More charges possible

Jason Sigler is no longer a priest and has lived in New Mexico for about three decades. But when Sigler was a priest, he was accused of damaging young lives in parishes in Michigan and New Mexico.

Sigler, who was born in River Rouge but ordained in Winnipeg, Canada, was laicized in the early 1980s. said he will be charged today with assaulting his 12-year-old third cousin at the boy's home in River Rouge and other places from 1964 to 1967.

Sigler would tell the boy's parents he was going upstairs to bless him at bedtime and then would perform oral sex on the youth, said.

Genesee County Prosecutor Arthur Busch said his office has been investigating the former priest for months and will decide this week whether to charge him with abusing two boys in the Diocese of Lansing.

One of those boys was of Macomb Township, now 40. On Tuesday, said Sigler repeatedly molested him in 1975 when the priest was at St. Robert Bellarmine Parish in Flushing.

"This man had no business being free to begin with," said

In New Mexico, Sigler was sentenced to probation on a criminal charge and faced several civil suits over the alleged abuse of minors, Busch said.

Sigler's attorney, Ray Twohig of Albuquerque, said his client will return to Michigan to fight the charges. "It's hard to imagine a charge that old being brought," Twohig said.

On May 23, 1964, Jason took the Oath "Perpetuo manendi" in the Archdiocese of Winnipeg according to the norms of Canon 956 of the Code of Canon Law, and was subsequently tonsured and incardinated into the Archdiocese of Winnipeg in the month of June. During the course of his seminary studies, he did have a great deal of difficulty with his studies.

Father Sigler had some difficulty in the Seminary in Edmonton, but this was straightened out and the Archbishop was pleased to ordain him to the Priesthood on June 1, 1966.

On June 21, 1966, Father Sigler was named a curate at St. Mary's Cathedral and on January 9, 1967, he was named curate at Our Lady of Victory Memorial Parish, also in Winnipeg. His transfer from the Cathedral to Our Lady of Victory Parish after only six months was not a reflection on Father Sigler but due to other circumstances in the Archdiocese at the time.

During Father Sigler's time in the Diocese, a little over two years, he showed himself always to be an excellent young priest, devoted and zealous. Cardinal Flahiff was extremely sorry to lose him, but two doctors, one in Detroit and one in Winnipeg had recommended that because of an upper respiratory infection, starting with a sinus condition and extending into his upper bronchial tubes, it would be better for him to seek a milder climate, because of the extreme variations in our weather, ranging from 40 degrees below zero in the winter to 95 degrees above zero in the summer. Accordingly, on October 4, 1968, His Eminence, George Cardinal Flahiff, Archbishop of Winnipeg, granted him "permission to leave the Archdiocese of Winnipeg in order to be accepted into the Diocese of Lansing 'ad experimentum'". Since that time, we have had no direct communication to or from Father Sigler. However, on March 5, 1970, Reverend James Sullivan, Vice-Chancellor of the Diocese of Lansing wrote to Cardinal Flahiff informing him that Bishop Zaleski had found it necessary to ask Father Sigler to leave the Diocese, and he had gone to St. Mary's Parish, North Branch, Michigan, with the approval of Bishop Gumbleton. On March 31, 1970, Father Tobin, s.P., Superior of Viae Coeli at Jemez Springs, New Mexico, in your Archdiocese wrote to the Cardinal that Father Sigler had arrived at Vias Coeli that afternoon requesting help for the problem which was the cause of his leaving Lansing. It is my understanding that Father Sigler was at Viae Coeli from March 31, 1970, to February, 1971. During his stay there the Archdiocese of Winnipeg expended \$1,099.70 for his expenses there, since no other Diocese would look after him and since he was canonically incardinated in this Archdiocese. However, as I mentioned above, we have not heard from Father Sigler since 1968.

Undoubtedly Your Excellency will wish to write to Bishops Zaleski and Gumbleton, and you are probably aware of his stay at Via@ Coeli.

I am enclosing a photocopy of Father Sigler's "elenchus vitae" as Your Excellency requested. I trust Your Excellency will find this information adequate and satisfactory. In closing, I would like to add to what wassquoted from a letter of the Cardinal's above, namely that during his more than two years in the Archdiocese, Father Sigler always acted as an admirable young priest and everyone in the Archdiocese was sorry to see him go. I do hope that he can be accepted into Your Excellency's Archdiocese since I do believe he is really committed to the priesthood. and the priestly ministry.



Report of my visit to St. Joseph's seminary, Edmonto is following the receipt of Father Schoen's letter of April 19, 1966.

Re: Jason Sigler

April 20, 1966: A letter was received from the rector of St.

Joseph's Seminary. In the letter he informed us of allegations made to him by one of the seminarians which revealed an excessive preoccupation with sex in conversation on Jason's part. Part of that letter was as follows:

"Some information has come to our attention which places the suitability of Rev. Jason Sigler for ordination to the priesthood in some doubt. A first year student with whom he has had too close a friendship despite advice to the contrary has felt compelled to reveal an excessive preoccupation with sex in conversation on Jason's part. The student has sworn to statements of Jason's which are unpriestly to say the least. They are probably only a front but one suspects that when a man vocalizes the ideals of a Don Juan on the eve of ordination, there must be something amiss."

*. "In view of this unfortunate turn of events the Staff feels that his ordination should be deferred until the situation can be more fully assessed. This is our recommendation at the moment"

Monsignor Chartrand discussed the letter with me. It was decided I should no to St. Joseph's to get a more complete picture of what the situation was and Awhat exactly the allegations were.

April 21, 1966: I visited St. Joseph's Seminary. The purpose of my visit, as I understood it, was twofold:

- a) to find out specifically what the allegations were:
- b) to ascertain, if possible, whether or not there was any indication or evidence of a basic weakness in the character of Jason in this area which would be the cause of excessive preoccupation with sex in conversation.

While at St. Joseph's I spoke with the following persons:
Father Schoen - rector of the seminary
Jason Sigler
Rob Bucher - the seminarian who made the allegations
Father Ymeller - Jason's spiritual advisor.

Rg: Jason Sicler (con't)

Father Schoen: I first spoke with Father Schoen who confirmed the allegations which were made in regard to Jason. He showed the allegations which had been made (he had the seminarian put in writing the allegations). The allegations confirmed that Mr. Sigler. was using a vocabulary that showed an excessive preoccupation with sex. I did not take a copy of the allegations with me but from memory I recall that in his talk there was repeated references to various parts of a woman's anatomy. The use of the word "fuck" was prevalent. At times of depression or boredom or when he was feeling down-in-the-dumps he would visit his friends room. At these times he had said "What I need now is a good piece of...." or "I think I'll no down to (such and such a street) and find a whore".

When confronted with this by the rector, Jason was very much surprised - to say the least. He confessed - and did not deny - that he had been using such language. Father Schoen said that it seemed that at the time he was using such language he did not avert to the possible scandal involved or to that fact that it was most unfitting and improper for one about to be ordained. After the confrontation Jason told Father Schoen that he now realized how improper and unpriestly pxxXxx it was.

Father Schoen explained briefly how the allegations came to be made. Briefly the circumstances were as follows:

During Jason's absence from the seminary for rest, in the latter part of February and most of March, he stayed with a priest friend of his in Calgary. While in Calgary he visited the home of Bob Bucher and his conversation with the family led the mother of Bob to be somewhat concerned over his friendship with Jason. She spoke to a priest who was a family friend. He advised her to speak to her pastor about it. She did. When Bob went home for his Easter holidays his pastor (Monsignor Anderson) spoke to him about it. Monsignor wrote to Father Scheen who called in Bob to his office for a first hand report concerning the language Jason was using. He asked Bob to put it in writing.

In discussing this Father Schoon did tell we that he felt that there might be nothing, behind this manner of speech on Jason's part. He said"it is so difficult to assess this." It could be due to his background and his american way of talking big. Jason told him a priest had advised him not to be afraid to talk about sex, that most of the priests who leave the priesthood because of it are the ones who keep it bottled up inside. He said he might be just using it to make an impression when he talks. He seemed inclined to think that probably there was no basic weakness of character behind it. In the early part of my conversation he did say to me that the situation didn't seem to be as bad as it first seemed, when he wrote the letter to the Archbishop.

Jason Sigler: After speaking to Father Schoen I had an interview with Jason. He was quite alarmed by this time - since Father Schoen had informed him that I was coming to St. Joseph's to investigate the matter. He seemed very worried when he came into the room. There was no doubt by this time, that we considered the matter to be a very serious one. And I sincerely think the seriousness of it was now understood by Jason. He readily admitted that he had used the language mentioned in the allegations. He admitted that he did not avert to the seriousness of it at the time, though now - since all this had transpired - he could see the seriousness of it. He recalled that he had heard priests using similar language when kibitzing together...but he felt they did not at all mean what they were saying. We discussed the matter of priestly behaviour and language, especially when among lay people even those laity we know so well and with whom we are close friends. He admitted that this did teach him a lesson, that he realized a priest did have to use a certain reserve and prudence in behaviour and language. He asked me to speak to his spiritual advisor, Father Mueller.

Bob Bucher I had a short talk with Bob who confirmed the allegations and said the improper language was rather regular thing with Jason - not in the sense of frequent, but that it did not occur just once or twice. He said he was surprised to hear a 4th year seminarian speak that way and that once or twice he had mentioned to Jason that this sort of language just didn't seem right.

Father Mueller spoke with me briefly about the matter. Father Mueller He had discussed it with Jason at some length. He felt that this did not indicate a basic defect in Jason's character in this area, but rather that it was probably more due to his way of "sounding off" from time to time, to his manner of seeming to want to make an impression when with others. I asked him about his ability and willingness to accept correction. He told me that Jason was quite frank and would willingly acknowledge and faults when brought to his attention and that he did make serious efforts to improve behaviour when requested to do so. He also said that he thought the Fathers at the seminary would likely take a less serious view of the matter when they would consider all the factors involved, such as Jason's personality. his way of speaking, his desire to impress, etc. At the end of the conversation. he mentioned that in his judgement Jason should be given an assignment in his first year as a priest, with an understanding pastor where he would have a certain amount of freedom to use the energy and initiative he has.

I had an interview of an hour and a half with FATMER TIMOTHY SULLIVAN. assistant at Our Lady of Lourdes Farish, River Rouger, Michigan, home morish of Jason Sigler. (VI2-0625)

Apparently Jason had great respect for Father Sulliven as a priest and even though Father has been in the parish only two years they have become good friends. I exposed the problem to Father Bullivan and asked him what he thought.

Faller was surtrised at this report and somewhat disturbed by it, he could not give any definite reason for Jason's actions as reported to the Superior of the Seminary. He made the following remarks on Jason's character and behavior as a seminarian.

- He said Jason was not a fake, that he came out strong to establish his image, at times was critical of the system of the seminary and injudent in sounding off or bucking authority. His way of talking big - he is somewhat of a blow hard - could be pretence. might be a result of certain feeling s of inadequacy, of being unwanted in his childhood. The whole parish is looking forward to the day then Jason will be ordained. If the ordination was deferred it would be very difficult for all concerned.

Father Bullivan was very often with me and showed great confidence in Jaron.

In response to your letter of June 22, 1973 requesting the service record of Father John (Jason) E. Sigler while he served in the Lansing Diocese, I am happy to provide the following information:

Father Sigler came to this Diocese in October, 1968 with a release from his Ordinary, Archbishop George B. Flahiff of the Archdiocese of Winnepeg. He was released to serve "ad experimentum" in the Diocese of Lansing. His reason for seeking a new Diocese was one of poor health and it was hoped that the climate here would prove more compatible than the rigors of Winnepeg winters. (Enclosed please find a copy of Archbishop Flahiff's letter of October 4, 1968).

He was assigned as an Assistant Pastor in St. John Parish, Jackson, Michigan, where he remained until he left the Diocese in March, 1970. During his assignment, he was well received by the people and was generally effective in the exercise of his ministry. Unfortunately, he allegedly became involved 'in re turpi' with some boys in the parish. The matter had been brought to the attention of the local police by the parents of one of the youngsters. Both the parents and the police agreed not to prosecute on the condition that he leave the Diocese, never to return. To the best of my knowledge, the allegations had some basis in fact. Father Sigler's reaction was one of genuine humility and honesty. He evidenced a sincere desire to seek professional help in overcoming his problem.

Since that time, we have had no direct communication to or from Father Sigler. However, on March 5, 1970, Reverend James Sullivan, Vice-Chancellor of the Diocese of Lansing wrote to Cardinal Flahiff informing him that Bishop Zaleski had found it necessary to ask Father Sigler to leave the Diocese, and he had gone to St. Mary's Parish, North Branch, Michigan, with the approval of Bishop Gumbleton. On March 31, 1970, Father Tobin, s.P., Superior of Viae Coeli at Jemez Springs, New Mexico, in your Archdiocese wrote to the Cardinal that Father Sigler had arrived at Vias Coeli that afternoon requesting help for the problem which was the cause of his leaving Lansing. It is my understanding that Father Sigler was at Via@ Coeli from March 31, 1970, to February, 1971. During his stay there the Archdiocese of Winnipeg expended \$1,099.70 for his expenses there, since no other Diocese would look after him and since he was canonically incardinated in this Archdiocese. However, as I mentioned above, we have not heard from Father Sigler since 1968.

Your Eminence:

My sincere apologies for the long delay in replying to your very kind letter of April 29, 1970. This delay was due to my inability to have the courage to take pen in hand and write to you. I suppose it was a lack of humility on my part. However, I just did not know where or how to begin a letter to you. At the time your letter arrived I had just completed a psychological evaluation, a physical examination and had my first psychiatric interview. I was filled with ambivalent feelings and thoughts and to be very truthful was not able to express my thoughts clearly. The acute stage of anxiety which brought on the nervous breakdown and the difficulty which arose left me in a state in which I was unable to function mentally and physically.

Another reason for the hesitation in answering your letter was that I myself did not know where I stood with Lansing, Detroit or Winnipeg. When the breakdown occured and the situation arose Bishop Zaleski's intention was that I return to you. However, I didn't feel as though I could do that because of the reasons of health which caused me to leave the Archdiocese of Winnipeg in October of 1968. As a result, Father James S. Sullivan, the Vice-Chancellor of Lansing, suggested that I find a place to stay where I could have peace and quiet for the time being in order to allow myself to calm down and view things more objectively.

At my request and in my presence ne called Father Emery Petho, the pastor of St. Mary's Burnside Church in North Branch, Michigan asking if I could go there temporarily. Father Petho most generously agreed to take me for the time being. It was necessary for Father Sullivan to obtain faculties for me from Detroit because he thought I should continue to function as a priest. He thereupon called or contacted Bishop Thomas Gumbelton, Auxiliary Bishop of Detroit (a friend of Father Sullivan's) and the Bishop agreed to allow me to stay with Father Petho for the present providing that I seek psychiatric help in the

near future. The communication between Bishop Gumbleton and Father Sullivan of Lansing was personal and secretive. Bishop Gumbleton agreed to the matter and granted me faculties until April 4, 1970 at which time I was to see him personally if I was to remain with Father Petho beyond that date. No one else in Detroit knew I was with Father Petho. Bishop Gumbleton was informed so that he would know the circumstances of the situation.

I spent three weeks with Father Petho in his rural parish, from March 3 to the 25th. After much prayer and thought and on my own initiative I wrote to Via Coeli for professional help. This was a short time after I arrived at Father Petho's. Father Tobin responded to my letter immediately upon its receipt via telephone and informed me that I could come to Via Coeli. He was not able to accommodate me until March 30th.

I did not seek entry into the Archdiocese of Detroit but merely went to stay with Father Petho because of our friendship and to have time to make a proper decision. I came to Via Coelientirely upon my own initiative. No one suggested that I go to Via Coeli. I had heard of Via Coeli some years ago and I thought that this would be the best move for me. It was a difficult decision since I did not come here under the sponsorship of anyone. No one in Lansing or Detroit suggested that I come to Via Coeli - the decision was made entirely by myself in the hope that I could receive the necessary professional help which I needed.

Father Tobin mentioned yesterday that he had heard from you and spoke of the agreement you had reached concerning my presence at Via Coeli. I am deeply grateful to your Eminence and the Archdiocese for the interest and desire to help in this situation.

My family and relatives and friends are not aware of this situation or where I am located at present. They merely have been informed that I had a nervous breakdown and have gone away for treatment. Father Sullivan in Lansing, Bishop Gumbleton in Detroit and Father Petho and Father John M. Fackler (a former pastor of mine in Jackson) know the details of the breakdown and where I am at present. I have been advised not to reveal the circumstances or my whereabouts to anyone outside of the above mentioned persons. I have been told by Father Petho that the situation as not too public and he felt it wise for me to quietly work at restoring my mental and physical health

Therefore, your Eminence, I would very much appreciate it if the details of this situation and my location be kept a

secret. Some of my relatives have attempted to locate me through Fathers Facksler and Petho. Someone might have the impudence to call or write to you or your Chancery about me. Should this happen I would be grateful if no information whatsoever be released to them. Perhaps friends in Winnipeg might enquire about me also. The statement that you know nothing about me would be appreciated. My foster parents, Mr. & Mrs. LaFountain have Father Fackler as the channel of information regarding me. Father Fackler can be reached by them if it should become necessary to contact me.

The situation looks very hopeful at present. The psychiatrist seems to indicate that the resulting situation was merely the result of a deeply entrenched anxiety state. He does not feel that the situation which developed was the main problem but that the anxiety state resulted and the mental and physical exhaustion also resulted) in a nervous breakdown. The nervous breakdown rapidly resulted in an inability to function.

In closing may I again apologize to your Eminence for not writing and replying much sooner to your communication of April 29, 1970. I assure you that it was not deliberate. I just found that I couldn't contact you for the many reasons mentioned in this letter mainly because I did not know the situation or my standing.



Unfortunately, early this week Father Elmer Wieber, the pastor of St. John's Parish in Jackson where Father Jason Sigler was assigned, came to see Bishop Zaleski and report that Father Sigler had become involved in some homosexual activity in the parish. To avoid any conflict with the law, Bishop Zaleski found it necessary to ask Father Sigler to leave. It was Bishop Zaleski's Intention to ask him to return to you, but Father Sigler asked if it would be possible to search out another solution.

At Father Sigler's request, I called Father Fetho in St. Mary's Farish, North Branch, in the Archdocese of Detroit. Father Petho is a close friend and graciously consented to take Father Sigler for the time being. Thereupon I contacted Bishop Gumbleton from Detroit who said that he would take Father Sigler for the present providing that he would obtain psychiatric help. I am sure that Father Sigler would agree to any recommendations offered him since he is very definitely committed to the priest-hood.

In response to your letter of June 22, 1973 requesting the service record of Father John (Jason) E. Sigler while he served in the Lansing Diocese, I am hoppy to provide the following information:

Father Sigler came to this Diocese in October, 1968 with a release from his Ordinary, Archbishop George B. Flahiff of the Archdiocese of Winnepeg. He was released to serve "ad experimentum" in the Diocese of Lansing. His reason for seeking a new Diocese was one of poor health and it was hoped that the climate here would prove more compatible than the rigors of Winnepeg winters. (Enclosed please find a copy of Archbishop Flahiff's letter of October 4, 1968).

He was assigned as an Assistant Pastor in St. John Parish, Jackson, Michigan, where he remained until he left the Diocese in March, 1970. During his assignment, he was well received by the people and was generally effective in the exercise of his ministry. Unfortunately, he allegedly became involved 'in re turpi' with some boys in the parish. The matter had been braught to the attention of the local police by the parents of one of the youngsters. Both the parents and the police agreed not to prosecute on the condition that he leave the Diocese, never to return. To the best of my knowledge, the allegations had some basis in fact. Father Sigler's reaction was one of genuine humility and honesty. He evidenced a sincere desire to seek professional help in overcoming his problem.

Chartrand indicates, I had informed him by phone and by that letter that the Jackson County (Michigan) prosecutor insisted that Jason Sigler must leave the diocese permanently as a condition to avoid criminal prosecution. While I can no longer recall the phone conversation with Msgr. Chartrand, the letter confirms that we had talked by phone prior to June 10, 1970.

Since that time, we have had no direct communication to or from Father Sigler. However, on March 5, 1970, Reverend James Sullivan, Vice-Chancellor of the Diocese of Lansing wrote to Cardinal Flahiff informing him that Bishop Zaleski had found it necessary to ask Father Sigler to leave the Diocese, and he had gone to St. Mary's Parish, North Branch, Michigan, with the approval of Bishop Gumbleton. On March 31, 1970, Father Tobin, s.P., Superior of Viad Coeli at Jemez Springs, New Mexico, in your Archdiocese wrote to the Cardinal that Father Sigler had arrived at Vias Coeli that afternoon requesting help for the problem which was the cause of his leaving Lansing. It is my understanding that Father Sigler was at Via@ Coeli from March 31, 1970, to February, 1971. During his stay there the Archdiocese of Winnipeg expended \$1,099.70 for his expenses there, since no other Diocese would look after him and since he was canonically incardinated in this Archdiocese. However, as I mentioned above, we have not heard from Father Sigler since 1968.

Undoubtedly Your Excellency will wish to write to Bishops Zaleski and Gumbleton, and you are probably aware of his stay at Via@ Coeli.

I am enclosing a photocopy of Father Sigler's "elenchus vitae" as Your Excellency requested. I trust Your Excellency will find this information adequate and satisfactory. In closing, I would like to add to what wassquoted from a letter of the Cardinal's above, namely that during his more than two years in the Archdiocese, Father Sigler always acted as an admirable young priest and everyone in the Archdiocese was sorry to see him go. I do hope that he can be accepted into Your Excellency's Archdiocese since I do believe he is really committed to the priesthood and the priestly ministry.





That proceeded to having the boys come to the rectory where he punched them and grabbed them in the genital area. He took off their clothing and proceeded to abuse them. did not go into any greater detail, he found this very difficult to discuss. He thinks that this began in the Fall of the year because the weather was getting cold and this continued for a year or so. He never told anyone about this, the first time he told anyone was when he left a note for his wife a week ago.



about Fr. Sigler in the paper he said that he had thought about it but that he didn't have the courage to do it.



When asked whether he had ever received any help, one time in the past he did go to Los Alamos to a psychiatrist but he really did not talk to him about the situation with the priest. He is very anxious to get on with his life.

He did not speak about any attorneys, he did not speak about any monetary arrangements. I told that we're interested in healing and reconciliation and I recommended a therapist in Santa Fe. He is anxious to call this therapist, in fact agreed to make a phone call on his way through Santa Fe as they return to Abiquiu and hopefully will be able to begin counseling as soon as possible. He also agreed to stay in contact with me.

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND RELEASE

The abuse, and the consequent damage, was indeed substantial. was subjected to criminal sexual contact by two priests in the same weekend, and these particular priests were the worst of the worst. Any expert in this field will easily attest to the compounded psychological damage caused by Father Sigler's pimping for Father Bissonnette.

Mr. has authorized this office to counteroffer in the amount of Redacted, Mr. is willing to negotiate, but any further movement is specifically conditioned upon a clear indication by the Archdiocese that there is interest in achieving a settlement for a reasonable amount.

INTERROGATORY NO. 15: Identify the dates and locations of each instance of battery, molestation or abuse which you allege was committed upon you by Jason Sigler, describe each such instance, and identify each and every witness to each such instance.

ANSWER:

I first met Father Sigler in the Summer of 1971, when he was assisting Father Kirsch at St. Thomas parish.

Father Sigler immediately ingratiated himself into my family, and soon he was treated as a member of the family. Often he would live at my house for two (2) to three (3) days at a time. Father Sigler even brought his parents from Michigan to visit our family. I recall that Father Sigler often gave my family books which he blessed.

I remember that the sexual contact started almost immediately after meeting Father Sigler. The first episodes occurred when Father Sigler would say goodnight to me. After saying goodnight, he would fondle me under the covers, and make me fondle him.

Father Sigler fondling me while I was fondling progressed to episodes in which Father Sigler performed oral sex on me, and then had me perform oral sex on him. I recall that Father Sigler would ask me to "lick him."

Father Sigler engaged me in this type of contact very frequently. We served Mass together on numerous occasions, and Father Sigler performed sexual acts on me both before and after

Mass. The sexual contact surrounding Mass usually consisted of Father Sigler fondling me and performing oral sex on me.

There was a period of time when I did not see Father Sigler. However, when he returned he told my family that he had been assigned to St. Anthony's parish in Ft. Sumner. Nonetheless, Father Sigler still visited my family, and continued to engage me in sexual contact during these visits. During one such visit, Father Sigler asked me "if I had any pubic hair." It never occurred to me to tell my parents what Father Sigler was doing because he was a trusted priest, and because my family and I believed that he was an angel of God.

I estimate that there were at least fifty (50) episodes of sexual contact from the Summer of 1971 through the Summer of 1974. I would have been nine (9) through twelve (12) years old during these years.

In addition to the Church and my home, Father Sigler performed sexual acts on me during trips to

Our client has authorized us to afford the Archdiocese of Santa Fe with a one-time opportunity to resolve our client's claims against the Archdiocese of Santa Fe and Jason E. Sigler, thus avoiding further litigation expense and the likelihood of a large jury verdict.

As you know, this is a case involving the sexual molestation of our client by Father Jason E. Sigler, a priest who was serving in the Archdiocese of Santa Fe at St. Thomas Parish in Abiquiu; Coyote, Mesa Pollo and Gallina, New Mexico.

was born on . His family were devout Catholics, and he was active in the church as a young boy and was serving as an altar boy when Father Sigler began serving at the Parish. He was taught by the parish priests that children, and himself specifically, should obey any Catholic priest.

Unfortunately for the priest with whom he came into contact in the Summer of 1971 when he was 10 years old was Father Jason Sigler. a notorious pedophile. Sigler served at St. Thomas Parish in home town of Coyote, with the approval and at the direction of the Archdiocese of Santa Fe, which was charged with the responsibility of his supervision. The Archdiocese of Santa Fe conducted no investigation whatsoever into Father Sigler's background, even though he was an incardinated priest with full facilities. Even though cannon law charged the Archdiocese of Santa Fe to hire; retain and supervise only individuals who were of good character and were not a danger to its parishioners, the Archdiocese of Santa Fe neglected to fulfill that duty in even a minimal fashion with respect to Father Sigler. In the case of Sigler, the Archdiocese of Santa Fe could have discovered his deviant nature if it had simply conducted a routine review of his prior conduct. 

You have requested notification of additional claims that this office has been instructed to pursue with regard to certain priests and the Archdiocese of Santa Fe. The purpose of this letter is to respond to your request and provide the factual background pertaining to the claims of these clients. This letter is submitted pursuant to the evidentiary restrictions of S.C.R.A. 11-408, and is not to be used for purposes other than settlement discussions.

With that preface, the following represents the identification of the individuals and the specifics of their abuse and injuries. The priests are Jason E. Sigler, Sabine Griego, Clive Lynn, Michael O'Brien, Anthony Gallegos, Charles H. Rourke, Bob Smith, Charles Martinez and John Esquibel.

FATHER JASON E. SIGLER



traditional Catholic home, both parents being very religious and devoted to their faith. Due to this upbringing, developed great admiration and respect for and obedience to Roman Catholic priests.

remembers that



was only nine (9) years old when Sigler began to molest him. He was a young child who was raised to believe that priests were next to God, and that you obeyed them and respected them. was at a very impressionable age, and was much too young to have realized what Sigler was doing to him.

served Mass with Sigler almost every weekend, and the first incident of molestation occurred after serving Mass on a Sunday. Sigler asked to stay after Mass to help him close up the Church because remembers feeling very proud and privileged that Sigler asked him to help with the Church

activities because he was one of the younger altar boys and thought that usually the older altar boys helped with these

activities. Sigler sexually abused when they were at the altar after everybody had left. It began by Sigler fondling genitals. Sigler continued to masturbate until he had an erection, and then performed oral sex on at the altar. This occurred numerous times after Mass when they were alone both in the sacristy and by the altar. also remembers that Sigler was always using a flashlight to check to see if was "getting any pubic hairs".

Sigler began to offer to take on trips to visit other parishes and places. It hought this was a great invitation as he was from a small town and his parents could not afford to take him and his siblings on many trips around the state. On one particular trip, remembers that Sigler fondled him while he was driving. Cannot recall anything else about this trip. On another trip, Sigler fondled and then made fondle him while he drove. Was too young to even contemplate what he was doing and therefore just obeyed Sigler. Says that the fondling became such a routine that whenever they were driving if the arm rest was down on the seat it meant that Sigler did not want to be fondled, and if Sigler raised the arm rest, it meant had to fondle Sigler. Sigler conditioned in this manner.

The fondling progressed on to oral sex and Sigler would make perform oral sex on him while he was driving. States that Sigler molested him in this fashion so many times that he cannot remember all of them. After a few years, Sigler was no longer the priest at the Gallina parish, but he continued to take on trips and abuse even after he left. recalls that Sigler had a habit of cleaning the head of his penis with Kleenex or a handkerchief.

was so young at the time that his memories of numerous incidents are vague and/or repressed. However, the trips that Sigler would take on are more vivid in memory. The remembers one incident when they were on a trip remembers he was approximately twelve (12) or thirteen (13) years old because Sigler and his cousin tried to get him into a bar. Says they walked into the bar, but were told to leave when the manager found out how old was. In response to your letter of June 22, 1973 requesting the service record of Father John (Jason) E. Sigler while he served in the Lansing Diocese, I am happy to provide the following information:

Father Sigler came to this Diocese in October, 1968 with a release from his Ordinary, Archbishop George B. Flahiff of the Archdiocese of Winnepeg. He was released to serve "ad experimentum" in the Diocese of Lansing. His reason for seeking a new Diocese was one of poor health and it was hoped that the climate here would prove more compatible than the rigars of Winnepeg winters. (Enclosed please find a copy of Archbishop Flahiff's letter of October 4, 1968).

hie was assigned as an Assistant Pastor in St. John Parish, Jackson, Michigan, where he remained until he left the Diocese in March, 1970. During his assignment, he was well received by the people and was generally effective in the exercise of his ministry. Unfortunately, he allegedly became involved 'in re turpi' with some boys in the parish. The matter had been brought to the attention of the local police by the parents of one of the youngsters. Both the parents and the police agreed not to prosecute on the condition that he leave the Diocese, never to return. To the best of my knowledge, the allegations had some basis in fact. Father Sigler's reaction was one of genuine humility and honesty. He evidenced a sincere desire to seek professional help in overcoming his problem.

At the time, he had completed his first year of theology at Mount St. Mary's Seminary of the West in Cincinnati, apparently studying for the Diocese of Gary, Indiana, although not incardinated to it. Previous to his one year at Mount St. Mary's, he had spent three years at St. Jerome's College, Kitchener, Ontario, taking a special year of Latin and two years of Philosophy. After consultation with the Director of Vocations and myself, the Archbishop agreed to accept him as a student for the Archdiocese of Winnipeg on a one year trial, and he accordingly entered St. Jeseph's Seminary in . Edmonton, Alberta.

On May 23, 1964, Jason took the Oath "Perpetuo manendi" in the Archdiocese of Winnipeg according to the norms of Canon 956 of the Code of Canon Law, and was subsequently tonsured and incardinated into the Archdiocese of Winnipeg in the month of June. During the course of his seminary studies, he did have a great deal of difficulty with his studies.

Father Sigler had some difficulty in the Seminary in Edmonton, but this was straightened out and the Archbishop was pleased to ordain him to the Priesthood on June 1, 1966.

On June 21, 1966, Father Sigler was named a curate at St. Mary's Cathedral and on January 9, 1967, he was named curate at Our Lady of Victory Memorial Parish, also in Winnipeg. His transfer from the Cathedral to Our Lady of Victory Parish after only six months was not a reflection on Father Sigler but due to other circumstances in the Archdiocese at the time.

During Father Sigler's time in the Diocese, a little over two years, he showed himself always to be an excellent young priest, devoted and zealous. Cardinal Flahiff was extremely sorry to lose him, but two doctors, one in Detroit and one in Winnipeg. had recommended that because of an upper respiratory infection, starting with a sinus condition and extending into his upper bronchial tubes, it would be better for him to seek a milder climate, because of the extreme variations in our weather, ranging from 40 degrees below zero in the winter to 95 degrees above zero in the summer. Accordingly, on October 4, 1968, His Eminence, George Cardinal Flahiff, Archbishop of Winnipeg, granted him "permission to leave the Archdiocese of Winnipeg in order to be accepted into the Diocese of Lansing 'ad experimentum'". Father Sigler has not been excardinated from the Archdiocese of Winnipeg.

Since that time, we have had no direct communication to or from Father Sigler. However, on March 5, 1970, Reverend James Sullivan, Vice-Chancellor of the Diocese of Lansing wrote to Cardinal Flahiff informing him that Bishop Zaleski had found it necessary to ask Father Sigler to leave the Diocese, and he had gone to St. Mary's Parish, North Branch, Michigan, with the approval of Bishop Gumbleton. On March 31, 1970, Father Tobin, s.P., Superior of Viae Coeli at Jemez Springs, New Mexico, in your Archdiocese wrote to the Cardinal that Father Sigler had arrived at Vias Coeli that afternoon requesting help for the problem which was the cause of his leaving Lansing. It is my understanding that Father Sigler was at Viae Coeli from March 31, 1970, to February, 1971. During his stay there the Archdiocese of Winnipeg expended \$1,099.70 for his expenses there, since no other Diocese would look after him and since he was canonically incardinated in this Archdiocese. However, as I mentioned above, we have not heard from Father Sigler since

Undoubtedly Your Excellency will wish to write to Bishops Zaleski and Gumbleton, and you are probably aware of his stay at Via® Coeli.

I am enclosing a photocopy of Father Sigler's "elenchus vitae" as Your Excellency requested. I trust Your Excellency will find this information adequate and satisfactory. In closing, I would like to add to what wassquoted from a letter of the Cardinal's above, namely that during his more than two years in the Archdiocese, Father Sigler always acted as an admirable young priest and everyone in the Archdiocese was sorry to see him go. I do hope that he can be accepted into Your Excellency's Archdiocese since I do believe he is really committed to the priesthood. and the priestly ministry.







DEFENDANT ARCHDIOCESE'S MOTION TO DISMISS PLAINTIFF'S COMPLAINT

COMES NOW Defendant Roman Catholic Church of the Archdiocese of Santa Fe, Inc., ("Archdiocese"), by and through its attorneys of record, Keleher & McLeod, P.A., and respectfully moves the Court for an order dismissing the complaint filed by Plaintiff and in support thereto represents to the Court as follows:

INTRODUCTION

Plaintiff filed his complaint on Novemer 7, 1996. His complaint makes detailed and prurient allegations of sexual misconduct which he claims occurred over 20 years ago. Plaintiff identifies himself only as "John Doe", although he fully identifies all defendants, including the Archdiocese, Jason Sigler, and Bishop Robert Sanchez. Plaintiff did not make an application to

the Court prior to filing the complaint to allow him to conceal his identity, nor has he made any such application since filing his complaint, all in violation of SCRA Rule 1-010(A) (1992 Repl).

The complaint alleges that in the early 1970's Plaintiff was an altar boy at that Jason Sigler performed non-consensual sex acts on him, that the Archdiocese knew Sigler was a pedophile, that the Archdiocese failed to warn parishioners that Sigler was a pedophile, and that the Archdiocese fraudulently intended to induce Plaintiff to remain in and financially support the Catholic Church. Plaintiff claims compensatory and punitive damages from the Archdiocese and the priest. Complaint paragraphs 1, 14, 24, 25, 26 and 43. These allegations over-step the parameters of notice pleading contemplated by the New Mexico Rules of Civil Procedure. SCRA Rule 1-008 (1992 Repl). Notice pleadings does not require that every theory be denominated in the pleadings; general allegations of conduct are sufficient.

Schmitz v. Smentowski, 109 N.M. 386, 389, 785 P.2d 726, 729 (1989).

The complaint was apparently drafted to attract and incense attention to Defendants while insulating Plaintiff from any identification or inquiry. The complaint only describes "John Doe" as a resident of church. Complaint paragraphs 1 and 24. Plaintiff makes no justification for filing anonymously other than "to prevent further embarrassment and humiliation" to himself. Complaint paragraph 1. While some cases have found that intensely personal matters may suffice to allow plaintiffs to proceed anonymously, those same cases also find that "[t]he risk that a plaintiff may suffer some embarrassment is not enough." <u>Doe v. Frank</u>, 951 F.2d 320, 324 (11th Cir. 1992). Even claims that a plaintiff alleging a sexual assault may be exposed to ridicule, harassment, and being ostracized by fellow college students are "insufficient to warrant anonymity." <u>Doe v. University of Rhode Island</u>, No. CIV A 93-0560 B, 1993 W.L. 66734l at 3 (D.R.I. 1993); <u>Doe v. Shakur</u>, 164 F.R.D. 359, 362 (S. D.N.Y. 1996).

Without the court's authorization for concealment of Plaintiff's identity, Plaintiff has failed to meet the requirements of SCRA Rule 1-010(A) (1992 Repl.), and his complaint is

Dear Archbishop Davis:

The two-fold purpose of this letter is to officially apply for incardination into the Archdiocese of Santa Fe and to request another assignment within the Archdiocese.

Further to our conversation of December 4, 1973 on the subject, I have written to the Diocese for which I was ordained requesting that a transcript of my service record be sent to you. I wrote today asking George B. Cardinal Flahiff, C.S.B., D.D., Archbishop of Winnipeg, to contact you in this regard.

I was born July 11, 1938 in River Rouge, Michigan and was raised in Southern Michigan. I was ordained to the Priesthood June 1, 1966 for the Archdiocese of Winnipeg (in Manitoba, Canada).

While serving in the Archdiocese of Winnipeg my first assignment was as Assistant at St. Mary's Cathedral Parish in Winnipeg. St. Mary's is a large, downtown city parish. My second assignment was to Our Lady of Victory Parish in Winnipeg. It is a residential (suburban) parish of over 600 families. While there, in addition to being Assistant in the parish, I was Chaplain to ten nursing homes and four hospitals.

In October of 1968 I was permitted to exercise my priestly ministry in the Diocese of Lansing, Michigan. This change was due to reasons of health. While in Western Canada I was not able to physically adjust to the severe winter climate and extremely cold temperatures. Hence, my physicians advised that I return to the more temperate climate of Southern Michigan.

While serving in the Diocese of Lansing I was assigned as Assistant at St. John's Parish in Jackson, Michigan. St. John's is a large parish of over 1,600 families and covered a portion of a city of 45,000 people plus a suburban and rural area of the surrounding county. I was there from October, 1968 until March, 1970. While at St. John's I served under three successive pastors. During the period I

was there three different pastors and three other assistants served the parish. As the above indicates, prior to coming to New Mexico I had experience in three different parishes and in various types of priestly ministry.

I came to New Mexico for reasons of health in April of 1970. In March of 1971 when my doctor allowed me to resume full priestly duties I came to St. Thomas Apostle Parish in Abiquiu at the invitation of the Pastor, Reverend Robert J. Kirsch. I have served in this parish for almost three years now.

The second reason for this letter, Archbishop Davis, is to request another assignment within the Archdiocese of Santa Fe.

In our conversation of December 4, 1973 you advised me to include both of these requests in one letter; and likewise requested that I write to you stating my preferences and wishes regarding the type of Parish I personally prefer to serve.

After almost three years here I find the vast area and sheer size of the Abiquiu Parish extremely demanding and tiring. Hence, I would prefer at this time; a parish which would require less driving and/or with better road and driving conditions. Attempting to serve nine different Churches and eleven distinct villages is a heavy strain. Therefore, I would appreciate a less demanding situation for my next assignment and one which is not quite so rural and isolated.

Eventually I would hope to be administrator or pastor of a parish in one of the smaller towns or cities of our Archdiocese. I, personally, find that I function much better in a small town than in a large city.

At this time, I would personally prefer not to be assigned to a large, city parish. I honestly feel that the mental strain; constant stress and daily pressures of a large, city-type parish would not be beneficial for me. Therefore, I would request that I definitely not be assigned to a parish in Bernalillo County if at all possible.

If possible, I would prefer, for this time, an assignment out of Northern New Mexico. I lean towards an assignment in the Central or Southern part of the Archdiocese. This area would expose me to the warmer climate and to a different mentality than the North. I feel that I would benefit from the experience of working in another area of the Archdiocese for a time.

In the almost three years I have labored in the Archdiocese I feel that I have come to understand and appreciate the customs, traditions, mentality and way of life of the people in New Mexico and I have a strong desire to exercise my priestly ministry in the Archdiocese of Santa Fe.

I hope that you and the Archdiocesan Personnel Board will give serious consideration to my request for incardination into the Archdiocese of Santa Fe and for a new assignment within the Archdiocese. SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND RELEASE

THIS SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND RELEASE (hereafter "Agreement") is entered into hovewhere day of Getober, 2016 by and between the Roman Catholic Church of the Archdiocese of Santa Fe, a corporation sole, and St. Anthony Parish (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Archdiocese") (and the Archdiocese to be hereafter collectively referred to as the "Parties"), in order to bring the matter in controversy between the Parties to a full and complete settlement.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, has made certain claims against the Archdiocese for personal injuries arising from incidents alleged to have taken place in New Mexico in a lawsuit styled in the Second Judicial District Court, County of Bernalillo, State of New Mexico (the "Lawsuit");

WHEREAS, laims are disputed by the Archdiocese, and the Parties desire to terminate and settle any and all Claims arising from the allegations, as defined hereinbelow;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, conditions and mutual promises contained herein, the Parties agree as follows:



Sigler's efforts, but he was unable to stop Fr. Sigler from forcing his mouth on Fr. Sigler's penis."

The molestation is alleged to have taken place over several months in 1974. Fr. Sigler wrote to then Archbishop Sanchez in 1982 advising him that he had decided to leave the active ministry and that he had entered into a civil marriage.

SPECIAL PERSONNEL BOARD MEETING

A special personnel board meeting was held on August 22, 1974 at the Chancery. Meeting, led in prayer by Archbishop Sanchez, began at 11:25 a.m. Previous minutes were read and approved. Answer: I attended St. Therese from 1st grade in about 1974 until 7th grade. I am unsure on the exact dates of abuse but it was all between 1979-1981. I was between the ages 11 and 13. The abuse occurred behind the rectory between the school and church, and behind the church downstairs in a sort of underground space between the rectory and the church. I recall 15 – 20 times. Most of the time he did oral sex on me, or occasionally fondled me.

But anyhow, I got a phone call one day from a gentleman here in town, and I don't remember his name, but he said he wanted an appointment with me. It was very important, very urgent. And I said, "Certainly."

So I set up an appointment with him, and he came into the office and said, "I understand that Father Jason is going to do the preliminary work for this particular couple," and I checked to see the registry book.

- A I do not. So anyhow, he said -- once I verified that yes, Jason was going to be the contact priest, he just came out and said --

Now, I believe they were cousins to this gentleman. There were two brothers. They came from a rather dysfunctional family, and they spent a great deal of time with this gentleman. And it was because they spent so much time in his house that they overheard this, that they had gotten the first information about that conduct between themselves and Jason.

So we set it up this way. I said, "Well, I have to interview these two boys to make it clear in my own mind what I have to do." So we set it up. And they gave me their age, and I think one was in junior high and one was about the 6th, 7th grade, something like that. Rather than intimidate the two boys, in terms of coming to a pastor's office and authority figure, things like that, since they spent so much time with this gentleman and his wife, I set it up so that I could interview the boys in their home.

Well, he was a working man, so we set it up for the

following Sunday, and that I would go to the home, his wife and himself would be my witnesses, and I would try to verify this particular charge. And I remember very clearly driving over on the West Mesa -- that's where they lived -- thinking that I had be very, very careful that I wouldn't be teaching the kids something, and yet I did not want to have a wild goose chase from the point of view of, "Well, we were just horsing around, messing around." I really wanted to have some specific information that, yes, some kind of sexual misconduct had taken place, and the boys verified it.

So then I sat with the boys and with this man and his wife and said that I would take action as soon as I could on this matter. And the fact -- and the boys themselves realized, "This man, he's sick," as they said. So that was on the Sunday afternoon.

Monday morning, I called the chancery and asked for Archbishop Sanchez. He just happened to be in the office, and I told him it was an emergency. I had to see him as soon as possible. He said, "Come up right away." So I did, and I told him what I had found out the afternoon before. So he said, "Ted, well, it's a situation where we've got to take action. I'm going to be giving a retreat this evening, an evening retreat out of Dominican Retreat House on Coors, and I want you and Jason to appear when I finish at about 9:30."

So I went back to the rectory, and I told Jason that

both of us were to appear that evening before the Archbishop.

So we did. Well, when we got into the -- he'd finished his duties, and we went into one of the side rooms there, and he just said to Jason, "Well, some very serious charges have been pressed against you, and I'm turning it over to Father Hunt, and he'll tell you."

So I gave him the information that I had acquired the afternoon before. And he did not deny it. He said, "It's authentic. It's true."

Then the Archbishop said to him that he had no faculties. He had to be out of the rectory by 8:00 the next morning and go back the Via Coeli. So that was my first knowledge of it, ever.

I am grateful for the letter which Father Starkey wrote to me in your name on March 23. The news it contained is sad. 

Unless this plea is rejected or withdrawn, that the defendant hereby gives up any and all motions, defenses, objections or requests which he has made or raised, or could assert hereafter, to the court's entry of judgment against him and imposition of a sentence upon him consistent with this agreement.

That, if after reviewing this agreement and any presentence report the court concludes that any of its provisions are unacceptable, the court will allow the withdrawal of the plea, and this agreement shall be null and void. 

Wayne County Prosecutor Announces Charges Against Four Catholic Priests

Wayne County Prosecutor Mike Duggan announces multiple charges of criminal sexual conduct against four men who previously served as priests in the Archdiocese of Detroit.

On May 3, 2002, the Archdocese of Detroit turned over to the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office allegations of sexual abuse made against 37 priests of incidents which allegedly occurred in Wayne County in the last 15 years. It was determined that 10 of the priests were deceased.

After a 4-month investigation, the Prosecutor's Office has now filed criminal sexual conduct 1st and/or 2nd degree charges against four priests. 15 other priests would have been charged were it not for the statute of limitations.

The four priests and the charges filed against them are as follows:

- 1) Harry Benjamin, 60, currently residing in Virginia, has been charged with 4 counts of criminal sexual conduct 2nd degree for allegedly sexually assaulting a 14 year old boy who belonged to St. Thomas A'Becket Parish In Canton.
- 2) Robert Burkholder, 82, currently residing in Hawaii, has been charged with 2 counts of criminal sexual conduct 2nd degree for allegedly sexually assaulting a 13 year old boy who belonged to St. Roberts Parish in Redford.
- 3) Edward Oleszewski, 67, currently residing in Florida, has been charged with 8 counts of criminal sexual conduct 1st degree for allegedly sexually assaulting an 11 year old boy in St. Cecilla's Parish in Detroit.



D marial rem 4) Jason E. Sigler, 64, currently residing In New Mexico, has been charged with 4 counts of criminal sexual conduct 1st degree and 4 counts of criminal sexual conduct 2nd degree for allegedly sexually assaulting a 12 year old boy in the boy's families' home in River Rouge, and a number of other places.

Prosecutor Duggan is asking individuals to come forward with any Incidences of misconduct by a current or former priest. Most important are incidences that occurred in the 1980s and 1990s, as those cases and individuals may still be subject to prosecution.

It is critical that individuals who believe they may have been the victim of a sexual assault by a member of the clergy of any denomination to confact either their local police department, or the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office at 313-224-5655.

"The city will prosper from a council that puts aside squabbling and helps make Albuquerque a better place for us all."



which he served in two states, including New Mexico.


The lawsuit names Jason Sigler, who was sentenced Aug. 4 to seven to 15 years in
