The Milwaukee Parental Choice Program, as the Wisconsin law is called, was passed by the state lawmakers in March after being introduced by State Rep. Annette Williams, who was critical of public education in Milwaukee's inner city.

Williams' four children attended Urban Day School in Milwaukee, one of the 10 private schools in the city that applied for eligibility under the legislation she sponsored.

Urban Day School was started by parents more than 20 years ago when St. Benedict the Moor and other schools were closed by the Archdiocese of Milwaukee.

Two other eligible Milwaukee schools have similar histories: Harambee Community School was once St. Elizabeth's, and Bruce-Guadalupe Community School formerly was Holy Trinity and Our Lady of Guadalupe.

In a court challenge to the law, a county circuit judge in Madison upheld it as constitutional. Groups opposing the law have promised to appeal, arguing that public spending on private schools is unconstitutional.
