# A Pastoral Letter to the People of God in the Diocese of San Diego 

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:
As you know from my letter to you in June, I am resolved to address cases of the sexual abuse of minors by priests "with transparency and openness, within the confines of respect for the privacy and reputation of the individuals involved."

Recently, three male adults made allegations of childhood sexual abuse against Monsignor Rudolph Galindo, a priest of this diocese who retired in 1986. Within the past several weeks, I investigated these allegations and met with Monsignor Galindo who admitted that they were true, accepting at the same time full responsibility for his conduct.

From my investigation, I am concerned that there are others who may have been harmed by sexual misconduct on the part of Monsignor Galindo during his various assignments as a priest. Wholeheartedly committed to the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, I invite any such persons to contact me in order that I might extend to them the pastoral outreach of the Church. I have directed the chancellor, Monsignor Steven Callahan, to personally receive any responses to this invitation at $858-490-8310$ or Post Office Box 85728, San Diego, 92186.

Once again, I want to assure you that, to my knowledge, we have no priests in active ministry who have sexually abused minors. In the rare situations in which there has been the abuse of minors, we have acted promptly to keep children and young people from risk and to reach out with pastoral concern and care to victims and their families. Moreover, we cannot lose sight of the fact, as you know from experience, that most of our priests are loving and selfless servants of whom we can all be proud.

In his homily for the closing Mass of World Youth Day in Toronto, Pope John Paul II said that "the harm done by some priests and religious to the young and vulnerable fills us all with a deep sense of sadness and shame." But, he added, "think of the vast majority of dedicated and generous priests and religious whose only wish is to serve and do good." These deserve our gratitude and support!

In the ongolng scandal of priests molesting children, San Diego Catholic Bishop Robert Brom has revealed that a retired priest admitted sexually abusing three men when they were minors.
Brom has barred that priest from ministry and has asked other victims to come forward.
The diocese turned over the name of Monsignor Rudolph Galindo to San Diego District Attomey Paul Pfingst this week.
"We're inyestigating to see if it's a prosecutable case," Pfingst said, adding that it will be a priority because there are accusations by more than

Under the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People adopted by U.S. bishops in June, any priest or deacon who sexually abuses a minur - past or present - is to be permanendy barred from ministry.
"I have prohibited Monsi. gnor Galindo from presending hinnseli as a pricsi or from functioning as a priest in any way whaisoever, and he accepted

Diego and Imperial counties. Galindo had been living in a retirement home for priests in San Antonio. Texas, but apparently has not been active in ministry because of poor health: A spokepsman at the Archdiocese of San Antonio said there is no indication that: he served as a priest there.

Brom described Galindo as "very remorseful and very understanding of the seriousness of what has happened." He also said Calindo "treed me to say ... that he has admitted to the allegations brought against him. He is not in a posture to defend himself against these al. legations."
Galindo served his first four years at St. Edward Roman Catholic Church in Corona. He spent the next decade at Our Lady of Guadalupe in Chula Yista.

- While this is the first time he has taken such action since the charter was adopted. Brom said zero tolerance was in place in the diocese before the bishops met.

After the meeting with Galindo, Brom said he sent the retired priest to an undisclosed treatment center for a psychological evaluation.
"I need to be sure that children and young people will not be at risk, even though from this point he won't be presenting himself or functioning as a priest," the bishop said.

Brom's letter urges other possible victims of Galindo to contact the diocese and lists the phone number and address for the Rev. Steven Callahan, chancellor of the diocese.
"From my investigation, I am concerned that there are others who may have been harmed by sexual misconduct on the part of Monsignor Galindo during his various assigroments as a priest" Brom wrote.

When asked why he issued this unusual appeal, Brom cited the newly adopted charter, which calls for dioceses to reach out to victims.
"I think it's the right thing to do," he said.
Mark Brooks, head of the local chapter of the Survivors Network of those Abused by Priests, a national victim's rights group, said he has "a lot of misgivings" about the bishop's request. SNAP suggests victims contact law enforcement.

This is not the first time that Galindo has been accused of sexual misconduct. In 1985. he paid $\$ 75,000$ to a then-19-yearold man who accused him of molesting him when he was an altar boy at St. Joseph Cathedral. Galindo denied that allegation.

Brom would give no details about the new victims or inctdents. saying the men were "very insistent on confidentiality." He did confurn that the diocese has paid no settlements.
"To guard the victims' Identity. we're not going to give so much information that you'd only have to fill in the blanks," Brom said.

Since being ordained in 1954. Galindo served at six churches in San Bemardino. San Diego and Imperial counties. Brom said that the incidents occurred at a church in: this rimmece whifh numare $\mathrm{C}_{2}$,

In 1968, he transterred to Our Lady of Guadalupe in San Bemardino. Six years later, he went to Our Lady of Mount Carmel in San Ysidro, and in 1976, he was made pastor of St Joseph Cathedral in downtown San Diego.

After the lawsuit was filed by the former altar boy, Galindo was sent in 1983 to Our Lady of Guadalupe in Calexico, where he stayed for three years until retiring because of declining health.

At Our Lady of Guadalupe Church in Chula Vista, one longtime parishioner said she doesn't believe that Galindo did these things.
"I have to hear it from the horse's mouth before I believe it - straight from the horse's mouth," said the parishioner, who did not want to be named.

Galindo built a new church and parish hall during his 10 years there, she said.

The monsignor is a former altar boy himself, having served at St John of the Cross Church in Lemon Grove.

It's been a summer of turmod for the Roman Catholic Diocese of San Diego as it grapples with the scandal of clergy sexual abuse that has rocked Catholic churches.

The names of 23 priests, accused of misconduct in cases that go back decades, were given to authorities in June. Some of the men are dead and several others have left the priesthood.

Since then, the diocese has given prosecutors names of three more priests from past files. Brom repeatedly has said that, to his knowledge, no priest who ever molested a child is in active ministry here.

Last month, the diocese acknowledged that a $\$ 250,000$ settlement was paid in December to a man who said he was molested when he was a minor by the late Monsignor William Kraft

Brom emphasizes that these cases represent a small fraction of the priesthood.
"Most of our priests are loving and sellless servants of whom we can all be proud," he wrote in yesterday's letter.

# Monsignor: Suit settled out of court

Kaisler sought to amend the original complaint, which named only Galindo as defendanh to include Bishop Leo T. Maher as a defendant.
In a memorandum filed April 5 , Kaisler said his own investigation turned up facts suggesting that Maber was negligent in bis supervision of Galindo.
"Had Bishop Maher properly supervised the activities of defendant Galindo he would have discovered that defendant Galindo was expending substantial sums of money in an effort to 'court' the plaintifl, a minor child.
"These expenditures included monies expended for numerous visits to the Town and Country Hotel in San Dhego, a vacation to the Hotel del Coroaado in Coronado, visits to the Palm Springs Spa, a two-week cruise to Alaska and a vacation to Hawaii," the memorandum says.
Kaisler's memorandum said that Galindo testified in a deposition that his compensation from the Catholic Church amounted to 8600 a month. and that in addition to travel expenses. Galindo "abo expended monies for luition for a private school for the plaintif, the purchase of articles of clobing and sils of muluey to the minor child."

Th his deposition, Galiado testified he had given Linh Do's parents $\$ 5,000$ paid $\$ 2,200$ for the private school tuition and bought Lint a piano for $\$ 818$. He also testified that be paid for karate lessons for Linh and opened a cavino armunt for him.
learmed of the trassaction in late 1081 and immedia tely complaised to both Galindo and Maber. One daugster, who asked not to be identified says the first letter of cormplaint to the bishop got no response. After a second lelter, Galindo agreed to deod the property back to the widow.

Kaisler's memo says the lawyer found individuals who, "because of the trust and confidence they reposed in the defendant ... were compelled to part with real property and other assets. Upon discovery of this ex. ercise of undue influence. complaints were made to Bishop Leo Maher, at times in writing."

The attorncy said in the memo that had Maher investigated, the bishop would have learned that Gal. indo was procrating money and spending it on Linh Do.
"If such an effort was actually undertaken by the bishop," the memo says. "he knew, or should have known. Lha! defendant Galindo was pursuing a most unusual social rela. tionship with a boy of the age of 13 , 14 or is years of age. It is important to note that the molestations which occurred continued for approximately a two to three-year period."
The reference to individuals who gave Galindo real property arises from a series of real estate transac. tlons in the 1970s in which Galindo acquired interest.
In one case tracked by The San Diego Union, an 85 -year-old widow deeded hall-interest in her home to Galindo in 1979. then rewrote her will to leave him the home, furnishings and any future dwelling she might buy.
