

10 in Area to Become Priests June 5

Ten area men, members of the St. Bernard's Seminary 1954 graduating class, will be ordained to the priesthood for the Diocese of Rochester by Bishop James E. Kearney on Saturday, June 5, in Sacred Heart Cathedral.

Besides the 10 new priests for this diocese, the ordination class will include 14 new priests for the Diocese of Syracuse, 6 for the Arch-diocese of Hartford, 3 for the Diocese of Ogdensburg, 2 each for the Diocese of Worcester, Mass., and Albany, and 1 each for the Diocese of Bridgeport, Conn., and St. Augustine, Fla.

The Rt. Rev. Msgr. Wilfred T. Craugh, rector of St. Bernard's, said that six members of the class served with the armed forces during World War II.

Mrs. C. W. Zuehlke To Head NAACP

Mrs. Carl W. Zuehlke was unanimously elected president last night of the Rochester Chapter of the National Assn. for the Advancement of Colored People.

She will begin her one-year term on June 1, succeeding the Rev. Charles G. Kearns.

Mrs. Zuehlke, who lives at 46 Barons Rd., later said the chapter would strive in the coming year to reduce "discrimination in housing." She said she did not yet have a specific program. Mrs. Zuehlke was elected at the annual meeting in the Baden Street Settlement. By coincidence, it was her 10th wedding anniversary.

With a unanimous resolution, the chapter praised the NAACP legal division for arguing the segregation cases that led to the Supreme Court decision of May 17. On that day, the court decreed that segregation in the public schools was unconstitutional.
