the time of formation that, on reflection, might throw some light on his capacity for a commitment to priesthood and celibacy?



Your Eminence:

I seek the assistance of your Congregation in a matter of great delicacy. It concerns, as the attached letter outlines, an incardinated priest of the Diocese of San Bernardino, who requests, for the reasons he details, a dispensation from the obligations assumed by ordination to the priesthood. I fully support this petition as his Diocesan Bishop and can testify to the truth of his statements.

Father Anthony Edward Rodrigue has an ongoing history of association and improper behavior with male minors stemming, as the psychological profile states, from the incapacity to associate with adult peers and regression to familiarity with minors. In 1979, he pleaded nolo contendere to accusations of child molestation and while still in treatment and on probation, he associated with minors taking one to a cinema where he was seen by the arresting police officer from the case. Occurrences such as these have continually and repeatedly caused scandal, even when no physical or other sexual activity could be proven. His mere association with a minor raises serious concerns.

I have tried at great expense to this local church (over \$200,000) over many years, every conceivable method of treatment and none has been able to successfully address or arrest his pedophilic proclivity.

For the good of the Church, local and universal, and to relieve Reverend Rodrigue from a burden, obviously too heavy for him to bear, I ask that his request for a dispensation from the obligations undertaken at ordination to priesthood be granted.

As stated in the letter from Archbishop John R. Quinn, seminary records were lost, so I have been unable to investigate antecedents therein extant. The opinion of Dr. Joseph Malancharuvil, Ph. D. an expert in the area is attached.

I cannot in conscience allow Father Rodrigue to minister as a priest (Canon 1722). I would live in constant fear that some incident could occur in a parish and that the diocese would be accused of gross negligence in continually reassigning this man, given his prior convictions. In the current very strict application of the doctrine of respondeat superior, the church stands to suffer great harm. He is not suited to a life of perpetual priestly celibacy and this was not discerned prior to ordination. As a matter of fact, he seems to function much better socially without the burden of priestly assignments and in employment in a secular position. A positive response to his petition would be an act of great understanding and compassion.

In accord with Canons 281.2, 384 and 1274.1,2 adequate provisions have been made for his support and maintenance from the diocesan retirement fund, as well as medical coverage available to him through the diocese. Currently, he is gainfully employed and has State Social Security and pension benefits forthcoming.

His judgmental capacity and his ability to deliberate maturely are impaired as Dr. Malancharuvil attests.

I ask your assistance in recommending his petition for a dispensation from the obligations assumed by ordination to the priesthood (Canon 290.3) to our Holy Father, Pope John Paul II.

Dear Bishop Straling:

I, Anthony Rodrigue, living at 25400 East Pumalo, Apt. D, San Bernardino, California, 92404, was born December 20, 1936 in San Diego, California. I was baptized at St. John's Church in San Diego on February 14, 1937, attended grade school from 1st through 8th grade at Our Lady of the Sacred Heart School, 9th grade at Woodrow Wilson Jr. High School, 10th grade at Hover High School and 11th and 12th grades at St. Augustine High School, San Diego.

I attended St. Francis Seminary, El Cajon, California, from September 1954 through 1956, Immaculate Heart Seminary, El Cajon, from 1956 to 1962, received my Sub-Diaconate, November 21, 1961 and Diaconate on December 21, 1961 at The Immaculata, San Diego. I was ordained to priesthood there on March 17, 1962.

My first assignment was at Mary Star of the Sea Parish, La Jolla, California from March 1962 through March 1964. Subsequent assignments were Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish, Lakeside, from April 1964 to April 1966; St. John Parish, Encinitas, April 1966 to October 1967; Our Lady of Guadalupe, Calexico, October 1967 to July 1970; Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Indio, July 1970 to January 1971; St. Joseph, Barstow, January 1971 to June 1972; and St. Augustine, Eagle Mountain, July 1972 to December 1973. Accusations were made against me having lost my temper with a child.

During the months of January, February and March, 1974, I was in studies at San Antonio, Texas and then returned to Our Lady of Guadalupe, Calexico, from April 1976. I was accused of improper activity with male minors. I was then transferred to Our Lady of Soledad, Coachella during June, July and August of 1976.

From September 15, 1976 to January 1977, I was at a Psychiatric facility, the House of Affirmation in Massachusetts and then attended the Renewal Program at the Second Vatican Institute in Oakland, California. From July 1977 through September 1979, I was at St. George Parish in Ontario. I was accused in a civil court of law of molesting

a male minor and convicted. I was placed on parole under the supervision of the Diocesan Bishop.

I was hospitalized from October 1979 to September 1980 at Sierra Royal Hospital in Azusa, California and violated parole by attending a movie with a male minor and was seen by a policeman. I then lived with the Paraclete Fathers in Cherry Valley, California from October 1980 through February/March 1981. My last assignment was at St. Joseph the Worker Parish in Loma Linda from March 1981 through August 1982, where, again I associated continually with young males despite warnings.

After a psychological examination at the Paraclete House in New Mexico, I was retired on disability in December 1982. I lived with the Paraclete Fathers in Cherry Valley from October 1982 through April 1985. I was under conservatorship from December, 1983 until March, 1985 and then was released because it was unworkable.

Having discerned my life journey, I now ask Our Holy Father, through your good offices, to be released from the obligations of priesthood and the promise of celibacy to avoid problems to the church and to completely dedicate myself to secular pursuits. Every month, I receive a diocesan pension and should I wish to procure added health coverage it is available through the diocesan plan. I thank you for all your care and concern, over the years, and regret any pain I have caused you. I ask this special favor now.

Dear Monsignor Behan,

Early in December you wrote to me concerning Father Anthony Rodrigue who was a student in Immaculate Heart Seminary when I was a Professor there. Since responding to your inquiry, I have had some additional thoughts about Father Rodrigue.

First of all, I would wish to clarify that I was not Rector at the time Father Rodrigue was ordained as I recall. Monsignor William A. Bergin was Rector at that time. I do think that it should be of record that when I became Rector on June 9, 1964 I discovered some irregularities in the seminary records. Approximately, two and not more than three days after I arrived to take up my duties, one of the pastors telephoned me inquiring about one of his students who had been dropped at the end of that school year. This occurred at a time when I was in another assignment at St. Francis Seminary in El Cajon. When I received the inquiry from the pastor, I told him that I would look into the records. On searching for the records, I was unable to find them and consequently telephoned Monsignor Bergin. Monsignor Bergin informed me on that occasion that he had destroyed the minutes of the faculty meetings and that he had destroyed some other records. Consequently, it may not be easy for you to get exact information about the situation at the time of Father Rodrigue's ordination. I would like you to regard this information concerning the seminary records as confidential since there is no reason after so many years now to have this become widely known but I do think you should be aware of it in your effort to put together a complete dossier on Father Rodrigue.

I hope that this information will be of some use.

I have your letter inquiring about Father Anthony Rodrigue.

I remember Father Rodrigue very well. He was indeed a seminarian during the time I taught in the Seminary in San Diego. However, it is twenty-one years since I was Rector of the Seminary and as I recall Father Rodrigue was a student who was ordained several years before 1968 so it is many years since I have had contact with him in any way.

I have only the vaguest recollections now of him as a seminarian. He was pleasant and friendly but I never knew of anything that would indicate that he was not suitable for a celibate life, at least if there were any such thing it did not come to light in the external forum. I no longer recall the judgment of the faculty about his suitability for ordination but the fact that he was ordained would suggest that at least the majority of the faculty was favorable toward his ordination.

In summary, then, I am not able to recall with sufficient clarity very much about the judgment of the seminary about Father Rodrigue.

PSYCHOLOGICAL EVALUATION UPDATE

Re: Anthony Edward Rodriguez

Date of Evaluation: January 29, 1991

Referral: Anthony Edward Rodriguez was referred for this evaluation update by the Very Rev. Msgr. Philip Behan, Vicar General of the Diocese of San Bernardino. The primary purpose of the evaluation was to assess Fr. Rodriguez's present psychological ability to be rehabilitated into active priestly ministry.

SPECIAL NOTE: THIS EVALUATION IS TO BE CONSIDERED AN UPDATE OF THE PREVIOUS EVALUATIONS DONE BY THE SAME EXAMINER ON MARCH 11, 1988 AND FEBRUARY 17, 1989.

Assessment Procedure: Clinical Interview.

Background Information: Please see previous evaluations.

FINDINGS:

Anthony Rodriguez continues to suffer from substantial and long-standing emotional and personality problems that seem to stem from his adolescent years. He does not have the personality makeup or emotional stability to be an effective priest. His prolonged history of psychiatric treatment, inappropriate sexual behaviors, serious dearth of social skills bear witness to the possibility that he was admitted to the priesthood mistakenly. It is quite possible that

Fr. Rodrigue suffered from a severe personality disorder prior to his ordination. The demands of priestly celibacy and ministry seemed to have led him to suffer from a series of emotional "breakdowns" as well as sexual misbehaviors one of which ended in his being criminally convicted through civil procedures.

Fr. Rodrigue received substantial and prolonged psychiatric and psychological treatments lasting for several years, including four months of inpatient treatment in a psychiatric hospital. He was placed on civil conservatorship for over an year, because of serious inability to manage his person and affairs. While he has profited from these interventions, they only proved his continued inability to serve as a functioning or effective priest.

Fr. Rodrigue is currently living alone in a rented apartment and working as a Janitor in the San Bernardino Community Hospital. He is maintaining adequately in this structured and relatively stress-free atmosphere.


During the interview, Fr. Rodrigue stated that considering all facts, it would be better for him to be released from his priestly obligations. He felt essentially content with his present living style, as well as arrangements. He experiences little stress and no tendency towards acting inappropriately. He does not associate much with other priests. He continues to attend Holy Mass at a nearby parish. His financial resources are adequate, particularly with the

Diocesan Pension he is receiving. It is important to note that Fr. Rodriguez felt that he would possibly have to suffer a lot of emotional stress, if he were to try to continue in active ministry.

Recommendations:

1. It is this examiner's continued recommendation that Fr. Rodriguez be released from his priestly obligations and vows.
2. For continued dignified life and in the interest of justice, it is recommended that he continues to receive pension benefits from the Diocese.

Client's Name: Rev. Anthony Rodrigue

Rev. Anthony Rodrigue has been in psychiatric treatment for over six years. In addition to being hospitalized, he also was placed under Conservatorship, because of extreme difficulty in functioning. He has been relieved of his priestly ministries for over three years.

A recent mental status examination (Feb. 13, 1989) revealed that Father Anthony Rodrigue continues to maintain at the minimal level of functioning. Considering all factors it is not recommended that he returns to priestly ministry. It is this examiner's considered opinion that as far as priestly ministry is concerned, Rev. Anthony Rodrigue is completely disabled.

Date of Evaluation: March 11, 1988.

Referral: Anthony Edward Rodrigue was referred for this evaluation by the Very Rev. Philip Behan, Vicar General of the Diocese of San Bernardino. The primary purpose of the evaluation was to assess Fr. Rodrigue's psychological ability to be rehabilitated into active-priestly ministry.

Background Information:

Anthony Edward Rodrigue (Tony) was born in December 20, 1936 in San Diego, the second child of Sydney Joseph Rodrigue and Minerva Trixello Rodrigue. He has one older and one younger brother. Tony's parents, both deceased, were practising Catholics. Tony's father was in the navy, and was emotionally somewhat inaccessible to his children. Tony's mother also, by Tony's report, "emotionally unexpressive" to the children and was reported to be quite strict. Tony's childhood was characterized by general shyness and social withdrawal. He had very few friends.

Tony graduated from High School (San Diego) in 1954. Towards the end of his High School, he was inspired by the Pastor to consider studying for the priesthood. He joined St. Francis minor Seminary, El Cajon in 1954. In 1962, he was ordained a priest for the Diocese of San Diego. His seminary-life was generally characterized by "quietness" and avoidance of any type of conflicts. Tony experienced some difficulties in his studies such as "blanking out" during exams. However he was considered hard-working and was always passed. Characteristically, Tony reports no emotionally significant relationships during this period. He did not consult with his spiritual director about any of his possible emotional conflicts, even though he reported serious confusion in regard to "distinguishing feelings from actions". It was obvious that he had considerable difficulty in integrating sexual feelings during this period. His general practice appeared to have

been one of repressing and isolating these feelings. The seminary atmosphere provided him considerable safety in continuing to avoid crucial issues of psychosexual development.

After his ordination, Father Tony had a series of assignments as Associate Pastor most of which were "uneventful". He was very quiet and he carefully avoided any conflictual situation. In 1971 Tony's mother died and this event precipitated considerable emotional turmoil. He was appointed Pastor of St. Joseph's Church, Barstow where he lasted less than two years. He was then transferred to St. Augustine's in Eagle Mountain. It was during this assignment that Tony became overwhelmed with his sexual difficulties and according to him he reported himself to the Chancery in San Diego. His difficulties included "fantasy involvement with minors and difficulty distinguishing feelings from actions". Consequently he was removed from his duties for "couple of weeks" and then was sent to Texas for a course in Spanish. After a trial period of "helping out" in Our Lady of Guadalupe, Calexico, he was assigned again as Pastor of Our Lady of Guadalupe Church in El Centro where he worked over six years. It was during this time he was alleged to have further difficulties with minors (Tony is characteristically vague and uncertain about what happened at this time). In May of 1976 Tony was sent for a psychological evaluation to the Affirmation House in Wittensville, Massachusetts. In September of the same year he was admitted to Affirmation House for four months of inpatient treatment. According to Tony this was "rough times" for him; it was during this period, he was helped to remember some sexually traumatic events of his childhood. Apparently Tony was involved in some sexual activities with children of his age around age 12. The nature and severity of this activities are still not clear; however these experiences seem to have impacted Tony's awareness seriously. In January, 1977 he was sent for a three-month course in Vatican II in Berkley. He was then assigned to St. George's Church in Ontario as Associate Pastor. Tony allegedly experienced further sexual problems during this assignment and sought outpatient treatment from Dr. Michael Goodman, psychiatrist. Subsequent to a police inquiry on his alleged sexual misconduct with minors, he was recommended to go for inpatient psychiatric treatment. He spent one year of inpatient psychiatric treatment in a private facility in Azusa, California. After his release from the hospital he was asked to stay in Cherry Valley, California, with the Servants of the Paracletos. In 1981 he was assigned to St. Joseph's the Worker in Loma Linda as Associate. Because of general difficulties in the Rectory, he was sent back to Cherry Valley in 1982. In October of the same year he was sent for an evaluation to the rehabilitation program for priests in Jemez Springs. According to Tony, the report from Jemez Springs was "quite damaging and unfair". Tony was then assigned to work with St. Vincent De Paul Society. This was not successful and the Bishop officially retired him from priestly ministry in December, 1982.

In 1983 Tony was put on Conservatorship which was revoked in 1985. Tony was then asked to find his own employment and living arrangements. In May, 1985 Tony left Cherry Valley to a rented apartment and to work as a Janitor in the Community Hospital. At the time of this report he is continuing to be employed at the hospital and is living by himself in a rented apartment.

Assessment Findings:

Anthony Rodrigue is suffering from substantial and long-standing personality and emotional problems. While he has profited from the many years of psychiatric treatment, his difficulties are far from resolved. Tony does not have the personality-makeup to be an effective priest. His thought processes are idiosyncratic and he is lacking in social-skills that are essential for success in priestly ministry. While he has atleast average intellectual abilities, his emotional difficulties render them ineffective in interpersonal situations. Tony has significant problems in expressing his thoughts and in asserting himself in social situations. This difficulty, stemming from early childhood, has rendered him generally avoidant and this has become an ingrained character-problem for him. Tony functions best in a highly supportive atmosphere or when he works alone in a project that does not involve people.

Tony's sexual integration is pathological. Substantial repression, isolation of emotions from thought processes, coupled with his serious difficulties in interpersonal relationships have made sexual development and integration quite difficult. His sexual identity is at best ambivalent. Tony did not report of any heterosexual or homosexual experiences with adults. His obvious difficulties in intimacy with adults seemed to have directed his fantasies towards minors. From what can be gathered of his verbal reports, he had been a passive recipient of "minors' affections". His sexual style is definitely passive. Given the appropriate circumstances, he would succumb to the processes.

Chances of Tony's rehabilitation into active priestly ministry are, for all practical purposes, non-existent. In fact, it would appear that priestly ministry could jeopardize his functionally adequate (however tenuous) current integration and could lead him to permanent psychiatric disability. This conclusion is reached after careful consideration of the relatively lengthy history of his treatment and the dynamics of his personality integration. Tony is functioning at his best now. He is holding a steady job and manages his rented apartment and is free from illegal and sexual activities. He also has developed some socially appropriate friendships with adults.

Recommendations:

1. It is my professional recommendation that Anthony Rodrigue be released from his priestly obligations and vows.
2. For continued dignified life and in the interest of justice I would recommend that he be allowed to continue to receive pension benefits from the Diocese.
3. It would be in Tony's interest for him to continue to consult with a professional on an adequately frequent basis to improve his personal integration and to protect himself from possibly dangerous tendencies.

It has been a privilege to evaluate Anthony Rodrigue. Please feel free to contact me if further information is required in this regard.

Reverend William D. Perri, s.P. has asked me to write to you concerning my evaluation of Father Anthony Rodrigue whom I saw on October 7, 1982 at Foundation House, Jemez Springs, New Mexico.

It is my professional opinion that Father Rodrigue suffers from paranoid schizophrenia. Unfortunately, this is a chronic illness for which there is no definitive cure. He has not been on medication at any time in his life, and it is certainly possible that with the aid of psychotropic medication, supportive therapy and a structured program, he might be able to function in a limited manner. I do not believe, however, that he is capable of functioning in the role of the priest in any sort of active ministry. Being very realistic, even with the best of medical and psychiatric care, I do not see this condition becoming alleviated to the point where he could ever return to any sort of active ministry.

A more detailed description of my evaluation of Father Rodrigue is contained in the letter of October 14, 1982 which was sent to you by Father William D. Perri, s.P., M.A., D.Min., Director, Foundation House.

If there is any further information that you wish from me, I would be more than happy to provide it.

Dear Father Webber:

This is to confirm our conversation at lunchtime of November 29, 1979. At that time, I advised you that the District Attorney for the County of San Bernardino (James M. Cramer) has agreed to allow Father Rodrique to enter a plea of no contest to one violation of Penal Code Section 647A. That section provides a punishment of up to six months in the County Jail or a \$500 fine or both for any person who annoys or molests a child under the age of 18.

Father Rodrique will be placed on summary probation to the court for a period of three years under the following provisions and terms:

1. He is to be placed in the constructive custody of Bishop Straling who shall remain constructively responsible for his personal supervision.
2. During this period of time of probation, Father Rodrique will continue to receive extensive therapy at Sierra Royale Hospital in Azusa under the supervision of Dr. Goodman.
3. After Dr. Goodman judges that he has made sufficient progress, Father Rodrique shall be assigned to a minimum of one year to the House of Affirmation.
4. During the period of probation he shall have no contact, while unsupervised, with any minor children.



benefit, his directive of October 17, 1979. In other words, Mr. Cramer wants a letter from Bishop Straling immediately, indicating that Bishop Straling will accept responsibility for Father Rodrique and that Father Rodrique will remain until released by Dr. Goodman at Sierra Royale Hospital. Mr. Cramer would further like to be assured that Father Rodrique will receive treatment for a minimum of one year at the House of Affirmation, where he will receive psychiatric care and further that the Church will take responsibility during the period of probation and Father Rodrique will not be a danger to society.

The one misdemeanor will be filed at the San Bernardino Municipal Court on December 12, 1979. I expect to enter a no contest plea with Father Rodrique, at that time, to the one count that is being filed and at that time the conditions of summary probation, as stated above, shall be imposed. Father Rodrique will then be booked and registered as a sex offender. It is my intention to go with you on December 10, in the morning hours, to pick up Father Rodrique at Sierra Royale Hospital and transport him to the San Bernardino Municipal Court where we can accomplish the above at 1:30 p.m.

I have reviewed Tony's personnel file. The only document that I can find that indicates he had serious issues is the enclosed copy of a letter from the House of Affirmation in 1976. Prior to that the file consists of letters of appointment as assistant and pastor. A letter of appointment as pastor to Our Lady of Guadalupe in El Centro is dated May 22, 1975, is followed by this letter, then a letter dated April 7, 1977 appointing him associate pastor to me at St. George parish in Ontario, California. There are no other documents, letters, or evaluation during that period.

Enclosed is a letter sent to Tony concerning his laicization. The Diocese of San Bernardino petitioned for the dispensation. He has worked as a janitor at a local hospital since 1985.

I remember interviewing Tony before he came to Ontario. There had been rumors concerning his presence at House of Affirmation. From today's vantage point, I now know he was in denial. He felt that he had been falsely accused. It was a different era. The problems that a priest had were handled differently.

I regret that there is so little information. With my best wishes.

Dear Bishop,

Regarding that confidential matter that you asked me to investigate further, I have obtained the following data.

It seems that about 20 years ago, there was a priest stationed here at St. George by the name of Anthony Rodrigue. (I do remember Msgr. Tim and I talking about this person some time ago - oh, perhaps several years back.)

At any rate, according to the story I got from the person who called us about 10 days ago, this Fr. Rodrigue molested his brother. The call came from a Mr. REDACTED REDACTED REDACTED and the one molested was his brother Jacob. Jacob is now 27 years of age, so this means he was about age 7 when these incidents took place. Yes, it seems that there were several occasions of molestation over a period of months.

According to REDA with whom I spoke last evening, the family does NOT want to create problems for the Church; however they are very concerned that this priest would not be continuing to engage in this behavior in some other parish or diocese. I assured him that the priest was not connected in any way to our diocese -- (20 years ago this matter would have been dealt with by the diocese of San Diego.) I told him that many of our priests still have close ties to brother priests in the San Diego diocese, and that I have never heard this person referred to or mentioned in any priestly gatherings. I told him that I was "fairly certain" that he was not practicing in the ministry in San Diego at the present time.

Also, RED mentioned that his brother REDA has had severe emotional problems over the years, and that the family feels that it is because there never was any "closure" put on the case.

Well, that's about all I could gather from our conversation. I hope I handled it correctly.

Dear Bishop Maher:

Bishop Phillip F. Straling has been approached by Father Anthony Rodrigue seeking his assistance with a petition for dispensation from the obligations of priesthood and celibacy from the Holy Father, Pope John Paul II. He has asked me to instruct the case in accord with the Procedural Norms issued by the Sacred Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith (1980; Prot. 128-61).

You knew him as a priest of the Diocese of San Diego, and were aware of some of the difficulties that transpired in his life as a priest, so I thought you might have some personal reflections to offer. I would appreciate any information you could provide concerning his life as a priest in the diocese and the problems that occurred. If there are any documents in the diocesan archives relating to his formation or to his life as a priest, I would truly appreciate having copies of them to instruct the case he has asked us to submit. Psychological testing documents at the time of entrance into the seminary or counselling during the formation years, might also support a deeper understanding of the facts and possibly provide new information that might assist us in preparing this case.



Your Excellency,

I pray this letter finds you in good health and blessed with a fruitful easter season, surrounded by all those who love you and work with you in San Diego. I have sought the assistance of Father George Crespin, Vicar General of the Diocese of Oakland to make sure this letter gets to you directly, because of the sensitivity and confidentiality of its content. What I will share with you is very painful and has taken years of writing and re-writing to get to its present form. Unfortunately, however, I am sure you have heard of cases of this sort before.

In 1976, at thirteen years old, I was sexually molested and taken advantage of by Father Anthony Rodriguez, who was then working at Our Lady of Guadalupe Church in Calexico, my home town. I was in the eighth grade at Our Lady of Guadalupe Academy. Fr. Bud Kaicher and Fr. Barry Vineyard know me very well and can give you a reference on me and my family at any time you request it. They both have presided over the marriage of one or another of my siblings and have been part of our family for many years.

I am writing to you to ask for two things:

- 1) That Father Rodriguez be suspended as a priest and placed in a certified treatment center for pedophiles.
- 2) That the Diocese of San Diego help me with the costs I have already incurred and will incur in the future to deal with this trauma.

What happened? I was sitting outside of school one afternoon as Fr. Rodriguez passed by on his green motorcycle. He was an amiable person; in fact, very friendly and youthful. I was excited to see him on the bike, as most kids are about people with motorcycles. Furthermore, a young priest in a motorcycle, speaking to me made me feel special because I had worked in the church since I was seven years old. My family had been very active as well. I was an altar boy and wanted to be a priest. The idea that a priest could harm me, or was anything but my friend was completely nonexistent. I would have probably done anything he said without seeing a problem.

You are probably aware that for most pious people of the background in which I grew up, a priest is a representative of Christ and unfortunately, most anything is accepted without question that comes from him.

He invited me to ride on the bike and of course I joyfully agreed. We rode to the rectory and he invited me to his room; nothing wrong with all this. I was excited and felt the rectory as part of my home in the same way I felt the Church was my home. Fr.

Rodrigue then invited me to sit in his little guest room and turned on the television. I think it was cartoons I saw. I am not sure. He went to his bedroom and was gone for some time. I heard the shower.

When I next saw him, he walked from his bedroom, naked across the T.V. set, with a towel in hand. He proceeded to lock the door that lead to the courtyard. At this point I felt this was inappropriate, thinking to myself: "What is this grown man doing naked in front of me." I remember the Father then approached me in a very natural way and sat next to me. He was playfully talking with me, probably about my body, though this I do not remember clearly. I do not remember either at what point he began to fondle me. But I do remember it was all in a playful manner the way he undressed me, unzipping my pants, etc., as if saying "this is all very natural." At that point I do not remember the sense of inappropriateness that I had had only a few seconds before, which is a question I have always had. If I felt he was being inappropriate when he appeared naked why couldn't I act on that. And where did that sense of inappropriateness go, once he got physically close? Why couldn't I say no, or walk out, or push him away, etc? What I do remember is that I was later on his bed and was receiving oral sex by him.

I left in a daze with a physical sensation I had never experienced and felt I had been a mischevious partner in something wrong. I remember thinking to myself: "If I say 'I will never tell anyone' I will go crazy and the first thing I will do is run to the nuns and tell them what happened." I had images of me kneeling before Sr. Ana Rosa, the school principal, crying, confessing my sin and exposing a very embarrassing situation for me and the priest. I also felt very strange, as if out of my body and in fact what I decided to do was "just let this experience be there next to me, not repress it or try to deny it," I thought to myself. It would just walk along side of me all my life and I would ignore it, never bothering it so I would not go crazy. Things would be as ussual. As strange as I might have felt however, I returned again to see Fr. Rodriguez. This time it was really a game, and I gave myself to the experience. I even thought, "well if Fr. is making me feel good, I should probably do to him what he is doing to me." But I simply could not do it, so I did not.

Questions arise, why did I not say no? Why did I come back? It seems to me those have little to do with the responsibility neglected and the confidence that was torn away by the actions of Fr. Rodriguez. An adult does not fondle or give oral sex to a thirteen year old boy; at least not in our society, it seems to me. I think this realization broke open in me one morning after serving at Mass. I was putting away my cassock and through the door could see Father Rodriguez speaking to an old lady in his usual friendly way. However, as I looked out I felt a genuine disgust (I did not feel mischievousness, or guilt, or any kind of "partner in crime" sensation). I felt disgust. I think I realized at this point what was happening. That sense of inappropriateness came back. And it made sense, since I was not in his room or alone with him. "What a scumbag," I thought to myself, of the priest. I never got near his room again.

For years I have felt very angry and disgusted at our church. This has only manifested itself in my family, however and with close friends. This is true even though I have always remained at the service of others from within the Church. For a long time I denied the experience and actually, I have been unconscious as to where my rage comes from. I have also felt guilty, that I have been quiet for so long, as a co-conspiritor, though consciously I realize I was the child and Fr. Rodrigue was the adult. It is only after many years of service to the community (work with war trauma in Central America and with victims of violence and abuse here in the states), in my relations with other priests and in discernment of my own life that I have come to the conclusion that, in fact, I was 13 years old, blindly faithful to the Catholic Church. The priest was the adult. Would it be correct for me as an adult now, to walk out naked in front of somebody else's 13 year old child and start playing with his genitiles and his body? It was his natural way of approaching this whole thing that I believe allowed me to simply follow him, not only once but twice. The truth is that I have very little faith in anyone these days.

Now, after years of working with battered women, victims of torture and war trauma, earthquake survivors, victims of rape, I have come to learn that it is typical for people who suffer abuse to separate from themselves psychologically when they are in the midst of an abusive situation, which is exactly what I did. It makes sense to me now, why it is that my sense of inappropriateness disappeared, why I could say to myself that I would let the experience be alongside of me, without dealing with it. In fact, I pretty much forgot the whole experience. I certainly never felt overwhelmed by it. I just let it be there like I proposed to myself.

I almost forgot about it, but in 1988 I was working for the Archdiocese of San Salvador and in the process I was among many who were harassed, shot at and beaten by the military of that country. I saw human beings being treated like dogs, eighteen year old girls beaten with rifles, infants torn from their hands. On a certain day I was walking with a workmate and I began to sob. I could not stop crying and I did not know what to say as she sat with me. But the words that kept coming to my mind was that it was not right that my innocence was taken away. I kept seeing Fr. Rodrigue thinking "no one had the right to take my innocence away like that." Then I realized where God was leading me with all this. After all those years of denial, it took me going to El Salvador, into a situation of war, seeing others being so cruelly abused and me being beaten over the head with a rifle for me to accept the harm that had been done to me by Fr. Rodrigue.

In El Salvador, I started slowly delapidating. My listening skills diminished almost completely, my energy level declined and I knew what I needed to do was come back to the States and deal with my life now. And even as I write this, as you can see, it has taken me five and a half years to get to the point of finally writing this letter in its final form. Denial has a very powerful paralyzing effect.

I am 31 years old, married and have a daughter now. One thing I have learned in my life is that I will always be affected by this trauma that I suffered in the same way as one can never truly recover a lost limb. But the only way I can heal so as to not pass its effects to my daughter is by dealing with this situation. I began dealing with it by seeing a therapist. For several years I have done that; once, as soon as I returned from El Salvador, for about a year and a half. I resumed again in 1991 until a few months ago. Through therapy, God has brought me now to this step: presenting this reality to you, as the head of the Diocese where the abuse happened. I stopped going to therapy because I was finding myself stuck writing this letter and decided I would spend no more time or money on therapy until I finished the letter. I trust in God all will work towards some sort of healing of myself, of Father Rodriguez of the many children whom I am sure he has hurt and of the Dioceses where he has committed such damage.

I say I am sure that he has harmed many other children, because after he molested me, I remember several friends making comments about how that priest was a pervert. A couple of years ago I was talking with my brother about this and he commented, "Oh yes, everybody knew that priest was a pervert."—Unfortunately, what he meant by everybody was all our peers, not the adults. My effort today is to communicate it to you because you can do something about it. I have heard Fr. Rodriguez went to work in the Diocese of San Bernardino. I do not know where he is now nor his status. Maybe some other child had the courage to expose his actions long ago. If this is the case then you have one more case for your records. If not, I would urge you to take action. You have the opportunity to put a stop to the victimization of other children and of the priest himself. For this reason I ask for his suspension as well as medical, psychological and spiritual treatment.

I ask for support for myself because, the denial which helped me survive as a teenager and even as a young adult, has hindered me in many ways as an adult. I see my life now depending on my ability to deal with this issue. In many ways I feel as if my life stopped at thirteen. I superficially dealt with it during the last eighteen years. But internally I glossed over much of what has happened to me. I work for the Church in several ministries. My spiritual formation was in my community and family and as an adult as a Jesuit for four years. I am still very much guided Ignatian spirituality. The Jesuits also gave me the possibility to travel and minister to people through Panamá, El Salvador, Guatemala and Northern Mexico. I seem outgoing and open to others and as Fr. Bud, Fr. Barry and Fr. George Crespin can tell you I have done a decent job in several areas of ministry. But I feel very stuck internally. I over extend myself. I have an incredible difficulty concentrating. I forget commitments (I even forgot to go the baptism of my own godson, who ended up not being my godson because of this). I believe I suffer from a mild but constant depression. This issue has caused me many problems in relationships and deeply affects my relationship with my wife.

It is incredible how evil and dirty one feels at the most profound level when something like this has happened. It is felt at

such a deep subconscious level, it is no wonder most people do not end up dealing with it. The sense of shame is destroyed and so is the sense of trust. I have seen people jump from relationship to relationship, employment to employment, etc. always wondering what it is they are looking for, when in reality, our pain is inside and we cannot deal with it. So many people get hurt in the process, especially those we reject because we cannot accept ourselves, thus do not allow anyone else to accept us. I am one of those people who has followed this pattern just mentioned. A vicious and contradicting circle begins and it is very hard to get out of it. It is a contradicting response to a contradicting event: a person you trust with your life, who represents an entire institution which is supposed to guide you, betrays all it professes in his behaviour toward you. I now have had to come back to my thirteen year old stage and expose what happened.

I have been the typical victim. Typical in my silence. Most people stay silent. I remember at one point Fr. Rodrigue took a group of boys swimming and upon returning, one of them, a friend, told me "that priest is a pervert, he was reaching for several of the boys' (testicles) under the water." At this point I knew I was a "victim" and that there were for sure others. Yet I did nothing. I feel I have committed the sin of omission. Even though one of my main reasons for writing this letter is to prevent the abuse of other children by this priest, it is with much shame that I do it, for it has taken me so long to accomplish this. I wish I had been able to do so earlier. For years I have been numb regarding this experience. The thought of not having said anything, knowing that many other children might have been molested as well, only increased my embarrassment and paralizis. I remember first beginning to write this letter at age 26, thirteen years after the abuse. I called Fr. Bud Kaicher, a friend, to tell him about it. I did not reach him and I did not call back.

However, since I came back from El Salvador, I have had an open and continual communication with Fr. George Crespin. It has been his close friendship, support and insistence, along with that of my wife and a couple of other close friends, that finally gave me that last convincing push to write this letter.

I would like to repeat my two requests your excellency:

- 1) That Father Rodrigue be suspended as a priest and placed in a certified treatment center for pedophiles.
- 2) That the Diocese of San Diego help me with the costs I have already incurred and will incur in the future to deal with this trauma. This second one is not a demand. If it is possible, the money would help.

I urge you once again, however, to take action, your excellency, and would encourage you to contact the people I have mentioned so you can get references on my person, to confirm that what I am telling you is the truth. I have been involved in the Catholic Church for most of my entire life. My intention is nothing other than to get the truth to you and get some support from the Diocese to cover some of the costs I have incurred in relation to this trauma. However, I have also contacted a lawyer because I know there are always legal matters involved in this kind of situation.



**INCARDINATION IN THE DIOCESE OF SAN BERNARDINO**

- A. Non-incardinated priests are eligible to request incardination in the Diocese after serving a minimum of three years in the Diocese.
- B. Although there may be exceptions in particular circumstances, a priest seeking incardination will be expected to have served in at least two different local assignments in the Diocese.
- C. The Personnel Board and/or its delegate shall be responsible for making a recommendation to the Bishop regarding the acceptance or non-acceptance of a priest's request for incardination. Such recommendations will be based on:
  - (1) a letter of permission from the petitioner's ordinary or religious superior stating permission for the petitioner to seek incardination into the Diocese, and attesting that the petitioner is a priest in good standing in the diocese or congregation
  - (2) a resume written by the petitioner including:
    - (a) a personal history, date and place of birth, upbringing, schools attended and degrees received, significant illness, special talents or skills in the ministry, any physical and/or emotional problems, if any.
    - (b) A certificate of health from a doctor or doctors appointed by the Diocese
    - (c) Ministerial history - when and where ordained, assignments held, reasons for transfers, etc
    - (d) Reasons for requesting incardination in the Diocese
    - (e) Reasons for leaving former diocese or congregation
    - (f) Types of assignments for which he feels suited
    - (g) Types of assignments for which he feels unsuited

- (h) Certification of having joined Social Security and enrolled in the priest's pension fund. Or, absolute certification of being cared for in another plan other than the two cited in the last sentence. A priest upon coming into the Diocese of San Bernardino is to submit a signed letter stating that he is a member of social security and wishes to join the pension plan.

(3) Letters of Recommendation

- (a) A letter from each of the pastors or superiors of the institutions in which the petitioner has served in the Diocese, evaluating the priestliness and ministerial skills of the petitioner, and indicating the writer's willingness to be associated with the petitioner in the ministry.
- (b) Letters from at least three other priests of the Diocese evaluating the priestliness and ministerial skills of the petitioner, and indicating the writer's willingness to be associated with the petitioner in the ministry
- (4) Final decision on the request for incardination is the responsibility of the Bishop in consultation with the Consultors
- (5) At the end of five years of service in the Diocese, any priest from another Diocese, or any exclaustrated religious intending to seek incardination in the Diocese must apply for incardination. If incardination is refused, the priest will either return to his own Diocese or religious community, or if permitted by the Bishop to continue working in the Diocese of San Bernardino he must have the proper authorization of his own Bishop or religious superiors.
- (6) In the case of a negative decision on his request for incardination, the non-incardinated priest has the option of requesting a hearing before the Bishop and/or his delegate or the Personnel Board.
- (7) After three years service, a non-incardinated priest is to ask for an evaluation.

I. Temporary Faculties

1. The Episcopal Vicar of the area is the one who grants faculties to priests who will be in the Diocese for a period less than two months.
2. The Episcopal Vicar will forward to the Pastoral Office, c/o Co-Chancellor for Pastoral Affairs, a notice stating he has granted faculties to a priest. In it the Episcopal Vicar will state:
  - A. Name of the priest.
  - B. What faculties have been granted.
  - C. What Diocese or Religious Order the priest belongs.
  - D. The reason why the priest is in the Diocese.

II. Long-Term Faculties

1. Request for Long-term faculties, defined as for a period of more than two months, must be obtained from the Pastoral Office.
2. Request for Long-term faculties must contain information listed in paragraph I. (2) above.

**I. Preamble**

- a. The priestly ministry in the Diocese of San Bernardino is, and has been enhanced by the service of many non-incardinated priests who have associated themselves with the priests of the Diocese in the service of the people. As a more comprehensive personnel policy governing the service of Diocesan priests emerges, it is important that it also reflect the service provided by priests who are not incardinated into the Diocese or assigned to a service in the Diocese by their religious superiors with the approval of the Bishop. It is the purpose of the following to provide a policy whereby such services may be utilized to the best advantage of the people ministered to and the priests desiring to provide such ministry.
- b. Definition of Terms - For the purpose of this policy statement, non-incardinated priests are considered to be:
  - (1) Clergy incardinated in other Dioceses who wish to serve in the Diocese of San Bernardino.
  - (2) Religious clergy other than those regularly assigned by their own religious superiors to a parish or apostolate staffed by their religious community with the approval of the church, and who wish to serve in the Diocese of San Bernardino.

**II. For the purpose of this policy statement, service in the Diocese of San Bernardino is construed to mean the fact or intention of receiving an official assignment in the Diocese. It does not refer to those priests who serve temporarily in a substitute capacity, e.g., supplying for summer vacation or short sabbatical leaves. Ordinarily, such temporary services should not extend beyond two months.**

**III. Acceptance and Assignment of Non-Incardinated Priests**

1. Full authority and competency for acceptance, assignment and continuation of service of non-incardinated clergy pertains to the Bishop of San Bernardino and to those persons or committees with whom he chooses to share the responsibility for this work.

2. The personnel board of the Diocese and/or its delegates shall be responsible for:
  - a) Receiving all requests for assignment and placement from non-incardinated priests.
  - b) Interviewing priests requesting to serve in the Diocese.
  - c) Making recommendations to the Bishop concerning the assignment and evaluation of all non-incardinated priests.

**IV. Documentation Required:**

1. Letter of permission from the priest's ordinary or religious superior clearly stating that the priest is in good standing in his Diocese or congregation and that he now has permission to work in the Diocese.
2. A resume written by the priest seeking service in the Diocese to include:
  - a. Personal history, date and place of birth, upbringing, schools attended and degrees received, significant illnesses, special talents or skills in ministry, physical and emotional health at the present moment.
  - b. Ministerial history - where and when ordained, number and type of assignments held, reasons for transfer.
  - c. Reasons for requesting to serve in the Diocese.
  - d. Types of assignment for which he feels suited.
  - e. Types of assignments for which he feels unsuited.
3. Letters of Recommendation from the petitioner's ordinary or major religious superior containing a statement concerning his physical and emotional health as well as a statement of the petitioners prior service.

**V. Criteria for assignment of Non-Incarnated Priests**

1. In the assignment of non-incardinated priests, the personnel board, in its recommendation to the Bishop will follow the same criteria for procedures employed in the assignment of incardinated priests.
2. The service of non-incardinated priests shall be reviewed annually.
3. Non-incardinated priests who are not assigned by the Bishop must have their residency in the rectory approved by the Bishop after a period of two months. The residence is subject to an annual review.

All priests of the Diocese of San Bernardino shall be enrolled in the United States Social Security Plan. Those who have not joined are asked to do so. Those who sometime ago waived their right to join Social Security, should request a setting aside of waiver. Those who waived their right to Social Security have until early February 1979 to join.

Priests are asked to join Social Security not only for some retirement benefits, but mainly for the medical benefits that can be obtained after the age of 65. Our Diocesan Health Insurance Plan presumes that a priest will be covered by Social Security after age 65. The Diocese is not covered and cannot assume the high costs of major medical expenses for priests over age 65 who did not join Social Security.

All priests of the Diocese are to be members of the Diocesan Retirement Plan. Each priest shall contribute \$150 per year, and the parish or institution to which the priest is assigned \$191. The Diocese shall contribute additional monies for each priest in the Retirement Plan to the Pension Fund. These are monies collected (2%) which is part of the parish annual assessment. The projected total amount for each priest for 1979, due to the pension plan is \$948. (Priest \$150 - Parish \$191 - Diocese \$607)

A priest coming to the Diocese of San Bernardino and seeking incardination must be eligible to be a member of the retirement plan. If not, a priest will not be incardinated unless he can give proof of adequate retirement monies from previous assignments or other sources.

The Diocese of San Bernardino provides a health insurance plan for priests. Each parish or institution shall pay \$200 per year for each priest on the health insurance plan. The Diocese of San Bernardino shall subsidize the additional premiums and the portion of self insurance.

There is a \$100 deduction each year. The health insurance plan covers the next \$900 of expenses. For medical expenses between \$1,000 and \$5,000, the priest pays 20% of the actual cost. All bills for medical expenses over \$5,000 and under \$100,000 are covered 100% by insurance companies. For the exact items covered by the health insurance companies, please consult their brochures. These may be obtained through the Diocesan Office. Any priest not being able to pay the 20% of medical costs between \$1,000 and \$5,000 should contact the Diocesan office for a loan of such monies.

Religious priests serving in the Diocese of San Bernardino or priests not incardinated can be included on the Diocesan Health Insurance plan if they have a full time assignment from the Diocese of San Bernardino and have a medical report of good health from a physician designated by the Diocese.

All priests are to be on Social Security so they can avail themselves of Social Security Benefits after age 65.

Each priest of the Diocese of San Bernardino is to have a Last Will and Testament on file at the Diocesan Pastoral Center. It is recommended that the Will be drawn up by an attorney, as many. Holographic Wills can be rendered invalid or contested, because of irregularities. A priest in sending his Last Will and Testament to the Diocesan Office, should send it in a sealed envelope so marked as "Last Will and Testament" with name and date. If you presently have a Will on file with the Diocese, please make a note that you would wish to have the old Last Will and Testament returned to you.

The Last Will and Testaments of all priests presently in the new Diocese of San Bernardino, are presently on file at the Diocesan Pastoral Center in San Bernardino.

We draw your attention to the new title that should be used in the Last Will and Testament if you are making any gifts or bequests to the Diocese. The proper legal title is The Roman Catholic Bishop of San Bernardino, Corporation Sole, The Most Reverend Phillip F. Straling, Incumbent. Priests who were part of the San Diego Diocese, and having left properties or other bequests to the Diocese of San Diego, should change their Last Will and Testament, life insurance policies, and any other documents which might have left properties to the old Diocese.

Some priests in order to help pay their seminary tuition in years past, have made out life insurance policies payable to the Roman Catholic Bishop of San Diego. We would remind you to change the beneficiary of these policies.

Priests are also asked to run a note in their Sunday Bulletins for several weeks reminding the laity of their parish of the change of name for gifts or bequests that have been left to the Diocese or the parish. They should be reminded that the legal title by which gifts can be accepted is the Roman Catholic Bishop of San Bernardino, a Corporation Sole, The Most Reverend Phillip F. Straling, Incumbent. If the properties are to be left for the benefit of the parish, the legal Diocesan title should be used, then noting that they request the Diocese to use the gifts or bequests for a particular parish or institution. Gifts or bequests made solely in the name of the Church or institution are not considered legal entities capable of receiving gifts and could possibly be challenged and lost to the Church or institution.

Any questions regarding the above matters, can be referred to Father Peter Covas or Mr. Jack Clinton at the Diocesan Pastoral Center.

PREAMBLE

1. Priests are taken from among men and appointed for men in all things which pertain to God, in order to offer gifts and sacrifices for sin. (Heb.5:1) Priests "have as their primary duties the proclamation of the gospel of God to all" (Vat.II Decree on the Ministry and Life of Priests C.11.) Diocesan priests are ordained to collaborate with their bishop in carrying on the mission of the Chruch. (CF. Const on the Church, Numbers 13 and 28)
2. From the above it follows that:
  - a. In serving the needs of God's people, the priest should experience a reasonable sense of personal fulfillment both in the use of his talents, and in the priestly associations he encounters in his assignments. Every priest should be free to express his desire for positions he feels he is best suited to fill and to seek assignments which includes priests with whom he can work effectively and comfortably. To the extent that it is possible, personal fulfillment can and should be a part of priestly service to God's people.
  - b. Personal fulfillment of the priests can never be at the expense of the well being of the Christian Community. The common good of God's people must always be the framework within the personal fulfillment of the priest. "The Son of Man has come not to be served but to serve." (Mark 10:45). Hence, the needs of the Church must take precedence over the desire of the individual priest, as priest and bishop together serve the people of God.

THE PERSONNEL BOARD

The Bishop is solely responsible for all priests in the Diocese. After hearing the recommendation of the personnel board, he will personally make the assignments of priests. The existence of the personnel board indicates efficiency in the discharge of this responsibility.

Every priest has the right to approach the bishop or the personnel board concerning his assignment. The board is bound to secrecy and each priest's right to privacy will be scrupulously observed.

1. Functions of the Personnel Board
  - a. To assist the bishop in the assignment of the clergy and personnel in the service of the Diocese.
  - b. In the fulfillment of this task of assisting that bishop, the board will:
    1. Develop and utilize every possible means to know the

priests of the Diocese, to determine their interest, their strengths and weaknesses, and areas of competence, so that they would be fulfilled as persons and the work of the church be furthered.

2. Conduct consultations before recommending to the Bishop specific assignments.
  3. Gather data continually on priest personnel, needs of the Diocese and the more effective placement of clergy personnel.
  4. Encourage priests to make full use of their personal talents, to continually up-date their pastoral knowledge through study and other progress.
  5. To develop and propose, and after approval, to evaluate periodically personnel procedures that will be helpful to the priests of the Diocese.
  6. To initiate and sponsor new ministries while furthering the established ones.
2. Make Up of the Personnel Board
- a. The personnel board shall consist of 7 elected priests plus the 2 ex officio members, the Chancellor for Pastoral Affairs, the Chancellor for Hispanic Affairs.
  - b. The term is for 3 years with eligibility to be elected for a second 3 year term. No man can serve more than two consecutive terms.  
(for the first term, members will serve two, three and four year terms as determined by casting of lots. This will allow new members to be added on an annual basis.)
  - c. The personnel board is designed so as to represent different categories of Diocese priests
    1. One priest from each deanery.
    2. One priest who is an associate pastor.  
(a priest who has been ordained from 1 to 12 years, is not a pastor or in special works.)
    3. One priest in special works.
  - d. The chairman of the personnel board is selected among the 7 elected members. The personnel board will meet monthly. A quorum consists of 4 members. The Bishop has the right to be at any or all meetings as he so desires.
  - e. Priests may approach the personnel board as a group or deal with any individual member of the board.
  - f. The personnel board is bound to confidentiality concerning any information that affects the personal life or reputation of the priest.

1. At age 65 a priest with the approval of the Bishop may request retirement status.
2. At age 70 retirement is recommended but may be waived at the reiree's request and the Bishop's approval.
3. At age 75 retirement is mandatory.

It is to be noted that a priest retiring from active duty with its entailed responsibilities should be encouraged to, and it is recommended, that he make himself available at least for limited pastoral work of his choosing.

PROCEDURE:

Phase I - Deanery Level

1. All Diocesan Incardinated priests on active duty will select a priest from their deanery to represent them on the Personnel Board.
  - a. First step - Priests are to select 3 eligible priests on first ballot.
  - b. Ballot is returned to Episcopal Vicar who with two other priests of the Deanery will tabulate votes.
  - c. The three priests receiving the highest number of votes will have their names on the second ballot.
  - d. Each priest is to select one name from the top three and return the ballot to the Episcopal Vicar who with two other priests will tabulate the vote.
  - e. The priest receiving the highest vote will represent the Deanery.

Phase II - Associate Pastors and Special Works Priests

1. Associate pastors will select one from their ranks to represent them on the Personnel Board.
2. Those in special works will select one priest to represent them on the Personnel Board.
3. Ballots for the above two categories will be sent out by the Chancellor for Pastoral Affairs.

Phase III - Election for the three above categories will be complete on or before May 31, 1979.

Phase IV - The elected members to the Personnel Board will take Office effective September 1, 1979.

Phase V

1. The priest elected to represent each deanery will draw lots for the initial term of office. Two will have a 3 year term, two will have a 2 year term, and one will have a 1 year term.
2. The Associate Pastor and the special works priest will draw lots for a two year term or a three year term.

The policy established on July 1, 1976 is to be kept in effect.

A. Appointment of Pastors

1. A priest selected to serve as a pastor will make a minimum commitment of three years in his parish.
2. At the end of the third year and continuing through the sixth year, the burden is on the Bishop and the Personnel Board why a pastor should be transferred.
3. After the sixth year, the burden shifts to the priest himself who must indicate substantial reasons why he should remain in the same assignment. After the sixth year a pastor should request renewal of his commitment on an annual basis.
4. Nine years of service will be the normal term of office for pastors in the Diocese of San Bernardino.
5. Nothing in the foregoing statements of policy shall preclude the possibility of individual requests for a change of assignment, or requests from the Bishop and/or the Board to consider a transfer after the minimum term of office (3 years) is completed.
6. Pastors who have reached their sixtieth birthday as of July 1, 1976 will be allowed in their present assignment until retirement age.
7. Pastors mentioned in #6 who request and are given a transfer become subject to regular appointment system.

1. It will be the policy of the Diocese that a priest to be appointed as an associate pastor will in all cases make a minimum commitment of two years to the parish community he will serve.
2. After the end of the second year and continuing through the fourth year, the burden will be on the Bishop and the Clergy Personnel Board to show cause why an associate pastor should be transferred.
3. Four years will be the normal term of office for an associate pastor to serve a parish community in the Diocese of San Bernardino.

This policy does not preclude individual requests for transfer by priests nor requests by the Bishop and Clergy Personnel Board to consider the possibility of a move after the minimum two year term is completed.

MESSAGE FROM BISHOP STRALING

Dear Catholic Educators:

A new calendar year has begun, but as educators we find ourselves at a midway point in the academic school year. I pray that this break for Christmas and New Year's has given you the necessary rejuvenation in body and spirit to resume the important task of Catholic education.

I am pleased with the progress we are making in education as we begin our new diocese. We are getting ourselves organized under the able leadership of Sister Charlotte Ell and the cooperation and help you have given her. We must continue to explore new and better ways to provide Catholic education for our young people.

At the principals' meeting in the beginning of the school year and at other gatherings, I have stated what I would like to see as our goals in Catholic education and the objectives we must pursue. Our schools must be truly Catholic. They must not be just private schools, an alternative to public education or merely Christian schools. Our schools must not become a haven for those who seek integration nor for only the rich and middle class. The opposite must be true, we must seek out the poor and underprivileged of our society.

In the last 15 years, fewer religious are available to teach in our Catholic schools. In fact, a number of our Catholic schools have no religious on the faculty. This has been a time of transition as academically well-qualified laity have assumed positions of leadership either as principal or teacher in our Catholic school system.

I am concerned, however, that some of our lay teachers and principals coming into the Catholic school system have not been properly prepared to teach religion. Some candidates have not been properly screened as to their spirit and ability to give Christian witness that are so essential in the making of a Catholic school. Some lay teachers have been fearful in assuming responsibility and have left the teaching of religion to a few religious who might still remain on the school staff.

New faculty members being hired to staff our Catholic schools must not only have top academic qualifications and teaching skills, but must be prepared and have the ability to teach religion and be a Christian witness in the classroom and school. All teachers and principals are to have or are to be in the process of acquiring a credential in religious education. The superintendent of Catholic schools will follow the guidelines and norms set up by the Catholic Bishops of the State of California for a credential in religious education. The superintendent will also give information as to the requirements for this credential and where classes or workshops in religious education can be obtained. Principals and teachers already in our Catholic school system who do not as yet have a credential in religious education, are to obtain one as soon as possible. Once a credential in religious education has been obtained, there is to be an annual updating to keep this credential valid.

The priests of the parish, or the priest in nearby parishes, if the Catholic school serves several parishes, are to be involved in the school's religious education program. The parish priest should visit the classroom at least once every two weeks, or even once a week if possible. There are to be Children's liturgies according to age groupings. These liturgies should be well planned by teachers, priests and children. There should be an involvement of the children in the liturgy through the use of music and other activities that will help them to pray and appreciate the liturgy.

Instruction in religion should be a daily event. It should not be pre-empted by what some would call "more important subjects."

The Christian witness given by priests, teachers, and principal is most important. The witness we give to the children will be a sign of the importance and validity of the religious instruction we provide. "Do as I say, not as I do," cannot be a part of a Catholic educational program.

Schools should encourage the involvement of parents and family in the religious education of children. Without the help and support of parents, much of the good teaching done by Catholic schools can be lost when a child returns home. We must not forget the instruction to parents in the baptismal rite of their children. "Parents are to be the first and the best teachers of their children." Some parishes, in conjunction with the CCD Program have initiated a "Family Religious Education Program." Parents are instructed on how they can give religious education to their own children, tying in with what they would receive in the classroom of a Catholic school or CCD Program. Such programs strengthen the family and can greatly reinforce the instruction a child receives in a religion class or in the celebration of the liturgy.

A major problem facing our parents and the Catholic school system

is the rising cost of education. How can we make Catholic education something our parents can afford, pay our teachers and staff a living wage and continue to offer high academic standards. I believe we must first be open and honest with our parents and parishioners as to the actual cost of education. The educational cost charged our parents should be computed as to what it actually costs to educate each child. This may be a shock to some families, especially to those who have several children in a school. We should ask parents to pay the full cost of educating their children. We also have the obligation to assist those families who would find it impossible to send their child to a Catholic school because of the number of children in the family or because of a low income. Each school should have a tuition assistance plan to aid such families. Tuition assistance is not to be viewed as charity, but rather as a total community response in helping to provide Catholic education for all children.

Tuition assistance monies can be obtained through special fund raising programs, bingo or monies offered from the parish tithe plan. I believe that if our people know the facts about the true cost of education today, those who can afford more, will pay their fair share of their children's education. For those needing tuition assistance, we can call on the whole community to assist. Keeping our schools open for all of our children, especially the poor and the underprivileged is a parish and community responsibility.

My thanks to all who through their dedication and hard work have contributed to the success of our Catholic school system in our diocese. Many have made great sacrifices including our parents, faculty, and parishes to provide the best academic and spiritual training for our youth. In this spirit, tradition and faith we must continue to offer the very best to our youth today.

All monies not needed for the regular operational expenses of a parish or institution are to be deposited at the Diocesan Pastoral Center.

The Diocese shall have the policy that all monies on deposit at the Diocesan Pastoral Center shall be paid upon demand to a parish or institution up to \$10,000. These monies could be used for operational expenses or repairs, etc.

The expenditure of more than \$10,000 on any project or parish or institutional improvements requires the approval of the Diocesan Pastoral Center. If monies are to be used for building or improvements, such requests shall be reviewed by the Building Commission.

All major building projects shall be presented to the Building Commission for their approval and shall be then put on a list of approved projects.

The interest rate to be paid to those who have monies on deposit, will now be 6% and to parishes or institutions having borrowed money, will pay 7%.

It is hoped that the above policies will encourage parishes to deposit their surplus monies which are over and above those monies needed for regular operational expenses with the diocese. In return, this will allow the diocese to have monies to loan for development of parishes and other institutional projects.

If any pastor has questions or problems with the above policy and adjustments need to be made, they should contact the Chancellor of Financial Affairs, Father Peter Covas.

This policy is effective July 1, 1979.

The Diocese of San Bernardino is presently adjusting to the amount of monies that parishes have on deposit and to the demands that are being made from presently approved building projects. As of this date, all the monies due to the Diocese of San Bernardino have not yet been received from the Diocese of San Diego. These monies will be received in the near future, but presently make it difficult to meet present bills of projects already approved.

Projects that have been approved prior to the formation of the new Diocese of San Bernardino are allowed to continue their building program to the amount specified. Any over runs must be approved in advance by the Diocesan Pastoral Center.

Presently, the Diocese in not having all the monies due to it at this time, finds it difficult to even meet the present commitments that have been made. For this reason, a moratorium is placed on all future building until the monies that are on deposit with the Diocese can be established and are available for future expansion.

The Diocese will follow the list established by the Building Commission and it will begin with those projects that have from 75 to 100 percent of the monies on deposit for their building program. As monies on deposit increase, we will again return to the policy that parishes must have at least 50% of the monies needed for a building project.

To build up the monies that the Diocese will have on hand to loan for new Diocesan Building Projects, parishes are asked to put all the monies that are not needed for their operational expenses on deposit with the Diocese of San Bernardino. Parishes that presently have loans from the Diocese are asked to pay back on these loans at regular intervals. One problem which hinders our future building, is that some parishes are not making regular payments which are substantially reducing their parish debts. The Co-Chancellor of Financial Affairs will be reviewing all of the records, and calling upon those parishes which have not shown a steady reduction of their parish debt.

In all future loans, made by the Diocese, an agreement is to be made by the parish upon reviewing their financial assets, and the amount of money that they are borrowing, of a regular loan repayment of principal and interest. In this way, parish debts can be paid as soon as possible thus enabling them to take on other building projects or other parishes to begin their building.

Some parishes, particularly some of the older parishes without great financial responsibilities and not having a building project, have waived their interest coming from monies that they have on deposit. Parishes that do not need this extra money, will greatly help the building program.

1. The Church has never held that there was anything intrinsically wrong in the cremation of the human body. As a matter of fact, the Church readily consented to it in the interest of public welfare.
2. The Church's opposition to cremation was based mainly on two points:
  - a) The Judeo-Christian tradition has always regarded burial as the most respectful means of disposing of the body of a deceased person.
  - b) The custom of cremation, especially by certain European groups, was used to deny the immortality of the soul and the eternal destiny of man.
3. Today the historical identification of cremation with an atheistic denial of immortality generally no longer exists in contemporary society.
4. The Church of July 5, 1963 issued a decree modifying its opposition to cremation.
5. The basic idea of the Decree:
  - 1) Burial of the dead should remain the practice of the Church unless serious reasons dictate cremation.
  - 2) Such reasons would be:
    - a) Cremation is the custom of the country;
    - b) Existence of serious public danger: disease, plague, war, etc;
    - c) Ground not available for cemeteries at reasonable cost or a country decrees all available land has to be used for the living.
  - 3) The Church tolerates cremation. The following concessions exemplify this:
    - a) Persons who are living and have taken legal steps to have their bodies cremated are not to be denied the sacraments.
    - b) Christian funeral services are not to be denied to a person who specified in a will the desire to be cremated at death;
    - c) Official liturgical rites, while not permitted at the crematory, may be held in the Church prior to the cremation of the body.

QUESTION: "Should the body be present in the Church for the liturgical ceremony?"

This is a PASTORAL QUESTION and should be settled at the local level. The presence of the body during the Mass would be ideal, but there are circumstances that would preclude this, e.g. cost, cremation plans, etc.

NOTE: No definitive directives have been given by regional or national groups of Bishops. This may well come in the future.

CAUTION If the purpose of cremation is to deny the immortality of the soul or the life hereafter, then Church Services are to be denied.

CHAPLAIN FUNERAL POLICY AT MARCH AFB, CALIFORNIA

The Air Force Chaplain Service considers it a privilege to provide a total pastoral ministry to the members of the Air Force community. This ministry attempts to match personnel and resources to the particular environment of each Air Force community. Therefore, the following statement is provided to assure a realistic policy for funeral support in the Southern California area:

1. Chaplains will provide military funeral support within their capabilities upon request of the next of kin of an active duty or retired member of the Air Force. However, civilian clergy may be substituted for an Air Force chaplain and families are encouraged to use their own minister, priest, or rabbi.
2. Chaplain support will include active duty chaplains assigned at March AFB and Reserve, Air National Guard and retired chaplains in the immediate area.
3. All requests for chaplain support will be made through the March AFB Mortuary, Affairs Office.
4. Requests for chaplain support not covered by the above policy will be resolved by the installation chaplain.

The parish church is the gathering place of the Christian Community and the ordinary place for administration of the sacraments and the celebration of the Liturgy. The proper place for the exchanging of wedding vows is in the church.

For pastoral reasons, and in particular, where one of the parties is a non-catholic, the marriage may take place in a Protestant Church. The couple should write a letter giving the reasons and petitioning for the marriage to take place in a Protestant Church. This petition is to be sent to the Chancellor of Pastoral Affairs along with the priest's own personal recommendation. If the Catholic Priest performs the ceremony, permission is to be obtained from the Chancellor of Pastoral Affairs. If a Protestant Minister performs the ceremony, a dispensation from form is also required. The record of a marriage taking place in a Protestant Church is to be recorded in the parish in whose territory the Protestant Church is located.

It is diocesan policy that NO weddings are allowed at public wedding chapels in the Diocese of San Bernardino: The Mission Inn Chapel, Assistencia, Edwards Mansion Chapel, etc. Permission will not be granted to any priest to perform a wedding in these chapels.

The diocese for serious and good pastoral reasons will grant permission for marriages to take place in a suitable home or other private place. It is stressed that the church is still considered to be a proper and most desirable place for all weddings.

Permission will NOT be granted for weddings in out-door places which are considered to be public, such as parks, country clubs, etc.

Permission for marriages in a suitable home or other private place is to be sought from the Chancellor of Pastoral Affairs. If the place of marriage is outside the priest's own parish jurisdiction, permission of the proper pastor is to be sought.

This policy became effective September 1, 1979.

CALEXICO — In the presence of a Bishop from across the border, the Imperial order of other monsignors, priests, nuns and hundreds of his parishioners, Father Luis Balderas was invested as Rev. Monsignor.

The "man for all seasons" as Msgr. Balderas was called by Bishop Maher, "is the man whose gift of faith demands a personal response." Msgr. Balderas gave thanks in his personal relationship to Our Lady.

The Bishop also praised the pastor of Calexico as a "man for all seasons, a man for God for others."

The Knights of Columbus 4th Degree honor guard marched in formation in the procession to and from the church, and the adult choir and mariachi band sang the hymns in English and Spanish.



Finally the Biblical bread was carried to the altar, followed by the bread, wine and water of the sacrifice. The bread was offered in memory of the First Vatican Council declaring the day "Msgr. Balderas Day" was also included in the offering.

Following a reception after the main ceremony the Estudiantinas from Vincent Memorial High School presented the two bishops and the monsignor on the steps of the rectory in the darkness of the November night.




