Your Excellency:

Thank you for taking the time to write me.

It is quite evident that you missed the main point of the original letter; the name Rudolph Galindo on my mother's checking account, savings account, deed to her property and in her will <u>without</u> the family's knowledge, and with evasive answers from both parties when the discovery was made. Why was he afraid for the family to know? Priests, regardless of vocation, are still human beings and subject to human frailties. Again I ask, is this situation such a case?

As far as Monsignor Galindo's phone call to me, the one call he made was nothing more than a thirty-minute monologue reiterating how long he and mother had been friends, what a wonderful person she is, etc. When asked about his name on the deed to her property, his reply was "I'm glad you brought that up." He said he didn't really want it there but gave me no time to ask why he permitted it to be done. Both times I made a comment, I had to interrupt him--he talked non-stop. No clear understanding of <u>anything</u> resulted from said phone call except reinforcement of my contention that there was something not completely kosher about that entire procedure of having his name put on all her property.

No disrespect is intended, but a phone call from him does not relieve you of the responsibility of answering your personal mail. If a cessation of communication between him and mother was what I wanted, I would have written him directly telling him to leave her alone. I don't have to go to a bishop for that!

It isn't necessary for you to reply to this letter, but if you would like to, a response would be appreciated. After all, it is only common courtesy to reply when a person comes to you for help with a problem, even if it is only to say "Sorry, I can't help" or "I don't feel that you have a problem".

I have a copy of your letter to Bishop Maher. I have not responded because I've been on vacation.

However, I am terribly sorry if I have in any way caused you and your family anxiety and worry because of my phone calls to your mother.

Doris, as you know, just to keep the record straight, my relationship with your mother has been one of years of friendship and gratitude. Your dear mother has been a personal friend of mine for nearly 30 years. In her young days and mine as a young priest, she helped me immeasurably as a Sacristan. No work around the church was too big or impossible. For this I am eternally grateful and I will never forget her kindness to me, especially in my young days.

I hope that the following comments will help clear the air regarding your letter. Lack of communication seems to be the problem.

You state in the second paragraph, that on September 1981, your name was taken off a checking account and mine put on. I had no idea that your name was taken off or that it was even on this account. (This was not made known to me by your mother.) All I did was sign a little card your mother sent me by mail and returned it back to her again. It was my understanding that it was a new account. Your mother asked me if I would do her a favor and help pay the utility bills, etc., if an emergency ever arose. I agreed only because she asked me to do this as a favor. I didn't want her to worry, nor did I want to refuse her. That emergency, however, never arose. Soon after a month or so, she went to live with you. I never wrote a check on that account. I never even saw the check book. (You fail to mention that I returned to you personally a small check, I believe of \$10.00 that your mother made out to me from that account. I could be mistaken but I am almost sure it was from that account. At that time I suggested that next time in San Diego, to please close this account, now that your mother was at your side. Do you remember?)

In the same second paragraph, you mention that "she felt it was her responsibility to provide a home." You may or may not know, but throughout the years everytime your mother mentioned this to me, I always said to her that the house should go to the church. She told me that she preferred to put my name on the property and to let me give it to the church on my death if I wished. Further more I always told her to check with the family first.

Again in the same paragraph you mention that I made a comment about "children's behavior towards aging parents." If I did make a statement such as that it was not intended to be personal in anyway. It was a general statement. REDAC I know for a fact that you have been an exemplary daughter as well as your other sisters and I'm sorry this statement has been misinterpreted.)

In the third paragraph, you mention that your mother both by mail and phone said that she was coming to San Diego on that particular Friday. I was delighted and looking forward to seeing you and your husband and your mother. I waited all day Friday. (Somewhere, lack of communication.) Saturday you arrived and I was not in - maybe even out of town. I don't remember. (I felt no reason to call again because your mother phoned the rectory either that same day or a couple of days aftewards and left the message, that other arrangements had been made. She would try to see me next time in San Diego. I felt no need to call, I just presumed the situation was taken care of.)

In the fourth paragraph, you mention that your mother had put my name on her property. This was her wish. She wanted to do this for me. It was my intent that the house would eventually go to the church. She understood this. When I asked her about the children she answered "the children are well taken care of." (I'm glad you mentioned the declaration of trust. This was documented giving her all rights to her property. She could do whatever she wanted freely. But you fail to mention that I took my name off the deed and gave the house back to your mother when she wanted to sell the house. Your mother has sold the house and she has the money. As regards the will, that's between the lawyer and the person making the will.)

In the fifth paragraph you complain about my reply to you. I'm sorry but I thought the note I sent you was an answer to your letter.

In the sixth paragraph, you mention phone calls. Your mother has both by mail and phone, contacted me and asked me to call her, not to forget her. So I have. (You may or may not be aware, I told her I couldn't Mrs. Doris R. Courtright August 27, 1982 Page Three

call as often as I would like to, because it was too costly. So we agreed that one time I'd call collect, she would pay and the next time I'd pay. We would alternate. And we agreed to cut down our calls to once or twice a month. This would help keep down the phone bill. A couple of times I told her that I thought it was too expensive for her. She'd always answer "please don't worry I enjoy talking to you." (Please remember your mother has been calling me for over 25 years once or twice a week. It was a way of life with her.)

REDAC I really thought I was doing the right thing by calling your mother, and bringing her a little joy. But maybe, it has had an opposite effect, I am terribly sorry.

I hope that the above comments have helped to clear the air just a little bit. Please don't worry anymore. Put your mind and heart at peace. I want you to know that I am not interested in a penny of your mother's estate. If I should be given even half a penny I'll return it to the family immediately. Secondly, I will not call your mother anymore because I didn't realize how much concern it was causing. I will pray for your mother always. Likewise, I promise to pray for you, your family and

One more thing, if need be I will be more than happy to forward a check for all the collect calls I've made, maybe ten or twelve at the most or whatever.

Your Excellency:

This letter is in regard to a situation that has developed between my REDACTED REDACTED REDACTED (REDACTED) (California and Monsignor Rudolph Galindo, St. Joseph's Cathedral, San Diego.

In September, 1981, without my knowledge, my name was taken off of and his name put on her checking account, into which her Social Security checks were automatically deposited. (Enclosure #1) In a conversation with mother about this change, she related pieces of conversation with him which gave her the impression that priests do not receive a large salary during their service years and upon retirement have no place to go and little to live on unless they have family to help. Therefore, she Another comment was made that he had worked with so many families where the children had stolen an aging parent's assets and he did not want that to happen to her. This would appear to me to be a direct character defamation of my sister and me.

On October 17, 1981, we had an appointment with and drove to San Diego solely to see Monsignor Galindo about the purchase of mother's car. Upon arrival at the appointed hour and day, we were told that the appointment had been the previous day, Friday, and Monsignor was not then in town. He did not call to ask why we came Saturday instead of Friday or to suggest a rescheduling of the appointment. We heard no more from him in regard to the car. It seems odd that he wasn't interested in seeing mother and getting better acquainted with the family of such a good friend as he

In 1978, against our advice, mother paid off the loan on her house, thus clearing the title of any encumbrance. In November, 1981, we discovered that two years prior, in November, 1979, the name Rudophh Galindo had been added to the Grant Deed to her Property. (Enclosure #2) On May 16, 1980, he excuted a Declaration of Trust. (Enclosure #3) Then, when she moved to Wichita, Kansas, in February, 1982, we learned that her Will, properly prepared by an attorney in 1973, had been revoked by the estate. The following is a direct quote from this Will: "I give my residence at my death with its contents, excluding items specifically disposed of in paragraph 2.1 California 92104."

Mother stayed with us in our home in Torrance from September, 1981, to February 4, 1982 when she left to live in Wichita near my sister, REDACTED , REDACTED , REDACTED , REDACTED , REDACTED asked for it. She was getting forgetful and was no longer capable of living alone with no family close by to help her take care of the basic necessities - paying bills, buying groceries, attending Mass, seeing the doctor or dentist. She is fully aware of her limitations and agreed that it was time for her to mover closer to one of her daughters since neither of us could move to San Diego to be with her. While here, she was happy and content, except after each phone call from her friend Monsignor Galindo when she became quite restless and aggitated. It took two or three days after his call for her to settle down to her usual cheerful self. When I wrote to him regarding this condition and asked specifically that he not urge or even suggest that she return to San Diego, the reply received gave no indication that he would honor my request. (Enclosure #4) In fact, he never even mentioned receiving my letter.

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Now that she has moved to Wichita, he calls her there, collect, running up phone bills for her to pay of \$50.00 a month, or more. Again, when she does not hear from him, she is happy in her new environment near her daughter, grandchildren and great grandchildren and content to let my sister and me handle her financial affairs. Now, after a phone call from him, she questions us as to the balance in her accounts and if her checks are coming in regularly. Such questions are never asked at any other time. She also becomes discontented and talks about returning to San Diego and even buying another house there. This kind of behavior is most disconcerting to those of us responsible for her well-being and we feel it is largely due to his influence exerted during these phone calls.

It was the hope of the family that when mother moved to Wichita this influence would cease, or at least subside, so that she could, once again, be free to do her own thinking. Since he continues his pursuit, we felt it was time to investigate his actions and/or motives. My parish priest, **REDADETATED**, what is the to investigate his Church, Torrance, California, said to take an attorney and several family members to see Msgr. Galindo on a fact-finding mission, take notes of the meeting, summarize them and write to you. In view of the past attempts to see the Monsignor, my husband and I shocked to hear of the actions taken by this priest and stated that a gift, such as the property involved here, offered to a priest should be directed to the Church or a charity - that he, personally, should never become involved as this man did.

We, as a family, do not appreciate this type of action by a clergyman with regard to an elderly widow, nor do we see any reason to let his upsetting influence on her conting. Any steps necessary to stop it will be taken. We wonder how many others may have been victimized with such tactics. It is our understanding that mother is not the first.

We would like for you to investigate this situation and if, indeed, there is any wrongdoing involved (as we suspect there is), would you please have Msgr. Galindo, in your presence, call mother and tell her the facts. If this is not feasible, then would you please officially notify her that her "dear, devoted friend" has been most unethical in his actions regarding her estate. She would not accept such an announcement from family. If there is any further action that we should take, please reply. Thank you.
