Dear Father Raleigh:

I hereby accept your resignation as Parish Priest of St. John the Baptist Parish at Milwaukie, the same to be effective Nov mber 5, 1946, and I hereby appoint you to be Paris' Priest of St. John the Apostle at Oregon City, the appointment to become effective November 6, 1946, St. John the Apostle at Oregon City being vacant new by recon of the death of father Sheridan.

Some time before the above-mentioned date, you will subscribe in my presence, or in the presence of a priest delegated by me, to the Profession of Fifth, required by Canon 14/3, \$1, and to the O th against Modernism, prescribed by Pope Pius X (1 September 1910, S.S.C.S.O., 22 March 1918).

I hereby dispense you from formul installation as Parith Priest at St. John the postle at Oregon City, and declare that you will have then canonical possession when Father Manik turns over to you November 6 the keys of the Church and of the Tabernacle. You will, ho over, observe the provisions of Decree 150 of the Fourth Provincial Council of Portland in Oregon.

I pray that God will bless you abundantly in your new field of labor.



## Father Raleigh Dies Unexpectedly April 12


Concelebrated Mass of Christian Burial was offered April 17 at St. Mary Cathedral, Portland, for Father Michael Raleigh, who died unexpectedly April 12 after entering a Portland hospital for scheduled abdominal surgery on April 13. Intermetal was at Mr. Calvary Cemetery.

Father Raleigh was born May 27, 1902, at Chicago. He attended St. Mary of the Lake Seminary at Maindelein, Ill., and St. Meinrad Seminary. He was ordained for the Archdiocese of Portland March 29, 1936.

Relewing his ordination he was associate pastor at St. John the Baptist Parish, Milwaukie from 1936-39, and at St. Joseph Parish, Salem, from 1939-40, when he received his first pastorate at St. Patrick Parish, Canby. In 1943 he was named administrator of St. Catherine of Siena Parish at Vannort. In 1944 he returned to St. John Mirish, Milwaukie, as pastor.

In 1946, he was named pastor at St. John the Apostle Parish, Oregon City. From 1951-56 he was on leave of absence, returning to become administrator at Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish, Rainier. Later that year he became administrator of St. Augustine Parish, Lincoln City. From 1958-59 he was administrator at St. Therese Parish, Portland, and from 1959-62 was administrator at St. Francis Parish, Portland.

From 1902-63 he was chaplain at

St. Vincent Hospital, Portland, and 1963-64 was chaplain at Christic Home at Marylhurst. In 1964 he returned to parish work and was pastor 1964-65 at St. Anthony Parish, Waldport. From 1965-68 he was administrator at St. Mary Parish, Florence, and served from 1968-72 as chaplain at St. Catherine Nursing Home, North Bend. He retired June 1, 1972, and became chaplain at Dammasch Hospital, Wilsonville, until retiring from that position in August, 1975. Following his retirement, he continued to assist in parishes with daily and weekend schedules.

Surviving are sisters Mary Dwyer and Terese Raleigh, both of Chicago.
