OBITUARIES

John Mladinich; captained 3,000 ships

John B. Mladinich used to tell friends that being a ship's captain was in his blood: "I am the son of a master, who was the son of a master, who was the son of a master, for a thousand years."

"The sea was his life," said Mary Brooks, a family friend for 30 years.

Mr. Mladinich — known variously as "Captain John" and "Johnny the Sheik" — died at age 92 Friday in a convalescent home.

Born in Austria, he joined his father at sea at age 8 on a two-masted schooner. He became a schooner master at age 16. During

his career, he was the master of about 3,000 ships.

In 1919 he came to the United States and became a citizen 20 years later. He spent several years in San Francisco, where his clothing earned him the nickname "Sheik."

He came to San Diego in the 1920s and settled into a career of delivering new ships, tugs, ferries and tuna boats to their owners all along the West Coast. He became a fixture along the waterfront here.

During World War II, he sailed on various merchant ships. After

the war, he was port captain for the National Steel & Shipbuilding Co. and for Campbell Industries.

Brooks said Mr. Mladinich taught thousands of people navigation skills over the years. "He had an uncanny photographic memory," she said. "He could go into a port one time and then sit down and draw the chart for that port."

A lifelong bachelor, he has no survivors.

A funeral service is scheduled at 10 a.m. tomorrow at the Beardsley-Mitchell Funeral Home in Ocean Beach. Cremation is planned.

MONSIGNOR WILLIAM D. SPAIN

Founder of St. Mark's parish

Monsignor William D. Spain, former pastor of St. James parish in Solana Beach and a 30-year member of the local Roman Catholic community, died last Tuesday in Hawaii of complications from surgery.

The Honolulu resident was 64.

Born in San Bernardino, Monsignor Spain graduated from Loyola University in Los Angeles in 1951. He attended theological college at Catholic University in Washington, D.C., and was ordained a priest at St. Joseph Cathedral in San Diego in May 1956.

Seven years later he founded St. Mark's parish in San Marcos. He became pastor at St. James in 1969, and stayed there until 1984.

In 1970, he was invested as monsignor, and three years later also was named a Knight of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulcher, an honorary Roman Catholic order.

Monsignor Spain also had a long affiliation with the University of San Diego. He was the school's first vice president and was a member of its board of trustees from 1973 until 1984.

He moved to Hawaii in 1985 after a public scandal about allegations that he became addicted to cocaine during a six-year homosexual affair with a young man. He spent three months in a treatment center and was reassigned to a post in Coronado before leaving the mainland.

In Hawaii, he was an assistant pastor at Holy Trinity Church.

Survivors include a brother, James E. of Newport Beach; two nephews; a niece; two aunts; and an uncle.

A memorial Mass will be celebrated in San Diego at 10 a.m. Thursday in the Founders Chapel at the University of San Diego.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated at Holy Trinity Church in Honolulu tomorrow night, with burial Thursday morning at Hawaiian Memorial Cemetery.

Store owner

Dwight M. Lobb, former owner of pet and hobby stores in San Diego, died Thursday from complications during surgery. He was 47.

A San Diego native, Mr. Lobb graduated from Point Loma High School in 1964. Two years later, he began a 19-year career with the Food Basket supermarket chain. He worked at various stores, but was affiliated mostly with the Point Loma branch.

In 1985, he and his wife, the former Suzanne Fogwill, became owners and operators of three Pet-mart stores in the area. They sold the stores in 1989.

That same year, they opened Zanights Hobbyworld in the Clairemont Square Shopping Center, which they sold last year.

Mr. Lobb was a member of the Retail Clerk's Union, Local 1222, and a former board member of the Clairemont Square Merchant's Association.

Survivors include his wife of 28 years, Suzanne; a daughter, Cathy M. Fabregas; a son, Danny K.; and a brother, Don W., all of San Diego.

Sellers memorial tomorrow

Memorial services for Margaret L. Sellers, former head of the Postal Service branch in San Diego, will be tomorrow at 11 a.m. in the Garden Chapel at Greenwood Mortuary. Ms. Sellers, 63, died Friday from cancer.

News fit to print — in obituaries

To many, he was a pillar of their community. Then came scandalous allegations. Because of his position, stories about his personal troubles appeared in local newspapers.

That was years ago. When he died last month, an obituary about him appeared in *The San Diego Union-Tribune*. And the allegations? They were right there, in the middle of the obituary, along with his good works.

Now his family is not only grieving for him, but is reeling from seeing the allegations once more in print. They say it's unfair.

I am not going to name the man. Family members do not want to see anything more in the newspaper about the unfortunate episode.

The information the family questions included both an allegation of sexual misconduct, which the man denied, and alleged drug abuse. There was no criminal prosecution; nothing on the public record beyond newspaper stories. Given that, was it really necessary to include the information?

I am conflicted about this: It is a powerful argument that the previously reported allegations did not involve criminal prosecution; it is a powerful argument that the man denied one of the allegations and that he cannot defend himself from the grave. I am also haunted by the pain the information in the obituary caused family members. I am equally aware that the name would be recognized by readers who might accuse the newspaper of covering up for a person with powerful ties in the community.

The man no longer lived in the county; the newspaper learned of his death through a notice submitted to the newspaper by a relative. As is usual practice, the reporter took the facts and supplemented them with information from the newspaper files. In this case, the information in the files included the allegations.

Had the family submitted it as a paid death notice, it would have appeared exactly as it was written by the relative. However, a paid death notice does not preclude a news obituary; if a person is prominent enough and there is space,

news obituaries are written.

I suspect not many readers know the difference between news obituaries and paid death notices that appear on the same page; the family did not, despite an item explaining that paid announcements are placed through the classified advertising department. Paid notices look different from regular news stories and obituaries. The type is smaller and in a different style.

Readers asked why the newspaper had to include the information that was so distressing. Explaining that the information was news didn't do it. One woman called the newspaper a four-letter name before slamming the phone down.

This was an obituary, readers said. It is probably the last word the public will read about the person. They say it is like a eulogy. It should concentrate on the good, not the scandalous.

Now look at it from the standpoint of a newspaper whose mission it is to report the news. Including the well-publicized allegations in the announcement of this man's death was a point of information for readers who may remember the name and wonder if he is not the same person they had read about in the past.

In this case, the information some readers feel should not have been included was deep in the story, in the seventh paragraph of an obituary that was 11 paragraphs long. Had the newspaper been attempting to sensationalize, the information would have been in the first paragraph and in the headline.

Even so, I have to agree with the family member who said: "So what? You know what the reader is going to remember."

Writing such an obituary is probably one of the most unpleasant tasks faced by any reporter. He or she knows the information probably should be included to give the full story, but most writers usually do

not relish doing so. The reporter knows the "professional" reasons for using the information: It's part of the man's past and the paper could lose credibility if it published a sanitized version.

Ombudsmen at the *Sacramento Bee* and *Baltimore Sun* did not see how the *Union-Tribune* could avoid reporting the information, but I could hear the reluctance in their voices.

As Art Nauman of the *Bee* put it: "My heart is in one place but my professionalism tells me something else."

Because it makes thoughtful journalists as uncomfortable as I know it does, newspapers need to put a little heart into their "professionalism."

A story July 25 about State Bar of California discipline of attorneys said that Clarence W. Hunsucker could not be reached for comment. There was no listing for Hunsucker in the telephone book or in attorney directories. The reporter did a computer search of the *Union-Tribune* library and found nothing. Apparently, she did the research a full week and a half before the story appeared. Had she done the research later, she would have found a paid death notice. Hunsucker died on July 11 and a notice first appeared July 18. Friends said that he had not practiced law for some time.

Usually, the names of the immediate family members are in the list of survivors in obituaries. An obituary last week for Dwight M. Lobb did not include his mother, Aline Lobb, of San Diego. The information, unfortunately, was not provided by the source.

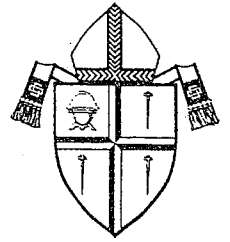

 OBITUARY FOR MONSIGNOR WILLIAM D. SPAIN, 64

Monsignor William D. Spain, former pastor of St. James parish in Solana Beach, died Tuesday in Honolulu, Hawaii, of complications following recent orthopedic surgery. He was sixty-four and lived in Honolulu. Prior to his residency in Hawaii, Msgr. Spain lived in San Diego County and served in several ministries in the Roman Catholic Community for over thirty years.

A native of San Bernadino, California and a 1951 graduate of Loyola University in Los Angeles, he attended theological college at Catholic University in Washington, D.C. and was ordained a priest on May 19, 1956, at St. Joseph Cathedral in San Diego.

Msgr. Spain founded St. Mark's parish in San Marcos in 1963 and served as pastor of St. James parish, Solana Beach, from 1969 through 1984. He was instrumental in the planning and construction of the present church and school facility at St. James.

In addition to his ministry as a parish priest, Msgr. Spain had a long association with the University of San Diego, serving as its first Vice President. As a member of the University's Board of Trustees from 1973 to 1984, he contributed to the University's emergence as an important center for higher learning.

Invested as a monsignor in 1970 by Bishop Leo T. Maher in ceremonies at St. James parish, he was also named a Knight of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulcher in 1973, an honorary Roman Catholic order.

In 1985, Msgr. Spain moved to Honolulu, one of his favorite travel destinations, where, although semi-retired, he served as an assistant pastor at Holy Trinity Church.

Survivors include his brother, James E. Spain of Newport Beach; two nephews, Michael Robert Spain of Corona Del Mar and James E. Spain of San Diego; a niece, Sheryl Ann Skidmore of Riverside; two aunts, Marie Foy and Leone McMillan of Rancho Bernardo; and an uncle, William Wunsch, also of Rancho Bernardo.

A funeral mass will be celebrated at Holy Trinity Church in Honolulu at 7:30 p.m., Wednesday, July 28, 1993. Burial will be at 11 a.m. the following morning at Hawaiian Memorial Cemetery in Honolulu.

A memorial mass will be celebrated in San Diego at 10 a.m. on Thursday, July 29, at Founders Chapel on the campus of the University of San Diego.

The Marian Year as proclaimed by Pope John Paul II concluded on the Feast of Mary's assumption into heaven (August 15, 1988). In the Encyclical Letter "On the Blessed Virgin Mary in the Life of the Pilgrim Church" (Redemptoris Mater) the Holy Father reflects upon the intimate bond between Mary's motherhood and redeemed humanity. He proposes Mary as a sure guide for the pilgrim church on earth, particularly as we prepare for the 2,000th year since the birth of her son. With this in mind, Msgr. William D. Spain, weekend associate at Holy Trinity Church, has prepared an exhibit of Marian Art (more than 30 artifacts) which he has collected over a period of 35 years. He believes this is especially appropriate as we prepare for the Feast of the Immaculate Conception and continue our celebration of the fiftieth anniversary of Holy Trinity Parish.

Marian art has been of great importance in christian countries from the 3rd century to the present day. It is not a special development of the Gothic period of the Middle Ages but has deep roots in early Christian thought and art and has a continuous history through the centuries.

It embraces single representations and liturgical Marian art; narrative cycles of her life, death, and glorification; portrayals of her miracles and apparitions; and symbolic Marian themes. The oldest portrayal of MARY is thought to be that of a mother and child from the catacomb of Priscilla (3rd century, Rome) which is probably connected with the prophecy of Isaiah (Is 7:14). The theme with a mother seated with her child on her lap occurs in the cemetery of Majus in the 4th century. The 5th century portrayals of Mary have a tendency to be more regal in the wake of the Council of Ephesus (431) which initiated the veneration of the Theotokos, i.e. mother of God. A mosaic in St. Mary Major, Rome showed the Virgin enthroned with the Child. The clothing is stereotyped; the Virgin wears an oriental gown and red slippers. The solemn full-face pose of Mary in the Adoration of the Magi in S. Apollinare Nuovo, Ravenna, foreshadows the style of portrayal on the ivory diptychs. From this point many modes developed, the most ancient in Byzantium being those of liturgical icons, thought to be connected with relics such as portraits of Mary from life and articles of her clothing. The historicity of most of these articles is justly questioned.

Beginning in the 7th Century we find that Western art borrowed heavily from Byzantium influence. The picture of Mary crowned as an impress as found in the Oratory of John VII occurs in the early 8th century. The motif of the crowned Madonna reappears during the Middle Ages in Romanesque and Gothic art. The Italians adopted the Byzantine modes of portrayal and gradually pictured the Blessed Virgin according to the Renaissance concept of idealized beauty. Gothic art gave us many examples of a graceful Madonna standing with Child. Western artist have created a number of types of the Virgin that are often linked with a particular group, miracle, shrine or country. The best source for the life of Mary is to be found in the Gospels. These events are especially popular in Marian art: e.g. annunciation, nativity, flight into Egypt, assumption.

We hope these observations will be of help to our people as they view various "art works" in this exhibit. We believe you will find the following to be of special interest:

1. Original 15th Century Holy Family (Italian Umbrian School - contemporary with Fra Angelico.) Oil on wood.
2. Italian porcelain, 8 examples. Professor A. Pattarino. Prof. E. Pattarino and A. Borsato. Circa 1945-65.
3. Salvador Dali lithographs. Our Lady of Guadalupe, the Immaculate Conception, the Coronation.
4. Various examples of the Madonna in crystal including words by Lalique and Limoges (French). Cibis and Fostoria (American).
5. Our Lady of Fatima and Our Lady of Lourdes.
6. Wood carvings including examples from Italy, Switzerland, and Oberammergau, Germany.

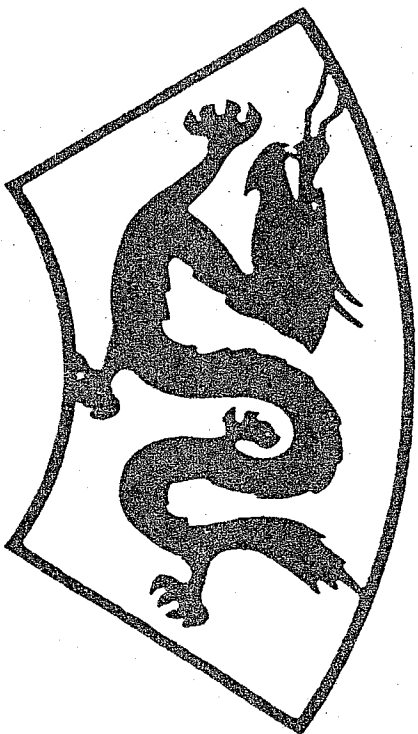


Monsignor William Spain has requested and authorized me to provide you with the following information concerning his request for retirement.

Monsignor Spain has been seeing me for individual psychotherapy since September 1984. Treatment has focused on assisting Monsignor Spain develop and maintain a program of quality sobriety.

During the period I have been seeing Monsignor Spain, he has experienced significant psychosocial stress. The loss of his parish, the death of his mother, and the harshness of scabrous press articles have been exacerbating factors in treatment. These stressors have been etiologically significant in Monsignor Spain's periods of depression, anxiety, and tension and correlated with his high blood pressure.

Treatment has therefore involved helping Monsignor Spain cope with these stressors. Continuing treatment demands, however, that some psychosocial stressors be removed. Based upon this necessity, it is my judgement that Monsignor Spain's continuing treatment and recovery can best be served by his retiring from active ministry.



Dear Bishop Maher:

As you know, Msgr. William Spain is a 58-year-old priest of 30 years who has had significant medical and emotional difficulties in the past few years. I have been treating Msgr. Spain since 1985 when we noted that he was significantly hypertensive. He also has had moderate exogenous obesity, and weight loss was recommended. During one of our follow-up examinations, it was noted that multiple extra heart beats were present. This was rather thoroughly evaluated, and he was found to have a rather serious cardiac problem--specifically, "ventricular tachycardia" but what we also would deem high-grade ventricular ectopy. This may be a serious problem in certain patients and demands treatment. We have placed Msgr. Spain on various cardiac medications, but thus far, I have not been able to control these extrasystoles. He currently is doing all that he can to normalize the heart beat and has refrained from all stimulants whatever and even mild antihistamines have not been taken at my recommendation. I feel that Msgr. Spain currently is totally and permanently disabled and should be allowed to maintain less stressful activities.

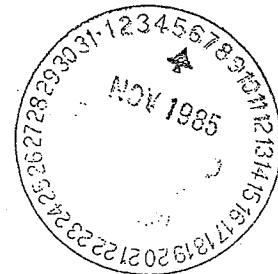


Your Excellency, Bishop Maher,

Departure Of William Spain

Monsignor William Spain is a long, long way from home as he descends the carpeted stairway and greets the visitor from San Diego. It is Saturday, June 23, the visitor is a reporter who has traveled to the Maplegrove Drug Rehabilitation Center fifty miles north of Detroit, and he is not a good sight for Msgr. Spain's sore eyes. As far as the monsignor knew, no one besides a few San Diego diocese officials and his immediate family was aware that he was in Michigan. Though Spain is counseling patients here today, he is actually a patient himself at Guest House, a treatment facility a few miles to the north for priests who suffer from drug and alcohol dependencies. For fifteen years, until early last April, Msgr. Spain was the pastor in charge of St. James Catholic Church in Solana Beach, then one day he was abruptly called into Bishop Leo Maher's office and whisked away to a hospital. But judging by his physical appearance now, Msgr. Spain does not look like a man who has been undergoing intensive treatment for more than two months.

He is fifty-six years old, six feet tall, and very flabby, and his gait is slow and careful. He is mostly bald, and his bloodshot eyes pierce through the spatchy red folds of his face. This day he is wearing dark-rimmed glasses, a blue shirt, and no shoes on his black-stockinged feet. Spain guides the reporter to a vacant office

and the two sit down to talk. The monsignor is nervous. The reporter hands him a business card and explains that he knows something about Spain's activities prior to his sudden departure from San Diego and that he needs to ask the monsignor some questions. The reporter

mentions some names of people who were intimate friends of the monsignor in San Diego. "It doesn't sound like it could be a very positive story," says Spain. "I'm here for health reasons, but beyond that you'll have to talk to Bishop Maher." The reporter then asks if the

monsignor would mind answering some specific questions. Spain says it depends upon the questions and asks the reporter to shut off a tape recorder that is lying on the seat between them. "Monsignor, do you know a man named Rick Bates?"

"Bishop Maher. Did you ever loan him a lot of money?"

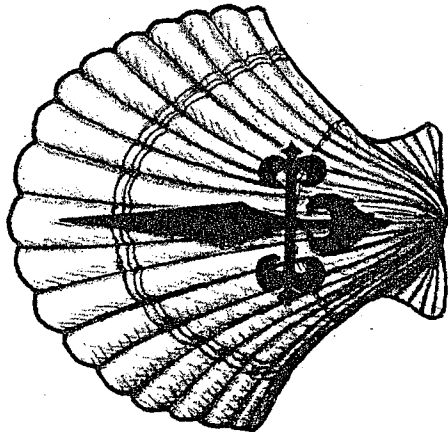

A Personal Pride Of Lions

Collecting Kingly Creatures Is A Jo

SOLANA BEACH — In a local building housing more than 200 lions, peace and serenity prevail.

The spacious Solana Beach rectory of St. James Catholic Church that accommodates Monsignor William Spain and his staff, is a menagerie.

Most of the handsome, inanimate beasts have come to the North County cleric as gifts from friends who live or have visited all corners of the world. His personal "pride of lions" originated in 1963, while he was serving as vice-president of the University of San Diego. The popular prelate was chosen that year for the significant task of forming a Catholic church in San Marcos, then a relatively small community. It was to be the college administrator's first pastorate, and he began the project with his customary zest and flair for the dramatic.

As a seminarian, Father Spain had noted that the Bible makes numerous references to lions, singly and in groups. It seemed appropriate that his new parish was to be dedicated to St. Mark, in the city known by the early evangelist's name in Southern Europe.

The winged lion, St. Mark's ancient symbol, is still part of the Renaissance decor of famed Piazza San Marco in Venice. One of Spain's most reassured figures is a centuries-old winged lion that once topped a flagpole in the world-famous square. It was presented to him by the mayor of Venice, when that dignitary visited the San Marcos parish a few years after its founding. As a gesture of appreciation, Father Spain gave the Venetian official an ornately designed "key to the city," more than two feet in length. The visitor was both delighted and astonished, since ceremonial keys to cities are apparently unknown in his area. "What a tremendous door your city must have," he commented, in some amazement.

Over the years, lions of all shapes, sizes, materials, and fabrics have come to join Spain's fabulous collection. Among them are shaggy-maned

animal kings with jeweled eyes from India, teakwood lions from Hong Kong, marble sculptures from Europe and Asia, and a hand-blown glass creation by a distinguished Italian artist.

In one corner of the rectory's reception room, an intricately carved lioness from Russia, head adorned with a small fur turban, eyes covered with dark glasses, crouches covertly. "That's our spy from Moscow," Spain blithely explains to visitors, with a twinkle in his eyes. "She watches us all very closely."

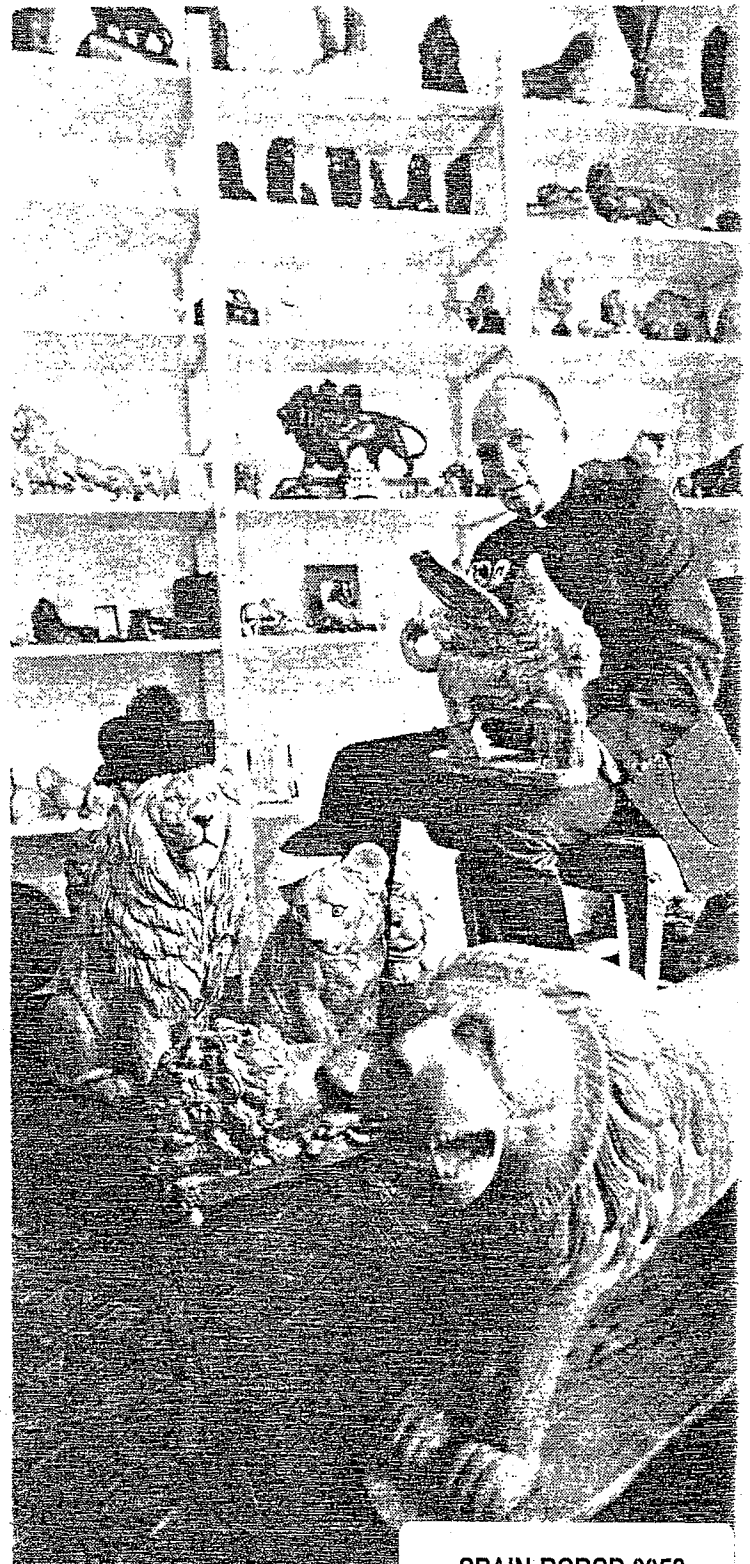
Another member of the lion collection is a tall, imposing beast who frequently wears the pastor's clerical headgear at a slightly rakish angle. "He's an ideal hat stand" his owner noted, with a smile.

In addition to tall shelves that hold part of his collection, the San Dieguito churchman, who was assigned 10 years ago to St. James Parish in Solana Beach, enjoys having several of his kingly creatures in various parts of the rectory, where they add panache to the dining area, patio and office. A gleaming brass knocker on the building's front door is in the form of a lion's head.

Proving that he inherited a generous portion of his characteristic good humor, the rectory's chief resident is pleased to display a delightful wall hanging, lovingly embroidered by his mother, Rose Spain of Rancho Bernardo. It is aptly titled, "Dandy Lions." The figures are large, brightly petalled flowers, each with a cheerful lion face as its center.

Although he has no desire to encounter the king of beasts alive, outside of a zoo or a wild animal park, the collector of leonine figures greatly enjoys his fascinating variety of representations, believed to be the largest in the Western states.

The popular church leader, who finds a pun irresistible, noted that his hobby, reflecting so many contributions from valued companions, is a special joy. "Next to my religion, my relatives and friends and parishioners," he commented, "you might say my lions are the pride of my life."

Monsignor Shows Lion Pride

SOLANA BEACH — Monsignor William Spain could be referring to his church when he talks about pride. But more than likely, he is talking with pride about the pride — nearly 250 — of lions who reside with him in the rectory.

Spain, 50, pastor of St. James Catholic Church here, collects lion figures of all sizes and shapes, beginning his hobby 17 years ago when he was assigned to start a church in San Marcos. The church was named St. Mark after the Biblical evangelist whose symbol is the winged lion. Spain obtained a replica of the lion

and several more lions after that.

"I definitely didn't realize I would be surrounded now by 243 lions," he laughs.

Most of Spain's lions are from other countries. He has inexpensive lions and several made of jade and gold which he keeps locked up. He has lions the size of a thumb and one that's two feet tall. Others are part of things usable in everyday life: a pipe, a shoe horn, even a lion can opener. Spain's Christmas ornaments, as you might guess, have lions on them.

One, he is a man of God; and two, he likes lions.

Well, yes, he is a man of God; for his man is Father William D. Spain, pastor of St. Mark's Catholic Church, and his house is his rectory. And, no, despite the fact that he has a collection of more than 140 figures of lions (believed to be the largest in the West) and you find them everywhere around the rectory, he doesn't especially care for lions. That needs some explaining.

In 1963, Father Spain was asked to form a Catholic Church in San Marcos. He was vice president at the University of San Diego, and the parish in the valley San Marcos would be his first.

There was no church building at all, and to be with services were conducted in the nearby Ol' O House. It was shared with the Congregational Church and movies on Saturday night featuring "Will Success Spoil Rock Hunter?" when St. Mark's moved in.

Father Spain decided that his parishioners and all the people of San Marcos needed to be reminded of the tradition for which the church and the city were named. The symbol of St. Mark the Evangelist is a winged lion.

And while Father Spain dislikes and fears live lions, he began collecting lion figures as a matter of necessity. Now lions, in a manner of speaking, are running over the rectory.

His first lions were two large teakwood figures, winged gargoyle-type faces from India, a gift from a friend at the university. He has a meerschaum pipe (unsmoked) from Istanbul carved in the head of a lion. There are more teakwood lions from Hong Kong and Taiwan, a lion made of Venetian glass and one sedentary lion wearing south sea island beads.

Another lion sits in a tub of ivy and wears a Middle-Eastern burnoose because Father Spain tried the headpiece there one day and liked the way it looked.

There is a carved replica of the walking lion, Antoine Barye. The knocker on the front door of the rectory is a lion's head. There are stuffed lions (one huge one picked up on a recent trip to Las Vegas) and there are little lionized pins.

There is a tapestry of orange, yellow and blue lion faces hanging in a hallway. It was made by Father Spain's mother. A lion's mouth holds a picture on the wall. A lion made of hemp holds pencils.

The Royal Dutch coat of arms, a lion, is posted under the television set.

Mrs. Margaret Ewing, Father Spain's secretary and housekeeper, wears an apron decorated with a bright orange lion, and she handles hot pots with a holder that is a lion.

The most valuable lion in the collection is a small gold one with ruby eyes that forms the top of a lava dish with which Father Spain performs his ablutions in the sanctuary.

The sanctuary itself once was a building used by the San Marcos Lumber Co., and Father Spain likes to point out that people now come in where the lumber was used to. And at the entrance of the church are two huge lions lying with paws outstretched.

Father Spain's favorite lion is one that holds a candle in its back. This will be featured in a blessing of the flame ceremony at St. Mark's fifth annual fiesta March 25-26.

The flaming lion once was perched atop a flagpole at St. Mark's Church in Venice and was presented to Father Spain by the mayor of Venice when he was there last July.

Father Spain, in turn, presented the mayor, D. Giovanni Favaretto, an elaborate two-foot-long key to the city from the people of San Marcos. Keys to cities are unknown in Italy, and when the Venetian mayor gazed upon the huge ceremonial key, he said in a seriousness:

"Your city must have a very big door."

In his research of the lion, Father Spain has found that the animal is mentioned in the Bible more than 15 times. And while he professes no great love for the lion, you get the feeling that he is warming up to the beast. He puts it another way:

"Well, I suppose I could have been sent to a Paris
