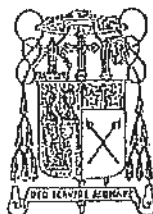

To the Most Reverend Ordinaries and Major Superiors of Men:

Thank you to those who have contributed recently to this ministry. If you have not yet been able to respond to our letter of November 2, we ask once again for your consideration of our request.

Enclosed is a copy of the information sheet which we send to those priests and Brothers who request it. Although we have included it in past letters to you, we have included it again because of the many changes, especially among major superiors of men.

In our letter to you of April, 1981, we wrote:

"Unfortunately, the need for these retreats continues to grow. Information obtained from the public media or from personal sources verifies that.

It seems another way to approach the difficulty is to 'nip it in the bud', that is, to assist seminarians while still in the seminary, or Brothers prior to perpetual vows. Most everyone with whom we have spoken agrees that something must be done for seminarians and Brother aspirants, but nothing positive has been brought to our attention. Since many are clandestine about homosexual difficulties, it seems the best attitude might be to assume that the situation exists in seminaries and religious houses and to develop a program accordingly. The assumption would be well-founded."

We received no comments, positive or negative, from that letter.

We would like to share with you an insight gathered in group discussions with the retreatants. Frequently, an attitude among seminarians and Brother aspirants is a distorted goal mentality. Some retreatants have said that while they were in formation everything was fine. But, after ordination, or perpetual vows for Brothers, things happened. While in formation, personal thoughts, feelings, and desires were controlled. They had friends, activities, security, three squares and a good bed. Then the "goal" of ordination or perpetual vows was realized. Now, in many cases, even this goal mentality is no longer significant; seminarians, Brothers, and men in ministry are rationalizing "This is the way I am"; or, "I'm overworked and need an outlet" or in various other ways.

Accordingly, we once again recommend that you broach the subject of homosexuality with, especially, seminarians and Brother aspirants, but, preferably, with all men in your charge or within your Diocese. A further recommendation is that you establish a straight-forward policy, that is to say, that you encourage your men to "get tough" with themselves. In many other situations, priests and religious must eventually do this. It is certainly courageous; and, for some it may be the last resort - psychiatric visits, individual counsel, ventilating with a good friend, a regular confessor, transfer etc. all having been tried, frequently to little or no avail.

We further recommend that you also outline the personal hazards to the men, along with the hazards to the Church, the Diocese or religious group,

and the damage done to individuals and families. Another consideration which might be mentioned is the possibility of legal proceedings, and major financial lawsuits for which the Diocese or religious group may be liable. Unfortunately, last week a priest in a mid-western state received a seven year prison sentence for "lewd conduct with a teen-age boy." The article in The Washington Post of January 24, 1985 reported the Judge as stating that the Church has "atonement to do" for not stopping the priest's "illegal sex acts long ago." And the pre-sentence report implied that Church "officials" should have notified police of the priest's inclinations since they "suspected" him "as early as 1966."

Still another harm is the disease Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome. We have heard of priests who have died of the disease AIDS already. Others are in various stages of it. For all it is sad and disheartening. The disease is escalating in epidemic proportions. Since one way the disease can be transmitted is in saliva, and since it can have a two year gestation period during which time a person may be a carrier without showing signs of the disease itself, concelebration and lay reception of the Eucharist under both species may become significant.

In summation, and as a guideline if you or your representative should decide affirmatively to speak with your men:

- 1.) A recognition of the difficulty in some men.
- 2.) Distorted goal mentality in formation; and/or, "This is the way I am" or, "I'm overworked and need an outlet" attitude.
- 3.) Straight-forward policy; "Get tough with yourselves."
- 4.) Hazards to the individual, the Church, the Diocese, and the religious group; and, damage done to others (especially minors) and families.
- 5.) Legal proceedings, and financial lawsuits; again, especially in cases of minors.
- 6.) Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS).
- 7.) The individual's peace of mind and more effective ministry.

It seems the only way to address the few is to speak with everyone; consequently, it seems appropriate that the above be presented in meetings with all seminarians, priests and religious in your Diocese or religious group.

In all of this, we hope you will consider our sincerity based on reality and experience. Certainly we do not assume that the above is a guaranteed answer to the problem. But it may be of some help.

March 8, 1985: After being informed by Bishop Giacida of the situation between Fr. Clarke and the B. family, I began to follow the instructions given me by Bishop Giacida as the procedure to follow in this case.

A) I called Fr. Hugh Clarke in Laredo. He was reached at the Curial Center where he was conducting a retreat. He confirmed what Bishop Giacida knew and expressed sorrow over the situation. He expressed regrets for the people involved and a desire to cooperate fully with the Bishop for his mental & spiritual well-being. He consented to leave for the Rest, Renewal, and Re-Creation Center in Alexandria, Virginia.

B) The phone at the Rest, Renewal, & Re-Creation Center was not answered under late afternoon, March 8. Fr. John Hawey, the Director, was out of town, yet when contacted by his associate, Fr. John Kinney, Fr. Hawey cleared the way for Fr. Clarke's arrival. Fr. Clarke will reside at the Oblates of St. Francis de Sales Seminary temporarily during the period of evaluation and if necessary until March 24th when Fr. Hawey returns. Fr. Clarke will be evaluated by staff psychiatrist Dr. John Kinney. I will be in touch with the staff during the week of March 11th when Fr. Clarke arrives.

c) Fr. Tom Keller was asked to assure the family that immediate action was taken. They were informed that Fr. Clark was cooperating with the Bishop and would be receiving assistance professionally for his actions. They were also encouraged to receive professionally counselling with Mr. Tom Carroll of the Diocesan Family Life Office. Tom Carroll contacted the family and arranged for an appointment on March 9, 1985.

MARCH 15, 1985: Since these events, I have learned the following additional information:

1) Mr. P. S. has a lawsuit pending against him for this information is known by all the family. He is away from the house and living a life Mr. & Mrs. are in their second marriages. The family unit consists of her 3 children, his 3 children, and their 3 children. The boys, P. & M., are his sons. Mr. is repentant over his actions, and is sincerely committed to a conversion process in his life, reports Fr. Tom Keller.

2) Tom Carroll indicated that only the parents appeared for their appointment. It was productive, and they were encouraged to bring the boys on subsequent visits. Fr. Tom phoned me March 14th and requested that Mr. Carroll seek another appointment with the parents for they were eager to continue so that healing can take place in all areas of their

family life. I will follow through with this request.

3) After concern and an absence of communication, I was notified that Fr. Clarke was in Washington, D.C. at De Sales Hall and in contact with Dr. Kinnane. It seems Fr. Clarke left Lando after the Cursillo ended and a priest substitute arrived on Tuesday March 12. Instead of going to De Sales Hall as instructed, he mistakenly travelled to the West, Shenandoah, and Re-Creation Center in Alexandria, Virginia. He spent the night <sup>in Alexandria</sup> ~~there~~ and then arrived the following day at De Sales in Washington, D.C.

I will continue to monitor the situation.

4) Fr. Tom Weller informed me that he had heard indications been told that this was not the last experience of Fr. Clarke's involvement with boys. I can't clearly recall of Fr. Weller how this before this episode or if the family informed him of this information. I seem to recall it is the former, since the latter would incriminate the present situation. (This information verified what a former Associate Pastor told me about his suspicions regarding Fr. Clarke. At that time, I did not act since there was no proof surfaced publicly and since the Associate didn't want to reveal anything. Father Clarke was serving also as an associate with this priest at Christ the King, Corpus Christi.

Dear Father Tamayo:

Father Clarke is doing very well and is going home to Laredo over Easter (leaving Friday, April 5, and returning Tuesday, April 9<sup>th</sup>). Enclosed is the initial "working diagnosis". There is every hope (with Fr. John Harvey's blessing) that he will be ready for return to his priestly duties by the end of April. Meanwhile —

- (1) he is developing great insight in therapy for the first time in his life into the problems that have plagued him since grade school. There were only 3 young people involved and there have been no other episodes of any kind whatsoever in the last 20 yrs of his priesthood in the diocese. There was one previous episode in Marston, Kent in about 1960.
- (2) He is working very hard with Fr. Harvey.
- (3) I referred him to an Eye-Ear-Nose-Throat specialist because of some more deterioration in hearing. He is now seeing this doctor.
- (4) I sent him to Dr. John Breiman, my own G.P., to check blood sugar levels and get on a diet. Fr. Murphy is doing very well and is losing weight.

# Compulsive-Sex Disorders Gain Psychologists' Attention

Every week, 10 men meet in Alexandria to talk about a common addiction they have long feared discussing.

The men, including a 44-year-old defense analyst who started the group in November, have uncontrollable compulsions for sex. They are not simply "oversexed," psychologists who treat them say; they are powerless over sexual impulses that can destroy their jobs, marriages and lives.

"I would think about sex 24 hours a day," said the military analyst, who asked not to be

identified, "I would drive around for hours looking for women."

"There were times I doubted my sanity," he said. "There was so much guilt, and yet it was like a force I couldn't stop. Once I felt pressure from work or anxiety, I'd go looking for it again . . . Then I discovered I wasn't alone."

A highly-regarded Minnesota sex psychologist says that as many as one in 12 Americans may have compulsive sexual behavior, of which there are various types. Individuals—women as well as men, and homosexuals as well as heterosexuals—can be affected by such preoccupations, which can result in be-

havior that ranges from prostitution to exhibitionism to rape.

Part of the problem is how to define such sexual conditions. Patrick Carnes, the Minneapolis psychologist and author of the pioneering work, "The Sexual Addiction," describes compulsive sexuality as secret, abusive and empty. "There is no such thing as a normal sex life," Carnes said. "But there are clearly abnormal ones."

"It can be such an intoxicating emotion for some that they become powerless," he said. "They have no sense of limits."

Carnes recalls that a physician whom he counseled was vexed by an overpowering

compulsion to have sex with prostitutes. That addiction cost him as much as \$23,000 a year, forced him to mortgage his home, destroyed his marriage and almost cost him his job.

Michael Quedano, a psychologist who counsels sex addicts in New York, said it is not surprising that we hear of prominent persons arrested for homosexual acts in public toilets, or public officials caught with prostitutes.

"You think when you hear these things: 'They should know better.' But this problem affects all kinds and is not something that you

can stop, even if you know what you are risking," he said.

"I spoke with an attractive, sophisticated, well-educated woman in her twenties," Quadland said. "She was involved with a sadistic man, and the only way she felt affirmed was to get recognition from him." Quadland says the woman grew up without a father and was totally confused about relationships with men.

The guilt, depression and anxiety felt by afflicted individuals often leaves them with so little feeling of self-worth that some may wish to kill themselves, other researchers say.

There are no firm statistics on the number of persons affected by such compulsions because the topic is difficult to research, but many believe the problem is widespread.

Patricia J. Aletky, an administrator at the American Psychological Association in Washington, said that the "number of people for whom sex is totally out of control is more frequent than rare."

"You can't exactly do a Gallup Poll on this," said John Money, the director of the psychohormonal research unit at Johns Hopkins Medical School in Baltimore.

"There are no statistics," he said,

"but there are a lot of people out there who are suffering."

Their problems, however, are beginning to win national attention. In January, the first in-patient clinic specifically to help sex addicts opened at the Golden Valley Health Clinic in Minneapolis. About 200 groups similar to the one in Alexandria have organized around the country.

Modeled after the successful Alcoholics Anonymous groups, the Alexandria organization is part of a network called Sex Addicts Anonymous.

"By calling it an addiction and treating it as you would a chemical dependency, you give the people who are suffering from this a chance to get over this very serious illness," Carnes said. "For too long they have been stigmatized by the words nymphomaniac, exhibitionist, voyeur."

Carnes' notion of equating sexual compulsion with alcohol dependency—rather than with perversion—is gaining acceptance among medical authorities. Last week in Philadelphia he began a five-city tour in which he is addressing hundreds of sex therapists, counselors and health professionals.

Still, the notion of sex addiction remains controversial in the medical and mental health professions.

Though most agree that the first step toward solving the problem is recognizing that it exists—just as

an alcoholic must admit that he or she is drinking excessively before the problem can be stopped—some think the alcohol analogy ends there.

For one thing, the critics note, reformed alcoholics are never supposed to touch alcohol again.

"Sex is a healthy, positive thing," said New York psychologist Quadland, "but the term sex addict suggests the abuse of something that is bad for the body."

Clive M. Davis, the editor of the Journal of Sex Research, the publication of the Society for the Scientific Study of Sex, said that if the addict label reinforces any cultural ideas that sex is bad, "The cure could be worse than the problem."

Money, of Johns Hopkins, also questions the value of a broad term that "lumps together the problems of a man who gets stimulus from an 8-year-old and someone who constantly buys pornographic materials and pays for prostitutes."

"But by whatever name—sex athlete, bed hopper, addict," said Nancy J. Dickinson, the executive director of the Human Sexuality Institute in Washington, the problems of destructive obsessions and excesses have been around a long time. "What's new is that we're looking at them in the light now."

With the alarming spread of herpes and AIDS, authorities say, some type of help is needed to curb the activities of people who find they no

longer know how many sexual partners they have had or even who they were.

There is no recognized formula for treating compulsive sexual behavior, but most authorities say that finding the root cause of the behavior is the first step.

Abuse or neglect in childhood, a severe lack of self-worth, loneliness or a repressively religious background could trigger the compulsion, the researchers say.

"My father was a . . . minister . . ." began the founder of the Alexandria group as he lit another cigarette over a Howard Johnson's cup of coffee.

"It was a small town," he said. "I remember being 4 or 5 and being physically abused. I don't think it was ever sexually, just beaten. First I sought release in drink, and then later whenever I wanted momentary relief I'd lose myself in sex."

Counselors agree that more people than ever are seeking help through such activities as joining a Sex Addicts group.

"We are where we were with alcoholics 15 years ago," Carnes said.

"More people are starting to talk about it, but we have a long way to go. If only people could read the letters I get, they would cry instead of sneer."

"I don't know if in my lifetime I'll be able to talk freely about this," the Alexandria military analyst said.

"I'm telling you because I know how painful this has made my life, and I want to tell others they're not alone. And yet, I would never dream of telling my boss." The middle-aged man shook his graying head. "The shock that it would cause."

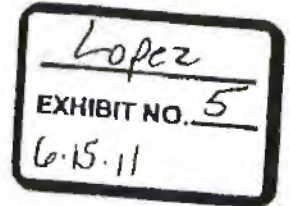

I am writing in follow-up of Fr. Clarke who came to Washington for professional help during the time period March 15 to April 26, 1985. I saw Fr. Clarke in forty sessions of crisis intervention and assessment, while he participated concurrently in a program designed and conducted by Father John Harvey O.S.B.

As you may be aware, there is now a fairly extensive clinical literature available concerning the treatment of such behaviors as Fr. Clarke demonstrated, and for which (among other issues) he was referred to me. The prognosis for such difficulties is widely regarded as poor-to-guarded, and in my opinion the prognosis for Fr. Clarke is as the literature, as well as my own professional experience would predict. That is, without regular, systematic, and professional care, Father Clarke is likely to lose the gains he made during his recent involvement here in Washington.

I wish therefore to remind and advise you of Father Clarke's ongoing needs for professional care and pastoral supervision, so that you might initiate appropriate action on his behalf. In my formal report to you and in my closing sessions with Fr. Clarke, I strongly advised continuing supportive therapy by a qualified doctor, even if this meant going twice a month to San Antonio, for example. Again, as you are no doubt aware, Fr. Clarke is not likely to initiate or sustain any treatment program on his own. 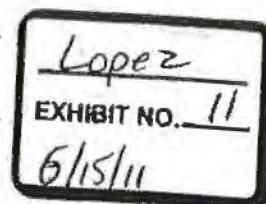



Monsignor Hugh Clarke, a retired priest of our diocese of Corpus Christi, died December 16, 2002, in Lifford, Co. Donegal, Ireland.

Monsignor Clarke, born December 30, 1924, in Lifford, Co. Donegal, Ireland, was the son of Hugh and Eleanor Porter Clarke. He attended Terenure College, the National University of Ireland and Jesuit Theologate, all in Dublin. He was ordained to the holy priesthood on July 16, 1950, at Holy Cross Seminary, Dublin, Ireland, by Archbishop John McQuaid. Monsignor Clarke came to the United States of America in 1968 and served Christ the King Parish, Corpus Christi, St. Patrick's Parish, Laredo, Corpus Christi Cathedral, where he served as Rector, and Our Lady of Refuge Parish, Refugio.

While ministering in the Diocese of Corpus Christi, Monsignor Clarke held several positions including Director of the Laredo Deanery Youth Cursillo, Diocesan Tribunal Judge, Defender of the Bond, Director of Pilgrimages, Diocesan Development Commission, Advisory Board of the *South Texas Catholic*, Director of Health Care Programs, Priests' Personnel Board, Editor of the *South Texas Catholic*, Diocesan Director of EMMAUS Spirituality Program and Corpus Christi Minor Seminary Board of Directors. Monsignor Clarke retired in 1996.

In 1957 in London, England, the Polish Government in Exile conferred on Father Clarke THE GOLD CROSS OF THE ORDER OF MERIT OF THE REPUBLIC OF POLAND in recognition of his work with Polish refugees. At that time, only nine people held this honor.

Monsignor is survived by one sister, Eileen McDevitt, Lifford, Co. Donegal, Ireland.


A Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated on Wednesday, December 18, in St. Patrick's Church in Lifford.

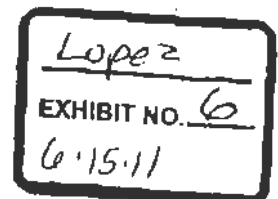

On a recent visit to Corpus I met with several friends with who I grow up with and were also, abused by the clergy...we laugh it off in way as to not have to talk about it, but there is string of alcoholism, drug abuse, homosexuality, suicide, mental disorders, child abuse, wife abuse, incarceration, death and others that never married. I for one will have to care and have been carrying load for one of his victims. The diocese knew that they had a problem clergy thats why he was sent away for awhile, before returning to the church located next to the housing project (his playground) of disadvantaged families.

Ms Rank mentioned that someone would be contacting us and now she is retired and we still have not heard back from anyone until your response.
