- I called to question him about a vision bill that has a balance of \$24.84. He is under the impression to always mail his Bills to HR for payment, even if the balance is his responsibility, and the Diocese will take of it. Is his statement correct? All the bills in the past that he sent to me have been taken care of by the Insurance's leaving a zero balance for him. I called the doctor's office on this current vision bill which they state Medicare paid a portion and has sent the balance to Gallagher for payment on 3/24/05, the bill remains outstanding. I left a message with Gallagher to see if they paid. If Gallagher says they won't pay the balance than do I tell Fr. James to pay or is his above statement true that we will automatically pay for him?
- I called to question him about all his bills that combined have a balance of \$145.00. His response is that he thought he needed to send all bills to HR for payment and also mentioned how can he be left paying these bills when the Diocese took him off payroll and pension, while still working full time at Good Shepherd parish. I told him that I would have to talk with the Chancellor's office to see if their was an arrangement made to give him this impression (I did not say all that to him just that I would call him back on it) that we are to pay his bills. If not I need to mail all these bills with a note stating that any balance remaining after all insurances has processed would be his responsibility to pay.
- Fr. Frank Sierra Out of all these bills I have only 2 left have a remaining balance of \$824.37 and the other \$157,871.60. This is the case were I don't think Fr. Sierra understands what has happened and does not know how to fix it. He needs someone who can call on his behalf because Medicare will not talk to me unless I have power of attorney. The hospital says he only has Medicare part B. I don't know what happed to part A so I called Little Flower Haven and spoke with a lady that said would help call for him while Fr. Sierra is on the other line giving permission to her so that she can fix this problem. In the meantime these bills are still outstanding and Gallagher sent us a fax indicating that Medicare denied charges and therefore Gallagher can't pay either. What can we do to help him? I know that you are trying to set up something but I thought I would write all this out.





We, the Parishioners of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church, present for your consideration, our desires and concerns. We have come here today, not to bargain with you, but to plead for our Church. Because we know you have a very busy schedule, we will try to be as brief and to the point as possible.

We want to have our priest present and accessible 6 days a week with one day off; that he be our Spiritual leader and guide to the following:

1. Daily Mass, daily communion and Saturday confession.

2. That he start Mass on time.

- That he teach the Liturgy; that it be better planned and that he celebrate Mass as ordered by Church guidelines.
- 4. That he teach the Sacraments, especially those concerned with First Communion, Confirmation, etc; that these celebrations be done in accordance to the new Diocesan guidelines.
- 5. That he be available to our Youth for Spiritual direction, especially when it concerns Liturgy, sex, drugs, etc.
- 6. That he be available to the sick and homebound; that he should visit and offer the Sacraments at least once a month.

We want that the election of a Parish Council be by the Parishioners and not appointed by the priest, so that:

- 1. We can reactivate church groups, such as the Altar Society and the Guadalupanas.
- We can reactivate activities such as jamaicas, bar-b-ques, etc. for the purpose of raising funds for our church.
- 3. The physical condition of church and grounds be done together in agreement with the Parish Council.
- 4. We can hire a parish secretary which is very essential.

We want a parish census (last one approximately 15 years ago) in order to update the registration list; we also desire a latest and informative bulletin.

We have these concerns for the following reasons:

- 1. The health of Fr. Frank Sierra is poor; he has diabetes, falls asleep frequently (in Mass also), and is showing signs of age.
- 2. The loss of our parishioners:
 - a. Those who are now going to other Roman Catholic churches.
 - b. Those who have joined other denominational religions.
 - c. Those, for the worst part, who are not going to church at all.

3. When Fr. Sierra went on vacation for one month recently and Msgr. Borrero was present:

a. The church filled to capacity.

- b. He left the church in the following condition: no natural gas, no food and no telephone.
- c. Response from the people was great, in spite of the condition he left behind.

It is very difficult for us to come and present these problems to Your Excellency. But we know that the Spiritual well-being of our families and our Community is our main concern. We are putting ourselves at risk for our children who will be the future leaders of Our Lady of Perpetual Help.

Again, we thank you for taking time out from your very busy schedule to listen to us and we pray that you will be favorable to our concerns. God bless you.


It was during this period in Rome that World War II broke out. Father harbored a Nazi soldier, Franz Grodecke, for about two months. Reluctantly, Father had to turn Franz over to the English. After the war Franz was returned to Frankfurt, his home. Father Sierra was reunited with him in Germany in 1970.

During his ten-year stay in Rome as a student, several people befriended him. He remembers Pane Bianco, a baker, who was very friendly to him; Mrs. Gatti who gave him books and was like a mother to him; and Monsignor Cappaferri who was the master of ceremonies for the Pope and who liked to collect stamps.

At the age of 23, on March 16, 1946, Frank A. Sierra was ordained a priest, at St. John's Cathedral, in Rome, Italy. At that same time, the Church was under the leadership of Pope Pius XII. Our present Pope John Paul II was ordained a priest that very same year in November. Also, that is the year that the U.S. Navy's famous Blue Angels squadron was formed.

After Father was ordained a priest, he returned to Barcelona to teach and minister for one year at a Catholic school and worked in the school's office. He taught geography, history and languages. At the end of that school year, he returned to Del Norte, Colorado, his hometown.

He spent his birthday, April 13, 1947, with his mother, father and family. He had a one-month reunion with them. Father Frank sensed that his parents had suffered a great deal of loneliness and longed for his return. He felt they were asking him, "Why did you go away from us for so long?"

While visiting his family in Del Norte, Father received word asking him to return once again to Spain. He answered this request to return and teach at this same school in Barcelona for one more year. It was at the end of this school year that Father answered a call to teach in Argentina.



Preachers Increase Effectiveness by Sensitivity to Cultural Differences

In this multicultural, multiracial and polyglot United States, practically every Catholic parish has minority groups represented in the congregation. Preaching to that minority, or to a mixed audience, is an art within the art of preaching.

But some things hold true for preaching to any minority group: The first word for the preacher, according to the three priests and a bishop interviewed for this issue of *Good News*, is "sensitivity." The preacher, especially when dealing with Hispanics, "needs to sympathize with the fact that many Hispanics are strangers in their own land. They may have been born here, but it takes three or four generations before they surmount just the tricks of surviving," explained Father Frank Sierra Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish, Brawley, California, whose life is spent ministering to Hispanics.

Said Korean Father John Lee, of Blessed Andrew Kim Church in College Park, Maryland, the preacher needs to be sensitive to the minority Americans uncertainty about the language. The language problems are with the first generation, usually the children are bilingual. There also are enormous cultural differences, he added.

In general, suggested Washington, D.C. Auxiliary Bishop Eugene A. Marino, SSJ., the preacher "needs to have a sensitivity to the cultural background of his audience and, I think, needs in some way to reveal that sensivity to those to whom he's preaching. You don't need to be of the same race or ethnic origin of the people you work with in order to work effectively with that group."

Turning to another minority, Capuchin Father Gilbert Hemauer director of the Tekakwitha Conference, contends that the native peoples' basic need "is that justice with love be implemented, assuring them that the citizens of this country stand by their word in honoring the treaties governing water, hunting and fishing, and that the native peoples are respected as a distinct people with their own culture, traditions and customs."

As each of these preachers reveals something about his work, the sensitivity displayed makes the point to all preachers quite clearly.

Father Frank Sierra

For more than a year, when he first returned from Latin America, Father Sierra would be in a local radio station at 5 a.m. each morning to begin two hours of preaching and talking to the people of Palm Springs, California. He was

broadcasting not to the occupants of the wealthy homes and 19th holes, but the Hispanics making their way to the fields, gardens and golf courses where they worked, listening to Sierra on little transistor radios fastened to their belts.

"At five in the morning, they appreciated that," Sierra said.

From the desert, the priest moved to the coastline. "I ran into the underground railroad, got a feeling for all the traffic coming across the border." He began ministering within a 100 mile radius to the "wandering people" in the fields and the restaurant kitchens. "They're not able to see much of the outside world, so they were happy to see me," and, as a rule, Father Sierra found the restaurant owners cooperated.

Now he is back in the desert again, two hours east of San Diego, helping two kinds of people, the newly arrived who need "clothing, food, some kind of comfort, or to be rescued from the concentration places in neighboring towns," and those "who have been here for years but still have no status."

This second group lacks any degree of stability, even though they have held jobs for years, they will have no insurance, no guarantees, no claim on citizenship. "One hospital bill and they're out," said Father Sierra, "they usually have to return to Mexico if they get pneumonia or something. We are able to help them across the border into their own land," he said.

On the spiritual side, Father Sierra ministers personally but also helps organize religious congresses, some that may last for three days and be attended by perhaps a thousand people. Usually he will have Latin American priests come to help "with round-the-clock activities: speaking, praying, healing and celebrating, sharing the meals and the lives the people have, and the stories they have."

The Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) has "never seized anyone at these gatherings," he said.

Father Sierra said that the preacher ministering to minorities such as the ones he deals with must realize that "religion-wise they've picked up very little from their ancestors because they come from such poor classes, out in the little towns and ranches of Mexico. They did not get to high school or religious education class, they've followed farm labor up and down the hills, many never did learn English."

"The preacher and priests must realize these people are suffering through all these circumstances, they need a lot of love and sympathy," he said. "They should be admired for their faith and endurance."

Father Sierra recommends looking at 1 Corinthians 13 for guidance. From the institutional Church he would like to see a greater willingness for the dioceses to make their structures available, "buildings that once were full of people could be full again," he said, referring to empty parochial schools. But it is the personal contact he most recommends to the preacher: "Love is being sensitive to their needs. Come down a little bit. Take their children on picnic as a priest. Eat with them, mingle with them, show them 'I have time to be with you, I have a special love for you. You, too, are God's special people.'

Father John Lee

Father John Lee from Taejon, Korea. pastor of a church that serves Northern Virginia, District of Columbia and Maruland Korean Catholics, has about 600 families in his parish. He mentions the language problem, and excuses his own English when trying to explain his work. Essentially, said Father Lee, who served in Canada before coming to the U.S., St. Andrew Kim Church (Kim was Korea's first Catholic priest-martyr) serves as a national parish in which people find their familiar social and religious customs. Non-Korean priests also help out in the parish, he said, especially for the children's mass where their English is better.

Bishop Eugene Marino

One of America's 10 black bishops, Bishop Eugene Marino explained further his remark that one does not need to be of the same race in order to serve people. "I am member a of the Josephite Society, a predominantly white religious



I am deeply grateful for your felicitations on my having arrived to celebrate a Silver Anniversary. I sincerely hope that I can produce better fruit of love for the Lord in the next 25 years. We should both be quite venerable Patriarchs if we make it to that age.

Bishop, Frank Sierra has appealed to me to give you my opinion of him as I honestly know of him. He was shaken by the charges of the lay person. As you know he feels quite sure that this is a parting shot from Father Humphreys, a vindictive and vengeful act.

It is not my position to interefere in the workings of the Diocese in these matters. It is beyond my competence. But in Christian charity, I cannot refuse to give my honest opinion of Frank if it will aid him, an opinion as I see him through the many Mexican American people I know in the Valley.

He has shown himself to be very zealous and extremely self-sacrificing to arise at 4:30 each morning for his two hour radio broadcast. He also likes people, and mixes with them in their lives, which of course includes their Fiestas. Occasionally he may have been the victim of over-familiarity, a fault of some lay people who take advantage of the good graces of a priest, any priest. But he does move decently among the people. No one has ever dared say that he drinks too much at such fiestas. I have never heard of any such charge, and I am sure that I would get such a word if it were true.

When I last spoke to Frank, I told him quite openly that the big Promotor Priest is out of style. His two main assest are his "simpatia", and his beautiful Spanish. 
